BELOIT BULLETPOINTS

COMING DOWN THE HOME STRETCH: The Beloit Snappers split their series with the Cedar Rapids Kernels thanks to a pair of key wins over the weekend. The Snappers' "tragic number" is 11, meaning any combination of 11 wins by Cedar Rapids and losses for Beloit will eliminate them from playoff contention.

TODAY'S STARTER: Josh Simpson will make his third start of his professional career tonight in the series opener against the Wisconsin Timber Rattlers. Simpson pitched 3 1/3 innings in his first High-A start against Cedar Rapids last Tuesday. In those 3 1/3 innings, he gave up two hits, two walks, one earned run, and struck out five Kernels. With Beloit, Simpson is 0-1 with a 5.34 ERA across 15 games. He's pitched 30 1/3 total innings with 26 hits, 18 earned runs, 12 walks, and 40 strikeouts. He missed nearly two months on the IL prior to his return last week.

VS TIMBER RATTLERS: The Beloit Snappers opened the season at Fox Cities Stadium against the Timber Rattlers and went 2-4. Connor Scott carried the Snappers offense in that series, hitting .360. On the season, Beloit is 9-9 against the Timber Rattlers. The last time these two teams played was on August 3rd through the 8th at ABC Supply Stadium. For the first series in their brand-new ballpark, the Snappers won four of the six games.

NO ONE BETTER: The Beloit Snappers have the best pitching staff in the entire High-A Central over the last 30 days. The Snappers have a team ERA of 3.36 in those last 30 days, which ranks top in the league. Their 1.16 WHIP ranks best in the league. Opposing teams are batting a league-low .207 against Beloit in the last month.

2021 Snappers Coaching Staff

Mike Jacobs - Manager

Jacobs enters his fourth season as a Minor League manager following a seven-year career in the Major Leagues as a first baseman. He managed the Batavia Muckdogs, then the Marlins Class-A Short Season affiliate in 2017 and 2018, and the Clinton LumberKings in the Midwest League in 2019. Under his tutelage, the LumberKings reached the Midwest League finals in 2019. He was set to manage the Jupiter Hammerheads, then the Marlins High-A affiliate in 2020 prior to the cancelation of the season.

As a player, Jacobs made his Major League debut with the New York Mets during the 2005 season, becoming the first recorded player in Major League history to hit four home runs in his first four career games. Following the season, he was traded to the Florida Marlins as the centerpiece of a trade package for All-Star slugger Carlos Delgado. Over the next three seasons with the Marlins, Jacobs hit 69 home runs and drove in 224 runs, including hitting 32 home runs during the 2008 season. He finished his MLB career following stops with Kansas City and Arizona and an additional season with the Mets with 100 career home runs and a .253/.313/.473 slash line.

Bruce Walton - Pitching Coach

Bruce Walton pitched four seasons at the Major League level from 1991 to 1994, appearing with Oakland, Montreal, and Colorado. In total, Walton played 11 seasons as a professional, including 10 in the Major and Minor Leagues and one with the then-independent St. Paul Saints.

Walton began his coaching career in 2002 as the bullpen coach for the Toronto Blue Jays, a position he held through 2009 before becoming the team's pitching coach from 2010-2012. Walton served as the Triple-A Iowa Cubs pitching coach in 2014 and joined the Miami Marlins organization in 2018, serving as pitching coach for the Jupiter Hammerheads in 2018 and the Jacksonville Jumbo Shrimp in 2019.

Matt Snyder - Hitting Coach

Matt Snyder will begin his professional coaching career in 2021 as the hitting coach for the Snappers. A 10th round selection in 2012 MLB Draft by the New York Yankees, Snyder played professionally from 2012-2019, reaching Triple-A as a first baseman. Snyder played in the Yankees organization for six seasons and finished his playing career with the New Orleans Baby Cakes, then the Marlins Triple-A affiliate in 2019. A three-time All-Star in the Minor Leagues, Snyder hit .278 and reached base at an impressive .360 clip across 245 games in his playing career.

Chris Briones - Defensive Coach

Chris Briones will serve as the defensive coach for the Snappers in 2021 after working as a catching coordinator with the Texas Rangers organization from 2012-2018. Prior to his coaching career, Briones played professionally from 1995-2003 including four seasons in the Minor Leagues in the Rangers and Padres farm systems and five seasons in independent baseball.
