**SMALL BALL FALL:** One game after their most powerful series of the year (season-high 13 HR in 6 games vs. POR) the Somerset Patriots used a small ball barrage to win their first playoff game as members of the Yankees organization by a score of 9-4 in Portland on Tuesday night. Despite leading the Eastern League with 205 HR during the 2022 season, on Tuesday the Patriots scored their nine runs on 12 hits, which were all singles, in addition to five walks and two errors by the Sea Dogs. After falling behind 3-0 on a set of back-to-back home runs, the Patriots pieced together a 13-batter, 8-run fourth inning to win game one. It was the Patriots' 7th game this season without an extra-base hit and their 12

hits without an extra-base hit were their most in a game this season (previously 7 on 7/30).

POWER VS. PORTLAND: Over the Patriots' last two series vs. the Sea Dogs, they have swatted a total of 25 HR. Somerset's 46 HR vs. the Sea Dogs this season are more than they've hit against any other Eastern League team and make up for 22.4% of the team's total HR this season.

**TOP OF THE HEAP:** The Somerset Patriots finished the 2022 regular season 83-53, marking the 4th-best record in all of MiLB. The Patriots led all of Double-A baseball in ERA (3.60, 3rd in MiLB), WHIP (1.17, 1st), BAA (.218, 1st), HR (205, T-3rd) and SB (205, 11th).

#### **TONIGHT'S PATRIOTS STARTER**



#### **RHP #18 CLAYTON BEETER**

CAREER: (0-9, 4.11 ERA, 129.1 IP, 207 K, 1.31 WHIP)

PITCH SELECTION: Fastball (93-96), Curveball (mid-80s)

- Beeter identifies himself as a power pitcher, who pitches almost exclusively with his fastball and curveball. His fastball sits 93-95 and tops out at 98 with ride through the top of the strike zone, while his curveball is a high-spin, top-to-bottom offering in the mid 80s that drops below the zone to induce most of his swings and misses. Beeter also very rarely utilizes a low-80s changeup with some sink and fade and used to throw a mid-80s slider that he stopped implementing when he was with the Dodgers.

- Beeter was acquired by the Yankees from the Dodgers hours before the 2022 MLB trade deadline on August 2. At the time of the trade, Beeter was ranked the Dodgers' No. 15 prospect per MLB Pipeline and No. 21 by Baseball America, which credited him with having the Best Curveball in the Dodgers MiLB system. Growing up in Fort Worth, TX, Beeter was a Texas Rangers fan, who grew up watching Joey Gallo. Upon being traded to the Yankees, he was ranked MLB Pipeline's No. 10

Yankees prospect and Baseball America's No. 16 Yankees prospect.

- Beeter made his pro debut in 2021 and posted a 3.44 ERA between High-A Great Lakes and Double-A Tulsa, but he mostly worked as an opener, throwing no more than 3.1 innings in an outing.

- Initially drafted by the Dodgers in Competitive Balance Round-B of the 2020 MLB Draft (pick 66 overall), Beeter signed for an over-slot amount of \$1,196,500. He was drafted out of Texas Tech, where he redshirted his freshman year. In his redshirt freshman year as the Red Raiders' closer in 2019, Beeter led Texas Tech to be 2019 College World Series semifinalists behind 21 appearances with an 0-3 record, 3.48 ERA, 8 saves and 40 K compared to 20 BB in 20.2 IP. During the Covid-shortened 2020 season, his redshirt-sophomore year, Beeter became Texas Tech's Friday night starter. In 4 GS, he went 2-1 with a 2.14 ERA and 33 K compared to 4 BB in 21.0 IP, before the season came to an end.

- Attending Birdville High School in Colleyville, Texas, Beeter had Tommy John surgery in high school during December of 2017, as well as a follow-up arthroscopic elbow procedure seven months later. As a senior in high school, he earned first-team All-District honors with an ERA of 0.81 and 106 strikeouts in 55 innings pitched. At the plate, he had a batting average of .417 with two home runs. A two-sport athlete, Beeter also lettered in football three years during high school.

Somerset defeated Portland in the season series 13-11, hitting more home runs vs. the Sea Dogs (46) than any other team they faced in 2022 and outscoring the Sea Dogs 130-105 overall. After the Patriots took 5/6 in their initial home series vs. the Sea Dogs in April, the teams split their two series at Hadlock Field during the summer, before the Sea Dogs took 4/6 in Somerset to end the regular season.

## COACHING STAFF



### **DAN FIORITO** ★ MANAGER

Born and raised in Yonkers, NY, Dan Fiorito enters his sixth season with the Yankees organization and his first as Somerset's manager. Fiorito is also the Yankees' Roving Upper Level IF/OF Instructor. He served as the manager of High-A Hudson Valley in 2021, after making his managerial debut in 2019 with the GCL Yankees East. Fiorito also had been slated to manage the Yankees' former short-season Single-A affiliate, Staten Island in 2020,

before the minor league season was canceled due to the COVID-19 pandemic. He served as the defensive coach at the Yankees' former Single-A Charleston affiliate in 2018, after making his professional coaching debut as defensive coach with the Yankees' former Rookie-level Pulaski affiliate in 2017.

His playing career began when he was signed by the Yankees as a non-drafted free agent in 2012. Over four seasons as an infielder in the Yankees system, he batted .240 (264-for-1102) with 107 runs, 52 doubles, six triples, seven home runs and 98 RBI in 322 career minor league games. Fiorito played three years at Manhattanville College (Purchase, NY) and is a 2008 graduate of Fordham Prep (Bronx, NY).



#### **GERARDO CASADIEGO** ★ PITCHING COACH

Gerardo Casadiego will begin his first season in Somerset and 10th in the Yankees organization. He held the same position in Hudson Valley last season, where the Renegade staff ranked second in the High-A East division in strikeouts (1,308, sixth in MiLB) and third in ERA (4.12). The Venezuela native has also previously served as the pitching coach for former Rookie-level Pulaski (2017-2019), DSL Yankees 1 (2014-2015) and DSL Yankees 2 (2016).

#### **JAKE HIRST** ★ HITTING COACH

Jacob Hirst will serve as hitting coach in his first season with Somerset and fourth with the Yankees organization. He was the hitting coach for Hudson Valley in 2021, when the Renegades' batters ranked second among High-A East clubs in triples (33) and OBP (.341), third in doubles (217) and fourth in home runs (156), batting average (.255), slugging percentage (.446) and OPS (.787). The Iowa native served the same role with the GCL Yankees West (2019-2020).



#### **AARON BOSSI** ★ DEFENSIVE COACH

Aaron Bossi begins his first season with Somerset after making his coaching debut in the same role with Hudson Valley in 2021. His prior experience for the organization was assisting rehabbing players at the minor league complex from 2017-2019. The St. Louis, MO native was signed as a non-drafted free agent by the Yankees on June 24, 2016 as a catcher/infielder. He played in 22 games for the GCL Yankees East in 2016.

- This season, on the final day before the All-Star break, Rosario hit for the cycle on 7/17 @POR in his former 2021 home ballpark, Hadlock Field. It was the first time in Rosario's career having hit for the cycle, making him the first Patriot in the Yankees era to have accomplished the feat and the first Patriot overall since Kyle Roller did so in 2017, when the Somerset Patriots were still in the Atlantic League.
- During March of 2022, Rosario was claimed off waivers by the Yankees from the Red Sox and optioned directly to Somerset.
- In his lone full season as a member of the Red Sox organization, Rosario spent all of 2021 playing in the Double-A Northeast for the Portland Seadogs (98 games), where he hit .232 with 48 R, 36 RBI and 11 SB. Against Somerset, he was 2-for-18 (.125). Rosario was ranked by Baseball America as the "Best Defensive Outfielder" in the Red Sox system.
- Rosario spent the first three seasons (2017-19) of his career with the Padres organization, after signing as an international free agent on 7/2/16 for \$1.85 million. He was traded by the Padres to the Red Sox on 8/30/20 in a package for Mitch Moreland. Rosario was ranked by Baseball America as the "Best Athlete" in Padres farm system in both 2018 and 2019. His favorite MLB player of all-time is Carlos Gomez.

- Sweeney began this season with 100 games as the everyday shortstop for High-A Hudson Valley. On Opening Day, April 8th, Sweeney hit the first pitch of the year for a home run off Greenville (now Portland) RHP Brian Van Belle. Spent one week in the 7-day IL from 4/19 - 4/26. Prior to being promoted to Somerset on September 6, he had slashed .241/.350/.415 (.765 OPS) with 14 HR, 51 RBI, 70 R, 59 BB and 29 SB.
- Made his pro debut in three games with the FCL Yankees to begin 2021. After going 3-for-5, with a HR and 3 BB, he was promoted to Single-A Tampa, where he spent the remainder of the season. Across 29 games, Sweeney slashed .245/.347/.518 (.875 OPS) with 6 HR, 23 RBI and 26 R.
- Sweeney was drafted by the Yankees with the 20th overall pick (first round) of the 2021 MLB Draft out of Eastern Illinois University, signing for \$3 million as one of three first rounders in EIU history. Eligible to be drafted after the 2021 NCAA season, Sweeney started 48 games at shortstop and hit .382 with 14 HR, 52 R and a .712 SLG. He struck out only 24 times, compared to 65 hits. He ranked seventh in the nation in on-base percentage (.522), ninth in walks (46) and 13th in RBI (58). He was named a first team All-American by Baseball America, Perfect Game and ABCA becoming the first player in EIU program history to earn first team All-American honors at the NCAA Division I level. His

46 walks (including 11 intentional) set a single season school record. He played in 14 games during the Covid-shortened 2020 season and hit .351. During his freshman season in 2019, he appeared in 55 games, hitting .266. - Sweeney was undrafted out of St. Xavier High School in Louisville and EIU was the only college to offer him a scholarship. At St. Xavier, he hit .389 as a senior

with 41 RBI and 18 SB and led the team to Kentucky State Baseball Championship as a senior.

After an injury that landed him on the IL in May, Wells returned to playing with Single-A Tampa from 6/25-7/4, spending eight games with the Tarpons and hitting .231 with a .950 OPS and two home runs. In total, prior to joining the Patriots on 7/6, Wells had played in 37 games, hitting .304/.425/.568/.993 with 8 HR, 22 RBI and 26 R. Defensively, Wells caught 17/49 attempted base stealers (34.7%) to begin this year, committing no errors in 283 total chances.
- Following the 2021 MiLB season, Wells played for the Surprise Saguaros of the Arizona Fall League alongside fellow Patriots, Elijah Dunham, Andres Chaparro and Tanner Myatt. Playing in 18 games during the fall, Wells ranked 6th in the AFL with a 1.034 OPS, adding 2 HR and 14 R. His 18 RBI were tied for the most of any catcher in the AFL.
