Thursday: RubberDucks 4, Fisher Cats 2: George Valera's two-run home run in the eighth inning broke a 2-2 tie and led Akron to its fourth straight win. Chris Roller also homered. The RubberDucks have won nine of their last 10 games and 15 of 18 since May 6.

Cantillo cruising: Joey Cantillo has pitched 22 scoreless innings in May across five outings (four starts). He has allowed just 10 hits and walked four batters while striking out 33. He is the only qualifying pitcher in the minors or majors to hold a 0.00 ERA this month. His league-best 0.64 May WHIP ranks third, and his league-low .135 opponents' average ranks fifth among all MLB and MiLB qualifiers. His five-inning start May 6 began Akron's current 15-3 stretch.

Valera on fire: George Valera has a nine-game hitting streak, with seven multi-hit games (three straight currently), going 17-for-43 to raise his average from .220 to .273. He has scored 12 runs with five homers (in the last seven games), three doubles, 18 RBI (five multi-RBI games, including three straight), two walks and two stolen bases. His organization-leading 32 runs are also second in the league. His 25 walks are seventh in the league (T-6th in the organization).

Naylor in new spot: Bo Naylor has led off Akron's lineup in his last eight games and has five multi-hit games, going 11-for-32 with three doubles, six walks, 10 runs and two homers. This season, he has 26 walks (sixth in Eastern League, T-3rd in the Guardians organization) and a .416 on-base percentage (fifth). His OBP is third and OPS (.865) is sixth in the system, while his .281 batting average is seventh.

Surging offense: Through May 15, the RubberDucks had the lowest batting average (.213), OBP (.301) and slugging (.323), and fewest home runs (18) of any Eastern League club. But in nine games since beginning a series May 17 in Binghamton, Akron is 8-1 and second in batting average (.298), tied for second in runs (64), and third in home runs (14), OBP (.363), slugging (.537) and OPS (.900). Akron has played a league-high 25 games decided by one or two runs. It is 16-9 in those games (6-6 in one-run games – including 3-3 in extra innings – and 10-3 in two-run games) and 10-7 in games decided by 3+ runs.

Returning cast: The RubberDucks' roster of 28 players includes 17 players who were with Akron when it clinched the league title on Sept. 24, 2021. Overall, 19 of the 28 appeared in a regular season or postseason game for Akron in 2021. On the field staff, Akron returns 2021 Double-A Northeast Manager of the Year Rouglas Odor, pitching coach Owen Dew, hitting coach Junior Betances, assistant hitting coach (2021 bench coach) Mike Mergenthaler, and athletic trainer Jacob Legan. New bench coach Juan De La Cruz had the same role with the club in 2019.

RubberDucks host Fisher Cats: Akron is playing its only scheduled series with New Hampshire this season. The teams split their last season series in 2019, 3-3, with Akron losing two of three at Canal Park. According to MLB.com, top prospects in this series include: **Guardians (MLB.com):** #2 OF George Valera, #4 IF Brayan Rocchio, #8 LHP Logan T. Strikeout strength: RubberDucks pitchers have struck out 506 batters, the most of any team in affiliated baseball (major or minor leagues). The Low-A Dunedin Blue Jays are second with 495. Akron's starting staff has 271 strikeouts, the most of any minor league team. The starters' 191.0 innings are second in the Eastern League, their 11 wins are tied for second, and their 3.44 ERA is fourth. The bullpen has the league's fifth ERA (4.09) and the league's most saves (16).

Ace Allen: Logan Allen brings the most Double-A experience of any Akron starting pitcher, with 12 games (10 starts) and 60 innings last year. This season, the club's Opening Night starter is second in the Eastern League and leads the organization with 62 strikeouts. He ranks fifth in the EL and second in the organization in innings (43.1).

Season format: The 138-game Eastern League season has two 69-game halves. The first half ends June 26. The second half begins June 28. The half winners in each division will play a best-of-three divisional playoff, with those winners meeting in a best-of-three championship series. The schedule has 22 six-game series and a pair of three-game series (Opening Weekend and the weekend after a four-day July break coinciding with the MLB All-Star Game). Akron will play every team in the league except Portland, and only play single series with Northeast Division clubs Reading, Binghamton, New Hampshire, Somerset and Hartford (all in the first half). Akron plays 24 games with Altoona, Bowie and Erie.

Reigning Champions: The RubberDucks finished a league-best 73-46 in the regular season in 2021, and they swept the Bowie Baysox in three games for Akron's sixth league title, adding to Eastern League crowns in 2003, 2005, 2009, 2012 and 2016. Akron was five outs from being eliminated on the last day of the 2021 regular season, but a four-run eighth inning at home against Somerset earned a 5-4 win and berth in the Championship Series. After winning the first two games in Bowie, the RubberDucks rallied from a 5-0 deficit in Game 3, capped by Bo Naylor's walk-off single to win the Double-A Northeast Championship at Canal Park.

Enters season ranked as No. 8 prospect in Cleveland system according to MLB.com, and as "Best Changeup" in Cleveland system by *Baseball America*.

2021 Season Highlights

- Named an MLB.com Organizational All-Star.
- Made his first nine professional starts for High-A Lake County before joining Akron on July 2. At the time of his promotion, he led the High-A Central in ERA (1.58), was tied for the lead in wins (5), was second in strikeouts (67), opponents' average (.200) and WHIP (0.97), and third in innings (51.1).
- Made 12 appearances (10 starts) for Akron, going 4-0 with a 2.85 ERA. After allowing a career-high five runs and three homers to Somerset Sept. 14, he returned in the Sept. 19 season finale to pitch the final five innings (4 H, 1 R, 0 ER, 0 BB, 7 K) and earn the win in the playoff-clinching 5-4 victory that extended Akron's season into the Double-A Northeast Championship Series.
- Finished the season among Cleveland minor league leaders in wins (9, T-2nd), strikeouts (143, 2nd), and innings (111.1, 3rd).

2020:

- Cleveland selected Allen in the second round (56th overall) of the 2020 draft, which was shortened to five rounds. Allen was Cleveland's third selection, following SS Carson Tucker (1st Round - 23rd overall) and RHP Tanner Burns (CBA Round - 36th overall).
- Allen shares the same name as Cleveland's Triple-A/MLB left-hander **Logan Allen**. The younger Allen said last year, "he reached out to me after the draft, and we talked... It's really funny. Maybe there can be some marketing possibilities one day."

Amateur

- Career at Florida International (2018-20): 11-12, 3.33 ERA, 31 G (30 GS), 183.2 IP, 246 K, 47 BB, 1.14 WHIP.
- Allen was a two-way player at Florida International, playing first base (50 career games) when he wasn't pitching. He was All-CUSA 2nd Team as a freshman and the All-CUSA 1st Team as a sophomore, both as a utility player. In three seasons at FIU, Allen batted .297/.362/.410 (.773 OPS) with six home runs, eight doubles and 23 RBI. As a freshman, when Allen played the most as a two-way player, he posted a career-best .390 OBP.
- In 2019, Allen became the first FIU Panther ever selected to the USA Baseball Collegiate National Team.
- Preseason All-American by several outlets ahead of the shortened 2020 season and the 2020 Conference USA Preseason Pitcher of the Year. He was a five-time C-USA Pitcher of the Week during his career, including in 2020 after pitching a seven-inning, one-hitter with 13 strikeouts against George Mason. He was a Freshman All-American by three different outlets in 2018.
- Allen has known his college coach, Mervyl Melendez, since he was five years old. Allen played "Pony Baseball" and travel baseball with Melendez's oldest son. Melendez helped coach the boys from a young age. "We consider [Logan] very dear to our family and he's like another son to me," Melendez said. Logan's older brother, Hunter, also played college baseball for Melendez at Alabama State from 2014-16 (Hunter is now the assistant softball coach at FIU).
- Drafted by the Baltimore Orioles in the sixth round of the 2016 draft out of University High School (Orange City, FL).

Scouting Reports:

- Allen's changeup - a circle change grip - is regarded as his best secondary pitch. According to his college coach, Mervyl Melendez, who also coached Allen in youth baseball, the development of that changeup goes back to Allen's youth. Melendez said he did not allow Allen to throw anything but a fastball and a changeup (no curveballs) until Allen was 12 years old. *MLB.com's* scouting report of Allen's changeup notes "his changeup is his bread and butter, a potentially future plus circle change he sells really well with good fade and sink that misses bats and elicits weak contact on the ground."
- Eric Longenhagen of *FanGraphs* notes Allen's athleticism as a two-way player has helped him maintain a "well-balanced, repeatable delivery." Allen's college coach, Mervyl Melendez, who also coached Allen in youth baseball (see "College Coach" note above), says of Allen's delivery "when [Logan] first started pitching at seven, you kind of saw the mechanical aspect of his pitching was a little bit more advanced than anybody else."

2022 RUBBERDUCKS FIELD STAFF

#24 Rouglas Odor, Manager (Third Season) – Odor, 54, is in his 35th season with the Cleveland organization as a player, coach and manager. The 2022 season will be Odor's third as RubberDucks manager (tying him with Joel Skinner, Dave Wallace and Brad Komminsk for most seasons as Akron's manager). In 2021, Odor was named Double-A Northeast Manager of the Year after leading Akron to the Double-A Northeast championship and a 73-46 record. He also guided the RubberDucks to a 61-79 record in 2019. Odor entered 2022 with a career record of 534-513 as a manager.

Odor was the first member of the Guardians organization to be a member of the Canton-Akron Indians, Akron Aeros and RubberDucks. He was an infielder for Canton-Akron for parts of the 1991, 1993 and 1994 seasons. Odor served as the Aeros hitting coach in 2012 and served as the RubberDucks hitting coach in 2014.

A native of Maracaibo, Venezuela, Odor was a 32nd round selection by Cleveland in the 1988 draft out of the University of New Orleans. The former shortstop played in the minor leagues for Cleveland from 1988-94 and for the Milwaukee Brewers organization in 1995. The 2019 season was Odor's first as a manager since 2008. He managed San Felipe in the Venezuelan Summer League (1999-2000), the Burlington Indians (2001-2004), the Mahoning Valley Scrappers (2005-2006), and Gulf Coast League Indians (2007-2008). In 2009, Odor began serving as hitting coach for the Kinston Indians (2009-2010), Double-A Akron Aeros (2011-2012), High-A Carolina Mudcats (2013), Double-A Akron RubberDucks (2014), and Triple-A Columbus Clippers (2015-2017).

Odor resides in Winter Haven, Florida, with his wife, Milagros. He has three sons and is the uncle of major league infielder Rougned Odor.

#35 Owen Dew, Pitching Coach (Second Season) — Owen Dew, 33, enters his sixth season in the Cleveland organization and second as RubberDucks pitching coach. In 2021, Dew led the Akron pitching staff to a 3.78 ERA (second best in the Double-A Northeast) and a franchise record 1,190 strikeouts. Prior to coming to Akron, Dew was the pitching coach for the Mahoning Valley Scrappers in 2017, AZL Indians in 2018 and Lake County in 2019.

Dew was a 21st round selection by Cleveland in 2010 out of the University of Central Florida. He spent parts of three seasons in the Cleveland organization, logging 58 appearances and 152.1 innings. Dew began his baseball journey as a right-handed pitcher for Seminole State College of Florida (2008-2009), before moving to the University of Central Florida in 2010. That same year, Dew advanced through Mahoning Valley with a strong 2.64 ERA in nine starts for the Scrappers. At Class-A Lake County, Dew was converted to a relief pitcher where he appeared in 15 games over the 2010 and 2011 seasons. In Dew's final season as a player, the right hander appeared in 34 games, accruing 70 innings and posted a 3.86 ERA with 41 strikeouts.

Since his playing career, Dew served as an assistant coach at Seminole State College of Florida while also assisting the Cleveland Indians as an associate scout from 2014-2017.

#16 Junior Betances, Hitting Coach (Second Season) — Betances, 48, enters his 25th season with the Guardians organization as a player, coach or executive and second as the hitting coach for the RubberDucks. In 2021, Betances guided the RubberDucks hitters to a .254 average (third best in the Double-A Northeast) with 116 home runs and 577 RBI (second best in the Double-A Northeast).

Betances came to the organization via the 1996 Rule 5 draft after spending six seasons in the Brewers organization. He batted .289 over 165 games in 1998 and 1999 for the Akron Aeros. Betances joined the coaching ranks in various roles for Cleveland's Dominican Summer League team from 2000-2010. Betances then served as Arizona League Indians coach from 2010-2015, and moved to Lake County in 2017 as the Bench coach for Manager Larry Day.

#28 Mike Mergenthaler, Assistant Hitting Coach (Second Season) — Mergenthaler, 33, enters his sixth year with the Cleveland organization and second season with Akron. Mergenthaler spent 2021 as the bench coach for the RubberDucks. Prior to coming to Akron, Mergenthaler was the bench coach with Lynchburg in 2019. In 2018 and 2019, Mergenthaler worked as a hitting coach for the Cleveland and Milwaukee joint Dominican Summer League team. The Thiells, New York, native was drafted as a player in the 32nd round of the 2011 amateur draft by the San Francisco Giants, playing in their system for parts of 2011 and 2012.

#27 Juan De La Cruz, Bench Coach (Second Season, not consecutive) – De La Cruz, 28, enters his fourth season with the Cleveland organization and second season with Akron, where he was the bench coach in 2019. De La Cruz spent 2021 as the bench coach for Low-A Lynchburg. De La Cruz was signed by Cleveland in 2009 and played eight seasons in the organization. He appeared in 12 games for the RubberDucks in 2017.

Jacob Legan, Athletic Trainer (Second Season) — Legan enters his ninth season in the Cleveland organization and second season in Akron. Prior to coming to Akron, Legan served as the athletic trainer for Lynchburg in 2019. He earned his bachelor's degree in Athletic Training from East Carolina and his master's degree in Exercise Physiology from the University of Akron.

Tyler Grisdale, Strength and Conditioning Coach (First Season) – Grisdale enters his first season with the Guardians organization. Grisdale spent two years in the Miami Marlins organization and four years in the Colorado Rockies organization, including as the Physical Performance Coach for the Spokane Indians (Colorado's High-A affiliate) in 2021.

We Are the RubberDucks

On October 29, 2013, team owner **Ken Babby** stood before a capacity audience at the Akron Civic Theater and announced that the team would be known henceforth as the **Akron RubberDucks**. In addition to being symbolic of the fun, family-friendly brand of entertainment offered by minor league baseball, the name also honors Akron's long history as the "**Rubber Capital of the World**." Brandiose Marketing of San Diego, California designed the team logo, colors, and various marks and insignias. Please note that for print coverage, *RubberDucks* is spelled as one word with a capital "D." In broadcast coverage, referring to the team as "*the Ducks*" is an acceptable variation of the team's nickname.
