**Aviators vs. Aces:** The Las Vegas Aviators professional baseball team, Triple-A affiliate of the Oakland Athletics, will face intrastate rival, the Reno Aces, Triple-A affiliate of the Arizona Diamondbacks, tonight in game five of the six-game series in Triple-A West action at Greater Nevada Field (9,100)...Las Vegas is 1-3 on the six-game Northern Nevada road trip...the series against the Aces will conclude tomorrow afternoon...following an off day on Wednesday, May 19, the Aviators will then return to Las Vegas Ballpark for a six-game homestand against the Salt Lake Bees, Triple-A affiliate of the Los Angeles Angels, from Thursday-Tuesday, May 20-25.

### Las Vegas defeats Reno 4-1 on Sunday afternoon (May 16):

The Aviators defeated the Aces 4-1 yesterday afternoon in game four of the six-game series before a crowd of 3,751 at Greater Nevada Field.

**Las Vegas offense:** The Aviators recorded 6 hits and rallied from a 1-0 deficit to score three runs in the eighth inning.

Francisco Peña delivered a pinch-hit, RBI single to break the 1-1 tie. Shortstop Pete Kozma was 2-for-5, stolen base, RBI; first baseman Frank Schwindel was 1-for-4, double, walk and right fielder Greg Deichmann was 0-for-2, three walks, runs scored.

**Reno offense:** The Aces recorded 5 hits and broke the scoreless tie in the sixth inning on a solo homer by center fielder Ben DeLuzio (1-for-3). Right fielder Stuart Fairchild was 1-for-3, stolen base.

**Las Vegas pitching:** Right-hander Brian Howard pitched 6.0 solid innings in the no decision. He allowed 3 hits, 1 run, issued no walks and struck out 6 batters on 81 pitches (51 strikes).

**Reno Aces:** In 2019, the Aces compiled a record of 66-74 (.471) and finished in second place in the Pacific Northern Division. The Aces are in their 11<sup>th</sup> season with the D-Backs.

**Sacramento 10-7 for fourth straight victory in series finale (Tuesday, May 11):** The Reyes de Plata defeated the River Cats 10-7 in the finale of the season-opening six-game homestand before a crowd of 4,682 at Las Vegas Ballpark.

**Las Vegas offense:** The Reyes de Plata recorded 13 hits and rallied from a 6-1 deficit for the victory. Las Vegas scored nine unanswered runs to take a 10-6 lead after seven innings. Third baseman **Edwin Diaz** (1-for-4) broke the 6-6 tie with a three-run homer in the fifth inning. Right fielder **Chad Pinder** was 3-for-4, walk, solo homer, two runs scored and first baseman **Frank Schwindel** was 2-for-5, two doubles, 2 RBI, run scored.

**Sacramento offense:** The River Cats recorded 11 hits and built a 6-1 lead after 2 ½ innings. Catcher **Chadwick Tromp** was 2-for-3, walk, two-run homer and right fielder **Drew Robinson** was 2-for-3, walk, double, solo homer.

**Reno defeats Las Vegas 8-5 in series opener (Thursday, May 13):** The Aces defeated the Aviators 8-5 in the opener of the six-game road trip before a crowd of 3,889 at Greater Nevada Field.

**Las Vegas offense:** The Aviators recorded 5 hits a built a 5-0 lead after 3 ½ innings. First baseman **Frank Schwindel** was 2-for-4, run scored. Catcher **Francisco Pena** (1-for-4) hit a two-run homer in the second inning and designated hitter **Cody Thomas** (1-for-3) added a solo homer in the fourth inning. Shortstop **Chad Pinder**, ML rehab assignment, was 1-for-4, double, 2 RBI.

**Reno offense:** The Aces recorded 9 hits and rallied from a 5-0 deficit for the victory. **Reno defeats Las Vegas 10-7 for second straight victory in series (Friday, May 14):** The Aces defeated the Aviators 10-7 in game two of the six-game series before a crowd of 3,689 at Greater Nevada Field.

**Las Vegas offense:** The Aviators recorded 12 hits and built a 7-1 lead after 2 ½ innings. Designated hitter **Luis Barrera** was 2-for-5 with a three-run homer in the second inning. First baseman **Frank Schwindel** was 2-for-5, double, RBI, run scored; center fielder **Buddy Reed** was 2-for-2, walk, double, RBI, run scored and third baseman **Jacob Wilson** was 1-for-3, two walks, double, RBI, runs scored.

**Reno offense:** The Aces recorded 11 hits and rallied from a 7-1 deficit for the victory. First baseman **Seth Beer** (1-for-4) broke the 7-7 tie with a solo homer in the seventh inning. **Reno defeats Las Vegas 3-0 for third straight victory in series (Saturday, May 15):** The Aces defeated the Aviators 3-0 in game three of the six-game series before a crowd of 3,769 at Greater Nevada Field.

**Las Vegas offense:** The Aviators recorded 4 hits and were shutout for the first time this season. Designated hitter **Greg Deichmann** and center fielder **Skye Bolt** were each 1-for-3, walk. Shortstop **Pete Kozma** was 1-for-4 and third baseman **Edwin Diaz** was 1-for-3.

**Reno offense:** The Aces recorded 7 hits and scored solo runs in the second, fourth and fifth innings. Third baseman **Drew Ellis** was 2-for-3, double, run scored. Right fielder **Josh Reddick** was 1-for-3, walk, RBI and left fielder **Stuart Fairchild** (1-for-4) hit a solo homer in the fourth inning.

**AVIATORS INFLIGHT NEWS –** Las Vegas is 1-3 on the six-game Northern Nevada road trip...the series and the road trip against intrastate rival, the Reno Aces, Triple-A affiliate of the Arizona Diamondbacks, will conclude tomorrow afternoon...Las Vegas and Reno will face each other a total of 24 times during the regular season...following an off-day on Wednesday, May 19, the Aviators will return home to host a six-game homestand against the Salt Lake Bees, Triple-A affiliate of the Los Angeles Angels, from Thursday-Tuesday, May 20-25...*the 2021 season will feature six-game series against opponents from Thursday-Tuesday and off days on Wednesday...*the 2021 season will also feature 120 games (60-home; 60-away).

**SILVER STATE DIAMOND CHALLENGE:** In 2009, Las Vegas and Reno developed the **Silver State Diamond Challenge** and the “**Silver Plate Trophy**” to add to the excitement to the rivalry for the two PCL teams that represent the state of Nevada...Reno defeated Las Vegas, 3-games-to-1, in the 2015 PCL Conference Championship Series. **The 2021 campaign will mark the 12th season of the S.S.D.C.**

**38 SEASONS IN THE SILVER STATE** – The Aviators are playing in their 39<sup>th</sup> Triple-A professional baseball season in the Silver State (formerly the Pacific Coast League, 1903-2020) and currently as a member of Triple-A West...the Las Vegas Aviators have the proud distinction of being the longest enduring franchise in the history of professional sports in the state of Nevada...Las Vegas Triple-A baseball was born on April 10, 1983 before a sellout crowd of 10,622 at Cashman Field (Las Vegas defeated Salt Lake City, 11-8).

**TRIPLE-A WEST:** Formerly the Pacific Coast League (118 years, 1903-2020)...Triple-A West will consist of two divisions for a total of 10 teams. **Western Division:** Las Vegas Aviators, Reno Aces, Sacramento River Cats, Salt Lake Bees, Tacoma Rainiers; **Eastern Division:** Albuquerque Isotopes, El Paso Chihuahuas, Oklahoma City Dodgers, Round Rock Express, Sugar Land Skeeters.

**TRIPLE-A EAST:** It will consist of three divisions for a total of 20 teams. **Midwest Division:** Columbus Clippers, Indianapolis Indians, Iowa Cubs, Louisville Bats, Omaha Storm Chasers, St. Paul Saints, Toledo Mud Hens. **Northeast Division:** Buffalo Bisons, Lehigh Valley IronPigs, Rochester Red Wings, Scranton/Wilkes-Barre RailRiders, Syracuse Mets, Worcester Red Sox. **Southeast Division:** Charlotte Knights, Durham Bulls, Gwinnett Stripers, Jacksonville Jumbo Shrimp, Memphis Redbirds, Nashville Sounds, Norfolk Tides.

**2020 SEASON – JUNE 30:** Major League Baseball™ (MLB™) informed Minor League Baseball™ (MiLB™) that it will not be providing its affiliated Minor League teams with players for the 2020 season due to the COVID-19 pandemic...as a result, the Minor League Baseball season was canceled for the first time in its history...Minor League Baseball, which began as the National Association of Professional Baseball Leagues, was founded on Sept. 5, 1901...the 2021 season will mark the 39<sup>th</sup> “calendar season” of Las Vegas Triple-A professional baseball in the Silver State.

**2019 SEASON** – The Aviators compiled the second-best record in the 16-team Pacific Coast League at 83-57 (.593)...Round Rock Express had the best record in the PCL at 84-56 (.600)...Las Vegas tied a franchise record for most road wins in a season with 44 (2002 team was 44-28, .611)...Las Vegas clinched its first PCL Playoff berth since the 2014 season (Triple-A affiliate of the New York Mets)...Las Vegas lost to Sacramento, 3-games-to-2, in the League Championship Series...the River Cats captured the PCL and the Triple-A championships...Las Vegas recorded 250 home runs, breaking the previous mark of 184 (2001, 2004).

**LAS VEGAS 80-WIN SEASONS** – The Las Vegas franchise has won 80 or more games in a season six times: **85** (2002, franchise best 85-59 record (.590)); **83** (1983 inaugural season, 83-60 (.580)); **83** (83-57, .593 in 2019); **81** (81-63, .563 in 2013); **81** (81-63, .563 in 2014); **80** (1986 PCL champions with an 80-62 mark (.563))...Las Vegas recorded back-to-back 80-win seasons for the first time in franchise history (2013 & 2014)...the 83-57 record in 2019 marked a single-season franchise record for winning percentage at .593 (140-game season).

**LAS VEGAS BALLPARK HISTORY:** The Howard Hughes Corporation® (NYSE: HHC) announced on October 10, 2017 its plans to develop and construct a baseball stadium in Downtown Summerlin® on approximately eight acres just south of City National Arena, the National Hockey League practice facility for the Vegas Golden Knights. The announcement on October 10, followed a vote by the Las Vegas Convention and Visitors Authority Board of Directors approving a marketing partnership that gives **LVCVA** naming rights to the stadium. The Las Vegas Ballpark was designed by HOK, a global architecture firm with an expertise in stadium design and constructed by **HUNT/PENTA**.

The groundbreaking ceremony took place on Friday, February 23, 2018 before a crowd of several hundred people! The 8,834-fan-capacity stadium blends the distinct architectural style of the Summerlin® community with the aviation legacy of Howard Hughes. The ballpark will provide a wide range of seating options including 22 suites, club seats, berm seating, party zones and decks, picnic tables, kids' zone, bars and even a pool beyond the outfield wall.

Designed to create a festival-like atmosphere in Downtown Summerlin, the site will be landscaped to complement the master planned community. Parking is conveniently located on adjacent sites.

The grand opening took place on Tuesday, April 9, 2019 before a sellout crowd of 11,036 and the Aviators defeated Sacramento, 10-2.

**LAS VEGAS AVIATORS LOGO AND INFORMATION:** The Howard Hughes Corporation®, owner of the city's professional Triple-A baseball team of Triple-A West (formerly the Pacific Coast League, PCL), and developer of the Summerlin® master planned community and the Las Vegas Ballpark® located at Downtown Summerlin®, announced on December 8, 2018 the team's new name - the **Las Vegas Aviators®**.

The name change completed a rebrand that included the team's new two-year Player Development Contract (PDC) with the Oakland Athletics (2018) and the opening of the Las Vegas Ballpark, the state-of-the-art Triple-A baseball stadium, that now serves as the home of the Aviators.

The name change (from 51s) pays homage to the company's namesake, **Howard R. Hughes, Jr.**, one of the twentieth century's most successful businessmen whose passion for aviation and legacy of innovation includes significant aviation-related firsts and accomplishments. In the H-1 Racer, a plane he designed and built, Hughes set the land speed record of 352 miles per hour in 1935. Hughes went on to set other records, including the fastest coast-to-coast flight in 1937 and the fastest circumnavigation of the globe in 1938, then acquiring and successfully operating major airlines and aviation companies.

#### **AVIATORS LOGO DESIGN AND CONCEPT:**

The color inspiration: the Las Vegas Sunset; the mountain range featured in the Aviators' sunglasses resemble the mountain range found in the Summerlin logo!

**Nevada's High-Flying Aviators (from UNLV News)** - Nevada has a rich history in Aviation; with 500 miles between the state's two largest cities (Reno and Las Vegas), aviation was ideal for Nevada.

**Aviation History in Las Vegas (from McCarran Airport)** - Aviation grew exponentially throughout the 1900s, bringing more and more travelers to our city.

**Individual Game Tickets** went on sale, Monday, May 3 through Ticketmaster ([www.ticketmaster.com](http://www.ticketmaster.com))...the individual game tickets will have an extremely limited availability for the 12 May home games (May 6-11 vs. Sacramento & May 20-25 vs. Salt Lake).

**Hospitality group areas**, including suites, party decks and the pool area in right-center field are available by calling the Aviators administrative offices at **(702) 943-7200**.

The Aviators will begin the 2021 season with reduced capacity at Las Vegas Ballpark in accordance with State and local COVID-19 guidelines...during the season, as capacity increases, ticket policies and procedures will change, and updates will be sent out at that time.

The week of April 26<sup>th</sup>, Aviators season ticket holders were offered a presale to select seats for the reduced capacity games in May...full season, half season and quarter season plans will be able to use their account credit as a ticket bank...these purchases will not require any additional payments...Aviators season ticket holders will log in to their Aviators

Account Manager at [www.aviatorslv.com/myaccount](http://www.aviatorslv.com/myaccount) to select their seats and games...each account will be allowed to purchase up to four tickets for each game based on availability.

VIP members, including Club seats, Home Plate Diamond, Sponsorship and Club Access accounts will be placed into a similar location to their season tickets...games will be added to your Aviators Account Manager and rotated to ensure each account holder has a chance to attend in a similar location...additional purchase options may be available for VIP members based on availability.

**Aviators on Radio in 2021: Russ Langer** will broadcast all 120 games on **Raider Nation Radio 920 AM** and on [www.aviatorslv.com](http://www.aviatorslv.com). Langer is in his 21<sup>st</sup> season behind the mike...he is a 10-time recipient of the Nevada Sportscaster of the Year award (2003, 2005, 2007, 2008, 2009, 2010, 2011, 2012, 2013, 2015) presented by the National Sportscasters and Sportswriters Association...also worked a total of 30 Montreal Expos games during the 2003 and 2004 seasons...in 2006, Langer was hired for additional major league duty by the Baltimore Orioles and broadcast 10 games on a fill-in basis during the course of the season...has also broadcast selected Los Angeles Dodgers Spring Training games in March of 2006 and in Arizona in March of 2008 and with the Toronto Blue Jays in 2009 and 2010 and Chicago White Sox in 2012-20...also broadcast the action for the 2016 Triple-A All-Star Game Radio Network from Charlotte, North Carolina...in 2020, Langer also completed his ninth season as the radio "play-by-play voice" for the UNLV Football team.

#### **ROBERT J. BLUM BROADCAST BOOTH AT LAS VEGAS BALLPARK:**

The "Aviators Home Radio Booth" was renamed the "**Robert J. Blum Broadcast Booth**" prior to the 2013 season at Cashman Field (and currently at Las Vegas Ballpark) to honor the then-51s Special Assistant to the General Manager... "The Blummer" passed away on July 22, 2012 at the age of 91...also served as the play-by-play voice for Stars/51<sup>s</sup> baseball in selected seasons from 1985-2005 & 2008-10...his company, Robert J. Blum Productions, also produced Las Vegas Triple-A professional baseball games broadcast on radio and television for several seasons.

**Aviators Manager Fran Riordan: \*\*\*2019 PCL Manager of the Year\*\*\*** ...was named the 25<sup>th</sup> manager (November 8, 2018) in the history of the Las Vegas franchise (1983 - present, 37 seasons). **Career Summary:** He has recorded 20 seasons overall in professional baseball and has been a member of the Oakland Athletics organization for the past six seasons (2015-20).

Riordan has compiled an overall managerial record over 21 seasons (**current**) of 1,029-987 (.510).

**2020:** Riordan was involved with the Athletics 60-man player pool alternate site located in San Jose, Calif.
