## INDY BITS

**ABOUT WEDNESDAY (G1):** In Game 1, St. Paul countered one Indianapolis run in the first inning with three of its own in the bottom half and never looked back. Four of the Saints five runs came courtesy of a pair of two-run homers by Mickey Gasper and Mike Ford against Thomas Harrington. Former Indian Brady Feigl blanked Indianapolis across the fifth and sixth innings to earn the win in his St. Paul debut. Nick Solak extended his hitting streak to 13 games with a pair of hits in the doubleheader opener before going hitless in Game 2 to conclude the team's highest streak of the season. The streak is also tied with former Indian Gilberto Celestino (Syracuse) for the longest among International League hitters this season.

**ABOUT WEDNESDAY (G2):** DJ Stewart and Abraham Gutierrez each homered to power the Indianapolis Indians to a 4-2 win in Game 2. With Ji Hwan Bae reaching on a walk, Stewart launched his third home run of the season in the first inning to put the Indians up by two early. Gutierrez followed with a solo shot of his own in the second inning to extend the lead, 3-0. The Saints manufactured one run in each of the second and third innings courtesy of Anthony Prato and Carson McCusker RBI singles, respectively, to cut the deficit to 3-2. Indianapolis extended its lead and capped the scoring in the sixth inning. Billy Cook drew a leadoff walk and subsequently stole second base. Gutierrez drove in his second run of the game with a single through the right side for late-inning insurance. Opener Ryder Ryan tossed 2.1 innings of two-run ball with Drake Fellows earning his second win in as many appearances with 3.0 scoreless frames and five strikeouts. Isaac Matson then retired all five batters he faced with three strikeouts for his first save on the campaign. Cory Lewis allowed the pair of early home runs en route to his first loss of the season, with the right-hander allowing six homers in his last 4.1 innings.

**HOMETOWN HOOSIER:** Matt Gorski was selected by Pittsburgh and made his MLB debut last night, going 1-for-4 with a home run in his first major league plate appearance. He became the first Pirate to homer in his MLB debut since Ke'Bryan Hayes in 2020 and the first Pirate to homer in his first career plate appearance since Starling Marte in 2012. Gorski clobbered the ball 115.2 mph and 434 feet. With that exit velocity, he tied Jake Burger's blast on July 17, 2021 with Chicago (AL) for the hardest-hit first career homer in the Statcast era (2015).

**SOLAK ECLIPSE:** Nick Solak extended his hitting streak to 13 games in the first contest of Wednesday's doubleheader, going 2-for-4 with a run scored. The streak ended after going hitless in Game 2, concluding a team-best run and tying Syracuse's Gilberto Celestino for the longest streak by an International League player this season. Solak hit .400 (20-for-50) with two doubles, three home runs, 11 RBI, four walks, 11 runs, three stolen bases and a 1.056 OPS in this span. He struck out just seven times across 55 plate appearances during the hitting streak. In last week's six-game series vs. Toledo, Solak hit .526 (10-for-19) with one double, one home run, seven RBI, three walks, three stolen bases and five runs against just two strikeouts.

**BAEWATCH:** Ji Hwan Bae went 1-for-5 with three walks, one run and one stolen base across Wednesday's doubleheader. He reached base in both games to extend his on-base streak to nine games, the team's longest active run. He is hitting .278 (10-for-36) with two doubles, seven walks, 10 runs and five stolen bases in this span. He has tallied a stolen base in five of his last six games, including a four-game streak from April 17-22, marking his first time stringing four straight games with a steal since July 8-14, 2021, with Altoona. Bae has one-plus hit in six of his past eight games and has a pair of three-hit performances in his past six contests.

**HONEST ABE:** Abraham Gutierrez powered the Indians to a Game 2 victory, driving in a pair of runs with a solo homer in the second inning and RBI single for insurance in the sixth frame. In nine games with Indy this season, Gutierrez is hitting .333 (9-for-27) with one home run, four RBI and an .801 OPS. He has four multi-hit performances on the campaign. The catcher has posted multiple hits and multiple RBI in two of his past three games.

**PEGGY PROWESS:** Liover Peguero extended his on-base streak to six games on Wednesday, drawing a walk in Game 1 and going 1-for-3 in Game 2. He is hitting .350 (7-for-20) with one double, one triple, one home run, five RBI, three walks, three runs and one stolen base in this span. He has one-plus hit in 15 of 19 games this season, including 13 of his past 15, and multi-hit performances in six of his past 12 contests. Leading the team in hits, Peguero is batting .314 (22-for-70) with five doubles, one triple, one home run, 10 RBI, seven walks, 10 runs and three stolen bases on the campaign.

**HOLDY ON REHAB:** Pirates right-hander Colin Holderman continued his rehab assignment on Tuesday, allowing one run across 0.2 innings. He began the assignment on Saturday, tossing a scoreless seventh inning en route to the Indians fourth straight win. Holderman was placed on the 15-day injured list on April 6 with a right knee strain. In 13 career games with Indianapolis, he is 0-0 with a 5.11 ERA (7er/12.1ip) with 11 hits, four walks, two hit batters and 15 strikeouts. Opponents are hitting .239 (11-for-46) against him in this span. He began the season on Pittsburgh's Opening Day roster, going 0-0 with a 9.64 ERA (5er/4.2ip), four walks and six strikeouts in five games. He has appeared in 127 games for Pittsburgh since 2022, going 4-9 with a 4.04 ERA (55er/122.2ip), 112 hits, 56 walks and 126 strikeouts.

**TONIGHT'S MATCHUPS:** The Indianapolis Indians continue this week's rain-shortened seven-game series with the series' second doubleheader taking place tonight. Game 1 is scheduled for 6:00 PM and Game 2 is set to begin about 30 minutes after the end of the first contest. Taking the mound for the Indians in Game 1 is Pirates top prospect Bubba Chandler. In 11 career starts with Indianapolis, Chandler is 4-0 with a 1.81 ERA (11er/54.2ip) and 77 strikeouts. He has struck out eight-plus batters in five of those starts and six-plus in eight. Chandler is 0-0 with a 1.59 ERA (2er/11.1ip) in two career starts against the Saints. He most recently faced the squad in his final start of 2024, tossing 5.1 innings of two-run ball with seven hits, two walks and eight strikeouts. Opposite Chandler is right-hander Marco Raya. Despite a 2.18 WHIP and .375 opponent average (12-for-32) this season, Raya has allowed just one run across three games and 7.1 innings. In his lone appearance with the Saints last season, Raya tossed 5.0 shutout innings against the Indians on September 20, marking his only career game against the club. In Game 2, Left-hander Nick Dombkowski is set to make his first start of the season with Indianapolis. He appeared in five games with Altoona to begin the campaign, posting a 2.45 ERA (3er/11.0ip) with 10 strikeouts. In 15 career games (five starts) with Indy, Dombkowski is 2-3 with a 5.45 ERA (22er/36.1ip). He made one career appearance against St. Paul on April 19, 2024, allowing one run across 4.0 innings. Throwing for the Saints is right-hander Darren McCaughan. He has not allowed a run in two appearances across 7.0 innings this season. He earned the win in his lone career start against Indy on June 7, 2024, with Columbus, tossing 5.2 innings of two-run ball with 10 strikeouts.

**ON THIS DATE IN 2015:** Designated hitter Tony Sanchez and third baseman Steve Lombardozzi combined to drive in eight of Indy's nine runs to lead the team to a 9-3 win at Fifth Third Field in Toledo. Sanchez went 3-for-5 with a pair of doubles and drove in five RBI, tying a career high for the third time. Lombardozzi had a game-high four hits, two of which were doubles, to raise his average to .392 to start the season. Sanchez would end the season tied with Elias Diaz and Brent Morel with a team-leading 47 RBI.
