MAYOR OF SLAMTOWN: McClanahan's grand slam was his second of the season. Wisconsin has five home runs with the bases loaded this season.

ABOUT CEDAR RAPIDS: The Cedar Rapids Kernels are charter members of the High-A Central League. The current franchise began its existence as the Cedar Rapids Braves, an affiliate of the Milwaukee Braves in the Three-I League in 1958. That was the same year and league the current Timber Rattlers franchise joined the Three-I League as the Fox Cities Foxes. Both teams moved to the Midwest League when the Three-I League ended after the 1961 season. Cedar Rapids has been called the Braves, Red Raiders, Cardinals, Astros, Giants, and Reds until they became the Kernels in 1993. That was the same year the California Angels became the parent club of the Kernels. That affiliation remained through the 2012 season. Cedar Rapids has been affiliated with the Minnesota Twins since 2013. The Kernels made the Midwest League playoffs every year they were affiliated with the Twins. Notable alumni include Mike Trout, Byron Buxton, Trevor Hoffman, and Ted Simmons.

ABOUT THE TWINS: Minnesota's former High-A Affiliate was the Fort Myers Miracle in the Florida State League. From 1995 through 2019, the Twins were affiliated with four teams in the Midwest League. They were with the Fort Wayne Wizards (1995-1998), Quad City River Bandits (1999-2005), Beloit Snappers (2006-2012), and Cedar Rapids Kernels (2013-2019)

PROSPECTING IN THE SERIES: [MLB Pipeline](#) puts four Rattlers on their list of Brewers Top 30 Prospects: Xavier Warren (#11), Carlos Rodríguez (#14), Nick Kahle (#19), and Joe Gray Jr. (#30). [MLB Pipeline](#) has six Kernels on their list of Twins prospects: Matt Canterino (#7), Matt Wallner (#12), Wander Javier (#21), Seth Gray (#24), and Yunior Severino (#28), and Louie Varland (#30). Blayne Enlow (#11) and Luis Rijo (#25) are currently on the Kernels injured list.

PITCHING MATCHUP

WISCONSIN SCHEDULED STARTING PITCHER:

RHP JOEY MATULOVICH: Selected by the Milwaukee Brewers in the 20th round of the 2018 draft out of the University of California, Berkeley.

A BEAR: Matulovich was 6-5 with a 3.79 ERA in 57 games – nineteen starts – over three seasons at Cal. He had 121 strikeouts over 163-2/3 innings pitched in his collegiate career. Matulovich was teammates with current Wisconsin reliever Arman Sabouri at Cal in 2017 and 2018.

ALL-STATE: Matulovich went 9-1 with 110 strikeouts as a senior at San Ramon Valley High School in Danville, California and was an All-State selection in 2015

I WOULD HAVE LIKE TO HAVE SEEN MONTANA: Matulovich began his professional career with the Helena Brewers in the Pioneer League in 2018. He was 3-2 with a 2.75 ERA in twelve games – two starts – for Helena. He walked fourteen and struck out 49 over 36 innings pitched.

IN 2019: Matulovich split time between the AZL Brewers Gold and the Timber Rattlers in 2019. He was 0-3 in eight games – six starts – in the AZL. Matulovich joined Wisconsin on August 1, 2019 and was 1-2 in nine relief appearances. He compiled a 5.57 ERA and 45 strikeouts over 32-1/3 innings in his two stops in the Brewers system in 2019.

MUDCAT: Matulovich started this season with the Carolina Mudcats in the Low-A East. He was 2-0 with a save in sixteen games – two starts – with 56 strikeouts and 21 walks in 40 innings.

LAST START: Matulovich had a no decision at home in [game one of a doubleheader against the Great Lakes Loons on August 11](#). He allowed six runs on six hits with three walks, two strikeouts, and two home runs in three innings. The Rattlers rallied from a 6-1 deficit for an 8-7 win.

VS. CEDAR RAPIDS (2021): Matulovich made his 2021 Timber Rattlers debut against the [Kernels on July 29 in a start at Neuroscience Group Field](#). He allowed five hits, walked none, and struck out four over five scoreless innings for the win.

CEDAR RAPIDS SCHEDULED STARTING PITCHER:

RHP BEN GROSS: The Twins selected Gross in the 10th round of the 2019 draft out of Duke.

BLUE DEVIL DAYS: Gross was 8-4 in his only season at Duke. He had a 4.40 ERA with 76 strikeouts over 75-2/3 innings pitched.

GETTING THE CALL: Gross was the starting pitcher in Duke's first game at the Morgantown Regional in 2019 and picked up the win against Texas A & M. He also started Game One of the Super Regional at Vanderbilt and picked up the win in that game, too.

A TIGER, TOO: Gross pitched three seasons at Princeton before going to Duke. He was picked in the 34th round of the 2018 draft by the Houston Astros after he was named Second Team All-Ivy League after that season with Princeton. Gross elected to head to Duke instead.

2019: Gross was 3-3 with 4.30 ERA in eleven starts for Elizabethton in the Appalachian League after signing with Minnesota. He gave up 56 hits and struck out 49 over 52-1/3 innings at Elizabethton.

LAST START: Gross won [at Peoria on August 11](#). He allowed two runs on six hits with a walk and thirteen strikeouts over six innings.

VS. WISCONSIN: Gross has made two starts against Wisconsin this season. He had a no decision against the [Timber Rattlers in Cedar Rapids on May 30](#) and a no decision [at Wisconsin on July 30](#). He has allowed three runs on six hits with two walks and fifteen strikeouts over 10-1/3 innings against Wisconsin this season.
