ABOUT LAST NIGHT: [The Wisconsin Timber Rattlers defeated the Quad Cities River Bandits 2-1 in the conclusion of a game that was suspended on June 20.](#)

This game was shortened by rain to eight innings and the regularly scheduled seven-inning game was rained out.

FINISH WHAT YOU START: Victor Castañeda, who started the game on June 20, continued where he left off on that day. He allowed one run on three hits with two walks and seven strikeouts over seven innings. The game was Castañeda's third quality start of the season and the first complete game as a professional.

QUALITY IS JOB ONE: The quality start by Castañeda was the eleventh of the season for the Rattlers.

SCORING SUMMARY: Xavier Warren put Wisconsin up 1-0 with an RBI single in the third inning. Michael Massey tied the game with a two-out, RBI triple in bottom of the sixth. The Rattlers went back in the lead in the top of the seventh when Felix Valerio doubled and Carlos Rodríguez drove him in with a single.

V IS FOR VICTORY: Valerio has four doubles and three homers in seven games with Wisconsin for an OPS of 1.173.

DOUBLE TROUBLE: Tonight's twinbill is the sixth of the season for Wisconsin. The Rattlers are 9-1 in doubleheaders during 2021. They have won game one in their previous five doubleheaders this season.

ABOUT QUAD CITIES: The River Bandits are the High-A Central League affiliate of the Kansas City Royals. The current version of Davenport Professional Baseball club started in 1960 as the Midwest League affiliate of the Milwaukee Braves. Quad Cities has affiliated with several MLB teams over the years: The California Angels (1962-1978 and 1985-1992), the Chicago Cubs (1979-1984), the Houston Astros (1993-1998 and 2013-2019), the Minnesota Twins (1999-2004), and the St. Louis Cardinals (2005-2012). The team became the Quad City River Bandits in 1992. They changed their name to the Swing of the Quad Cities from 2004 through 2007 before changing to Quad Cities River Bandits in 2008. Quad Cities won Midwest League pennants in 1968, 1971, 1979, 1990, 2011, 2013, and 2017. Notable alumni of Quad Cities: Carlos Correa, Joe Mauer, Josh Hader, Lance Lynn, Carlos Martinez, Billy Wagner, Shawn Dunston, Justin Morneau, and Brett Phillips. Modern Woodmen Park, opened as Municipal Stadium on May 26, 1931. The stadium was renamed as John O'Donnell Stadium in 1971. The stadium was remodeled after the 2003 season and was renamed Modern Woodmen Park for the 2007.

ABOUT THE ROYALS: The Kansas City Royals return to what used of to be the Midwest League after leaving Kane County at the end of the 2012 season. They had previously been in the Midwest League with Waterloo from 1969-1976. Other Midwest League teams the Royals had as an affiliate: Appleton (1987-1992), Rockford (1993-94), Springfield (1995), Lansing (1996-1998), Burlington (2001-2010), and Kane County (2011-2012). The Royals had worked with Lexington in the South Atlantic League as the Low-A affiliate from 2013-2019. Wilmington had been the High-A affiliate of the Royals from 2007-2019.

PROSPECTING IN THE SERIES: [MLB Pipeline](#) puts six Rattlers on their list of Brewers Top 30 Prospects: Joe Gray Jr. (#9), Freddy Zamora (#11), Xavier Warren (#14), Carlos Rodríguez (#22), Joey Wiemer (#23), and Victor Castañeda (#30). [MLB Pipeline](#) has two current River Bandits on their Top 30 list of Kansas City Royals prospects: Nick Loftin (#11) and Will Klein (#28). Asa Lacy (#3), Noah Murdock (#18), and Tyler Gentry (#21) are on the Quad Cities IL.

WISCONSIN SCHEDULED STARTING PITCHER (GAME ONE):

LHP BRANDON KNARR: The Brewers signed Knarr as a non-drafted free agent out of the University of Tampa on July 17, 2020.

GOLDEN DOME: Knarr pitched at Notre Dame as a freshman and appeared in twelve games.

TO FLORIDA: Knarr spent his sophomore season at the College of Central Florida. He was 6-1 with 86 strikeouts and an ERA of 4.66 over 65-2/3 innings in sixteen games – thirteen starts.

TAMPA, TOO: Knarr transferred to the University of Tampa for the 2019-2020 season and was 4-1 with 64 strikeouts and a 2.55 ERA over 35-1/3 innings pitched in six starts before the shutdown.

IN THE MUD: Knarr started the 2021 season with the Carolina Mudcats. He was 7-2 with 103 strikeouts over 75 innings and an ERA of 3.84 in sixteen games – thirteen starts – before his promotion to Wisconsin on August 17.

LAST START: Knarr had a [no decision at Cedar Rapids on August 19](#) in his Timber Rattlers debut. He allowed four runs (three earned) on a hit with six walks and five strikeouts over 3-2/3 innings.

VS. QUAD CITIES: Knarr has never faced the Bandits prior to this evening. This is also the first time he will pitch against an affiliate of the Kansas City Royals.

WISCONSIN SCHEDULED STARTING PITCHER (GAME TWO):

RHP JOEY MATULOVICH: Selected by the Milwaukee Brewers in the 20th round of the 2018 draft out of the University of California, Berkeley.

A BEAR: Matulovich was 6-5 with a 3.79 ERA in 57 games – nineteen starts – over three seasons at Cal. He had 121 strikeouts over 163-2/3 innings pitched in his collegiate career. Matulovich was teammates with current Wisconsin reliever Arman Sabouri at Cal in 2017 and 2018.

ALL-STATE: Matulovich went 9-1 with 110 strikeouts as a senior at San Ramon Valley High School in Danville, California and was an All-State selection in 2015

I WOULD HAVE LIKE TO HAVE SEEN MONTANA: Matulovich began his professional career with the Helena Brewers in the Pioneer League in 2018. He was 3-2 with a 2.75 ERA in twelve games – two starts – for Helena. He walked fourteen and struck out 49 over 36 innings pitched.

IN 2019: Matulovich split time between the AZL Brewers Gold and the Timber Rattlers in 2019. He was 0-3 in eight games – six starts – in the AZL. Matulovich joined Wisconsin on August 1, 2019 and was 1-2 in nine relief appearances. He compiled a 5.57 ERA and 45 strikeouts over 32-1/3 innings in his two stops in the Brewers system in 2019.

MUDCAT: Matulovich started this season with the Carolina Mudcats in the Low-A East. He was 2-0 with a save in sixteen games – two starts – with 56 strikeouts and 21 walks in 40 innings.

LAST START: Matulovich had a no decision [at Cedar Rapids on August 17](#). He allowed two runs on five hits with three walks and two strikeouts in four innings. The game was tied 2-2 when Matulovich left the game. The Kernels would win the game 4-2 in ten innings.

VS. QUAD CITIES: Matulovich has not faced the River Bandits this season. He pitched twice against the River Bandits in 2019 as a reliever when Quad Cities was affiliated with the Houston Astros.

VS. KANSAS CITY AFFILIATES: Matulovich made two relief appearances against Idaho Falls, the Pioneer League affiliate of the Royals in 2018. He allowed three hits with three strikeouts over 4-1/3 scoreless innings.

QUAD CITIES STARTING PITCHER (GAME ONE):

RHP CHRISTIAN COSBY: The Royals selected Cosby in the 14th round of the 2018 draft out of Chapman University, an NCAA Division III school in California.

CALIFORNIA: Cosby pitched three seasons at Chapman. In his final year, he was 8-3 with a save in sixteen appearances – eleven starts. Cosby had an ERA of 2.91, walked 31, and struck out 56 in 65 innings pitched in his final season of college baseball.

WHY DOES THAT SOUND FAMILIAR? Chapman University reached the NCAA Division III College World Series ten times between 1995 and 2021. They won the title in 2003 and again in 2019. Current Milwaukee Brewers broadcaster Jeff Levering played at Chapman and was a member of the 2003 Championship team.

DOWN IN THE DESERT: Cosby went 2-0 with two saves and a 3.43 ERA in thirteen relief appearances for the Royals team in the Arizona League during 2018. He walked fourteen and struck out 42 in 39-1/3 innings.

WHAT'S A CHUKAR? Cosby was 1-1 with Idaho Falls in 2019. He made eleven appearances – one start – with a 4.75 ERA. Cosby walked thirteen and struck out 37 over 36 innings with the Chukars in the Pioneer League during that season.

STARTING IN THE SOUTH: Cosby began his 2021 season with Columbia in the Low-A East. He was 1-1 with a 2.45 ERA, six walks, and 23 strikeouts over 14-2/3 innings in five relief appearances before his promotion to Quad Cities.

LAST START: Cosby had a [no decision at South Bend on August 20](#). He struck out four over two scoreless innings before rain halted the game and forced a suspension.

VS. WISCONSIN: Cosby is 1-0 in two games – one start – against Wisconsin this season. He beat the [Timber Rattlers in a relief appearance at Modern Woodmen Park on June 15](#). Cosby had a no decision in a [start at Wisconsin on July 11](#). He has walked three, struck out nine, and allowed one hit over nine scoreless innings against Wisconsin this season.

QUAD CITIES STARTING PITCHER (GAME TWO):

LHP EMILIO MARQUEZ: The Royals signed Marquez as an International Free Agent on March 4, 2018 out of Venezuela.

LEVEL UP 2019: Marquez started 2019 in the Arizona League and was 5-1 with a 2.51 ERA in thirteen games - six starts - before a bump to Lexington in the South Atlantic League where he made one regular season relief appearance and ne save in one playoff appearance.

LEVEL UP 2021: Marquez started 2021 with Columbia in the Low-A East. He was 6-1 and a save with a 1.86 ERA in 20 games - five starts. Marquez walked sixteen and struck out 87 in 63 innings with the Fireflies before his promotion to Quad Cities this week.

LAST START: Marquez had a [no decision at Charleston on August 18](#). He allowed three runs on two walks and one hit with four strikeouts over four innings. The one hit he allowed was a three-run home run.

VS. WISCONSIN: Marquez never faced the Rattlers before tonight. The only time he has faced an affiliate of the Milwaukee Brewers was [on August 6 in a start against the Brewers Gold in the Arizona League](#). He allowed one run on three hits over five innings with no walks and two strikeouts in a no decision.
