TODAY'S GAMES: The Space Cowboys begin their 2024 season on the road as they face off with their in-state rival, the Round Rock Express, the Triple-A affiliate of the Texas Rangers. It is the first of 27 games in 2024 against the Express, the most common opponent for Sugar Land in 2024. The Space Cowboys will also play 15 of their first 48 games against Round Rock, including 12 of their first 24 at home.

EXHIBITION SEASON: Before the start of the regular season, the Space Cowboys took on the Houston Astros in a two-game exhibition match up on Monday and Tuesday night... Sugar Land won the first game, 3-1, thanks to a go-ahead RBI double from Justin Dirden and 4.0 innings of one-run pitching from RHP Rhett Kouba, who struck out five batters... Quincy Hamilton hit a lead-off home run in the top of the first inning on Wednesday, but behind offensive outbursts from their starters, the Astros topped Sugar Land 7-3.

NEW LOOK SPACE COWBOYS: The Space Cowboys return just four players from their 2023 Opening Day roster: RHP Misael Tamarez, C Luke Berryhill, OF Justin Dirden and OF Pedro León.

HOME GROWN TALENT: Sugar Land's Opening Day roster has 13 players that were drafted by the Astros, five free agent signings, three players acquired in trades, two international free agents, one MiLB Rule 5 Draft pick and one undrafted free agent.

PROSPECTING: The Space Cowboys open the 2024 season with six of the Astros' Top 30 prospects per MLB Pipeline, including: RHP Spencer Arrighetti (#3), OF/INF Joey Loperfido (#6), RHP Rhett Kouba (#14), INF Will Wagner (#15), OF Pedro León (#26) and RHP Misael Tamarez (#30).

SERIES-OUSLY SPEAKING: Sugar Land embarks on a new season after going 6-15-2 in six-game series in 2023, 0-1 in seven-game series and 1-1 in three-game series... The Space Cowboys went 4-8-1 overall at Constellation Field in 2023... Sugar Land's opening series of 2024 is a three-game series, one of two three-game series for the Space Cowboys in 2024.

LOWDOWN ON LOPERFIDO: After a breakout 2023 campaign, OF Joey Loperfido was named the Astros Minor League Player of the Year by Astros Player Development and *Baseball America*. The 24-year-old combined to hit .278 in 124 games with 27 doubles, 3 triples, 25 home runs, 78 RBI, 79 runs scored and 27 stolen bases.

Loperfido led the Astros' organization in hits (130), extra-base hits (55) and doubles (27) while finishing 2nd in home runs (25), RBI (78) and total bases (238), 3rd in average (.278), slugging percentage (.510) and OPS (.880), T-3rd in runs scored (79), 4th in OBP (.370) and walks (65) & 5th in stolen bases (27).

As a non-roster invitee to Spring Training, Loperfido stayed in Major League camp until Sunday, the final day of Spring Training. In 18 games, Loperfido went 13-for-34 (.382) with five doubles, a triple, 7 RBI, 5 runs scored, 7 walks and a stolen bases.

ON THE ROAD AGAIN: For a fourth consecutive season, the Sugar Land Space Cowboys open their Pacific Coast League campaign on the road... Sugar Land was in El Paso to begin 2023, at Sacramento to start 2022 and played their first game as the Triple-A affiliate of the Houston Astros on May 4, 2021 at Albuquerque.

ABOUT THE OPENING DAY RECORD: Since joining the affiliated ranks in 2021, the Space Cowboys are 1-2 on Opening Day.

BOMBS AWAY: INF Shay Whitcomb took home the Joe Bauman Award in 2023, given annually to the Minor League leader in home runs. Whitcomb launched 35 home runs in 2023, tying with Minnesota Twins farmhand Yunior Severino for the MiLB lead in home runs... Whitcomb was named the winner by having more RBI than Severino, which served as the tie breaker.

His 35 home runs were the most home runs for an Astros' Minor Leaguer since Kyle Tucker hit 34 in 2019 with Round Rock. Additionally, with 102 total RBI, Whitcomb was just the 7th Astros' farm hand with over 100 RBI since 2014 (Justin Dirden, 101 in 2022; AJ Reed in '18 (108), '17 (104) & '15 (127); Matt Duffy, 101 in 2015; J.D. Davis, 101 in 2015)... He was also one of just 10 players in MiLB with at least 100 RBI last season.

The 25-year-old infielder led the Astros' organization in home runs, RBI (102) and total bases (253) and was 2nd in Hits (129) & extra-base hits (54), T-3rd in runs scored (79), 5th in slugging (.470) & 9th in OPS (.771).

BEST WEEK OF MY LIFE: INF Will Wagner was promoted to Sugar Land for the last week of the season in 2023 and had one of the best weeks of his young career, going 15-for-26 (.577) with three doubles and four RBI in six games... Wagner reached safely in all six games with Sugar Land, hitting safely in five of them with five multi-hit games, totaling 15 hits, the most in MiLB during that week... He registered a pair of four-hit games and knocked a walk-off single to cap one of his four-hit nights... For his performance, Wagner was named the Pacific Coast League Player of the Week.

QUITE AN IMPRESSION IN SPRING: Along with Loperfido, several other members of the Space Cowboys impressed as non-roster invitees in Major League Spring Training... INF Jesús Bastidas batted .333 (6-for-18) with a double in 17 games, OF Quincy Hamilton hit .300 (6-for-20) with 2 triples, 3 RBI and 2 stolen bases and OF Pedro León went 7-for-25 (.280) with 2 home runs, 4 RBI and 2 stolen bases in 2 attempts.

RIDE THE BIKE!: On June 24, 2023, OF Pedro León hit for the cycle in reverse order, homering in the 3rd, tripling in the 5th, doubling in the 7th and singling in the 8th... It is the first cycle in Space Cowboys history and the first for León at any level in his career... The La Habana native also reached on a walk and a hit by pitch and scored all six times he reached, setting a new single-game record for runs scored in Space Cowboys history.

SEEING 20-20-20: Both Pedro León (23 2B, 21 HR) and Joey Loperfido (27 2B, 25 HR) posted seasons in 2023 in which they had at least 20 doubles and 20 home runs while stealing at least 20 bases (León - 21; Loperfido - 27)... They were two of just 23 players in Minor League Baseball to have at least 20 doubles, 20 homers and 20 stolen bases, with Corpus Christi OF Kenedy Corona joining them (21 2B, 22 HR, 32 SB)... INF Shay Whitcomb came just one double shy of joining that group, but along with León and Loperfido was one of just 33 players with at least 20 steals and 20 home runs.

UN DULCE IDENTIDAD: As part of MiLB's 'Copa de la Diversión,' the Space Cowboys will once again rebrand on multiple occasions in 2024 as "Los Dulces de Sugar Land." The name is to honor the Latino community's contribution to the foundation and growth of the City of Sugar Land, which are as real as the sugar that gives our hometown its name. The primary logo of 'Los Dulces de Sugar Land,' is vibrant and features a watermelon candy capped in a flame of chamoy and chili powder.

WHERE TO FIND US: All 150 Space Cowboys games can be heard once again be heard on ESPN 92.5 FM (Gow Media). An audio streaming link is also available at slspacecowboys.com. All Space Cowboys games can be seen on MiLB.TV, MLB.TV, the MiLB App and on Bally Live. Garrett Greene returns for his second season as the primary play-by-play broadcaster for Sugar Land and will be on the call for all 150 games. He'll be joined at home and on select road games by Gerald Sanchez, who continues in his fourth season calling games for Sugar Land.

NOW HERE'S A STOREY: Mickey Storey returns for his fifth season as the manager of the Astros' Triple-A affiliate and his fourth with Sugar Land, continuing as the only manager in Sugar Land's history since they became affiliated with the Astros. Storey joined the Astros organization as a coach in 2016 and has managed with Single-A Quad Cities (2018) and Triple-A Round Rock (2019), along with three seasons in Sugar Land. Storey appeared in nine seasons at the professional level as a right-handed pitcher, including stints at the Major League level with the Astros (2012) and Blue Jay (2013). He appeared in four collegiate seasons at Florida Atlantic and was selected by the Oakland Athletics in the 31st round of the 2008 MLB Draft.

REST OF THE CREW: Joining manager Mickey Storey on the Space Cowboys coaching staff are pitching coach Thomas Whitsett, hitting coach Aaron Westlake and development coach Wladimir Sutil. Whitsett enters his first season as the Space Cowboys pitching coach, replacing Erick Abreu, who joined the Atlanta Braves in 2024 as their bullpen coach. Whitsett was the Astros' Assistant Pitching Coordinator in 2023 and served as the Pitching Coach for Double-A Corpus Christi in 2022. He also worked as a pitching coach for Single-A Fayetteville in 2019 before spending a year out of the Astros organization as the director of player development for pitching at the University of Arizona in 2021. Westlake returns for his second season as Sugar Land's hitting coach and previously was the hitting coach in Double-A Corpus Christi in 2022 and a development coach for the Florida Gulf Coast League Astros in 2021. Sutil enters his third season on the Space Cowboys staff after serving as the manager for the Astros' Florida Complex League team in 2021. He's worked as a manager for Astros affiliates at the Short-Season and Gulf Coast League levels, joining the organization as a coach in 2014.

A LITTLE ABOUT US: Through its first nine seasons, Sugar Land played in the independent Atlantic League of Professional Baseball. They won the Atlantic League Championship in '16 and '18 and appeared in the postseason in five of nine seasons. Sugar Land still holds Atlantic League single-season records for wins (95) and winning percentage (.679) from its '13 season. Sugar Land was managed by former Major Leaguers Gary Gaetti (2012-17) and Pete Incaviglia (2018-20). As an independent team, Sugar Land went 601-502. Notable people to appear for Sugar Land include: LHP Scott Kazmir, RHP Roger Clemens, IF Rafael Palmeiro, Tracy McGrady, IF James Loney, C Derek Norris, OF Willy Taveras and RHP Felipe Paulino.
