ABOUT LAST NIGHT: The Indianapolis Indians scored a run in each of the first three innings, including a five-run second frame, to back Bubba Chandler's second quality start and sixth scoreless start of the season in their 8-1 victory over the Louisville Bats on Friday night at Victory Field. The holiday contest was all Indianapolis from the get-go. Billy Cook opened the bottom of the first inning with a double and immediately came around to score on a single from Ji Hwan Bae to give Indy a lead they would not relinquish. The Indians kept their foot on the gas in the second inning and broke the game wide open. Liover Peguero and Matt Fraizer reached base to start the inning and came around to score on an RBI single from Tsung-Che Cheng. The Indians benefitted from back-to-back throwing errors from Louisville to plate two more runs before Nick Yorke capped the second inning with an RBI triple, his second of the week against the Bats, to grant Indy a 6-0 advantage. The Indians capped their fireworks in the third inning when Cheng connected with his second two-RBI hit of the day, this time a double, to give him a career-high tying four RBI. The Bats strung together a double and a single in the seventh to bring in a run but were held scoreless otherwise.

YOU KNOW WHY THEY CALL IT VICTORY FIELD: Indianapolis improved to 32-11 at Victory Field this season last night, improving their home winning percentage to .744, their best start at home since at least 2005 (min. 21 G, excluding their 15-5 (.750) start at home in 2021). Their 2025 mark is the best home record in Triple-A and third-best of full-season minor league teams. The Indians have won 22 of their 27 home games since May 11, which is tied with Single-A Brooklyn for the most in Minor League Baseball in that span, and 30 of their last 37 dating back to April 16, which is the most in MiLB.

FIREWORKS ON THE FOURTH: Last night marked Indy's fourth straight win on July Fourth, their longest winning streak on the date since a five-game run from 1998-2002. The seven-run win was their largest differential on July Fourth since 2016, when they beat Louisville 11-3. The Indians improved to 15-13 on Independence Day in the Victory Field era and 9-7 opposite the Bats in those games.

EAGLE SCREECH: Bubba Chandler earned his third win of the season last night, tossing 6.0 shutout frames with five hits, two walks and six strikeouts. It was his first scoreless start of 6.0-plus innings since Sept. 10, 2024, vs. Rochester. In seven career starts against the Bats, Chandler is 2-0 with a 1.27 ERA (4er/28.1ip) with 22 hits, 11 walks and 40 strikeouts. Chandler has struck out six-plus batters in 14 of his 24 career starts with Indianapolis, and did so in back-to-back contests for the first time since May 13-18. To date, he has thrown 39 pitches of 100.0 mph or faster this season, second among all starters in Minor League Baseball at High-A or above, trailing only Nashville's Jacob Misiorowski (66).

CELEBRATE THE DATE: Tsung-Che Cheng (2-for-4, 2B, 4 RBI, R) powered the Indians offense last night, driving in a career-high tying four runs on July Fourth. It was the sixth time in his career that he has done so and the first since Aug. 7, 2024, with Double-A Altoona at Portland.

SOLAK ECLIPSE: Nick Solak (1-for-5, R) extended his on-base streak to 20 games last night, tying Ji Hwan Bae's 20-game stretch from April 13-May 21 for the longest by an Indian this season. It is the fifth-longest active on-base run in the International League. Solak is hitting .346 (27-for-78) with three doubles, two home runs, 11 RBI, nine walks, 15 runs, one stolen base and a .884 OPS in his stretch. He has hit safely in 18 of those 20 games, with a team-high tying 14 game hitting streak from June 12 (1)-27. Solak recently reclaimed qualified player status, and now ranks among the IL in AVG (.368, 1st), OBP (.430, 3rd), OPS (.989, 3rd) and SLG (.559, 6th).

NICK KNOCKS 'EM IN: Nick Yorke (0-for-4, 3B, RBI) extended his on-base streak to 10 games, hitting .289 (11-for-38) with two triples, two home runs, 12 RBI, six walks, five runs, three stolen bases and a .966 OPS in this span. He has posted one-plus RBI in five of his last six games, and strung together four straight multi-RBI games from June 28-July 2, marking the longest such run of his professional career. Since hitting .212 (14-for-66) in 18 games through April to begin the season, Yorke is hitting .298 (56-for-188) with an .800 OPS in 49 games since May 1. Yorke posted a season-high 4 RBI on Tuesday night, finishing 2-for-4 with one triple, one home run and one run. It was his most runs driven in since July 2, 2024, with Worcester at Syracuse. His 18 multi-hit contests this season trail only Nick Solak for the team lead.

TONIGHT'S MATCHUP: The Indianapolis Indians continue this week's six-game split series between the Louisville Bats at Victory Field tonight at 7:05 PM. LHP Hunter Barco is set to make his ninth start of the season, last tossing 6.0 innings of one-run ball with a season-high tying seven strikeouts on June 29 vs. Omaha. He made one previous start against the Bats on May 15 at Victory Field, allowing two runs in 0.1 innings as he left the game with an injury. Opposite Barco is RHP Aaron Wilkerson, who is set to make his 17th start of the season and fourth against Indy. In those three starts against the Indians this season, he is 1-0 with a 1.72 ERA (3er/15.2ip).

BARCO' AT THE MOON: Hunter Barco has tossed a career-high 6.0 innings in back-to-back starts, and seeks to join Thomas Harrington (3 QS, 6/3-14) as the second Indian to throw three consecutive quality starts this season. Barco is 2-0 with a 1.82 ERA (5er/24.2ip) in six home starts. He has struck out five or more batters in six of his eight starts on the campaign, and has six-plus in three straight.

ECHOLOCATION: The Indians improved to 7-0 at home against the Bats this season and have won eight straight over the club at Victory Field. Since July 4, 2024, the Indians are 15-2 against the Bats at the Vic. They seek their second straight series victory over the club.

ON THIS DATE IN 2019: After winning five straight games with a 1.78 ERA (7er/35.1ip) and 0.91 WHIP for Double-A Altoona, James Marvel made a statement in his Triple-A debut against Toledo at Victory Field. The right-hander went the distance in Game 2 of a doubleheader, tossing 7.0 three-hit innings with six strikeouts to earn his first Indians win and sixth straight in the minors. Two runs in the second inning and a solo home run by Ke'Bryan Hayes in the third gave Marvel the run support he needed and led to a twin bill sweep of the Mud Hens.

TONIGHT'S PITCHER

Hunter Barco: The southpaw ranks as Pittsburgh's No. 5 prospect and Minor League Baseball's No. 88 overall prospect according to MLB Pipeline.

Historic Zeroes: Barco did not allow a run in his six starts with Double-A Altoona, totaling 25.2 consecutive scoreless innings to begin the season, marking the longest scoreless streak in Curve history.

Last Outing: Barco tossed a career-high tying 6.0 innings on June 29 vs. Omaha with one run, one hit, no walks, one hit batter and a season-high tying seven strikeouts.

Against the Bats: He made one previous start against the Bats on May 15 at Victory Field, allowing two runs in 0.1 innings as he left the game with an injury.

EAS Pitcher of the Month: Barco was awarded the 2025 Eastern League April Pitcher of the Month Award after leading the league (min. 20ip) in ERA (0.00, 20.2ip) and batting average against (.132, 9-for-68), while ranking second in WHIP (0.63) and tied for fourth in strikeouts (30).

Mowing Them Down: Barco finished his award-winning April with back-to-back eight-strikeout starts, the last of which came in just 3.0 innings of work on April 27 at Double-A Chesapeake. He became the first Pirates full-season farmhand to strike out eight or more batters in 3.0 innings or less since Osvaldo Bido also struck out eight in 3.0 innings vs. Triple-A Louisville on Aug. 4th, 2022.

Miscellaneous: Barco was selected by the Pirates in the second round (44th overall) of the 2022 First-Year Player Draft out of the University of Florida (Gainesville).
