### INDY BITS

ABOUT LAST NIGHT: Behind Bubba Chandler's best start of the season, the Indianapolis Indians scored in four consecutive innings to take the series lead with a 7-2 win over the Omaha Storm Chasers on Thursday night at Werner Park. Nick Yorke got the Indians on the board early, launching his second home run of the season in the first inning. Indianapolis then broke the game open with a three-run fourth inning. Tsung-Che Cheng and Ji Hwan Bae singled, Alika Williams walked and Nick Solak was hit by a pitch to force in a run. Yorke followed with an RBI single and Malcom Nuirez drew a bases-loaded walk to extend the lead to 4-0. Omaha responded in the bottom of the fourth with back-to-back doubles from Nick Loftin and MJ Melendez to score a run, but the Storm Chasers' threat ended there. The Indians answered with insurance runs in each of the next three frames. Omaha mounted a late rally in the ninth with singles by Loftin and Melendez. After Tanner Rainey plunked Peyton Wilson to load the bases, a sacrifice fly from Cam Devanney brought in the game's final run before Rainey closed the door.

BUBBA ON THE BUMP: Pirates top prospect Bubba Chandler earned his second win of the season last night, tossing 5.0 innings with three hits, one run, one walk and a season-high nine strikeouts.

Chandler's .122 opponent average (10-for-82) and 0.67 WHIP lead the International League and both rank fourth in Minor League Baseball. His 36 strikeouts and 1.42 ETRA (4er/25.1ip) each rank fourth in the IL. In 13 career starts with Indianapolis, Chandler is 6-0 with a 1.67 ETRA (12er/64.2ip) and 90 strikeouts. He has struck out eight-plus batters in six of those starts and six-plus in nine. He has thrown 13 pitches at 100.0 mph or higher this season, with three of those coming last night. His eight pitches at 100.3 mph or faster are each of the hardest-thrown pitches by any minor league starting pitcher in High-A or above, tooping out with a career-best 101.5 mph fastball to strike out Will Benson looking in the fourth inning on Aoril 13 at Louisville.

SUPER STARTERS: Bubba Chandler and Mike Burrows combined for a dominant performance last night, tossing 8.0 innings with four hits, one run, two walks and 14 strikeouts. It marked the first time two Indy pitchers combined for 14-plus strikeouts since Hunter Stratton fanned five and Osvaldo Bido fanned nine on April 16, 2023 vs. St. Paul. Bido's nine punchouts that day were the most by a reliever in Victory Field history.

SOLAK ECLIPSE: Nick Solak continued his scorching run this season, going 1-for-4 with one double, one RBI and one run in last night's contest. Solak ranks among International League leaders in batting average (.387, 29-for-75, 2nd), 0PS (1.061, 4th), SLG (.627, 5th) and OBP (.434, 8th). His .394 average and 1.070 OPS through April were the highest for an Indians hitter through April (min. 75 PA) since Gregory Polanco hit .400 with a 1.089 OPS through the month in 2014. He talliled a pinch-thi single in the ninth inning on Wednesday after relieving DJ Stewart. With a pinch-hit homer on Sunday in the eighth inning at St. Paul, these marked his first two knocks as a pinch hitter in his minor league career and the latest two since a pinch-hit single off Rick Porcello on Sept. 25, 2019, with Texas vs. Boston. He has reached base safely in 20 of his 21 games on the campaign and has one-plus hit in 19 of those, including a team best 13-game hitting streak from April 3-23. Solak hit .400 (20-for-50) with two doubles, three home runs, 11 RBI, four walks, 11 runs, three stolen bases and a 1.056 OPS in this span. He struck out just seven times across 55 plate appearances during the hitting streak.

BAEWATCH: Ji Hwan Bae extended his on-base streak to 15 games yesterday, going 1-for-4 with a run. It is the longest on-base streak by an Indian this season and is tied for the sixth longest active streak in the International League. He is hitting, 295 (18-for-61) with five doubles, five RBI, eight walks, 16 runs and five stolen bases in this span. Since making his season debut with Indy on April 8, he is tied for the IL lead in runs scored during this span with 19. He has one-plus thir in six straight contests, nine of his past 10 and 12 of the 15 games in his active on-base streak. He has scored one-plus run in 11 of the 15 games, including four straight, and one-plus walk in seven of those games. Bae scored a career-high tying four runs on April 17 vs. Toledo (3x, MR: 9/11/22 at OMA). He tallied a stolen base in four straight games from April 17-22, marking his first time stringing four straight games with a steal are tied for the longest streak by an International League player this season. He picked up three RBI in Game 1 on April 25, driving in three-plus runs for the first time since Sept. 22, 2024, at St. Paul.

EXIT MUSIC (FOR A BASEBALL): Nick Yorke launched his second home run of the season in the first inning last night, going 3-for-5 with two RBI and one run. It marked his second three-hit game of the campaign, last doing so on April 22 at St. Paul. He has reached base safely three-plus times in two of his last five games, two-plus times in three of those and one-plus in four. It was his fourth multi-hit game of the season.

JACK'S BACK; Jack Suwinski is off to a hot start since being optioned to Indianapolis, going 1-for-4 with one RBI and one run on Wednesday. In five games since being optioned to Indianapolis, Suwinski is hitting .368 (7-for-19) with one double, two home runs, four RBI, three walks, five runs and one stolen base. He reached base safely two-plus times in his first four games and has one-plus hit in all five games

YEAN SHORTS: Eddy Yean tossed 1.1 scoreless innings on Tuesday, escaping a bases-loaded jarm in the eighth inning after walking three consecutive batters with one out. He extended his scoreless outing streak to six games, surpassing David Bednar's five straight scoreless outings for the longest run by an Indian this season. In this span, he has thrown 8.1 innings with six hits, five walks and five strikeouts. This, opposed to allowing four runs, five hits and five walks with just one strikeout in his first 2.1 innings this season. It is his longest scoreless outing streak since six consecutive from July 17-Sept. 4, 2024, with Alhona

**TODAY'S MATCHUP:** The Indianapolis Indians continue this week's six game series with a 2-1 advantage, taking on the Omaha Storm Chasers at 7.35 PM tonight. Right-hander Braxton Ashcraft is set to make his team-leading seventh start of the season. He earned his second win of the season in his last start on April 26 at St. Paul, tossing 5.0 innings with seven hits, five runs, two walks and five strikeouts. He has allowed seven-plus hits and five-plus runs in back-to-back starts. Tonight marks his first career start against the Storm Chasers. Opposite Ashcraft is Storm Chasers right-hander Thomas Hatch. He is set to make his sixth start of the season and first career start against Indianapolis.

**ON THIS DATE IN 2015:** After falling behind 5-3, the Indians scored three runs in the bottom of the ninth inning to beat Lehigh Valley, 6-5. A leadoff single by Gustavo Nunez began the rally, and he scored on a groundout. With two outs, a two-run single by Brent Morei completed the comeback for the Tribe and handed Bobby LaFromboise his first win of the season. The Tribe bullpen tossed three one-hit innings to assist the rally.
