LHP KOHL DRAKE (0-0, 6.75) vs. RHP TANNER GORDON (1-0, 0.00)

TODAY'S GAME: The Aces hold a 2-0 series lead after a 1-0 victory last night ... Tanner Gordon is slated to make his second start for the Isotopes while Kohl Drake is set to take the hill for the Aces.

1-0 AT RGCU FIELD: Last night's contest was just the third nine-inning 1-0 game at RGCU Field in team history (also: June 23, 2009, vs. Nashville, win; May 26, 2014, vs. Reno, loss). In the 2014 contest, Reno also scored their run on a non-hit (wild pitch).

GEORGIA BOY: Charlie Condon went 2-for-4 yesterday with a double and one punchout. He has a hit in four of five games while recording three multi-hit contests.

-Over his first five Triple-A games, Condon is 7-for-18 with two homers, one double, five RBI, three walks, seven strikeouts and one stolen base

-Among PCL leaders, he ranks 4th in slugging (.778) and OPS (1.278), T-5th in homers, 7th in total bases (14) and T-7th in average (.389)

STERLIN: Sterlin Thompson went hitless for the first time in five Triple-A games this season.

-In his last 95 Triple-A games dating back to May 9, 2025, he is slashing .334/.428/.583 with 25 doubles, seven triples, 16 homers and 59 RBI.

CC: Cole Carrigg went 0-for-4 with a strikeout last night, ending his four-game hit streak to begin his first Triple-A season. ... Has the second-most steals in the PCL with three.

TRIPLE-A DEBUT: Sean Sullivan made his Triple-A debut last night and tossed 4.2 frames of one-run ball while allowing four hits and two walks with eight punchouts, including seven-straight between the second and fourth innings.

RUNS ALLOWED: Albuquerque limited their opponent to one run for the second time in 2026 Wednesday (also: March 27 at Oklahoma City, 3-1 win).

-In 2025, the Isotopes held their opponents to one run or fewer just four times (two shutouts).

SHUTOUT: The Isotopes were shutout at home last night for the first since September 3, 2025, vs. Round Rock (3-0). Additionally, it's the eighth time Albuquerque has been shutout by Reno (last: June 22, 2019, at Reno, 1-0) and the fifth occurrence at RGCU Field (last: June 28, 2014, 2-0).

MLB REHAB: In his second rehab game with the Isotopes yesterday, Zac Veen went 0-for-3 with one strikeout. Over his first two contests, he is 0-for-7 with four punchouts.

-Blaine Crim, also in his second rehab game with the Isotopes, went 1-for-3 with a single last night. In two rehab contests, he is 2-for-6 with two singles and two strikeouts.

THE MACHINE: Vimael Machin collected three hits Tuesday, including a triple. Over his first three games with Albuquerque is 5-for-9 with a triple and four walks.

PUNCHOUTS: Albuquerque pitchers fanned 12 batters last night, the third-straight contest with double-digit strikeouts (last: August 19-21, 2025, vs. Las Vegas; 13, 10 and 14).

-The club has 49 strikeouts on the year, tied for second-most in the PCL.

-In the box, the Isotopes have struck out 40 times, the third-fewest in the PCL.

HOME TURF: The Isotopes have lost their first two home games of a season for the fourth time in team history (also: 2003, 2008, 2021).

RUNS SCORED: Albuquerque has scored just 14 runs on the year, second-fewest in all of Triple-A. Additionally, the club has scored just five runs in their last 31 innings at-bat.

PROSPECTS: Seven players on MLB.com's top 30 Rockies prospects list begin the year with Albuquerque: No. 2, UTL Charlie Condon; No. 6, UTL Cole Carrigg; No. 11, LHP Sean Sullivan; No. 14, LHP Welinton Herrera; No. 15, OF Sterlin Thompson; No. 16, RHP Gabriel Hughes; No. 22, LHP Carson Palmquist.

2026 FIRST-HALF SCHEDULE: The Isotopes will face eight teams over the 75-game first-half schedule, which ends June 21 ... Round Rock is the only opponent the club will not face in the first-half ... Albuquerque will play Oklahoma City 15 times over the first 75 games and six in the second-half of the season.

-Forty-five of Albuquerque's first 75 games will come against El Paso (18), Oklahoma City (15) and Sugar Land (12).

2025 ATTENDANCE: Albuquerque led the Pacific Coast League in total attendance in 2025 (493,849) for the third time in club history (2023 and 2024) while also pacing the circuit in average attendance (6,765) for the fourth time (2022, 2023, 2024).

NUCLEI NOTES

SKIPPER: Pedro Lopez enters his 22nd year as a minor league manager and fourth guiding the Isotopes. He is the eighth manager in club history and is in his sixth year overall with the club, becoming the longest-tenured coaching staff member in franchise history. Spent 2021 as Albuquerque's hitting coach and 2022 as its bench coach ... Notched his 1,000th career managerial victory June 4, 2023 at Salt Lake, when the Isotopes defeated the Bees 7-1 ... Managed in the Texas Rangers (2001-05, 2007) and New York Mets (2011-19) organizations while claiming the 2014 Eastern League Championship with Double-A Binghamton. Lopez was drafted in the 21st round by the San Diego Padres in the 1988 MLB Draft and spent 13 years in the minor leagues, reaching Triple-A on four occasions.

CRAIG BJORNSON: Begins his first season as Isotopes pitching coach, and 27th year in the professional coaching ranks ... Was previously in the Rockies organization from 2009-11 as the pitching coach for the Casper Ghosts of the Rookie Level Pioneer League ... Most recently spent three seasons in the Braves organization as a pitching coach (Triple-A Gwinnett, 2023), roving pitching instructor (2024) and bullpen coach (Gwinnett, 2025). Was in the Major Leagues as a bullpen coach for the Houston Astros (2012, 14-17) and Boston Red Sox (2018-20) ... Won back-to-back World Series championships with the Astros in 2017 and Red Sox in 2018 ... Spent a total of 13 seasons as a Minor League pitching coach from 1999-2011 in the Montreal/Washington, Kansas City, Los Angeles (NL), and Colorado organizations. Signed as a free agent by the Astros in 1991 and pitched for parts of three seasons in their Minor League system. Attended Arizona Western Junior College where he was teammates with Pedro Lopez, and also played collegiately at Nicholls State University.

LUIS LOPEZ: Joins Albuquerque as bench coach after spending the past four seasons in the same role with the Double-A Hartford Yard Goats ... Began his coaching career as a Minor League hitting coach in the Red Sox organization from 2008-11. Was the Braves' Minor League infield coordinator from 2012-17, then managed the Gulf Coast League Tigers in 2018 and 2019. Appeared in parts of 11 MLB seasons from 1993-2005 with San Diego, New York (NL), Milwaukee, Baltimore and Cincinnati.

MATT SNYDER: Enters his first season in the Colorado Rockies organization as the Isotopes hitting coach ... Previously had stints in the Marlins system as hitting coach with High-A Beloit (2021-22) and Double-A Pensacola (2023) before serving as Minor League hitting coordinator in 2024. Last season, he was the hitting coach for the High-A Jersey Shore Blue Claws in the Phillies organization ... Was a 10th round pick by the Yankees in 2012 and played eight Minor League seasons with New York-AL (2012-18) and Miami (2019). Reached Triple-A with New Orleans in 2019.

HOSHI MIZUTANI: Returns to the Isotopes for his sixth season, becoming the longest tenured athletic trainer in team history. On September 19, 2025, Mizutani was awarded Minor League Trainer of the Year for the Pacific Coast League. He is in his ninth year in the Rockies organization.

SPLIT-SEASON PLAYOFF FORMAT: For the fourth-straight year, the Pacific Coast League will use a split-season format to determine playoff participants. With one 10 team division, the first half winner (concluding June 21) will host the second half winner (beginning June 23) in a three-game set. The winner will then face the International League champion for the Triple-A Championship in Las Vegas, NV, on September 26. The Isotopes have not reached the playoffs since 2012, tied with Charlotte for the second-longest drought among all 30 Triple-A teams. Only Louisville has gone longer without reaching the postseason, as they last qualified in 2010.
