# **RHP #5 YOENDRYS GOMEZ**

CAREER: (9-9, 3.39 ERA, 209.2 IP, 214 K, 1.24 WHIP)

- In his second Double-A game on 9/8 @HFD, Gomez started the second no-hitter in Somerset Patriots franchise history with five hitless innings to earn his first win of the season. Gomez allowed only one baserunner in the game, a two-out walk in the fourth inning after he had retired the first 11 batters of the game. Steven Jenning finished the combined, 7-inning no-hitter (game two of a double header sweep) with two perfect innings.

- After having undergone elbow surgery last August, Gomez, began this season on the injured list. He made his season debut on June 9 in a rehab appearance for the FCL Yankees. He was then promoted to High-A Hudson Valley on June 17, where he started 10 games for the Renegades, compiling a 1.93 ERA and 27 strikeouts over 28.0 innings pitched.

- In 2021, a shoulder injury held Gomez out for the beginning of the season, before he pitched for Single-A Tampa, starting in nine games, with no decisions and a 3.42 ERA. Gomez underwent elbow surgery in August of 2021, which kept him out for the begging of the 2022 season.

- During the Covid shutdown in 2020, Gomez spent time working remotely with Yankees minor league pitching coach Dustin Glant, when he worked on adding a slider to his repertoire. Following the 2020 MLB season, the New York Yankees added Gomez to the 40-man roster.

Began 2019 with six starts for Advanced-Rookie level Pulaski, going 4-2 with a 2.12 ERA, before a promotion to Single-A Charleston, where he started six games and went 0-3 with a 6.08 ERA.
Split his second pro season between the DSL (two starts) and GCL Yankees East (10 games, 9 starts. Combined to appear in 12 games (11 starts), going 4-1 with a 2.08 ERA.

- Spent his pro debut season (2017) mostly in the DSL (10 games, 8 starts), before one start in the GCL. Combined to appear in 11 games (9 starts), going 0-3 with a 5.40 ERA.

- Signed by the Yankees for \$50,000 as an international free agent at 16-years-old out of Venezuela on July 2, 2016, Gomez has added roughly 5 mph to his fastball since signing with the Yankees. The 2023 season will be Gomez' last minor league option year.

# DAN FIORITO \star MANAGER

Born and raised in Yonkers, NY, Dan Fiorito enters his sixth season with the Yankees organization and his first as Somerset's manager. Fiorito is also the Yankees' Roving Upper Level IF/OF Instructor. He served as the manager of High-A Hudson Valley in 2021, after making his managerial debut in 2019 with the GCL Yankees East. Fiorito also had been slated to manage the Yankees' former short-season Single-A affiliate, Staten Island in 2020,

before the minor league season was canceled due to the COVID-19 pandemic. He served as the defensive coach at the Yankees' former Single-A Charleston affiliate in 2018, after making his professional coaching debut as defensive coach with the Yankees' former Rookie-level Pulaski affiliate in 2017.

His playing career began when he was signed by the Yankees as a non-drafted free agent in 2012. Over four seasons as an infielder in the Yankees system, he batted .240 (264-for-1102) with 107 runs, 52 doubles, six triples, seven home runs and 98 RBI in 322 career minor league games. Fiorito played three years at Manhattanville College (Purchase, NY) and is a 2008 graduate of Fordham Prep (Bronx, NY).



# **GERARDO CASADIEGO** ★ PITCHING COACH

Gerardo Casadiego will begin his first season in Somerset and 10th in the Yankees organization. He held the same position in Hudson Valley last season, where the Renegade staff ranked second in the High-A East division in strikeouts (1,308, sixth in MiLB) and third in ERA (4.12). The Venezuela native has also previously served as the pitching coach for former Rookie-level Pulaski (2017-2019), DSL Yankees 1 (2014-2015) and DSL Yankees 2 (2016).

# JAKE HIRST ★ HITTING COACH

Jacob Hirst will serve as hitting coach in his first season with Somerset and fourth with the Yankees organization. He was the hitting coach for Hudson Valley in 2021, when the Renegades' batters ranked second among High-A East clubs in triples (33) and OBP (.341), third in doubles (217) and fourth in home runs (156), batting average (.255), slugging percentage (.446) and OPS (.787). The Iowa native served the same role with the GCL Yankees West (2019-2020).





# AARON BOSSI ★ DEFENSIVE COACH

Aaron Bossi begins his first season with Somerset after making his coaching debut in the same role with Hudson Valley in 2021. His prior experience for the organization was assisting rehabbing players at the minor league complex from 2017-2019. The St. Louis, MO native was signed as a non-drafted free agent by the Yankees on June 24, 2016 as a catcher/infielder. He played in 22 games for the GCL Yankees East in 2016.







In Somerset's series against Hartford, he went 9-for-20, leading the league in BA (.450), OBP (.500), SLG (.800) and OPS (1.300), tying for first in hits (9) and RBI (7). Dunham also extended a career-long hit streak to 12 games by homering in back-to-back games to round out the weekend, including a grand slam.

- Collegiately, played two full seasons at Indiana, plus 2020. In his last full season as a sophomore in 2019, he led the team in batting (.310) and OBP (.434) en route to being named Third-Team All-Big Ten after 43 games. He began his junior season in 2020 hitting .390/.493/.559 in 15 games with 11 walks. His seven doubles and .493 OBP led the Hoosiers. He earned Big Ten Player of the Week honnors for the week of 2/24/20, before the remainder of the season was cancelled. - Attended Reitz High School in Evansville, where he hit .386 his senior year with a .541 OBP and 26 stolen bases. Three-sport athlete lettered in baseball, basketball and football. Grew up a Cardinals fan, with Albert Pujols his favorite player. Dunham's family owns a donut shop in Fort Worth, Texas, called "Parlor Donuts." His brother, Isaiah, who is a graduate of Yale, runs the business.


