LHP Jay Groome (NR) vs. RHP Karl Kauffmann (NR)

TODAY'S GAME: Albuquerque looks to even the series after dropping a 6-5 decision in the season opener last night against the Chihuahuas ... Karl Kauffmann is expected to make the start for the Isotopes while Jay Groome is slated to take the hill for El Paso ... With an Isotopes loss in tonight's contest, El Paso will claim its first series victory since taking six of seven in Albuquerque from Sept. 6-11, 2022 (Chihuahuas won first six games of set).

OPENING NIGHT: With the loss last night, the Isotopes fall to 11-10 all-time on Opening Night ... Albuquerque has dropped five of its last six season openers and eight of their last 10.

HOME OPENERS: At Isotopes Park on Opening Night, the club dropped to 6-4 all-time and have lost three-straight season openers in Albuquerque ... All-time, the Isotopes are 14-7 in their first contest at BGC Field

ONE-RUN GAME: The one run loss yesterday drops Albuquerque to 2-3 in one-run games on Opening Night (last: 2022, loss 3-2 at Oklahoma City)

MR. VOLUNTEER: Jordan Beck recorded two hits last night, including his first Triple-A home run in the fourth inning to center field that left the bat at 104.0 MPH. Additionally, he tallied his first Triple-A hit during his first at-bat in the second frame, a line drive single up the middle that registered at 108.6 MPH. ... All three of Beck's batted balls in play had exit velocities of 90 MPH or higher.

EXIT VELO: Out of the nine batted balls registered at 100 MPHplus in the opener, the Isotopes recorded eight of them. Hunter Goodman tallied the highest exit velocity: 110.1 MPH, a double ... Four of them went for extra-bases (three doubles, one homer)

BOUCHIE THE BRUIN: Sean Bouchard swatted two hits last night, including a double, while driving in a run. Dating back to last year with the Rockies, four of his last five contests have been of the multi-hit variety.

FAN FAVORITE: Coco Montes also recorded two hits yesterday. Over his last 15 games dating back to 2023 (all with the Isotopes), he has registered a hit in 14 of them. During the stretch, he's batting .333 (22x66) with three doubles, three homers and 16

RUNS IN A FRAME: All five of Davis' runs came in the secondthe second-most most tallies allowed in a frame on Opening Night (most: 6, 5th in 2014 at Tacoma).

BY WAY OF THE K: Albuquerque batters struck out 15 times last night—establishing a new Opening Night record, at home or on the road (previous: 14, April 8, 2010 at Oklahoma City, 13 innings).

FIVE-OH: Matthew Batten connected on five hits in the opener. the first opposing player to tally five hits since Kyle Lewis June 22, 2023, at Reno.

ISOTOPES DEBUTS: Kyle Wilcox made his Isotopes debut and tossed 2.0 scoreless frames while fanning two ... John Curtiss also made his Isotopes debut and went 1.0 inning while allowing one run, unearned, on two hits and a walk.

RISP: The Isotopes went 3-for-11 with RISP last night and left

PROSPECTS: Four players on MLB.com's top 30 Rockies prospects list will start the season with Albuquerque: Beck, Drew Romo (No. 9), Hunter Goodman (No. 12) and Greg Jones (No.

MLB EXPERIENCE: The Opening Day roster features 16 players who have seen time in the Major Leagues. Right-handed reliever John Curtiss has registered the most MLB service time (three years and 137 days).

NUCLEI NOTES

SKIPPER: Pedro Lopez enters his 20th year as a minor league manager and second guiding the Isotopes, the eighth manager in club history ... Spent 2021 as Albuquerque's hitting coach and 2022 as its bench coach ... Notched his 1,000th career managerial victory June 4, 2023 at Salt Lake, 7-1. Managed in the Texas Rangers (2001-05, 2007) and New York Mets (2011-19) organizations while claiming the 2014 Eastern League Championship with Double-A Binghamton. Lopez was drafted in the 21st round by the San Diego Padres in the 1988 MLB Draft and spent 13 years in the minor leagues, reaching Triple-A on four occasions.

HOMETOWN KID: Jordan Pacheco begins his third season as the Isotopes hitting coach ... An Albuquerque native and 2004 graduate of La Cueva High School, Pacheco then attended the University of New Mexico (2005-07), where he was one of the most prolific offensive players in school history (.384, 59 2B, 25 HR, 145 RBI) ... Drafted by Rockies in the 9th round in 2007 and made his MLB debut with Colorado in 2011.

CHRIS MICHALAK: Begins his second season as Isotopes pitching coach ... Pitched for the Albuquerque Dukes in 2000, followed by stints with the Isotopes in 2004 and 2008 ... Started second-to-last game in Dukes history, giving up two runs in 6.0 innings during Game 4 of a PCL First Round playoff series at Memphis Sept. 9, 2000 ... Appeared in 61 Major League games (24 starts) over five season with the Arizona Diamondbacks (1998), Toronto Blue Jays (2001) Texas Rangers (2001-02) and Cincinnati Reds (2006) ... 12th round selection by the Athletics in 1993 ... Has been in the coaching ranks since 2009, including stops as the pitching coach for the Hagerstown Suns (2010-11), Potomac Nationals (2012-13) and Harrisburg Senators (2014-17). He was also the Minor League pitching coordinator for the Miami Marlins form 2018-20 and coached in the Washington Nationals organization from 2021-22.

MICHAEL RYAN: Enters his first year with the Rockies organization as the Isotopes bench coach ... It's his second stop in Albuquerque after the former outfielder played in 33 games for the club and hit nine homers during the 2008 campaign. He and Michalak were teammates on that squad for four days in late July ... Entered the coaching ranks in 2012 as a coach for the Double-A Altoona Curve (Pirates). He then managed in the Pirates organization at three levels for seven seasons with stops at Single-A West Virginia (2013-14), High-A Bradenton (2015-16) and Double-A Altoona (2017-19), while winning the Florida State League in 2016 and Eastern League in 2017. Ryan compiled a 221-197 managerial record with Altoona—the most wins for a manager in Curve history ... He also managed in the Cubs organization (High-A South Bend, 2021 and Double-A Tennessee, 2022-June 2023) ... A 5th round draft pick by the Minnesota Twins in 1996, played in 149 MLB games over parts of five seasons with the Twins (2002-05) and Angels (2010) ... Last Angels player to wear 27 prior to Mike Trout's call-up in 2011.

SPLIT-SEASON PLAYOFF FORMAT: For the second-straight year, the Pacific Coast League will use a split-season format to determine playoff participants. With one 10 team division, the first half winner (concluding June 23) will host the second half winner (beginning June 25) in a three-game set. The winner will then face the International League champion for the Triple-A Championship in Las Vegas, NV, Sept. 28.

BALLS AND STRIKES: The Automated Ball-Strike System (ABS), now in its third year in the Pacific Coast League, will be used for all Monday-Thursday games while the Challenge System, second year in the PCL, will be used for all Friday-Sunday contests. Each team has three challenges per game, retaining one for each successful challenge.
