INDY BITS

ABOUT LAST NIGHT: The Indianapolis Indians built a 6-2 lead after six innings on Wednesday evening, but the Omaha Storm Chasers scored five runs in the seventh to erase the deficit and even the series at Werner Park with the 9-6 triumph. With the Indians holding onto a four-run lead, Randy Labaut retired Nelson Velazquez to open the bottom of the seventh before six of the next seven Omaha batters reached base safely to flip the script. A double by Nick Pratto began the five-run rally, which included a run-scoring balk and game-tying errant throw to the plate from new reliever Yohan Ramirez. The Storm Chasers went in front when Harold Castro bounced a single through the right side. The Indians trailed 2-0 after two innings but then scored six unanswered runs before Omaha's decisive rally. Ji Hwan Bae knocked in Indy's first run with a groundout in the top of the third. Llover Peguero led off the fourth with a double and scored on a single by Jack Suwinski. Darick Hall then homered for the second consecutive game to drive in two, bringing his total RBI on the young series to six. The lead swelled to 6-2 with a two-run fifth, highlighted by Bae's double to extend his on-base streak.

HARMONY HALL: Darick Hall hit his second home run in as many days with a two-run go-ahead shot in the fourth inning yesterday. It marked his first time with homers in back-to-back games since a three-game run from Game 2 on Aug. 23 through Game 1 on Aug. 26, 2023, with Lehigh Valley at Scranton/Wilkes-Barre. Hall hit a first inning grand slam in Tuesday's series opener, marking his first grand slam since a walk-off blast on Sept. 22, 2024, with Lehigh Valley vs. Worcester and Indy's first grand slam since Joshua Palacios on Sept. 8, 2024, at Toledo. Hall's four-RBI performance in that game was the best single-game total by an Indian this season.

SOLAK ECLIPSE: Nick Solak continued his scorching run this season, tallying a pinch-hit single in the ninth inning yesterday after relieving DJ Stewart. With a pinch-hit homer on Sunday in the eighth inning at St. Paul, these marked his first two knocks as a pinch hitter in his minor league career and the latest two since a pinch-hit single off Rick Porcello on Sept. 25, 2019, with Texas vs. Boston. Solak ranks among International League leaders in batting average (.394, 28-for-71, 2nd), OPS (1.070, 4th), SLG (.634, 5th) and OBP (.436, 7th). Solak's .394 average and 1.070 OPS are the highest for an Indians hitter through April (min. 75 PA) since Gregory Polanco hit .400 with a 1.089 OPS through April in 2014. He has reached base safely in 19 of his 20 games on the campaign and has one-plus hit in 18 of those, including a team best 13-game hitting streak from April 3-23. Solak hit .400 (20-for-50) with two doubles, three home runs, 11 RBI, four walks, 11 runs, three stolen bases and a 1.056 OPS in this span. He struck out just seven times across 55 plate appearances during the hitting streak.

BAEWATCH: Ji Hwan Bae extended his on-base streak to 14 games yesterday, going 1-for-4 with a double, two RBI and one run, surpassing Nick Solak's 13-game hitting streak for the team's longest on-base run of the season. He is hitting .298 (17-for-57) with five doubles, five RBI, eight walks, 15 runs and five stolen bases in this span. He tallied a stolen base in four straight games during this run from April 17-22, marking his first time stringing four straight games with a steal since July 8-14, 2021, with Altoona. The four consecutive games with a steal are tied for the longest streak by an International League player this season. He has one-plus hit in five straight contests, eight of his past nine and 11 of the 14 games in this span. He scored a career-high tying four runs on April 17 vs. Toledo (3x, MR: 9/11/22 at OMA). He picked up three RBI in Game 1 on April 25, driving in three-plus runs for the first time since Sept. 22, 2024, at St. Paul. He has scored one-plus run in 10 of the 14 games and one-plus walk in seven of those games.

JACK'S BACK: Jack Suwinski is off to a hot start since being optioned to Indianapolis, going 1-for-4 with one RBI and one run yesterday. In five games since being optioned to Indianapolis, Suwinski is hitting .368 (7-for-19) with one double, two home runs, four RBI, three walks, five runs and one stolen base. He has reached base safely two-plus times in his first four games and has one-plus hit in all five games.

YEAN SHORTS: Eddy Yean tossed 1.1 scoreless innings on Tuesday, escaping a bases-loaded jam in the eighth inning after walking three consecutive batters with one out. He extended his scoreless outing streak to six games, surpassing David Bednar's five straight scoreless outings for the longest run by an Indian this season. In this span, he has thrown 8.1 innings with six hits, five walks and five strikeouts. This, opposed to allowing four runs, five hits and five walks with just one strikeout in his first 2.1 innings this season. It is his longest scoreless outing streak since six consecutive from July 17-Sept. 4, 2024, with Altoona.

SPEEDY SULLY: Brett Sullivan hit an RBI triple in the sixth inning on Tuesday, marking the first triple by an Indy catcher since Grant Koch recorded a three-bagger on Aug. 25, 2023, vs. Iowa.

TODAY'S MATCHUP: The Indianapolis Indians continue the six-game series against the Omaha Storm Chasers tonight at 7:35 PM. Omaha evened the series yesterday, snapping an eight-game losing streak, their longest since an 11-game skid from Aug. 1-12, 2023. Taking the mound for the Indians is right-hander Bubba Chandler who is set to make his first career start against the Storm Chasers. In his last outing, Chandler earned his first win of the season on Game 1 of April 25th's doubleheader at St. Paul, tossing 5.0 shutout innings with one hit, two hit batters and four strikeouts. In 12 career starts with Indianapolis, Chandler is 5-0 with a 1.66 ERA (11er/59.2ip) and 81 strikeouts. He has struck out eight-plus batters in five of those starts and six-plus in eight. Opposite Chandler is left-hander Ryan Ramsey who is set to make his Triple-A debut. Ramsey began the season with Double-A Northwest Arkansas, posting a 3.38 ERA (7er/18.2ip) across four games (three starts) with 12 hits, two hit batters, six walks and 21 strikeouts.

ON THIS DATE IN 1958: Sam Mele hit a three-run, pinch-hit home run in the eighth inning to lead Indianapolis to a 5-3 win over Minneapolis at old Victory Field. Cloyd "Junior" Boyer went the distance over 9.0 innings for Indy, allowing three earned runs on six hits and two walks with five punchouts. Mele went on to later manage the Minnesota Twins to a 1965 American League pennant.

In 12 career starts with Indianapolis, Chandler is 5-0 with a 1.66 ERA (11er/59.2ip) and 81 strikeouts. He has struck out eight-plus batters in five of those starts and six-plus in eight.
