Thursday: RubberDucks 5, Fightin Phils 3: Alex Royalty pitched six innings of one-run ball, giving Akron its second six-inning start of the series, to earn his first Double-A victory. **Andrew Monasterio** led the offense with a 3-for-5 night, posting two doubles and three RBI.

Birthday trio: Three RubberDucks have birthdays on Friday, May 21 – left-hander **Eli Lingos** (25), catcher **Josh Rolette** (25), and infielder **Tyler Freeman** (22).

Finding his stride: **Tyler Freeman** had his first career five-hit game on Saturday and has a team-season-best nine-game hitting streak, while also reaching base in all 11 games he has played this season. His 16 hits are tied for sixth, and his .348 batting average ranks seventh in the Double-A Northeast.

Heating up in a hurry: Infielder **Andrew Monasterio** began the season with 14 hitless at-bats, but he has six hits in his last 10 at-bats – including three-hit games May 14 and 20 – to raise his average to .250 (6-for-24). He has matched his total of three-hit games from 2019 (two in 70 Double-A games), and Thursday was his first three-RBI game since June 21, 2019.

Oscar on offense: Outfielder **Oscar Gonzalez** hit .188 with one home run and nine RBI in his first 29 career Double-A games for the RubberDucks in 2019. But he is leading the offense in 2021, with a team-high four home runs (tied for third in the Double-A Northeast) and 11 RBI (tied for ninth). He is 0-for-7 on the current homestand.

RubberDucks host Fightin Phils: The RubberDucks are playing the first of two scheduled series this season with the Reading Fightin Phils, with six games at Canal Park this week and six at FirstEnergy Stadium in Reading Aug. 10-15. In 2019, Reading won 7 of 13 meetings, including four of seven in Akron. According to MLB.com, top prospects in this series include:

Who played in 2020? With the 2020 minor league season canceled, **Tyler Freeman** and **Bo Naylor** participated in the alternate site for Cleveland last year. Left-hander **Joey Cantillo** was acquired in Cleveland's trade of **Mike Clevinger** to San Diego on Aug. 31, 2020, and was at the alternate site for the Padres and Indians last season. Outfielder **Will Benson** played for Team Texas in the independent Constellation Energy League in Sugar Land, Texas.

Home cooking: The RubberDucks won their first six home games and are 7-1 at Canal Park. In 2019, the RubberDucks were just 30-40 at home – their first losing record at Canal Park since 2014 (32-39).

SeaWolves slow down Ducks in Erie: After Akron ran its season-opening winning streak to six with a series-opening win on May 11, the Erie SeaWolves won three straight games and took four of six from Akron at UPMC Park May 11-16. Akron outscored Erie, 28-25, in the six games, but the first team to score was the team that won all six games. The RubberDucks were held scoreless for a stretch of 20 innings at one point, and lost two games in which they held a lead. In 50 innings, the pitching staff walked 26 batters (4.68 BB/9 IP, 12.1% walk rate) and struck out 68 (12.24 K/9 IP, 31.8% strikeout rate).

Prospects make Double-A debuts: The RubberDucks featured two of the Cleveland Indians' top prospects, according to MLB.com, when they opened the 2021 season at Canal Park on Tuesday. Shortstop **Tyler Freeman** (No. 2) and catcher **Bo Naylor** (No. 3) are making their Double-A debuts.

Alternate site 2021: Akron's roster includes six players who were at the Indians' alternate site in Columbus in April 2021: pitchers **Joey Cantillo**, **Nick Mikolajchak**, and **Tanner Tully**, catchers **Bo Naylor** and **Mike Rivera**, and infielder **Andrew Monasterio**.

A winning start: The last unbeaten team in Double-A in 2021, Akron started the season 6-0 for the first time since the franchise moved from Canton to Akron before the 1997 season. Akron started 0-6 in 2019. The six-game winning streak was the club's longest since a seven-game streak May 2-8, 2018.

First-rounders: In Naylor (drafted No. 29 overall in 2018) and Benson (No. 14 overall in 2016), the RubberDucks will feature two Indians first-round picks for the first time since 2016, when Clint Frazier (2013) and Bradley Zimmer (2014) teamed up in the outfield during the club's last Eastern League championship season in 2016.

Limited experience: Among the 27 RubberDucks entering Opening Day, only six have played as high as Double-A in their careers. All of those appeared for Akron in 2019. Alex Call (81 games) and Oscar González (29) are returning outfielders. 2019 RubberDuck Andrew Monasterio is the only returning infielder, although Trenton Brooks, a 2019 RubberDucks outfielder, will play first base. Ohio State alumnus **Tanner Tully**, the 2019 Akron innings leader (129.1) will be the most experienced member of a pitching staff that otherwise has a total of 10 Double-A innings, all by left-hander Eli Lingos when he made a start and relief appearance for Akron in 2019.

McCarthy went 4 2/3 scoreless innings, posting the first eight-strikeout game by a RubberDuck this season, as Akron tallied a season-high 16 strikeouts, snapping a three-game losing streak. He worked around two walks and a fourth-inning single. Left-hander Skylar Árias got the last out of the fifth inning but allowed an Erie run in the sixth. Left-hander Jake Miednik (who earned the win) and right-hander Nick Mikolajchak combined for scoreless relief through the eighth inning. Right-hander Juan Móta allowed a ninth-inning home run.

Notes

- Has been involved with Vs. Cancer for seven years and is currently teamed up with Lake County manager Greg DiCenzo on a fundraising campaign to advocate for children battling pediatric brain cancer. McCarthy and DiCenzo's Vs. Cancer Fundraising Page has raised over \$13,000, surpassing their \$10,000 goal in under a month. McCarthy has also shaved his head for the cause. DiCenzo is the National Co-Chair of the Vs. Cancer Baseball Ambassadors program. McCarthy has also pledged to donate \$3 per strikeout he records this season.
- Vs. Cancer was built by athletes for athletes, giving them the platform to raise money for childhood cancer. Founder Chase Jones experienced the childhood cancer world first-hand; in 2006, as an eighteen-year-old college freshman, he was diagnosed with a Stage IV brain tumor. As a baseball player at the University of North Carolina, his team rallied around him during treatment and began raising funds to support their local hospital. As a byproduct of community help and national research, Chase attests his status of ten years cancer-free to a combination of the two (<http://www.vs-cancer.org/about-us/>)
- Got engaged in November 2020... Shane and his now-fiancée adopted a yellow lab named Haven during the summer of 2020.

2019 Highlights

- Went a career-long 6.0 IP in back-to-back starts in a win against South Bend on April 18 (6 IP, 4 H, 1 ER, 1 BB, 4 K) and a no-decision against Dayton on April 24 (6 IP, 3 H, 2 ER, 2 BB, 4 K). Set a career-high with 10 strikeouts on Aug. 22 in a no-decision against Bowling Green (3.1 IP, 3 H, 2 ER, 10 K).
- McCarthy left his start on May 23 at Dayton and was placed on the Injured List. He made four rehab starts in the Arizona League before returning to the Captains for an Aug. 22 start. He went on to start the opening game of the Midwest League quarterfinals.

College Highlights

- Pitched the first perfect game in Seton Hall and Big East history during his sophomore year on April 15, 2016. He struck out eight and needed just 88 pitches (69 strikes) to pitch nine perfect frames against the LIU-Brooklyn Blackbirds.
- McCarthy finished his Seton Hall career ranking second in program history in career starts (50), fourth in innings pitched (300) and eighth in strikeouts (211).
- 2018 All-Big East 2nd Team, 2016 All-Big East 1st Team, 2016 ABCA All-Region 2nd Team, 2015 Freshman All-American
- McCarthy was drafted in the 18th round of the MLB Draft in back-to-back years. Following his junior season in 2017, the right-hander was selected by the St. Louis Cardinals in the 18th round (544th overall). The Indians then took McCarthy following his senior season in the 18th round (553rd overall).
- McCarthy put up his best numbers at Seton Hall during his freshman and sophomore years. He posted a 2.19 ERA his first year on campus and a 2.38 as a sophomore. In all, his sophomore year was his best with career-highs in strikeouts (84), innings (102), K/9 (7.41) and K-BB (4.67).
- McCarthy finished his four-year college career with a 1.91 BB/9 rate and a 3.30 K-BB. He exhibited better control as a sophomore with a career-high 4.67 K/BB ratio, made up of a career-high 7.41 K/9 rate and a 1.69 BB/9 rate that was his second-best season in that regard. McCarthy's K/BB dipped to 2.19 his junior year (46 K, 21 BB) and ticked back up his senior year to 3.25 (52 K, 16 BB).

2021 RUBBERDUCKS FIELD STAFF

#24 Rouglas Odor, Manager (Second Season) – Odor, 53, became the 18th manager in club history when he led the club in 2019. The RubberDucks posted a 61-79 record, good for fifth in the Eastern League Western Division following a 34-35 first half record. Odor has twelve seasons of managerial experience where he has compiled a career record of 422-442 (.488).

When Odor was Akron's hitting coach in 2014, he became the first person to wear the uniforms of the Canton-Akron Indians, Akron Aeros, and Akron RubberDucks. He played 197 games for Canton-Akron during the 1991, 1993-94 seasons, and he was the hitting coach for the Aeros' 2012 Eastern League Championship squad.

The 2021 season is Odor's 34th in the Cleveland organization as a player or coach (21st as a coach). The former shortstop was a 32nd-round draft pick by the Indians in 1988 and played in the minor leagues for the Indians from 1988-94 and for the Milwaukee Brewers organization in 1995. The 2019 season was Odor's first as a manager since 2008. He managed San Felipe in the Venezuelan Summer League (1999-2000), the Burlington Indians (2001-2004), the Mahoning Valley Scrappers (2005-2006), Gulf Coast League Indians (2007-2008). In 2009, Odor began serving as hitting coach for the Kinston Indians (2009-2010), Double-A Akron Aeros (2011-2012), High-A Carolina Mudcats (2013), Double-A Akron RubberDucks (2014), and Triple-A Columbus Clippers (2015-2017).

The Maracaibo, Venezuela, native resides in Winter Haven, Florida, with his wife, Milagros. He has three sons and is the uncle of Texas Rangers infielder Rougned Odor.

#35 Owen Dew, Pitching Coach (1st Season) — Owen Dew, 32, makes his first visit to Akron after serving as the pitching coach for the Lake County Captains in the Class-A Midwest league in 2019. Dew began his baseball journey as a right-handed pitcher for Seminole State College of Florida (2008-2009), before moving to the University of Central Florida in 2010, when he was drafted in the 21st round of the 2010 amateur draft by the Cleveland Indians. That same year, Dew advanced through Mahoning Valley with a strong 2.64 ERA in nine starts for the Scrappers. At Class-A Lake County, Dew was converted to a relief pitcher where he appeared in 15 games over the 2010 and 2011 seasons. In Dew's final season as a player, the right hander appeared in 34 games, accruing 70 innings and posted a 3.86 ERA with 41 strikeouts.

Since his playing career, Dew served as an assistant coach at Seminole State College of Florida while also assisting the Cleveland Indians as an associate scout from 2014-2017. Dew was then appointed as a full-time minor league pitching coach within the organization, making stops with the Mahoning Valley (2017), Arizona League Indians 2 (2018), and Lake County Captains (2019). The 2019 Lake County Captains pitching staff posted a team ERA of 3.73 over 1191 innings, good for eighth in the Midwest League.

#16 Junior Betances, Hitting Coach (First Season) — Betances, 47, hits Akron for the first time in his 21-year coaching career with the Cleveland Indians organization. After posting a .289 batting average over 165 games in 1998-1999 with the Akron Aeros, Betances joined the coaching ranks in various roles for the Cleveland Indians Dominican Summer League team from 2000-2010. Betances then served as Arizona League Indians coach from 2010-2015, and moved to Lake County in 2017 as the Bench coach for Manager Larry Day. The native of La Vega, Dominican Republic, Betances has developed a wealth of experience in various player development roles within the Indians organization.

#28 Mike Mergenthaler, Bench Coach (First Season) — Mergenthaler, 32, moves up the Indians farm system to Akron in 2021, following his 2019 season serving as the Lynchburg Hillcats bench coach for Manager Jim Pankovits. In 2018 and 2019, Mergenthaler worked as a hitting coach for the Cleveland Indians' and Milwaukee Brewers' joint Dominican Super League team. The Thiells, NY, native was drafted as a player in the 32nd round of the 2011 amateur draft by the San Francisco Giants, playing in their system for parts of 2011 and 2012.

Jake Legan, Athletic Trainer (First Season) — Legan heads to Akron for the first time in his six-year career with the Cleveland Indians. Legan previously served as the Lynchburg Hillcats' athletic trainer in 2019.

Scott Nealon, Strength and Conditioning Coach (Second Season, not consecutive) — Nealon enters his eighth season in the Cleveland Indians organization, returning to the same position he held in 2016 for the RubberDucks Eastern League Championship Series. Nealon was the Triple-A Columbus strength and conditioning coach the last three seasons (2017-2019), including the Clippers' 2019 Governor's Cup championship season. Previously, Nealon served as strength and conditioning coach for the Carolina Mudcats (2013-2014), Lynchburg Hillcats (2015), before he made his way to Double-A Akron. Nealon earned his master's degree in exercise science from Baldwin Wallace University in Berea, Ohio.

We Are the RubberDucks

On October 29, 2013, team owner **Ken Bobby** stood before a capacity audience at the Akron Civic Theater and announced that the team would be known henceforth as the **Akron RubberDucks**. In addition to being symbolic of the fun, family-friendly brand of entertainment offered by minor league baseball, the name also honors Akron's long history as the "**Rubber Capital of the World**." Brandiose Marketing of San Diego, California designed the team logo, colors, and various marks and insignias. Please note that for print coverage, *RubberDucks* is spelled as one word with a capital "D." In broadcast coverage, referring to the team as "*the Ducks*" is an acceptable variation of the team's nickname.
