**THINKIN' 'BOUT LAST NIGHT:** Quad Cities won its first extra-inning contest of the season, walking off the Lansing Lugnut for the second time this series with a 3-2 victory after 10 innings ... the game featured just one earned run as the Bandits and Nuts combined for five errors including three in the extra frame ... Nolan Sailors drove in the game-winner, plating Erick Torres in the bottom of the tenth with a sacrifice fly ... Justin Lamkin completed his first career quality start, tossing 6.0-shutout innings while striking out six ... Kamden Edge earned his first High-A hold with a pair of perfect innings and two strikeouts.

rate ranks third-best in the Midwest League and leads the Royals' farm system in 2026.

**ALL ABOUT TIMING:** In Quad Cities' eight wins the River Bandits batted a combined 36-for-108 with runners in scoring position (.333) ... in their seven losses, Quad Cities hit just 8-for-72 (.111) with RISP.

**PROSPECTING THE RIVER:** The River Bandits' roster features six of the Royals' top 30 prospects (MLB Pipeline): **Blake Mitchell** (1), **David Shields** (3), **Ramon Ramirez** (7), **Justin Lamkin** (14), **Asbel Gonzalez** (16), and **Josh Hansell** (27).

**LIVING UP TO THEIR NAME:** Swiping two bags last night, the River Bandits now lead the entire High-A level and rank 11th in Minor League Baseball with 51 stolen bases.

**CRANK UP THE AC:** With a second-inning single last night, Austin Charles is now in the midst of a 10-game hitting streak ... over the stretch, 22-year-old owns the second-best batting average in the Midwest League (.472) with five extra-base hits and 10 RBI ... Charles is the first River Bandit to put together a hitting streak of 10 or more games since Sam Kulasingam hit in a dozen consecutive contests last season (6/22-7/8).

**TWO-FOR-ONE SPECIAL:** Including two more last night, the River Bandits have turned 25 double plays through their first 17 games of the season, tying Lansing for the most in the Midwest League to begin the season.

**GO, GO GONZO:** Asbel Gonzalez enters Sunday riding a nine-game hit streak ... the outfielder is batting .389 (14-for-36) over the stretch, with 10 of his Midwest League-best 12 stolen bases.

**STARTING STRONG:** Over the last seven games, River Bandits' starters have combined to allow only three earned run over 31.2 innings (0.85 ERA) with 36 strikeouts and just 14 hits allowed.

**WALK IT OUT B-MITCH:** Including 10 against the Lugnuts this week, Royals' top prospect Blake Mitchell sits atop the Midwest League with 22 walks through his first 17 games ... his 29.9 walk

### MANAGER JESUS AZUAJE

Azuaje enters his 12th season—fourth managerial—in the Royals’ organization and takes the reins in Davenport for the second-straight season after managing the Columbia Fireflies (Single-A) in 2024 and the ACL Royals (Rookie) in 2023. He spent the previous eight seasons serving as hitting coach in Burlington (2015-2016), Lexington (2017-2020), and Columbia (2021-2022). Prior to joining the Royals, Azuaje spent six seasons as a manager and coach in the Seattle Mariners organization, including a stint in the Midwest League as hitting coach for Clinton (Single-A) in 2009, and as Latin America Field Coordinator for the Los Angeles Dodgers in 2014.
