DEES IS GOING NUTS: Excluding his season debut on 4/6 when he gave up a career-high 8 ER, Bailey Dees has pitched to a 2.65 ERA over his last 10 starts (16 ER in 54.1 IP), which ranks 4th in the Eastern League over that span (since 4/13). During this stretch, Dees has posted 56 K and 14 BB with batters hitting .226

SEIG' YA: Anthony Seigler enters today having homered in backto-back games, with each of his last two homers having served as the game-decisive hits in the Patriots' 4-1 win on Saturday and their 4-2 win on Sunday. Seigler has now homered six times this season, all coming over his last eight games dating back to 5/30, in which he is slashing .310/.333/.966 with 6 HR, 10 RBI and 9 R. Prior to this stretch, dating back to the beginning of last season, Seigler was batting .172 over his first 105 Double-A games with 5 HR. Seigler's 6 HR this season are already more than the five he hit during all of 2023, and are one shy off his career-high of 7 HR, which he accomplished over a career-high 97 games in 2022. **SUMMER OF AGUSTIN:** After his longest homerless drought since 2021 with the FCL Yankees (18 games). Agustin Ramirez broke out on Friday night with a three-homer game, signaling his first career multi-home run performance. Ramirez's 6 RBIs also tied a career-high mark (6/14/22, FCL). Ramirez's 15 homers this season lead all Double-A batters and are the second-most of any hitter in Minor League Baseball (including Ben Rice). One season after Ramirez set a career-high 18 HR in 114 games, he's hit 15 HR in 51 games this season. Ramirez is the first Patriot to homer three times in a game since Tyler Hardman (7/1/23 @BOW). JUNE OF JONES: Spencer Jones enters today having homered in three of his last four games and four of his last nine games. Over Jones' last nine games dating back to 5/31, he is 12-for-38 (.316) with 4 HR, 13 RBI, and 10 R. In the month prior to this stretch (4/30-5/30), Jones was hitting .140 (14-for-100) over 26 games with 47 K, 0 HR, 7 RBI and 9 R. Jones' 12 RBIs during the month of June are tied for the Eastern League lead. The Yankees' No. 2 prospect has reached safely in 21 of his last 22 games since 5/16 vs. POR.

DEFENSE WINS GAMES! Somerset snapped its season-long four-game losing streak on Friday night with a 12-4 win. During the losing streak, the Patriots allowed 16 stolen bases and committed 10 errors, which led to 10 unearned runs. This season, the Patriots are 13-24 in games where they commit at least one error. Contrastly, they are 15-5 in games where they do not commit an error this season.

2024 SOMERSET PATRIOTS COACHING STAFF

RAUL DOMINGUEZ: Manager (2nd year)

Raul Dominguez enters his second consecutive season as manager for the Somerset Patriots, 10th overall as a manager and 18th coaching in the Yankees organization. He led the 2023 Patriots to a Double-A best record of 84-53 and a +211 run differential, which ranked first among all MiLB teams. Under his leadership, the Patriots finished with the Eastern League's top record in both halves of the season and clinched their second straight playoff berth. In 2023, Dominguez became the third manager in Somerset Patriots Double-A franchise history and in 2024 he will become the first to serve as manager for more than one season. Before joining Somerset, Dominguez spent the prior two seasons (2021-2022) as a defensive coach for Triple-A Scranton/Wilkes-Barre. He previously served as defensive coach for Trenton (2018-2019) and Tampa (2017). The Panama City, Panama native gained prior managerial experience with the GCL Yankees East (2016), DSL Yankees 1 (2011-15) and DSL Yankees 2 (2009-10). From 2012-2015, his teams finished at least 10 games over .500, including reaching the DSL semifinals in 2012 and 2015.

KEVIN MARTIR: Hitting Coach (1st year)

Hitting coach Kevin Martir begins his first season in Somerset and fourth in the Yankees organization, after serving in the same position for High-A Hudson Valley in 2023 and Single-A Tampa for two seasons in 2021-22. He joined the Yankees organization in 2020 and had been scheduled to serve as hitting coach for former Rookie-Advanced level Pulaski, prior to the cancellation of the minor league season. Martir began his coaching career in 2019 as a development coach for the GCL Phillies East. Martir starred at catcher during his playing career at the University of Maryland (2013-15), where he was a semi-finalist for the Johnny Bench Award in 2015. Martir was drafted by the Houston Astros in the 18th round of the 2015 MLB Draft. He played two professional seasons for the Astros with Rookie-Advanced Greeneville in 2015 and Short-Season Class-A Tri-City in 2016. A native of Brooklyn, New York, Martir graduated from the Grand Street Campus in 2012, after transferring from Xaverian High School in Brooklyn prior to his senior year.

BRETT DeGAGNE: Pitching Coach (1st year)

Pitching coach Brett DeGagne begins his first season with Somerset and fourth year in the Yankees organization. After making his organizational coaching debut as the Single-A Tampa Tarpons' pitching coach in 2021, DeGagne most recently served as the FCL Yankees pitching coach in 2022 and 2023. In 2023, his staff led the Florida Complex League in strikeouts (587) and finished fourth in ERA (4.47). DeGagne was initially tabbed to be the DSL Yankees pitching coach in 2020, before the cancellation of the minor league season. DeGagne played college ball at the University of North Dakota from 2012-2016. He moved on to grad school at St. Cloud State University, where DeGagne also began his baseball coaching career. He served as the Huskies' pitching coach during the 2017-2018 seasons. He gained additional coaching experience in 2018 as the pitching coach for the Bismarck Larks of the Northwoods League. One year prior to joining the Yankees, in 2019 DeGagne took over as pitching coach for North lowa Area Community College.

AARON BOSSI: Defensive Coach (3rd year)

Aaron Bossi returns for his third consecutive season as the Patriots' defensive coach. Under Bossi's leadership in each of the past two seasons, infielders Jesus Bastidas (2B, 2022) and T.J. Rumfield (1B, 2023) were each awarded Rawlings Minor League Gold Gloves for their work in the field. Bossi has also overseen Somerset's baserunning program each of the last two seasons, leading the team to an Eastern League-best 205 stolen bases in 2022 and a Double-A-best 256 stolen bases in 2023. Bossi made his coaching debut as Hudson Valley's defensive coach in 2021. Prior to his coaching experience with the Yankees, he spent 2017-2019 assisting rehabbing players at the organization's minor league complex in Tampa. The St. Louis, Missouri native was signed as a non-drafted free agent by the Yankees on June 24, 2016 as a catcher/infielder. He played in 22 games for the GCL Yankees East in 2016.

Acquired: 2021 MLB Draft (18th round, pick 543)

2024: After posting a 3.03 career ERA as a reliever in his first three pro seasons over 122 IP in 81 apperances, this spring the Yankees approached Dees about transitioning to a starting role. "I was excited as soon as they asked me," Dees said. "I had started in college all four years, so I had done it in the past. I loved relieving, but I also loved starting in college, so it was just whatever they needed me to do... I guess just because of how they built me up during spring - things were going well and some of my pitches had improved a little bit," said Dees. "It was something that they came to me with and I just kind of had the attitude of whatever they need, I'm down."

2023: Began the season with High-A Hudson Valley, making 26 appearances and posting a 1.74 ERA with a 59/15 K/BB ratio. He was promoted to Double-A Somerset on 7/25 and finished the season over 16 games for the Patriots in which he posted a 4.29 ERA in 21.0 IP.

2022: Spent the bulk of his second pro season with Single-A Tampa, going 4-3 over 31 games, while posting a 3.31 ERA, 24 BB, 62 K and a 1.14 WHIP. In September, he was promoted to Hudson Valley for his final three appearances of the season, allowing 4 R (2 ER) over 5.2 IP with 2 BB and 8 K.

2021: Pitched three games in his pro debut season for the FCL Yankees, including his only career start prior to this season, combining to allow 5 R (2 ER) over 2.1 IP with 1 BB and 5 K.

College: Pitched four seasons at Penn State University, working primarily as a starter in 43 career games (33 starts) and going 8-9 with a 4.52 ERA with 64 BB and 176 K. He earned Academic All-Big Ten honors his sophomore, junior and senior seasons (2019-21).

Personal Notes: Attended Hough High School (NC) as a junior and senior, after transferring from Independence High School (NC) as a freshman and sophomore. As a freshman in 2014, he helped lead Independence to a conference championship, while guiding Hough to back-to-back conference championships in 2017 and 2018.

Career Notes: Selected by the Yankees in the 18th round of the 2021 MLB Draft, signed for \$50,000. Dees was the latest draft pick to sign with the Yankees out of the 2021 Draft.

Wegner rounded out his debut campaign with 19 games for the Renegades, over which he hit .254 with 2 HR and 6 RBI.

College: Wegner was a four-year starter at Creighton from 2019-22, before transferring to Arkansas

Contege. Weighter was a dual-year starter at clerginon from 2019-22, before transferring to Arkansas for his fifth year of eligibility. As a freshman, he earned All-Big East 2nd Team honors, batting .264 with 20 RBI and 1 HR, which came in the form of a grand slam in his first collegiate game. As a senior, he slashed .343/459/635 with a team-leading 11 HR and 53 RBI, earning All-Big East 1st Team honors. Overall in his four seasons for Creighton, he posted a .306 average and 14 HR. Within 30 minutes of entering the NCAA transfer portal, he was contacted by Arkansas assistant coach Nate Thompson. During his fifth college season at Arkansas in 2023, Wegner played in 43 game, missing 18 games due to a fractured thumb, and hit. 313 with an 1.130 OPS, 15 HR, and 51 RBI. In his lone season as a Razorback, Wegner's team won the 2023 SEC Championship in 2023, the school's fourth in program history, leading Arkansas to the No. 3 overall seed in the NCAA Tournament. He hit home runs in his final two college games in the Fayetteville Regional of the NCAA Tournament and was named a midseason All-American by D1Baseball.

Personal Notes: Three-sport athlete at Kearney High School (Kearney, NE), Wegner was ranked the No. 13 overall prospect in the state of Nebraska by Prep Baseball Report. Prior to high school, he represented Nebraska (Kearney Little League) in the 2012 Little League World Series with his father, Brad, serving as the team's head coach. He went 3-for-4 with a homer and 5 RBI in the state's first ever LLWS win, coming over Germany. During his graduate year at Arkansas, Wegner earned the nickname "Pops" from his teammates.

Career Notes: Selected in the ninth round of the 2023 MLB Draft by the Yankees, signing for \$72,500 as a senior-sign.

During the season, he saw action at second base for the first time in his career, playing in nine games at the position. 2022: Entering the 2022 season ranked as MLB Pipeline's No. 17 Yankees prospect, Vargas spent his first full season with Single-A Tampa, hitting. 203 in 100 games with a .583 OPS, 33 RBI, and 8 HR. He led the Tarpons in stolen bases (27) and runs (59).

2021: Ranked as the Yankees' No. 13 prospect by MLB Pipeline, Vargas spent all of 2021 season with FCL Yankees, playing in 42 games, hitting .273 with a .755 OPS, 3 HR, and 26 RBI. Vargas led the FCL in runs (37) and ranked fourth in stolen bases (17).

2019: Made professional debut for the Dominican Summer League Yankees on 6/1, where he played eight games and hit .289, ahead of a promotion to the Gulf Coast League on 6/24. Played in 40 games for the GCL Yankees-East, hitting .219 with 1 HR, 16 RBI and 14 BB to only 22 K. Vargas went a perfect 13-for-13 on the base paths in the GCL and he led the league with five triples. Vargas was promoted to Rookie-Advanced Pulaski for the 2019 Appalachian League Playoffs, appearing in one game: Game Three of the league's semifinals vs. the Burlington Royals, which was a 17-inning, five-hour, 19-minute game that the Royals won to send them to the league championship.

Career Notes: Vargas was expected to sign with the Reds as an international free agent, but Cincinnati

was penalized for exceeding their bonus pool money the prior signing period leaving them unable to sign a prospect to a contract above \$300,000. The Yankees swooped in to ink Vargas for \$2.5M on 8/1/18, dishing out the third-highest bonus in the class. The Yankees acquired the extra international pool money they needed for Vargas, the 8th-ranked prospect in the class, by sending Caleb Frare to the White Sox, and both Giovanny Gallegos and Chasen Shreve to the Cardinals. Vargas played for Matanzas in Cuba's 15U national league in 2016, batting .296/.395/.449 with 14 walks and eight strikeouts in 116 plate appearances. In 2017, he jumped to the 18U league as a 15-year-old. Vargas was part of the first signing class which allowed Cuban players to be signed by MLB teams without having to defect.
