On May 7, 1993, Rowdie made his first appearance on behalf of the Indianapolis Indians at Bush Stadium!

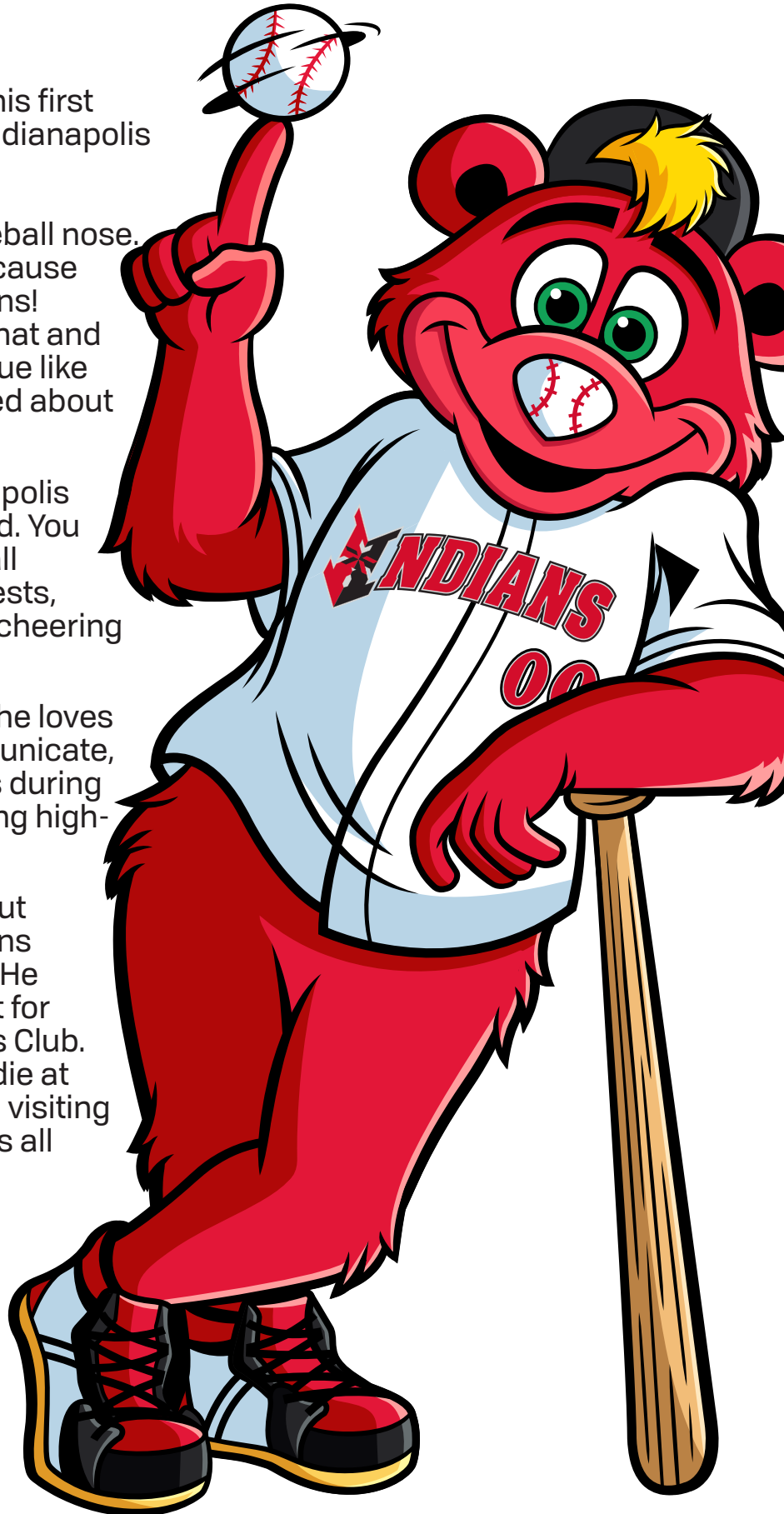

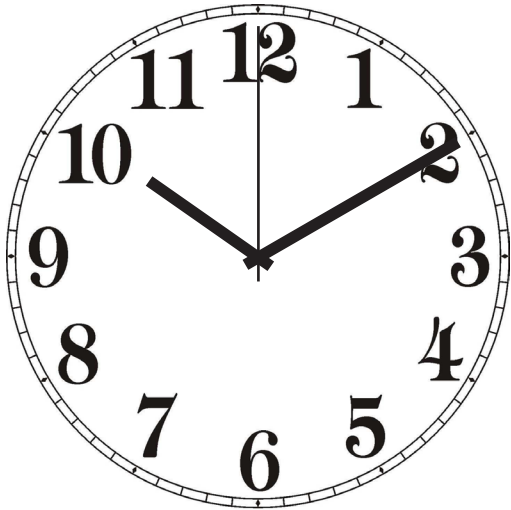

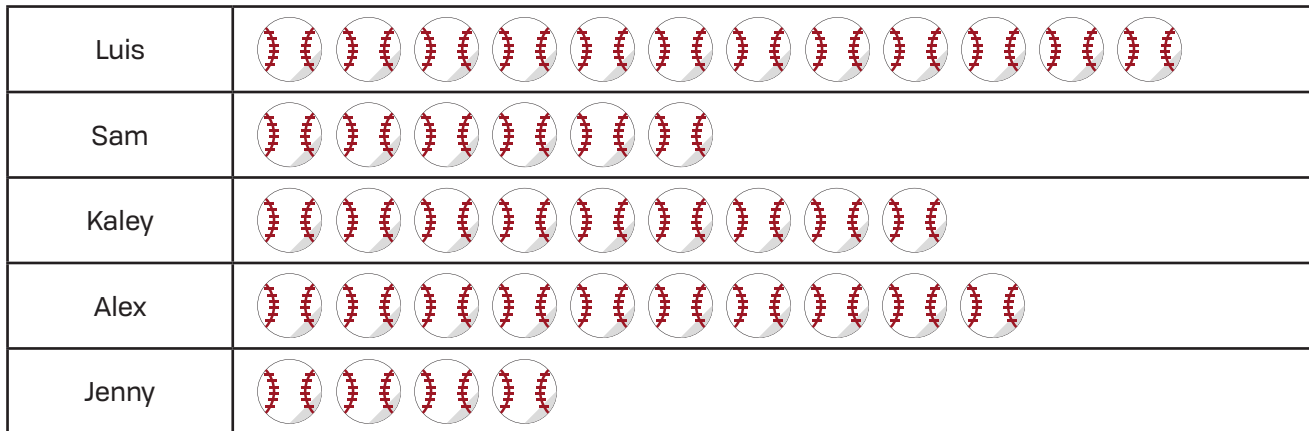
