Today's Game

The Clippers will send RHP Jean Carlos Mejia to the mound today, making his first start since getting optioned on 8/8. Toledo will counter with RHP Drew Hutchison. The Clippers are 31-37 (.456) against right handers this year. Hutchison has faced the Clippers 12 times in his career, going 4-5 with a 4.41ERA (69.1IP, 59H, 35R, 34ER, 32BB, 68K).

vs. the Mud Hens

Columbus is 7-12 opposing the Mud Hens this season, but managed a 4-2 series when they met in HP (6/15-6/20). Individually, Nolan Jones has hit .338 (22x65) with 3HR and 11RBI against Toledo this year (19G), while Yu Chang has hit .313 (31x99) with 5HR and 17RBI in his career (26G). Renato Nunez has 6HR against the Clippers this year, Yariel Gonzalez and Aderlin Rodriguez have 5HR.

Be Reasonable

Over the last 30G, the Clippers have pitched five shutouts and gone 2-3 in games after a shuout (gave up zero total runs in both wins after a shutout; 30 total runs in losses after a shutout, at least nine in each). In the 25G in which the Clippers have allowed runners to score (195 total, 7.8 per), they have given up at least nine on 12 occasions (had three shutouts, 9G with 9+ runs through first 53).

Knockout Blows

The Mud Hens missed the extra point in the 4th last night, but the six they did put on the board was enough to seal the victory. Since 7/8, opponents have had eight innings of 5+ runs (49 multi-run innings in 248 times at bat) against just one such inning for the Clippers (36 multi-run innings in 250 times at bat). In innings 1-4 of the 28G in question (112 total innings), the Clippers have been outscored 112-73.

One Thousand

Coming into today's game, opponents are on the doorstep of 1,000 homers hit at Huntington Park with 998HR in 12 seasons (includes playoffs). In Toledo's first visit to Columbus, 6/15-6/20, the Mud Hens had games of 5HR (6/16) and 4HR (6/20) on the way to piling up 12HR in the series. In the last 16G at home, Clipper pitching has given up 31HR with two 0HR games (7/22 vs. lowa, 8/8 vs. Omaha).

Welcome Back

Daniel Johnson and Yu Chang have each hit in all 3G since returning from the taxi squad on 8/7, going a combined 9x26 (.346) with 2HR and 7RBI. Johnson is slugging 1.000 over the course of his 3G, turning in a pair of doubles, a triple and a HR (only one single). In addition, Johnson has drawn a pair of walks (.500OBP) to go against 3K (Chang has 7K, half of his AB).

Month On, Month Off

Beginning on 8/4, Nolan Jones has four multi-hit games in his last six, batting .435 (10x23) with 2HR and 6RBI. In the month prior, 7/4-8/3, Jones hit .172/.287/.368 with 5HR and 11RBI over 25G. For the month from 6/4-7/3, he hit .292/.411/.573 with 3HR and 17RBI in 27G (also had 14 doubles) and from opening day to 6/3, he struggled to .173/.313/.272 with a HR and 7RBI in 24G.

Rarified Air-ias

Gabriel Arias enters today riding a 20G on base streak that has seen a couple of close calls recently (.402OBP since 7/18; singled in 10th on 8/6, in 9th on 8/5). His streak is one off his career best (7/19-8/12/18 with Fort Wayne) and started with him tying his career best with a 9G hit streak from 7/18-7/28. Since 6/12, Arias is hitting .321 (59x184) and has reached base safely in 43 of 48G (.376OBP).


Brooks is Back

Starting with a hitless game in which he drew 3BB, Trenton Brooks has put together a 10G on base streak since 7/30 in Nashville (.4520BP). He has a hit in eight of the 10 (.343, 12x35) and has 4XBH (.967SLG), including last night's homer (first since 7/22 vs. lowa). Following a 2HR game at lowa on 6/10, his last 5HR have come in Huntington Park (last 9HR from Nolan Jones have been at home).

Bullpen Bashers

The Clipper bullpen (Logan Allen) recorded 5.0IP with 0ER on Sunday, marking the 12th time this year the relievers have had at least 5.0IP and 0ER (no other IL team has more than eight such games). However, only one of those games has come against Toledo (5/18, first matchup), as the Mud Hens have pounded the Clipper bullpen to a 6.60ERA in the last 18G (76.1IP, 56ER)

This Date in Clipper History

Andy Stankiewicz ended a 17-inning marathon against the Pawtucket Red Sox by singling in the winning run of a 3-2 game. Stankiewicz wore a Clippers uniform during the 1988, '90, '91, '93, '99 and 2000 seasons, playing in 452 games for Columbus (5th most in franchise history). He ranks among the Clippers' all-time leaders in hits (10th, 368), runs (7th, 211), triples (tied 4th, 17) and stolen bases (tied 5th, 74).

Huntington (Small) Park

In each of the first 11 years since the move downtown, Huntington Park has ranked among the top two in the IL in homers per game, totaling 2.25 per contest (1,763HR, 783 games). In 2019, HP averaged over three per game for the first time ever (seventh time averaging over a pair), as the Clippers surrendered a record 127HR and just missed out on triple digits themselves (97HR was second highest team total). Including the postseason, the Clippers have been out-homered over the life of the park (998 to 953).

Homers, Homers and More Homers

The franchise record for homers was destroyed in 2019 (213, +31 from '83), as was the record for homers allowed (198, +42 from '98). This season's Clippers are homering at a rate of 1.29 per game, putting them two off of the pace of the pre-2019 record (adjusted for 140G). On the mound they are allowing 1.53 per game, enough to beat the pre-2019 record by 40, even with the shortened season.

Ain't Over 'Til It's Over

From 2014-19, no team had more come from behind victories than the 210 posted by Columbus and no team produced a better winning percentage when trailing than the .353 of the Clippers (Scranton/WB was 2nd in percentage, .338, and wins, 192). This year has seen the Clippers go 16-46 (.258) in games in which they trail, ranking 11th.

Not Close

The Clippers have suffered the most losses by at least a grand slam in the IL (27; six in 10G from 7/8-7/19) and rank tied for last in wins by at least that many (12, Norfolk). That poor ratio has led to a -91 run differential (had a -50 differential over 10G from 7/8-7/19), a figure that places them 12th in the IL (Charlotte, -92; Norfolk, -93).

Get What You Pay For

Columbus was the last team in the IL to play free baseball this season, playing 85 straight games, including the postseason, between extra-inning rumbles on 7/31/19 vs. Louisville and 6/26/21 vs. St. Paul. The Clippers were also the last team to win an extra-inning game, toppling Omaha on 8/6 (snapped 5G losing streak in extras). The 85G regulation-inning streak was the longest for Columbus dating to the 1984 season (as far back as the day by day records go), as was 45 straight to start a season.

Trending Downward

The current staff ERA of 5.55 is on pace to be the worst in franchise history (5.08, 1983) and anything over 4.71 will mark the fifth straight season in which the ERA has gotten worse. From 2011-16, the Clipper staff turned in a sub-4.00ERA five times in six seasons (zero such seasons from 1993-2010), including the best two ERAs of the past 32 years (3.33 in 2015 and 3.65 in 2016). The 5.89ERA at Huntington Park is the worst ever (5.29 in 2019, only time ERA has ever been over 5.00 at HP).

Under Control

After three straight seasons leading the IL in strikeouts, the Clipper lineup is not threatening for a fourth, as they are currently 75K off the lead. To begin the season, they were averaging as many as 10 per game through the first 38G, but that has cooled considerably in recent weeks (8.57K per game since 7/6). The 2019 squad obliterated the franchise record, as they struck out 95 more times than the previous high (1,392; each of last three seasons rank among franchise's three worst, totalling 3,979K in 422G).

Defense Doesn't Win Anything

When playing errorless baseball, the Clippers have a winning percentage that is marginally higher (.477, 21-23) than when they make a mistake in the field (.410, 16-23). After an exceptional defensive run from 2015-2019, in which the fielding percentage was never below .983 and the team never committed more than 88E, the 2021 team is on pace to botch 89 plays (adjusted for 140G season, have not had triple digits in errors since six straight seasons from 2009-14) with a fielding percentage of .982.

One On, No Out Success

When the leadoff batter of an inning reached base in 2019, the Clippers plated him nearly 60% of the time (over 51% only once in the last six seasons, 55% in 2016). Getting more than one base was a specialty of Clipper hitters, as they led the IL with 136XBH to lead off the inning, including 54HR (led the IL, had 28 leadoff homers in 2018). So far in 2021, the Clippers are scoring the leadoff batter 52% of the time he reaches, with the leadoff batter scoring himself 25 times (on pace for 39HR).

Andres Gimenez advanced a runner with a sac bunt on 7/25 vs. lowa and the runner came around to score in the win (4-1 when advanced runner scores). During 2019, the Clippers struggled in the bunt department, but when the advanced runners scored, they were 7-1. During 2018, Columbus was 23-2 in games in which a run was scored after a good bunt attempt.

No Difference

Through the first half of the season, in which the IL played with 18-inch bases (shortening the distance between bases by a whopping 4.5 inches), the Clippers saw a combined average of 1.71 stolen base attempts in their games (averaged 1.73 attempts per game over five seasons from 2015-19). However, since going back to normal bases, steal attempts are at 1.92 per game.

Manager Profile

Andy Tracy makes his Clippers debut in 2021, following Tony Mansolino's championship rookie year in 2019 (sixth Clipper skipper to win Governors' Cup in first season; Gene Michael-'79, Joe Altobelli-'80, Frank Verdi-'81, Bucky Dent-'87 and Mike Sarbaugh-'10). This season marks Tracy's second year as a manager (first with Williamsport in the Philadelphia system), as he holds a career record of 67-92 (.421), 37-46 with Columbus (.446).

Another Debut:

Mejia's first start of the year came in the team's second game, marking the second straight night they used a starter that had never pitched above High-A (**Kirk McCarty**). Mejia then went on to make his Major League debut on 5/21 vs. Minnesota (2.1IP, 1H, 5K), becoming the 5th of 11 Clippers to debut in MLB this season.

In Cleveland:

After two games above High-A, Mejia was promoted to Cleveland on 5/18, where he made his first three Big League appearances in relief (5.0IP, 1H, 0R, 0ER, 1BB, 7K). Mejia ran his scoreless innings streak to 8.0 with his first MLB start on 6/4 at Baltimore, but then was battered for 12ER in 9.2IP over 3GS from 6/9-6/18. A quality start on 6/24 at Minnesota netted a no-decision (6.0IP, 1ER) and he gave up 12ER in 6.2IP over his next 2GS, both losses, before getting optioned to Columbus on 7/8. Mejia's second stint (7/19-8/8) was even worse, going 0-3 with an 11.12ERA over 4GS (17.0IP, 25H, 21ER, 12BB, 16K).
