### CREDENTIAL REQUESTS

Single-game credentials must be requested through the Biloxi Shuckers media relations department at least 24 hours prior to the date your outlet is planning to attend. Only legitimate news-gathering outlets, at the discretion of the Biloxi Shuckers, will receive credentials. All credentials are non-transferable and should be visible at all times. Credentials will not be issued to anyone under 18 years of age. The Biloxi Shuckers reserve the right to revoke credentials at any time. Anyone seeking autographs, player memorabilia, personal photos, etc. will have their credentials revoked immediately.

### ACCESS TO SHUCKERS BALLPARK

Location of the media entrance to the ballpark will be on the north side of the stadium off Howard Avenue. Media members must have their credential in order to enter the ballpark. There is very limited parking available in the lot north of the stadium off of Howard Avenue.

### CREDENTIAL PICKUP

All media credentials will be available for pickup at ticket window at the Shuckers Box Office, located on the northeast side of the stadium near the corner of Caillavet and Howard Avenue.

### CLUBHOUSE ACCESS

Both the home and visiting clubhouse are considered CLOSED at all times unless permission is obtained through the Shuckers' Media Relations Department. Any entrance to either the home or visiting clubhouse must be accompanied by a member of the Biloxi Shuckers' Media Relations Department.

### REQUESTING INTERVIEWS

All requests for interviews with Biloxi Shuckers players, coaches or front office members should be booked through the media relations department. All requests are encouraged to be made at least 24 hours prior to the interview. No interviews are to be conducted while a game is in progress. No interviews may be conducted during a team workout, unless otherwise authorized. Interviews on gamedays are best conducted after the team takes batting practice. Video cameras are not permitted in the areas where players park or player entrances/loading dock areas. Interviews may be shot on the field or in the dugout if weather and player/coach availability permits. **STARTING PITCHERS WILL NOT BE AVAILABLE FOR PREGAME INTERVIEWS ON DAYS THEY ARE STARTING.**

### MILWAUKEE BREWERS REHAB ASSIGNMENTS

Players on minor league injury rehab assignments for the Milwaukee Brewers will be made available to the media when possible with their schedule. All interview requests with rehabbing players must be authorized by a member of the Biloxi Shuckers media relations staff. In accordance with Major League Clubhouse policy, no starting pitcher will be made available for pregame interviews on the day they are starting.

### VISITING PLAYER INTERVIEW REQUESTS

All requests for visiting players should be organized in conjunction with that teams' media relations department. The Biloxi Shuckers media relations staff can help facilitate requests through other teams media relations departments.

### FIELD/DUGOUTS

Media members holding credentials that grant field access may be present in the foul territory/dugout areas up to one hour prior to the scheduled game. At no time are media members allowed to cross the foul lines into the field of play. Foul territory and dugout areas must be clear of ALL media exactly one hour prior to the start of the game unless a special request has been made to the Biloxi Shuckers Media Relations staff or college media relations staff.

### PHOTOGRAPHERS/VIDEOGRAPHERS

Photographers and videographers may utilize the on-field camera well next to the dugout on the first base and third base side of the ballpark. Space is limited, and all photographers/videographers must accommodate the space needs of the television camera operators and Biloxi Shuckers staff in this area. No photography is permitted on the field of play while the game is in progress. Special photo requests must be authorized by a member of the Biloxi Shuckers media relations staff.

### PRESS BOX

Limited space in the ballpark press box (3rd floor) is available for **WORKING MEDIA ONLY**. Photographers and videographers may utilize the second and third rows of press row for editing. Game information, rosters, lineups and complimentary wired or wireless internet connection will be provided to you. There will be no cheering or rooting for either team at any point during the game. Individuals who violate press box rules will be removed and credentials revoked upon the discretion of the Biloxi Shuckers media relations department.

## SHUCKERS BALLPARK GROUND RULES

### HOME RUNS

- Batted ball flies over the first (lower) 8' outfield fence.
- Batted ball strikes the scoreboard, scoreboard netting, batter's eye or outfield light pole.
- Batted ball strikes foul pole above outfield fence level.

### DEAD BALLS

- Any ball going into the dugout is dead.
- Any ball lodged in, on or behind the backstop netting is dead.
- Any ball lodged in, on or around the bullpen benches is dead.
- Any ball lodged under, on top of, behind or inside the tarp is dead.

### LIVE BALLS

- Any ball bouncing off the tarp.
- Any loose ball in the bullpen.
- Any thrown ball hitting the dugout rails or dugout netting and rebounding onto the field.
- Any ball that lands in the space between the foul pole and the outfield wall.

### FLY BALLS

- If a player catches a fly ball in the dugout one foot must remain on the dugout's top step/field level.
- Players may lean across the tarp to catch a fly ball, however players must not sit upon, step on or use the tarp as an aid in catching the fly ball.

## BASEBALL TERMS OF INTEREST

**ASSISTS:** An assist shall be credited to each fielder who throws or deflects a batted or thrown ball in such a way that a putout results, or would have resulted except for a subsequent error by any fielder. Only one assist and no more shall be credited to each fielder who throws or deflects the ball in a run-down play which results in a putout, or would have resulted in a putout, except for a subsequent error.

**BATTING AVERAGE:** Divide the numbers of hits by the number of official at-bats.

**BATTING TITLE QUALIFICATIONS:** To qualify for the Double-A South batting or slugging title, a player must have a minimum of 372 plate appearances (the equivalent of 2.7 plate appearances for each of the 138 scheduled games). However, a player with fewer than the required number of plate appearances whose average would be the highest if he were charged with the required number of official at-bats shall be awarded the batting championship.

**CONSECUTIVE-GAME HITTING STREAK:** A consecutive-game hitting streak shall not be terminated if all of a player's plate appearances result in a walk, hit batsman, defensive interference or a sacrifice bunt. The streak shall terminate if the player has a sacrifice fly and no hit.

**CONSECUTIVE-GAME PLAYING STREAK:** A consecutive-game playing streak shall extend if the player plays one half-inning on defense, or if he completes a time at bat by reaching base or being put out. A pinch-running appearance shall not extend the streak. If a player is ejected from a game by an umpire before he complies with the requirements of this rule, his streak shall continue.

**DAY OR NIGHT GAME:** Any game scheduled to start after 5:00 p.m. is considered a night game. A game scheduled to begin before 5:00 p.m., which is delayed by rain or any other reason, is still considered a day game. However, both games of a two-night doubleheader will be considered night games.

**DESIGNATED FOR ASSIGNMENT:** When a player is taken off a Major League roster and is designated for assignment, such player must be released, traded, or his contract assigned within 10 days of the notice given.

**DESIGNATED HITTER RULE:** Since 2022, the Southern League has used a universal designated hitter regardless of affiliation.

**EARNED RUN AVERAGE:** Multiply the number of earned runs by nine; take the resulting number and divide it by the number of innings-pitched.

**EARNED RUN AVERAGE TITLE QUALIFICATIONS:** To qualify for the Southern League ERA crown, a pitcher must have the lowest earned run average after at least 111 innings-pitched (the equivalent of 0.8 multiplied by the number of scheduled games -138).

**FIELDING PERCENTAGE:** Divide the total putouts and assists by total putouts, assists and errors.

**FREE AGENCY:** If a player has six years of Major League service, he is eligible for free agency. A player has 15 days from the first day following the World Series to file for free agency. A player is also eligible for free agency if he has played seven seasons or more in the Major or Minor Leagues and is not on a Major League team's 40-man roster as of October 15.

**INJURED LIST:** In the Minor Leagues, players placed on the injured list must remain there a minimum of seven consecutive days. There is no limit to how many players can be on the injured list at one time and those on the injured list do not count toward the team's roster limit.

**MAGIC NUMBER:** Determine the number of games yet to be played, add one, then subtract the number of games ahead in the lost column of the standings from the closest opponent.

**MAJOR LEAGUE REHABILITATION:** A Major League player may be assigned to a minor league affiliate for the purpose of injury rehabilitation for a maximum of 20 days for non-pitchers, and 30 days for pitchers. The player continues to receive his Major League salary. Any service with the minor league club shall be deemed Major League service. Rehabilitation assignments do not count as optional assignments. Players on rehabilitation assignment do not count against a team's roster limit.



**ON-BASE PERCENTAGE:** Take the total number of hits, walks, and hit-by-pitches and divide by the total number of at-bats, walks, hit-by-pitches, and sacrifice flies. Times awarded first base on interference or obstruction are not figured into on base percentage.

**OPTIONS:** An optional assignment of a player contract shall be permitted for not more than three seasons between Major League and Minor League clubs. Players optioned for less than a total of 20 days in one season shall not be charged with an optional transfer. Players who, prior to the start of the season, have been credited with less than five seasons in professional baseball, shall be eligible for a fourth optional assignment, without waivers, during that season. Since 2022, players can be optioned five times in a season. A player optioned six or more times must be placed on waivers after each ensuing option.

**PLAYER LIMITS:** In Double-A in 2024, rosters will have 28 active players for the duration of the entire season. Players on the injured list or on rehabilitation assignment do not count against the 28-man active roster. In the Major Leagues, rosters are 40 until Opening Day, at which time they decrease to 26 players. Teams are limited to carrying 13 pitchers during this time. On September 1 through the end of the regular season, Major League rosters increase to 28 active players with a limit of 14 pitchers.

**RECALLED:** When a player is on a Major League team's 40-man roster and added to the team's 26-man active roster during the season from the Minor Leagues, he has been recalled. If a player is not on the Major League 40-man roster, the Major League club must purchase his contract from the Minor League team and add him to its 40-man roster.

**ROOKIE QUALIFICATIONS:** A player shall be considered a rookie unless; he has exceeded 130 at-bats or 50 innings-pitched in the Major Leagues or accumulated more than 45 days on the 26-man active roster of a Major League club or clubs. Time in military service and time on the injured list is excluded.

**RULE 5 DRAFT:** A player not on a Major League 40-man roster as of November 20 is eligible for the Rule 5 Draft if the player was 18 years of age or younger when he first signed a professional contract and this is the fourth Rule 5 Draft held since he signed. Or if the player was 19 years of age or older when he first signed a professional contract and this is the third Rule 5 Draft held since he signed.

**SAVE RULE:** Credit a pitcher with a save when he meets all three of the following conditions:

- He is the finishing pitcher in a game won by his club; and
- He is not the winning pitcher; and
- He qualifies under one of the following conditions:
  1. He enters the game with a lead of no more than three runs and pitches for at least one inning; or
  2. He enters the game, regardless of the count, with the potential tying run either already on base, at bat, or on deck, or
  3. He pitches effectively for at least three innings.

*No more than one save may be credited in each game.*

**SLUGGING PERCENTAGE:** Divide the total bases of all safe hits by the total number of at-bats.

**SUSPENDED GAME:** In the Southern League, any regular season game that is called before it is completed or is called at any point with the score tied shall become a suspended game. In accordance with Official Rule 4.12 (c), a suspended game must be resumed and completed from the exact point of suspension and must be played the number of innings it was originally scheduled to include. If the suspended game is called before becoming a regulation game (before the fifth inning), the regular game following the suspended game shall be a seven-inning game. If the suspended game is called after becoming a regulation game (from the fifth on), the regular game following the suspended game shall be a nine-inning game. Attendance reporting from suspended game shall reflect the number of fans present when the contest started, not when it was completed and does not qualify as a lost opening.

**WAIVERS:** If a player placed on Major League waivers is not claimed by another team after two (2) business days after waivers have been requested, the player has "cleared waivers" and the team has secured waivers for the remainder of the waiver period. The team then can send him to the Minor Leagues, trade him to another team prior to the Trade Deadline, or do nothing at all. After the trade deadline, players may still be placed and claimed on outright waivers, but trades are no longer permitted after that date (July 31). If a player does not clear waivers - he is claimed by another team or teams- the club requesting waivers may withdraw the waiver request. If the club does not withdraw the waiver request, the player's contract is assigned as follows: If only one claim is entered, the player's contract is assigned to the claiming club; if more than one club in the same league makes a claim, the club currently lower in the standings gets the player; if clubs in both leagues claim the player, preference shall always go to the club in the same league as the club requesting waivers.



**WINNING PITCHER:** The starting pitcher will be credited with the win only if he has pitched at least five complete innings and his team not only is in the lead when he is replaced, but remains in the lead the remainder of the game. When the starting pitcher does not meet the preceding criteria and more than one relief pitcher is used, the victory shall be awarded on the following basis:

- When, during the tenure of the starting pitcher, the winning team assumes the lead and maintains it to the finish of the game, credit the victory to the relief pitcher judged by the scorer to have been the most effective.
- Whenever the score is tied, the game becomes a new contest insofar as the winning and losing pitcher is concerned.
- Once the opposing team assumes the lead, all pitchers who have pitched up to that point are excluded from being credited with the victory except the current pitcher.
- The winning relief pitcher shall be the one who is the pitcher of record when his team assumes the lead and maintains it to the finish of the game.



## 2024 PACE OF GAME REGULATIONS

**PITCH TIMER:** To encourage a crisp pace of play, Pitch Timers will be used at all full-season PDL levels. The Pace of Game Procedures that will be used in 2023 are very similar to the regulations that were used at the PDL levels during the 2022 season.

a. **Time by Level:** The amount of time on the Pitch Timer in Double-A is 0:14 with no runners on and 0:18 with a runner on base.

b. **Obligations of the Hitter:** Batters will be required to be in the batter's box and alert to the pitcher with 8 or more seconds remaining on the Timer, which is a change from the 9-second threshold used at all PDL levels in 2022. This change was made to align with the Major League version of the Pitch Timer and to respond to feedback from hitters who felt they could use additional time between pitches, particularly with the bases empty.

c. **Disengagement Rule:** If the pitcher makes a pickoff attempt at any base, feints a pickoff, or otherwise steps off the rubber with runners on base he shall be charged with a Disengagement. To ensure that pitchers do not circumvent the Pitch Timer regulations by stepping off the rubber, pitchers at all PDL levels shall be limited to a total of two Disengagements per plate appearance with runners on base. Consistent with the Disengagement Rule in use during the 2022 PDL season, the Disengagement count will not reset until the following plate appearance, even if a runner advances or is retired during a plate appearance. Please note that this is in contrast to the Major League level, where a pitcher's Disengagement count will reset if a runner advances during a plate appearance.

d. **Pitching Changes During an Inning Break:** The Between Inning Timer will not reset if a new pitcher enters the game during an inning break. Previously, the Between Inning Timer would reset to 2:15 when a new pitcher left the bullpen area. In 2024, the Between Inning Timer will start upon the final out of the previous half inning and will not reset unless signaled by the umpire. New pitchers entering the game should be prepared to leave the bullpen immediately and take their final warm-up pitches on the game mound prior to the start of the inning.

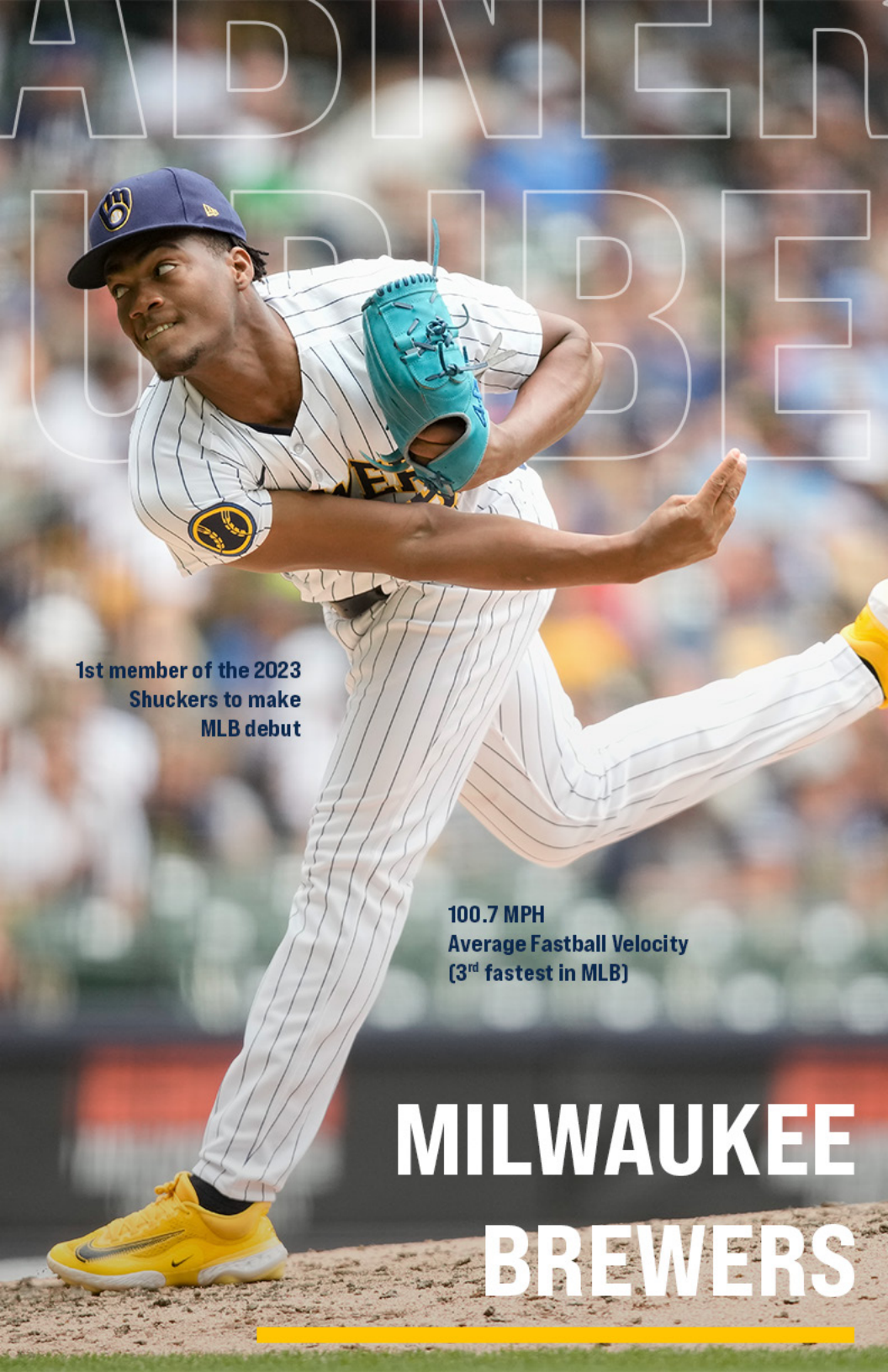
e. **Enforcement:** The Pitch Timer will be strictly enforced starting on Opening Day.

g. **Rehabilitation Assignments:** Major League Players on rehabilitation assignments will be subject to all the Pace of Game Procedures applicable to the level of play to which they are assigned. The only exception is that during the appearance of a Major League pitcher, the time between pitches will be 15 seconds with the bases empty and 20 seconds with runners on base (i.e., the settings used at the Major League level).

**BIGGER BASES:** Eighteen-inch bases will be used at all full-season levels of play and in the domestic Complex League throughout the 2024 season. Fifteen-inch bases will continue to be used in the Dominican Summer League. Bases will be positioned in the traditional configuration (i.e., consistent with what is used in the Major Leagues).

**RESTRICTIONS ON INFIELD POSITIONING:** At all PDL levels, the domestic Complex League, and in the Dominican Summer League, a minimum of four infielders (not including the pitcher and the catcher) will be required to be positioned within the outer boundary of the infield with two infielders entirely on each side of second base. Additionally, infielders may not switch sides during an inning unless there is a substitution for a defensive player other than the pitcher.

## 2023 ROBIN YOUNT AWARD HONOREES



### JACKSON CHOURIO - BREWERS CO-MINOR LEAGUE PLAYER OF THE YEAR

Chourio hit .282/.338/.467 with 26 doubles, 3 triples, 22 HR, 91 RBI, 88 runs and 44 stolen bases over 128 games between Biloxi and Nashville. The 19-year-old spent most of 2023 in Biloxi where he batted .280/.336/.467 with 23 doubles, 3 triples, 22 HR, 89 RBI, 84 runs and 43 stolen bases in 122 games. He was promoted to Nashville on Sept. 18 and hit .333/.375/.476 with 3 doubles, 2 RBI, 4 runs and a stolen base over 6 games. Ranked as Milwaukee's top prospect and the No. 2 overall prospect in baseball by MLB Pipeline, Chourio led the organization in RBI (91), hits (150) and total bases (248). He ranked among leaders in runs (2nd, 88), extra-base hits (2nd, 51), stolen bases (T-2nd, 44), HR (3rd, 22), doubles (T-4th, 26) and slugging percentage (6th, .467).



### TYLER BLACK - BREWERS CO-MINOR LEAGUE PLAYER OF THE YEAR

Black began 2023 at Double-A Biloxi where he hit .273/.411/.513 with 16 doubles, 8 triples, 14 HR, 48 RBI, 70 runs and 47 stolen bases in 84 games. He was promoted to Triple-A Nashville in early August and batted .310/.428/.514 with 9 doubles, 4 triples, 4 HR, 25 RBI, 35 runs and 8 stolen bases in 39 games. Black led all of Minor League Baseball in triples (12). He paced Milwaukee's organization in runs (105), stolen bases (55) and extra-base hits (55) and ranked among leaders in OPS (2nd, .930), hits (2nd, 128), walks (2nd, 88), total bases (2nd, 231), slugging percentage (3rd, .513), RBI (4th, 73), HR (5th, 18), on-base percentage (5th, .417) and doubles (6th, 25).



### CARLOS F. RODRIGUEZ - BREWERS CO-MINOR LEAGUE PITCHER OF THE YEAR

Rodriguez went 9-6 with a 2.88 ERA and 158 strikeouts in 128.1 innings over 26 starts in 2023. He made his first 25 starts with Biloxi, posting a 2.77 ERA with 152 strikeouts in 123.2 innings. He concluded his season with a start for Nashville on September 20, 2023, striking out 6 over 4.2 innings (5h, 3er, 4bb). Selected in the sixth round of the 2021 First-Year Player Draft, the native of Nicaragua led the organization in opponent batting average (.187) and ranked among leaders in starts (T-1st, 26), ERA (2nd, 2.88), wins (T-2nd, 9), strikeouts (3rd, 158), WHIP (3rd, 1.12) and innings (5th, 128.1).



### ROBERT GASSER - BREWERS CO-MINOR LEAGUE PITCHER OF THE YEAR

Gasser went 9-1 with a 3.79 ERA and 166 strikeouts in 135.1 innings over 26 appearances and 25 starts for Nashville in 2023. Acquired from San Diego in the Josh Hader trade in August of 2022, Gasser led all of Triple-A in strikeouts (166). He ranked among organizational leaders in strikeouts (2nd), wins (T-2nd, 9), innings pitched (4th, 135.1), ERA (4th, 3.79), opponent batting average (4th, .236), starts (T-4th, 25) and WHIP (6th, 1.28).

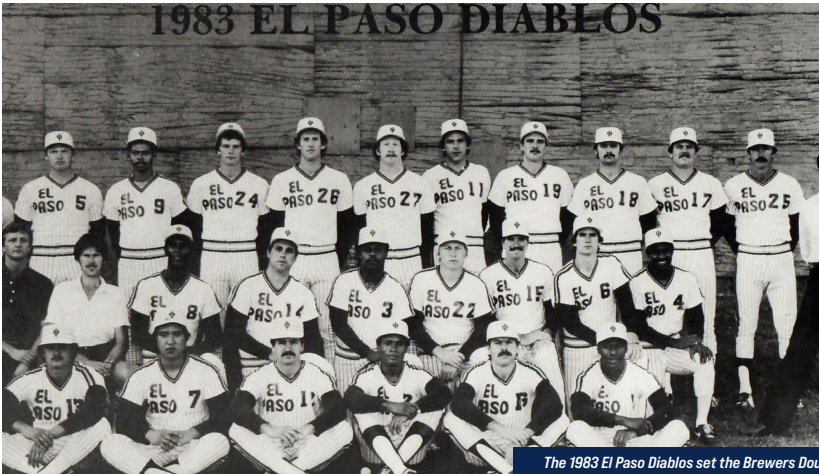

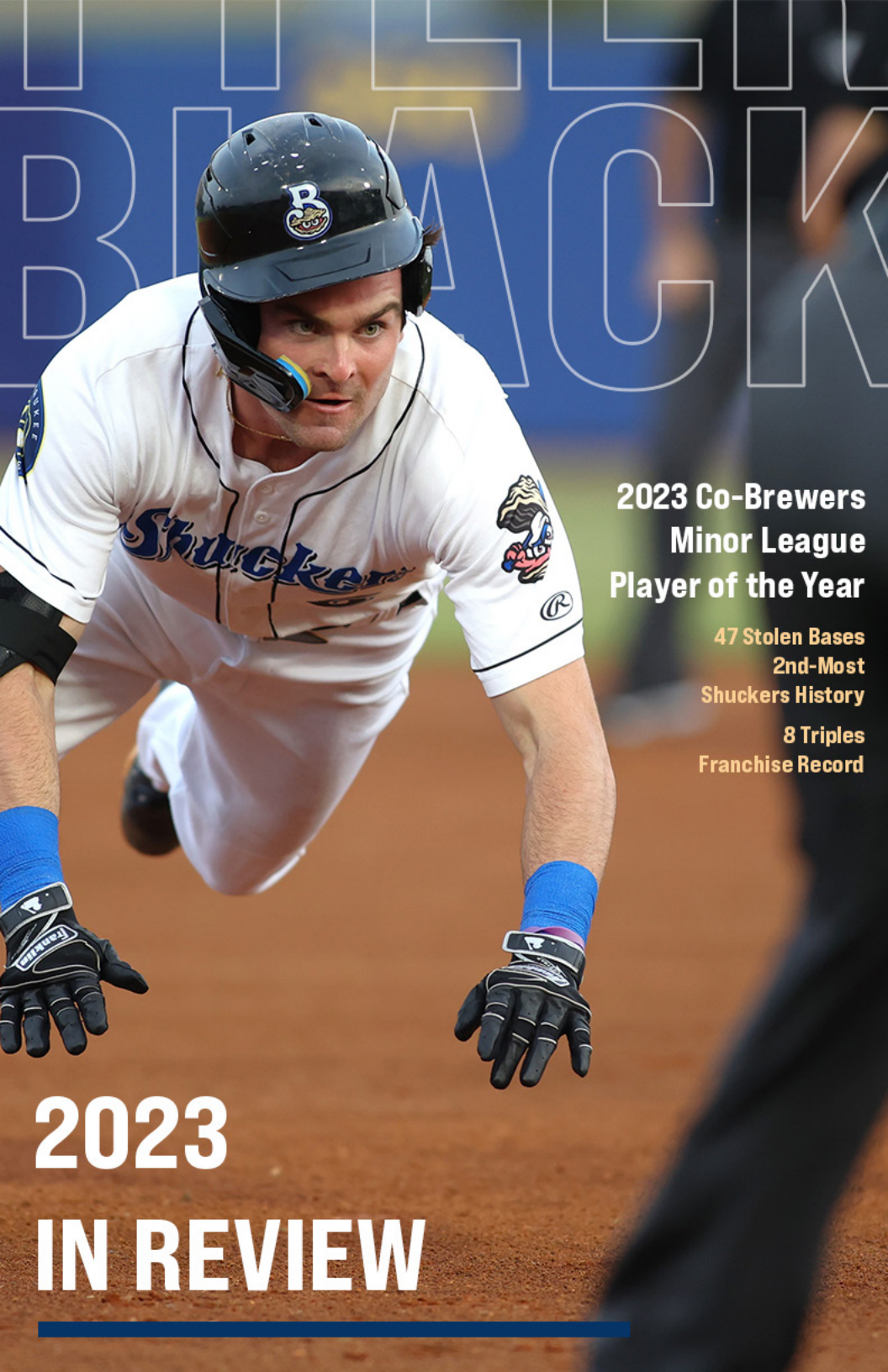

**HEY NOW, YOU'RE AN ALL-STAR:** 3B Tyler Black, OF Jackson Chourio, C Jeferson Quero and RHP Carlos Rodriguez were all named to the 2023 Southern League All-Star team, the most Shuckers selected in any season in franchise history... Rodriguez was also named the Southern League Pitcher of the Year, becoming the fourth player in franchise history to win the award.

**LEADING THE ORGANIZATION:** 3B Tyler Black, OF Jackson Chourio and RHP Carlos Rodriguez were all selected for the Brewers' 2023 Robin Yount Performance Awards... Black and Chourio were named the Co-Minor League Players of the Year... Rodriguez was named the Co-Minor League Pitcher of the Year.

-  Chourio was the first player in Brewers' history to earn Minor League Player of the Year twice after being named the 2022 Brewers' Minor League Player of the Year.
-  Rodriguez joined RHP Ben Hendrickson ('02, '04) as the only two pitchers in Brewers' history to be named the Minor League Pitcher of the Year twice.


**BEST IN THE SYSTEM (AGAIN):** OF Jackson Chourio was named the *Baseball America* Brewers' Minor League Player of the Year for the second consecutive season... Chourio, the Brewers' top prospect, became the first Double-A player since at least 2005 to tally a 20/40 season and became the first teenager since OF Delmon Young in 2005 to record a 20/20 season at the level.

**BEST IN CLASS:** *Baseball America* released their Double-A Best Tools and Prospects Awards on Tuesday, September 5, as voted on by league managers... The Shuckers took home several Southern League honors, including; OF Jackson Chourio - Best Batting Prospect and Most Exciting Player, INF Tyler Black - Best Strike-Zone Judgment and RHP Jacob Misiorowski - Best Fastball.

**THE FUTURE IS NOW, FRIENDS:** C Jeferson Quero and OF Jackson Chourio represented the Milwaukee Brewers during the SiriusXM All-Star Futures Game at T-Mobile Field in Seattle, Washington on July 8... Both were in the starting lineup for the National League, and Quero tallied an RBI single in a 5-0 win... The pair were the ninth and 10th Shuckers' players selected for the event... RHP Jacob Misiorowski also appeared at the event, and was promoted to Biloxi on July 22.

**ANOTHER NEW FRANCHISE RECORD:** INF Tyler Black reached base in 35 straight games for Biloxi between April 29 and June 16, the longest in franchise history (since 2015) and the second-longest streak in the Southern League in 2023... Over the 35-game streak, Black had a .421 on-base percentage, drew 38 walks, collected 31 hits, 11 extra-base hits and tallied 30 stolen bases... Black reached base in 79 of 84 games with Biloxi prior to his promotion to Triple-A Nashville.

**CROSSING THE 40 MARK:** INF Tyler Black became the second player in Shuckers' franchise history (since 2015) to tally 40 stolen bases in a season, reaching the mark on Sunday, June 25 against the Chattanooga Lookouts... Black ended his time with Biloxi with 47 stolen bases, the second-most in franchise history... OF Jackson Chourio would cross the 40-mark in September, making 2023 season the first in franchise history with multiple players tallying at least 40 stolen bases.



-  The two were the first pair of Southern League teammates since at least 2005 to each tally 40+ stolen bases in a season.

**HE JUST GETS ON BASE:** C/1B Wes Clarke reached base in 30 consecutive games from August 10 to September 15, 2023, the second-longest in franchise history (since 2015) and the third-longest in the Southern League during the 2023 season... During the streak, Clarke had a .304/.482/.608 slash line, and walked in 23% of plate appearances... Clarke also drew a walk in 22 of the 30 games during the streak.

**IN A LEAGUE OF HIS OWN:** INF Tyler Black had a breakout year with Biloxi in 2023... Prior to his promotion to Triple-A Nashville, Black had a .240 isolated power, a 15.8% walk rate and a 20.0% strikeout rate... Black ended the year as the only qualified hitter in Double-A with an isolated power of .230+, a walk rate of at least 15% and a strikeout rate of 20% or lower... The only other players to record that season at the Double-A level since 2006 are C Adley Rutschman ('21, BAL), C Luke Montz ('11, FLA), 1B Carlos Santana ('09, CLE) and 1B Jeff Larish ('07, DET).


**WELCOME TO THE SHOW, ABNER!** RHP Abner Uribe made his MLB debut on Saturday, July 8, tossing a perfect eighth inning and working the ninth against the Cincinnati Reds at American Family Field in Milwaukee... Uribe became the first member of the 2023 Shuckers to make their big league debut... With Biloxi, Uribe struck out 28 in 15 innings with a 1.80 ERA... In his big league debut, Uribe touched 100 MPH multiple times, and tallied two strikeouts.

**THE NEED FOR SPEED:** INF Tyler Black (47), OF Jackson Chourio (43) and INF/OF Isaac Collins (29) became the first trio in franchise history (since 2015) to all tally at least 25 stolen bases in a season... Both Chourio and Black reached 40-plus in 2023, the second and third times a player had reached the mark in franchise history.

-  As a team, the Shuckers tallied 214 stolen bases in 2023, the fourth-most out of any team in Double-A and the most out of any team in the Southern League.
-  Chourio, Collins and Black combined for 119 stolen bases in 2023, more than three entire Double-A teams.



**ONE OF A KIND:** **OF Carlos Rodriguez** became the first Shuckers' player to record multiple hits in six straight games, doing so between August 9-15... Rodriguez broke the previous record, set at five by **OF Jackson Chourio**, **OF Sal Frelick**, **OF Brice Turang** and **OF Garrett Cooper**... Rodriguez's six-game multi-hit streak was tied for the longest in the Southern League in 2023.

 During Rodriguez's six-game multi-hit streak, he was 12-26 (.462) with three doubles and eight RBI... Over that span, he raised his average from .268 to .285, a 17-point increase.


**HOMER HAPPY SHUCKERS:** The Shuckers homered in 14 of their final 16 games, including at least one homer in each of their final nine games... The Shuckers ended the season with 152 home runs, two shy of tying the single-season franchise record of 154, set in 2022.


**CROWING A NEW STRIKEOUT KING:** **RHP Tobias Myers** set the Shuckers' new single-season strikeout record with a fourth-inning strikeout of **C Edgar Quero** on Saturday, September 9, giving him 158 strikeouts on the year... He broke the previous record of 157, set by **RHP Alec Bettinger** in 2019... Myers finished the Shuckers' season with 168 strikeouts, more than any pitcher in Double-A.

**LEADING THE LEVEL:** **INF/OF Isaac Collins** set a new single-season franchise record with a .424 on-base percentage in 2023, the highest out of any player in Double-A... Collins became the first Southern League player to lead Double-A in on-base percentage since **OF Jonathan Rodriguez** with the Chattanooga Lookouts (MIN) in 2017... Collins drew 75 walks and struck out 55 times in 376 plate appearances.

**SPEEDING INTO HISTORY:** The Shuckers stole their 200th base of 2023 on Saturday, September 2 against the Tennessee Smokies, becoming the ninth Southern League team since 1980 to reach 200 in a season... Since 1980, the eight other teams to reach 200 are the Montgomery Biscuits in 2022 (203) and 2019 (213), the Birmingham Barons in 2002 (220) and 1989 (264), the 2000 Carolina Mudcats (209), the 1994 Knoxville Smokies (203), the 1983 Savannah Braves (203) and the 1981 Nashville Sounds (205)... The Shuckers finished the year with 214 stolen bases, the most in franchise history.


**POST ALL-STAR BREAK POWER:** **C/B Wes Clarke** ended the year with 26 home runs, the most by any Shuckers player since **OF Corey Ray** set the franchise record with 27 in 2018... His 26 home runs were the second-most by a player in franchise history and tied for the second-most out of all Double-A hitters.


 Clarke ended the year as the Southern League home run leader... It was the first time a Shucker had finished the year as the league's home run leader since 2018, when **OF Corey Ray** finished atop the leader board with 27.


 After the All-Star Break (July 14), Clarke hit 17 home runs, the most in Double-A and tied for the third-most in Minor League Baseball.

**THE ERA KING:** **RHP Carlos Rodriguez** finished the Double-A regular season with 25 starts, 123.2 innings, 152 strikeouts and a 2.77 ERA... Rodriguez ended the season in the top-five in franchise history (since 2015) in ERA (5th, 2.77) and strikeouts (3rd, 152)... He finished the year as the Double-A leader in ERA by 0.20 over **RHP Patrick Monteverde** (PNS) and opponents' average by 35-points over the next-best qualified pitcher.

**THE OLD RECORD BOOKS? THEY'RE USELESS:** During the Shuckers' 18-1 win over the Birmingham Barons on Thursday, September 7, the Shuckers set new single-game franchise records with 18 runs and 22 hits.

 The 18 runs broke the previous franchise record of 16, set on May 29, 2022 against the Montgomery Biscuits... The 18 runs are tied with the Birmingham Barons on June 28, 2023 and the Chattanooga Lookouts on August 18, 2023 for the second-most runs scored in a game in Regions Field history (since 2013).


 Their 22 hits broke the previous record of 20, set on May 13, 2015 at the Jackson Generals and tied on August 2, 2017 against the Jacksonville Jumbo Shrimp and on July 21, 2021 against the Mississippi Braves.

 The win was also Biloxi's 70th of the year, marking the sixth time in franchise history the Shuckers have reached the mark... It was the first year Biloxi's won at least 70 games since they won 80+ in back-to-back years in 2018 and 2019.

**THE YOUNG AND RESTLESS:** The Shuckers lineup ranked as the youngest in Double-A in 2023... Per *Baseball-Reference*, which uses playing time to weight and measure the average age, the average Shuckers hitter was 22.6 years old, a year younger than the average Southern League batter... For comparison, the oldest lineup in Double-A was the San Antonio Missions (SDP) with an average of 25.3 years old... The Shuckers roster had nine players who ended the year at 22 years old or younger with **OF Jackson Chourio** being the youngest player at 19 years old.

**FINISHING OUT THE ROAD SLATE:** With a win on Sunday, September 10, the Shuckers tied the franchise record with their 40th road win of the year... Between August 7 and the end of the year, the Shuckers won 16 of their final 18 road games, including a sweep of the Tennessee Smokies.

 In the final 18 road games, the Shuckers averaged 6.4 runs per game, a .273/.346/.434 slash line and a 2.64 ERA..

 Over the first 41 road games, Biloxi averaged 5.8 runs per game, a .254/.363/.424 slash line and a 5.42 ERA.



**THE NEW KID MAKING AN IMPACT:** Brewers' 2023 first-round draft pick, **INF Brock Wilken**, made his Double-A debut on Tuesday, September 12 after 41 games between High-A Wisconsin and the Rookie-level ACL Brewers... In his first three games, Wilken hit two home runs, including a 100 MPH, 393-foot solo home run in his second game in Double-A... Wilken, who set the Wake Forest single-season record with 31 home runs in 2023, smashed a grand slam to left for his first Double-A hit in his second at-bat at the level.

**THE FIRST FOR MYERS:** Shuckers' RHP **Tobias Myers** tallied his first career complete-game shutout on Tuesday, August 29 against the Tennessee Smokies... Myers tallied seven strikeouts over six shutout innings in a 9-0 Shuckers win.

**Myers'** shutout was the ninth in Biloxi Shuckers franchise history (since 2015), and the first since RHP Trey Supak threw a one-hit, seven-inning complete game shutout on July 16, 2019 against the Chattanooga Lookouts.

**HOMERING INTO HISTORY:** C/1B **Wes Clarke** became the fourth player in franchise history (since 2015) to hit at least 20 home runs in a season and was later joined by **OF Jackson Chourio** as the fifth... The pair joined **OF Corey Ray** (27, 2018), **C/OF Jakson Reetz** (22, 2022) and **INF Cam Devanney** (20, 2022)... Clarke finished the season with 26 home runs, the most in the Southern League and the second-most in Double-A... Chourio finished with 23, tied for the fourth-most.

**BEST IN THE SYSTEM:** **OF Jackson Chourio** was named the Brewers' Minor League Co-Player of the Month for July... RHP **Carlos Rodriguez** was named the Brewers' Minor League Pitcher of the Month for July after being named the Southern League Pitcher of the Month.

**Over** four starts in July, Rodriguez allowed two earned runs over 18.1 innings, a 0.98 ERA... He held opponents to a .152 (10-66) average and allowed one run or less in all four starts... Entering today, Rodriguez leads all Double-A pitchers in opponent's average, limiting them to a .183 clip on the year... He's also among the Double-A leaders in ERA (2nd, 2.79), strikeouts (T-5th, 118) and WHIP (7th, 1.14).

**In** July, Chourio was among the Double-A leaders in average (.388), extra-base hits (T-3rd, 14), home runs (T-4th, 6) and OPS (5th, 1.165)... Chourio tallied a hit in 16 of 19 games, including multiple hits in 12 games... He tallied five straight multi-hit games from July 6-18, tying the Shuckers' franchise record.

**TURNING UP THE OFFENSE:** The Shuckers tore through July, averaging over seven runs per game and going 15-9 in the month, the most wins in any month this season... The Shuckers also outscored opponents 170-136 (+34) and scored five or more runs in 19 of 24 games in the month.

**The** Shuckers 170 runs were the second-most scored in any month in franchise history (since 2015).

**Biloxi's** 40 home runs marked the second-time in franchise history that the Shuckers had hit at least 40 in a month (43, July 2018).

**Biloxi's** .386 on-base percentage, .510 slugging percentage and .896 OPS were the best in any month in franchise history, clearing the previous OPS record (.861 OPS, June 2022), by 35 points.

**ARRIVING IN STYLE:** RHP **Jacob Misiorowski** tied the Shuckers single-game record with 12 strikeouts in a shutout win over the Mississippi Braves on Tuesday, August 15... The Brewers' top pitching prospect set new career-highs in strikeouts (12), innings (6.0) and pitches (96)... Misiorowski became the sixth player in Shuckers' franchise history (since 2015) to strike out 12 in a game and the first since **LHP Ethan Small** on June 12, 2021 against the Mississippi Braves... Over five starts in Double-A, Misiorowski struck out 36 batters in 21.0 innings, a 34% rate.

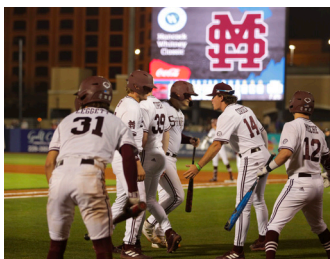

**ORLANDO ARCIA - BREWERS MINOR LEAGUE PLAYER OF THE YEAR**

In the Shuckers inaugural season, Arcia finished in the Top 5 in the Brewers' organization in batting average (.307), RBI (69) and stolen bases (25). The shortstop was also named a Southern League Mid-Season All-Star, Postseason All-Star and the Southern League Player of the Week for the week of June 1. Additionally, Arcia collected the MiLB Rawlings Gold Glove for shortstop, was named a MiLB Brewers' Organizational All-Star and was named the MiLB.com Staff Choice for Breakout Prospect. Arcia also became the first Shuckers' player to participate in the MLB Future All-Stars Game at Great American Ballpark.

**JORGE LOPEZ - BREWERS MINOR LEAGUE PITCHER OF THE YEAR**

Lopez dominated the Southern League in his first season at Double-A, going 12-5 with a 2.26 ERA in 24 starts for the Shuckers. Woodruff started his season with High-A Brevard County but made his impact with Biloxi in 2016, making 20 starts with the Shuckers. In the Brewers' organization, Woodruff led all pitchers in ERA (2.68), wins (14) and strikeouts (173). The Tupelo, MS native also led the Southern League in WHIP (1.04) and batting average against (.211) while finishing third in ERA and fourth in strikeouts. Woodruff was named the Southern League Pitcher of the Month for July after twice taking home Pitcher of the Week in the month, and also collected MiLB Organizational All-Star honors and was named a *Baseball America* Minor League All-Star.

**CORBIN BURNES - BREWERS MINOR LEAGUE PITCHER OF THE YEAR**

In just his second professional season, Burnes took the Brewers' organization by storm, leading the organization in ERA (1.67) and finishing third in strikeouts (140). After making 10 starts with High-A Carolina, Burnes earned a promotion to Biloxi on May 30 and continued his roll, earning Pitcher of the Week Honors for the week of July 9. Along with being named the Brewers' Minor League Pitcher of the Year, Burnes was named a MiLB Organizational All-Star, a Baseball America Double-A All-Star and a Baseball America Minor League All-Star.

**COREY RAY - BREWERS MINOR LEAGUE PLAYER OF THE YEAR**

The Brewers' Minor League Player of the Year award was just one of the many accolades that Ray earned after his breakout season in 2018. During the year, Ray led the Southern League in home runs (27), stolen bases (37), doubles (32), extra-base hits (66) and total bases (254), while finishing second in slugging percentage (.477) and runs scored (86), third in hits (127) and fourth in RBI (74). Ray became the first player in Southern League history to lead the league in both home runs and stolen bases as part of his Southern League MVP season that also featured a Mid-Season All-Star nod, a Postseason All-Star honor and Southern League Player of the Month honors in July. The former fifth-overall pick also led the Brewers' organization in home runs and stolen bases while finishing second in RBI and was named an MiLB Organizational All-Star.

**ZACK BROWN - BREWERS MINOR LEAGUE PITCHER OF THE YEAR**

Brown pitched his way to the top of the Southern League leader board and the Brewers' organization with a breakout season in 2018. The righty led the Brewers' organization in ERA (2.40) and finished third in strikeouts (119) despite missing almost a month with a high-ankle sprain. He took home the Southern League Most Outstanding Pitcher Award after leading the league in ERA and winning percentage (.900) while finishing second in WHIP (1.04) and batting average against (.207). He was named the Southern League Pitcher of the Week after throwing a complete game shutout on June 15, and also was named a Mid-Season All-Star, a Postseason All-Star, an MiLB Organizational All-Star and a Baseball America Double-A All-Star.

**TRENT GRISHAM - BREWERS MINOR LEAGUE PLAYER OF THE YEAR**

Trent Grisham's incredible 2019 started in Biloxi and ended in Milwaukee playing right field for the Brewers. The 2015 first-round pick found his swing in late May, starting with a 4-for-5 performance against the Mobile BayBears on May 26. Grisham set a franchise record with four walks in a game on June 1, and tied a Shuckers' franchise record by homering in four straight games from May 31 to June 3.

Over his final 20 games with the Shuckers, Grisham slashed .342/.479/.822 with seven doubles, two triples, eight home runs and 25 RBI, walking 20 times while striking out just eight. He reached base safely in 19 of those 20 games and hit safely in 15 of them. He was named a Southern League Midseason All-Star and started in center field at MGM Park in the All-Star Game on June 18 before a promotion to Triple-A San Antonio. Grisham continued his hot hitting at San Antonio, slashing .381/.471/.776 in 34 games with eight doubles, three triples, 13 home runs, 30 RBI and 37 runs scored. Grisham was named the Brewers' Minor League Player of the Month in May, June and July before earning a promotion to Milwaukee on August 1. Despite playing with the Big League club for the last month of the season, Grisham led the Brewers' Minor League system in home runs (26), finished second in extra-base hits (54) and total bases (223), third in walks (67), tied for fourth in RBI (71) and fifth in runs scored (71).

**ETHAN SMALL - BREWERS MINOR LEAGUE PITCHER OF THE YEAR**

Ethan Small was assigned to the Shuckers to begin the 2021 season and in his first start at MGM Park he authored the first five innings of Biloxi's first nine-inning no-hitter. After finishing May with a 4.24 ERA, Small kicked it into another gear in the month of June, tossing 10.2 scoreless innings across two starts, allowing just three hits and striking out 19 batters. He then tied the Shuckers' franchise record with 12 strikeouts across 6.2 innings on June 12 against Mississippi. In his final start with the Shuckers, Small hurled seven scoreless innings and allowed just three hits and one walk while registering nine strikeouts. The lefty was promoted to Triple-A Nashville, and despite a finger injury, made nine appearances and pitched to a 2.06 ERA with the Sounds. All told, Small went 4-2 with a 1.98 ERA in 18 starts and was selected to the MLB All-Star Futures Game along with earning Brewers' Minor League Pitcher of the Month honors in June.

**JACKSON CHOURIO - BREWERS MINOR LEAGUE PLAYER OF THE YEAR**

In his first full season, 18-year-old Jackson Chourio played at three levels in the Brewers' system, finishing the year with the Shuckers. Between Low-A Carolina, High-A Wisconsin and Double-A Biloxi, Chourio slashed .288/.342/.538 with 30 doubles, five triples, 20 home runs, 75 RBI and 75 runs. He was second in the Brewers' system in slugging percentage, third in extra-base hits (55), doubles and OPS, tied for third in triples, fourth in RBI and fifth in home runs, total bases, runs scored and batting average. Chourio was named the Carolina League MVP and also earned the MiLB Rawlings Gold Glove Award® in the outfield.

2023



**JACKSON CHOURIO - BREWERS CO-MINOR LEAGUE PLAYER OF THE YEAR**

Jackson Chourio became the first player in Double-A since at least 2005 to record at least 20 home runs and 40 stolen bases in a season, tallying 22 homers and 43 stolen bases with the Shuckers in 2023. Chourio also became first player in Brewers' history to earn Minor League Player of the Year twice. His 22 home runs were the most by a teenager in Double-A since at least 2005. Chourio was also among the Southern League leaders in hits (1st, 143), RBI (2nd, 89), home runs (T-4th, 22), stolen bases (5th, 43), extra-base hits (6th, 48), average (6th, .280) and slugging percentage (7th, .467). He also set the new Shuckers' single-season record with 89 RBI.

**TYLER BLACK - BREWERS CO-MINOR LEAGUE PLAYER OF THE YEAR**

With the Shuckers, Tyler Black put on a base-stealing clinic, tallying 47 in just 84 games, the second-most by a player in franchise history. Black also set the franchise record with a 35-game on-base streak between April 29 and June 16, the second-longest by any Southern League player in 2023. Black was one of five qualified players in Double-A since 2006, and the first since Orioles catcher Adley Rutschman in 2021 with the Bowie Baysox, to finish a season with an isolated power of at least .230, a walk rate of at least 15% and a strikeout rate of 20% or less. Black ended the season among the league's best in on-base percentage (2nd, .411), OPS (2nd, .924), slugging (4th, .513), triples (2nd, 8), stolen bases (T-2nd, 47) and average (10th, .273). His eight triples set the Shuckers' single-season franchise record. Black was promoted to Triple-A Nashville on August 6.

**CARLOS F. RODRIGUEZ - BREWERS CO-MINOR LEAGUE PITCHER OF THE YEAR**

The Double-A leader in ERA and opponent's average, Carlos Rodríguez, dominated on his way to his second straight Brewers' Minor League Pitcher of the Year honor. Rodríguez led all qualified Double-A pitchers with a 2.77 ERA, 41 points better than any other pitcher. He also limited opponents to a .183 average, 45 points better than all other qualifiers in Double-A. With Biloxi, Rodríguez limited opponents to two runs or less in 18 of his career-best 25 starts. Rodríguez, along with Chourio, was promoted to Triple-A Nashville following the conclusion of the Shuckers season.

In an exciting Game One, Biloxi jumped out to a 2-0 lead after three frames. Pensacola scored three runs in the fourth to go in front, but the Shuckers responded with five in the bottom of the fifth. Carrying a 9-5 lead going into the ninth inning, All-Star closer Nate Griep allowed a grand slam to Alex Kiriloff that tied the game at 9-9 before Royce Lewis hit a go-ahead homer in the next at bat. In the bottom of the ninth, Joantgel Segovia drove in C.J. Hinojosa to tie the game before Dillon Thomas hit a walk-off homer to walk it off in 10 innings. The Biloxi professional baseball team revealed their identity on November 24, 2014, as the Biloxi Shuckers took center stage during a ceremony inside Biloxi's historic Saenger Theatre.

The team name was selected after nearly 60,000 votes were cast during a month-long "Name the Team" contest yielded six finalists.

A tenacious oyster is the centerpiece of the identity, seen in the club's primary logo and home and alternate caps. The letters "BS" make up the road cap designation. The batting practice cap features the historic Biloxi Lighthouse resiliently rising above storm waters. Gulf Blue, Sand, Coral and Black make up the club's official colors, paying tribute to the Gulf Coast. The Shuckers are the first professional sports team to use this color combination. The logos and color scheme are seen throughout the home of the Shuckers.



## CREATING THE BRAND

The Shuckers' look was brought to life by Brandiose, an industry leader in team identity creation. The development process began in March 2014 when Brandiose's partners Jason Klein and Casey White met in Biloxi with fans, staff and community members to learn about the stories, history, and personality of Biloxi.

"Biloxi is one of the most resilient cities in America," said Klein. "Our goal is to integrate Biloxi folklore in the Shuckers brand, and to create the most legendary entertainment experience on the Gulf Coast."

## SHUCKERS BALLPARK

Featured by Southern Living and Forbes as one of the top ballparks in the country, Shuckers Ballpark opened its gates for the first time on June 6, 2015. The newest jewel in the Mississippi Gulf Coast's crown combines sports and entertainment perfectly, providing fans with the ultimate hospitality experience. After more than a decade of efforts, the Mississippi Gulf Coast finally had its Minor League Baseball facility. Located just across Highway 90 from the Gulf of Mexico, Shuckers The ballpark's capacity is 6,067 and features a boomerang-shaped grandstand, allowing fans to be closer to the action than at most parks.



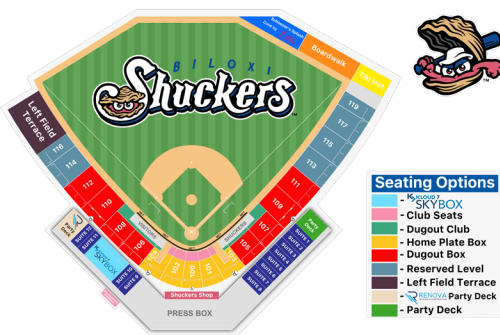
The ballpark's suite level contains eight suites on the first base side and four suites on the third base side. Each suite has outdoor seating for 12 guests and an overall capacity of 20. The Renova Roof Party Deck and First Base Party Deck are at each end of the suite level, offering capacity for up to 55 guests. Guests can enjoy the game from patio tables or stadium seating. The Kloud 7 SkyBox is located between suites 10 and 11, featuring an indoor-outdoor experience, fully stocked cash bar and all-you-can eat buffets. The blue waters of the Mississippi Sound, the inlet of the Gulf in Biloxi, can also be glimpsed on the horizon from the third base side of the suite level. The backdrop is the majestic Beau Rivage, which has been the state of Mississippi's tallest building since the casino opened on March 16, 1999. MGM Resorts International, the parent company of Beau Rivage and owner of the land on which the ballpark stands holds the naming rights of the ballpark. The name of the ballpark was officially announced on September 24, 2014.

The exact plot of ground designated for the ballpark has a storied history. Biloxi's original resort hotel, the Buena Vista, was located where the ballpark now stands. It had five stories and 200 rooms and was constructed in 1924. Hurricane Camile in 1969 dealt massive damage to the structure and the grand facility never recovered.

The ballpark is the fourth ballpark to ever host professional baseball games in Biloxi. The first was Point Comfort Park, although it was used for just part of the 1908 season by the Gulfport-Biloxi Sand Crabs of the Cotton State League. Biloxi Stadium, which opened in 1928, was the spring training home of the Washington Senators from 1930-1935 and the Philadelphia Phillies in 1938. In 2003, two games were played at Hollis Field, a high school facility, between the Pensacola Pelicans and Baton Rouge River Bats of the independent Southeastern League. None of the three ballparks that hosted professional baseball in the past in Biloxi still stand.

Located off of Highway 90 and Interstate 110, adjacent to Beau Rivage Resort & Casino, Shuckers Ballpark is within walking distance of downtown Biloxi and beaches of the Gulf Coast. There are 2,500 hotel rooms in a two-block radius and MGM Park is located three miles from I-10. MGM Park is home to the Biloxi Shuckers, Double-A affiliate of the Milwaukee Brewers, and hosts concerts, festivals, and other outdoor events.

### SHUCKERS BALLPARK AMENITIES

Shuckers Ballpark features a tiered Party Patio (The Left Field Terrace) with 4Tops tables and premium seating for up to 100 persons or groups, 12 luxury suites, The Kloud 7 SkyBox with capacity of 75 to 100, two party decks (The Renova Roofing Party Deck and the First Base Party Deck) located on the suite level with capacity of up to 50-75, a grass berm in right center field, one main gate located down the third base line, a center field gate and two entrances on the concourse level. 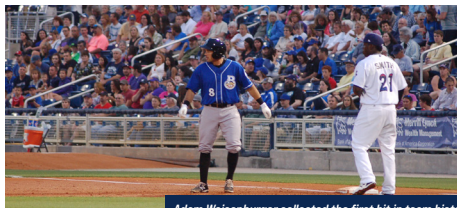


## APRIL 9, 2015 - FIRST GAME AT PENSACOLA

## APRIL 9 - JUNE 5, 2015 - A 54-GAME ROAD TRIP

The most iconic portion of the 2015 season was probably the historic road trip. The Inaugural Biloxi Shuckers endured a seemingly endless 58-day, 54-game, eight-city road trip that spanned 2,800 miles. The historic road trip was chronicled by numerous publications, which included ESPN. The Worldwide Leader in Sports dedicated time on Sports Center, Baseball Tonight and nine pages in an August edition of ESPN The Magazine to the Shuckers.



The Shuckers won over 60% of the games while on the road (33-21). The team traveled from Pensacola to Mobile, back to Pensacola, to Huntsville, Jackson (TN), back to Huntsville, then Chattanooga, Birmingham and finally ending up in Biloxi on June 6. Over the 2,800-mile pilgrimage 32 players suited up for the Shuckers.





## JUNE 6, 2015 - THE FIRST GAME AT MGM PARK

It was one of the most historic days for Biloxi, and for that matter, Minor League Baseball. The Shuckers came off the road on June 5th – winning an extra-inning game in Birmingham – loading the bus to Biloxi for the first time since the brief visit on April 14. The Shuckers arrived just before 4 am and would have a full day of ceremony, which served as an end to the 54-game road trip, but beginning of what no one could of ever expected.



Shuckers Ballpark opened its gates for the first time on June 6, 2015 as Tyler Wagner threw the first pitch to Mobile's Jack Reinheimer at 7:07 p.m. CT. The Shuckers fell behind by a run in the top of the 14th inning, but Nick Shaw followed a single by Parker Berberet with one of his own, scoring pinch runner and pitcher Brent Suter from second base. Suter took a detour around third base coach and skipper Carlos Subero, but the grinning southpaw eventually scored. Let the celebration begin!

After the season, MiLB.com writers and readers named the Shuckers' homecoming its 2015 "Game of the Year", earning the MiLBy award. Out of over 20,000 games played around Minor League Baseball in 2015 – that was the pinnacle.

The team began their day around 11 a.m. and was part of the GameDay Experience with Biloxi Main Street, including a parade to their new home. The pregame festivities featured Southern League President Lori Webb, Brewers General Manager Doug Melvin, Minor League Baseball President Pat O'Conner, Mississippi Governor Phil Bryant and many more. ESPN concluded their features of the club on this date and the final piece could not have been scripted any better.

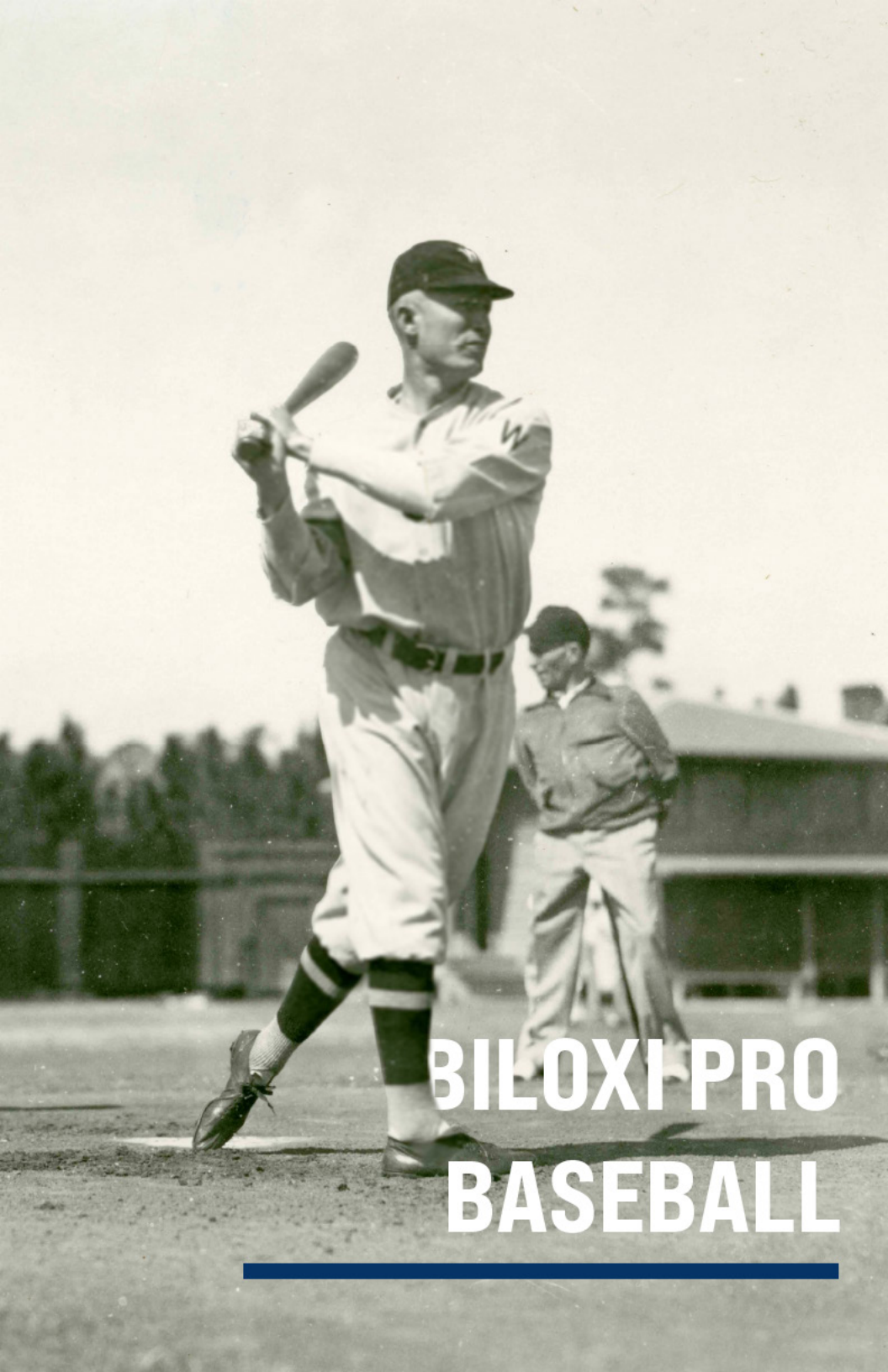

## BILOXI/GULFPORT BASEBALL HISTORY

The 2015 relocation of the Huntsville Stars to Biloxi marked the arrival of the first professional team in the area in almost 90 years. While minor league records were not as exhaustive then as they are today (and many physical documents were lost during Hurricane Katrina in 2005), local historians have been able to piece together the story of Biloxi baseball through newspaper archives and eyewitness accounts.

The history of baseball in the Biloxi area dates back to at least 1892 when amateur teams were first recorded to have played the sport. The first professional baseball team arrived in 1906 as the Gulfport Crabs, an entrant in the Class D Cotton States League. As the lowest level in the minor league system, Class D teams were limited to 14 players, including a player-manager, and required their pitchers to play other positions. The Crabs likely played on a large plot of land bound by 12th Street, 38th Avenue, 15th Street and 42nd Avenue in Gulfport, just south of the present-day Milner football stadium.

After two years of low attendance in Gulfport, half of the team's stake was sold to a group from Biloxi. As a consequence, the team spent the 1908 season split between Gulfport and Biloxi as the Gulfport-Biloxi Sand Crabs. When in Biloxi, the team played at Point Comfort Park (bound by Oak and Maple Streets on the east and west, and 8th and 9th Streets on the south and north). Though the move helped increase attendance, the Cotton States League folded before the 1909 season and Biloxi was once again left without a team.

While there was no permanent baseball in Biloxi for many years, several teams visited the area for Spring Training. The Detroit Tigers prepared for the season in Gulfport from 1913 to 1915, and the Atlanta Crackers of the Southern Association trained in nearby Bay St. Louis.

By 1922, the Cotton States League had been revived and in 1926 the Brookhaven (MS) Truckers moved to the Coast area to become the Gulfport Tarpons. The new franchise played on the same grounds in Gulfport, which had by then been built up to a fairground that seated 2,500 spectators. Despite the improved accommodations, Gulfport's population was simply too small to support a team. Ownership once again proposed an agreement with Biloxi to split the team, but Biloxi instead devoted their baseball funds toward the creation of a new facility in the hopes of attracting Spring Training teams. The Tarpons moved to El Dorado, Arkansas to become the Lions before the 1929 season. Economic stress brought about by the Great Depression caused the Cotton States League to fold once again in 1932.

After its final brush with full-time professional baseball, the coast area became a frequent Spring Training site for several Major and Minor league teams in the days before the Cactus and Grapefruit Leagues. The Baltimore Orioles and Albany Senators of the International League called Gulfport their southern home, as did the aforementioned Atlanta Crackers. The new stadium in Biloxi, built on Naval Reserve land populated with oak trees for ship construction, hosted the Casey Stengel-managed Toledo Mud Hens (American Association) for its first two springs. Joe Cronin and the major league Washington Senators (American League) occupied Biloxi Stadium for the next six springs, including their pennant-winning 1933 season (The last pennant for any D.C. baseball team until the 2019 Washington Nationals World Series Title). The Milwaukee Brewers of the American Association, market predecessors of the current Shuckers parent club, trained in Biloxi in 1937 before the Philadelphia Phillies (National League) closed out the Spring Training era in 1938. In 1941, the land surrounding Biloxi Stadium was claimed by the Department of War for the construction of Keesler Air Force Base.

Several semi-pro teams kept baseball alive in Biloxi, Gulfport and D'Iberville in the years that followed, and Biloxi hosted the Southern Negro League's Biloxi Dodgers from the 1940s to the 1980s. After the turn of the 21st century, an effort spearheaded by Biloxi native and former MLB catcher Barry Lyons scheduled regular exhibition games between local teams in order to generate interest in a revival of professional baseball.

Though preliminary efforts to move a Southern League franchise to Biloxi were put on hold after the devastation of Hurricane Katrina, allocation of funds from a BP response grant following an oil spill allowed for the construction of a state-of-the-art stadium in downtown Biloxi. With a home in place, the sale of the Huntsville Stars to food services executive Ken Young on December 18, 2014 brought a team to MGM Park and began a new era of Biloxi baseball. An exciting 2015 season saw the Biloxi Shuckers reach the Southern League championship and 2016 was highlighted by an exhibition game against the Milwaukee Brewers, the first visit by an MLB team since 1937.

### ROBERT J. GILKS, 78, OLD BASEBALL STAR

BRUNSWICK, Ga., Aug. 21 (AP) —Robert J. (Bobby) Gilks, former scout for the New York Yankees and a Southern Association manager, died at his home near here last night at the age of 78.

In 1903, 1904 and 1906 he piloted the Shreveport club of the Southern Association, and in 1914, the Montgomery team in the same league.

For many years Mr. Gilks was Southern section scout for the Yankees, being succeeded in 1923 by Johnny Nee, present scout. George Pipgras, noted Yankee pitcher and now an umpire in the American League, was one of the outstanding players signed by Mr. Gilks.

Mr. Gilks was one of the "Old Orioles," having played with Baltimore in the National League in 1892 and 1893 when John J. McGraw, Willie Keeler and Joe Kelley and Wilbert Robinson were breaking in as youngsters. One of his teammates was Bill Clarke, the veteran baseball coach at Princeton.

Before playing in Baltimore, however, Mr. Gilks had become famous as a pitcher and outfielder at Cleveland. He was the first outfielder to make the play—regarded then as most daring—of trapping a ball to gain a force play on the bases. He was so skillful at it that he figured in double plays on many occasions. He was also one of the first outfielders to make an unassisted double play.

Mr. Gilks was the first player to make two two-base hits with the bases full in one game, performing the feat on Aug. 5, 1890, at Cleveland. It has been equaled only three times in fifty-four years.

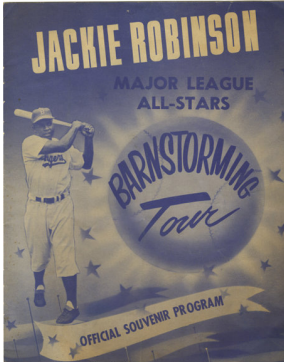

## 1953 JACKIE ROBINSON BARNSTORMING TOUR

During the 1953 offseason, Jackie Robinson embarked on what would be his final barnstorming tour, and made a stop in Biloxi on November 2, 1953. The tour went through 32 cities across Virginia, North Carolina, Tennessee, Alabama, Mississippi, Louisiana and Florida.

On the tour, Robinson played against a team of Negro League All-Stars. His team featured plenty of Major Leaguers, including 2022 Hall of Fame inductee Gil Hodges, Luke Easter and Al Rosen of the Cleveland Indians, Bobby Young of the Baltimore Orioles and Ralph Branca of the Detroit Tigers.

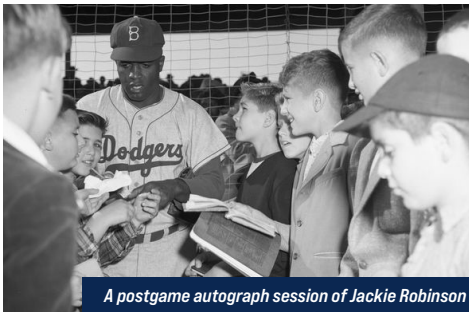
Robinson and his All-Stars got underway at eight p.m. on November 2, 1953 at the Lee Street Diamond. It was estimated by the Sun Herald that over 9,000 fans turned out to see the contest. Luke Easter hit a two-run homer in the bottom of the first inning and Jackie Robinson drove in Gil Hodges in the bottom of the eighth inning to give his All-Stars a 6-5 victory.

Already a National League MVP and five-time All-Star by the time he passed through Biloxi, Robinson would help the Dodgers to their first World Series title two years later, defeating the New York Yankees in seven games in the 1955 World Series.

Along with being retired by every team in Major League Baseball, Robinson's number 42 is the only number retired for the Biloxi Shuckers.

## Robinson Stars Edge Negro Nine 6 To 5 At Biloxi

Big Luke Easter of the Cleveland Indians blasted a home run, Gil Hodges of the Brooklyn Dodgers rapped a double off the boards, and Jackie Robinson drove in the winning run with a sharp single through the box Monday night as Jackie Robinson's All-Stars edged past the Negro League All-Stars 6-5, at Biloxi.

One of the largest crowds ever to witness any sport action on the Biloxi High School athletic field turned out to the Lee Street diamond to see the Big Leaguers in action. An announcement informed the fans that over 9,000 were in attendance.

Playing without the services of Al Rosen of the Cleveland Indians who had been listed on the roster, but who had not joined the team because of a back ailment, the Robinson Stars exploded for four runs in the first frame and added single tallies in the sixth and eighth to eke out their 6-5 verdict.

The Negro stars opened the scoring in the top half of the hello frame when they pushed across two runs with the aid of only one hit. A hit batsman, a single, a fielder's choice and two walks accounted for the runs.

But in the bottom half of the initial frame the crowd got its moneys worth when Luke Easter uncorked on a two-one pitch to send it sailing over the right field fence for a home run, the only four ply blast of the game.

Bobby Young, Baltimore Oriole (formerly St. Louis Browns) second baseman, had walked just prior to Easter's four master, so when Big Luke uncorked his powerful drive, the score was knotted at 2-2.

The Robinson squad went on to add two more runs in the first frame. Gil Hodges reached first on an error and scored on McNeil's double to right. McNeil later scored on Glenn's sharp single over second.

However, the Negro League stars caught up in the second frame when they pushed across two markers, and later took a brief lead in the sixth inning when they scored one more run.

Robinson's stars knotted the count in their half of the sixth with a single tally and scored the winning run in the eighth.

A fitting climax to the game came in the eighth when Hodges walked to open the inning, stole second, and scored on Robinson's sharp single through the box.

Entertainment was provided fans by King Tut, the Clown Prince of Baseball, who works with the Indianapolis Clowns during the regular season, and his sidekick, BeBop, a pocket size dwarf. Their antics provided the crowd with laughs when the game was progressing slowly.

Sidney Wasserman, road manager for the troupe, said that the Stars would probably make Biloxi a regular stop on the winter circuit in the future. He said that he was well pleased with the turnout and that Biloxi's ball diamond was as good as he had seen in the south.



## BILOXI DODGERS (SOUTHERN NEGRO LEAGUE)

The Negro Southern League, sometimes known as the Gulf Coast Negro League, operated as a semi-professional league from 1936 to 1986, with league entrants from Mobile, Alabama to Jackson, Mississippi. The Biloxi Dodgers, Pascagoula Merchants, Moss Point Monarchs and Gulfport Angels represented the Coast area in the league.

The Biloxi Dodgers played their home games at Lee Street Diamond on the land currently occupied by the southern end of the Ray and Joan Kroc Corps and Community Center, generally playing doubleheaders on Sundays between 2 p.m. and 8 p.m.. The Dodgers were owned by Roselle Horne, who ran and owned the Streamline Barber Shop. According to Roselle's daughter, Kay, "My dad ate and slept baseball. The barbershop was a hub to come and talk baseball."

Roselle had a color TV in the barber shop partially to bring in business but also so people could watch baseball on TV. Horne was a massive Los Angeles Dodgers fan, hence the reason for choosing the name for the Biloxi franchise. More than owning the team, Horne loved mentoring young men in the community and used the Dodgers to help do that.

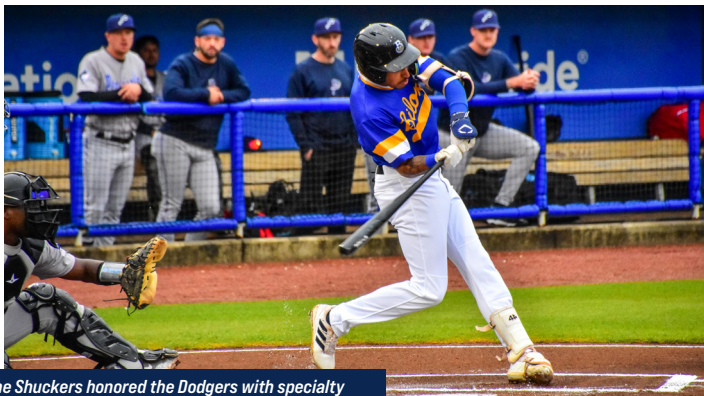
Many former Dodgers' players went on to professional success. Lionel Antoine played for the Dodgers before going on to play tight end at Southern Illinois. He was drafted third overall by the Chicago Bears in the 1972 Draft and was converted to offensive tackle. He played for the Bears from 1972 to 1978, appearing in 68 games, including 39 starts. Nathaniel Puryear, a right-handed pitcher, went to Stillman College after playing with the Dodgers and was selected in the second round of the 1976 draft by Cleveland. Puryear would pitch in the Southern League on two occasions, starting 20 games for the Chattanooga Lookouts in 1978 before returning to Chattanooga in 1982. The righty concluded his career in the Brewers' organization, pitching for Class-A Stockton in the California League in 1983.

The Dodgers also featured Johnny Thompson, Randolph 'Kitty Kat' Peyton, Shelby Barnes, Ephron Lee, Stanley Buckley, Gary Dronet and Kevin Burdine and were led for most of their time by manager William Windham.

The Negro Southern League holds the unique distinction of being integrated in reverse. Some white baseball players, like former Braves and Cardinals scout Lefty O'Neal, played on teams that were predominantly black in a transition period after Jackie Robinson broke the color barrier. O'Neal detailed his experience with the Biloxi Dodgers in his book "Dreaming of the Majors – Living in the Bush," in which he said "I will forever be grateful to Mr. Horne the barber, who was willing to break the color barrier and allow us to play for his team. He saw talent and didn't worry about color... A part of me will always be at Main Street and Lee Street, in Biloxi, Mississippi, and the players and fans will always have a special place in my heart."

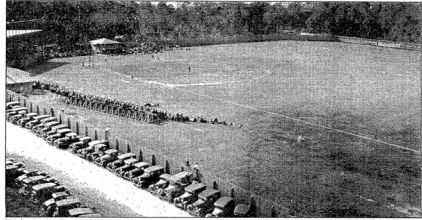

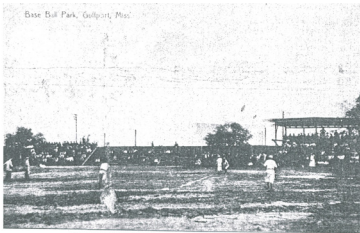

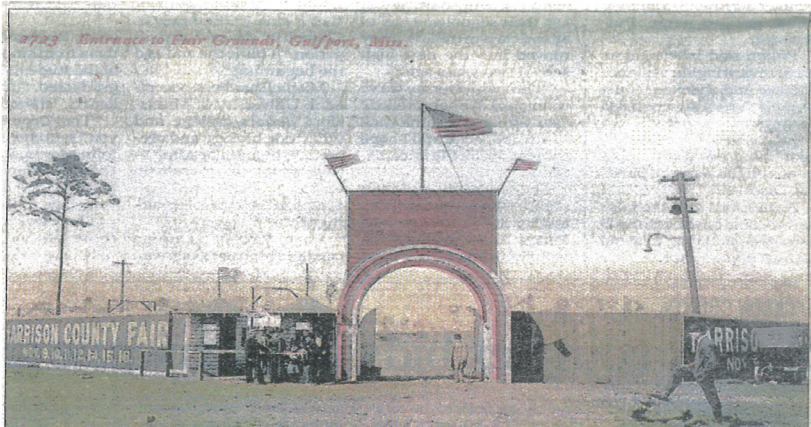
