SMALL BALL FALL: One game after their most powerful series of the year (season-high 13 HR in 6 games vs. POR) the Somerset Patriots used a small ball barrage to win their first playoff game as members of the Yankees organization by a score of 9-4 in Portland on Tuesday night. Despite leading the Eastern League with 205 HR during the 2022 season, on Tuesday the Patriots scored their nine runs on 12 hits, which were all singles, in addition to five walks and two errors by the Sea Dogs. After falling behind 3-0 on a set of back-to-back home runs, the Patriots pieced together a 13-batter, 8-run fourth inning to win game one. It was the Patriots' 7th game this season without an extra-base hit and their 12 hits without an extra-base hit were their most in a game this season (previously 7 on 7/30).

DUNHAM AND DASH: As part of Somerset's 9-4 victory in Portland on Tuesday night, Elijah Dunham went 4-for-5, marking his second 4-hit games of the season. His last 4-hit game was also in Portland, on his 24th birthday (5/29).

POWER VS. PORTLAND: Over the Patriots' last two series vs. the Sea Dogs, they have swatted a total of 25 HR. Somerset's 46 HR vs. the Sea Dogs this season are more than they've hit against any other Eastern League team and make up for 22.4% of the team's total HR this season.

TOP OF THE HEAP: The Somerset Patriots finished the 2022 regular season 83-53, marking the 4th-best record in all of MiLB. The Patriots led all of Double-A baseball in ERA (3.60, 3rd in MiLB), WHIP (1.17, 1st), BAA (.218, 1st), HR (205, T-3rd) and SB (205, 11th).

RHP #18 CLAYTON BEETER

CAREER: (0-9, 4.11 ERA, 129.1 IP, 207 K, 1.31 WHIP)

PITCH SELECTION: Fastball (93-96), Curveball (mid-80s)

- Beeter identifies himself as a power pitcher, who pitches almost exclusively with his fastball and curveball. His fastball sits 93-95 and tops out at 98 with ride through the top of the strike zone, while his curveball is a high-spin, top-to-bottom offering in the mid 80s that drops below the zone to induce most of his swings and misses. Beeter also very rarely utilizes a low-80s changeup with some sink and fade and used to throw a mid-80s slider that he stopped implementing when he was with the Dodgers.

- Beeter was acquired by the Yankees from the Dodgers hours before the 2022 MLB trade deadline on August 2. At the time of the trade, Beeter was ranked the Dodgers' No. 15 prospect per MLB Pipeline and No. 21 by Baseball America, which credited him with having the Best Curveball in the Dodgers MiLB system. Growing up in Fort Worth, TX, Beeter was a Texas Rangers fan, who grew up watching Joey Gallo. Upon being traded to the Yankees, he was ranked MLB Pipeline's No. 10 Yankees prospect and Baseball America's No. 16 Yankees prospect.

- Beeter made his pro debut in 2021 and posted a 3.44 ERA between High-A Great Lakes and Double-A Tulsa, but he mostly worked as an opener, throwing no more than 3.1 innings in an outing.

- Initially drafted by the Dodgers in Competitive Balance Round-B of the 2020 MLB Draft (pick 66 overall), Beeter signed for an over-slot amount of \$1,196,500. He was drafted out of Texas Tech, where he redshirted his freshman year. In his redshirt freshman year as the Red Raiders' closer in 2019, Beeter led Texas Tech to be 2019 College World Series semifinalists behind 21 appearances with an 0-3 record, 3.48 ERA, 8 saves and 40 K compared to 20 BB in 20.2 IP. During the Covid-shortened 2020 season, his redshirt-sophomore year, Beeter became Texas Tech's Friday night starter. In 4 GS, he went 2-1 with a 2.14 ERA and 33 K compared to 4 BB in 21.0 IP, before the season came to an end.

- Attending Birdville High School in Colleyville, Texas, Beeter had Tommy John surgery in high school during December of 2017, as well as a follow-up arthroscopic elbow procedure seven months later. As a senior in high school, he earned first-team All-District honors with an ERA of 0.81 and 106 strikeouts in 55 innings pitched. At the plate, he had a batting average of .417 with two home runs. A two-sport athlete, Beeter also lettered in football three years during high school.

The Somerset Patriots' first playoff series as the Yankees' Double-A affiliate takes place against the rival Red Sox' Double-A affiliated Portland Sea Dogs. 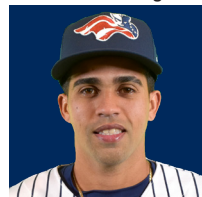

- Dominguez earned his third promotion of the 2022 season on September 13, when he was transferred from High-A Hudson Valley to Somerset following the end of the South Atlantic League season. In his final week with Hudson Valley, Dominguez earned his first career Player of the Week honors. In his final High-A game, Dominguez homered from both sides of the plate for the Renegades, the first multi-HR game of his professional career, coming in his 171st career game.

- Began the 2022 season with Single-A Tampa, playing the bulk of his season (75 games) while slashing .265/.363/.440 with 9 HR, 36 RBI and 54 R, en route to a promotion to Hudson Valley. In 40 games at High-A, Dominguez slashed .306/.397/.510 with 6 HR, 22 RBI and 33 R.

Jasson's father, Felix, was an avid Yankees fan and named Jasson after former Yankees first baseman Jason Giambi.

- This season, during the week of August 8-14, Dunham was awarded Eastern League Player of the Week honors for the first time in his career. In Somerset's series against Hartford, he went 9-for-20, leading the league in BA (.450), OBP (.500), SLG (.800) and OPS (1.300), tying for first in hits (9) and RBI (7). Dunham also extended a career-long hit streak to 12 games by homering in back-to-back games to round out the weekend, including a grand slam.

Dunham was originally drafted in the 40th round of the 2019 MLB Draft by the Pirates and he elected to go back to school at Indiana.

- Collegiately, played two full seasons at Indiana, plus 2020. In his last full season as a sophomore in 2019, he led the team in batting (.310) and OBP (.434) en route to being named Third-Team All-Big Ten after 43 games. He began his junior season in 2020 hitting .390/.493/.559 in 15 games with 11 walks. His seven doubles and .493 OBP led the Hoosiers. He earned Big Ten Player of the Week honors for the week of 2/24/20, before the remainder of the season was cancelled.

- Attended Reitz High School in Evansville, where he hit .386 his senior year with a .541 OBP and 26 stolen bases. Three-sport athlete lettered in baseball, basketball and football. Prior to being promoted to Somerset on September 6, he had slashed .241/.350/.415 (.765 OPS) with 14 HR, 51 RBI, 70 R, 59 BB and 29 SB.

- Made his pro debut in three games with the FCL Yankees to begin 2021. After going 3-for-5, with a HR and 3 BB, he was promoted to Single-A Tampa, where he spent the remainder of the season. Across 29 games, Sweeney slashed .245/.347/.518 (.875 OPS) with 6 HR, 23 RBI and 26 R.

- Sweeney was drafted by the Yankees with the 20th overall pick (first round) of the 2021 MLB Draft out of Eastern Illinois University, signing for \$3 million as one of three first rounders in EIU history. Eligible to be drafted after the 2021 NCAA season, Sweeney started 48 games at shortstop and hit .382 with 14 HR, 52 R and a .712 SLG. He struck out only 24 times, compared to 65 hits. He ranked seventh in the nation in on-base percentage (.522), ninth in walks (46) and 13th in RBI (58). He was named a first team All-American by Baseball America, Perfect Game and ABCA becoming the first player in EIU program history to earn first team All-American honors at the NCAA Division I level. His 46 walks (including 11 intentional) set a single season school record. He played in 14 games during the Covid-shortened 2020 season and hit .351. During his freshman season in 2019, he appeared in 55 games, hitting .266.

- Sweeney was undrafted out of St. Xavier High School in Louisville and EIU was the only college to offer him a scholarship. At St. Xavier, he hit .389 as a senior with 41 RBI and 18 SB and led the team to Kentucky State Baseball Championship as a senior.

Wagaman's .754 OPS with Hudson Valley at the time of his promotion to Somerset was the highest mark he has achieved in his professional career.

- Split 2021 between Single-A Tampa (31 games) and High-A Hudson Valley (47 games), combining to hit .220 with 34 RBI, 31 runs scored and six home runs.
- In 2019, spent the majority of the year in Low-A Charleston (82 games), adding another six games in the GCL. He hit .233 with 41 RBI, 25 R and a career-high 7 HR.
- Played all of 2018 with Short-season Staten Island, hitting .194 with 19 R, 18 RBI and 5 HR.
- Wagaman made his professional debut in 2017 with Rookie-level Pulaski. He played in 59 games, hitting a career-best .264, adding 29 RBI and 23 runs scored.
- Collegiately, he had originally committed to play at Chico State, before winding up at Orange Coast College, where he finished fifth in the state with 14 home runs, slugged .636 as a sophomore. Attended Aliso Niguel High School and reached the 2014 CIF-Southern Section Division II Championship Game. Initially selected by the Yankees in the 13th round of the 2017 MLB Draft.

- Began the 2022 season by playing 28 games for High-A Hudson Valley, where he slashed .323/.429/.576/1.005 with 6 HR, 16 RBI and 21 R. After an injury that landed him on the IL in May, Wells returned to playing with Single-A Tampa from 6/25-7/4, spending eight games with the Tarpons and hitting .231 with a .950 OPS and two home runs. In total, prior to joining the Patriots on 7/6, Wells had played in 37 games, hitting .304/.425/.568/.993 with 8 HR, 22 RBI and 26 R. Defensively, Wells caught 17/49 attempted base stealers (34.7%) to begin this year, committing no errors in 283 total chances.

- Following the 2021 MiLB season, Wells played for the Surprise Saguaros of the Arizona Fall League alongside fellow Patriots, Elijah Dunham, Andres Chaparro and Tanner Myatt. Playing in 18 games during the fall, Wells ranked 6th in the AFL with a 1.034 OPS, adding 2 HR and 14 R. His 18 RBI were tied for the most of any catcher in the AFL. For his efforts, he was named an AFL Rising Star.

- In Wells' pro debut season during 2021, he combined to hit .264/.390/.476 in 103 games with OPS of .886, 16 HR, 76 RBI and 82 R between Single-A Tampa (65 games) and High-A Hudson Valley (38 games), where he was promoted to on 8/3.

- Collegiately, Wells spent two seasons with the University of Arizona Wildcats, playing in 71 games and hitting .357 with a 1.036 OPS with 7 HR, 74 RBI and 85 R. Among his honors while at Arizona, Wells was first named Pac-12 Freshman of the Year in 2019, when he was also a Freshman All-American honoree per Collegiate Baseball, Baseball America, NCBWA and Rawlings. In 2020, Wells was a Collegiate Baseball Second-team All-American and was named to the Buster Posey National Collegiate Catcher of the Year Award watch list (top NCAA catcher). Both of Wells' parents, Greg and Michelle, were graduates and former athletes at the University of Arizona as well.

- During the summer of 2019, Wells played in the Cape Cod League with the Yarmouth-Dennis Red Sox. In 42 regular season games, where he was named a Cap Cod League All-Star starter, after hitting .308 with 7 HR, 26 RBI and 23 R. Wells was named a 2019 Cape Cod League Outstanding Pro Prospect.

- Wells spent his preps career at powerhouse Bishop Gorman High School in his hometown of Las Vegas, combining to hit .428 with 87 RBI and 85 during his preps career. He was named team captain and Most Valuable Player as a junior and senior. As a junior, Wells was the 2017 Nevada Gatorade Player of the Year. Upon graduating high school, Wells was originally selected by the Yankees in the 35th round of the 2018 MLB Draft. After electing to play college ball at Arizona, the Yankees selected him again in the first round of the draft two years later, 28th overall. Wells is currently living at the Volpe household, alongside teammates Max Burt and formerly Anthony Volpe and Blake Perkins.
