**MICKEY MAGIC:** On Thursday night, Mickey Gasper supplied the Patriots with their fourth walk-off win of the season, lining a 10th inning RBI-single into right field. In two years since re-branding as the Zorros de Somerset, the Patriots have now walked off in their orange Zorros jerseys four times, twice in 2022 and twice in 2021. Over Gasper's last 20 games since 5/28, he's slashing .373/.464/.108 with 18 R and 13 RBI.

**SWEENEY'S SUCCESS:** Trey Sweeney has hit safely in a team-high 10 straight games, going 16-for-49 (.327 BA) with 11 RBI, 9 R and 6 BB. Over his last 11 games, Sweeney is 20-for-66 (.303 BA) with 13 RBI, 14 R, 7 XBH and 9 BB.

**PATRIOTS PUNCHOUTS:** With 16 strikeouts in Thursday night's 4-3 extra innings win, Somerset's pitching staff has now struck out 10+ batters in 6 of its last 7 games and 15 times out of 21 games during the month of July. Overall, the Patriots have struck out double-digit batters in 57/92 games (62 percent of games) this season.

**HARDMAN > RUNNING MAN:** After scoring the game-winning run in Thursday night's 4-3 extra innings win, Tyler Hardman has now scored a run in eight straight games, which is the longest active streak in the Eastern League.

**MARTIAN MAN:** On Thursday night, Jasson Dominguez registered his second three-hit game of the season in his 21st multi-hit performance of the year. Of Dominguez's 21 multi-hit games, 10 have come in the month of July. During July, Dominguez is 26-for-88 (.295/.367/.398) with 10 RBI, 12 R, 2 HR, 10 BB and 9 SB. Entering today, his .224 BA is at a season-high mark.

**TOUGH TO TOP:** Somerset's last 13 losses in-a-row have been decided by three runs or less dating back to 6/20 vs. NH. The stretch includes eight one-run losses. Somerset is 26-26 in games decided by three runs or less this season and 27-8 in games decided by 4+ runs.

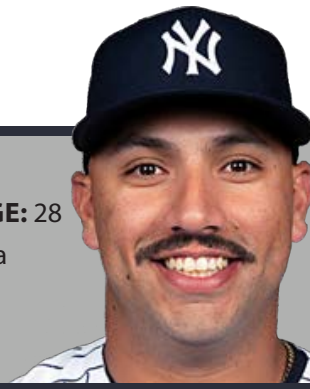

- ▶ Has appeared in parts of five Major League seasons with the Baltimore Orioles (2018), the Yankees (2019, '21-22) and the Seattle Mariners (2020)...made his first career All-Star team in 2022.
- ▶ Has made three career Opening Day rosters (2018 with Baltimore, 2020 with Seattle and 2022 with the Yankees).
- ▶ Has allowed 3R-or-fewer in 38-of-42 starts since the beginning of 2021 and 2R-or-fewer in 32 of those starts.
- ▶ In 50 appearances (42 starts) since the beginning of 2021, has gone 14-7 with a 2.61 ERA (251.1IP, 73ER), 266K and a .200 (183-for-917) opponents' BA...his 2.61 ERA in that span is the second-lowest in the AL and the fourth-lowest in the Majors (min. 200.0IP)...his 0.98 WHIP in that span is the lowest in the AL and third-lowest in the Majors...his .200 opponents' BA in that span is the fourth-lowest in the AL and eighth-lowest in the Majors over that span (min. 200.0IP).
- ▶ Has allowed 3R-or-fewer in 34 of his 37 starts since 8/15/21, including 2R-or-fewer in 28 of those starts.
- ▶ In 22 career starts at Yankee Stadium, is 7-2 with a 2.33 ERA (123.2IP, 32ER), 126K and a .183 opponents' BA (80-for-437)...has allowed 3R-or-fewer in each of those 22 starts, including 2R-or-fewer in 18 of those games.
- ▶ Since 2021, is 7-2 with a 2.15 ERA (134.0IP, 32ER) and 142K in 27 games (22 starts) at Yankee Stadium...his 2.15 ERA at Yankee Stadium is the third-lowest in the Majors among any pitcher at a single ballpark since 2021 (min. 100.0IP), trailing only Los Angeles-AL's Shohei Ohtani (1.88 ERA at Angel Stadium) and Miami's Sandy Alcantara (1.99 ERA at loanDepot park).
- ▶ Since 2021, right-handed batters have hit .206/.259/.353 (156-for-756) with 30 doubles, 27HR and 52BB against Cortes...among left-handed pitchers vs. right-handed batters in that span (min. 200BF), he ranks fifth in the Majors in opponents' OBP, eighth in opponents' OPS (.612) and ninth in opponents' BA.
- ▶ Allowed 3R-or-fewer in 19 consecutive starts from 8/15/21-6/2/22(G1), the second-longest streak in franchise history by a Yankees starting pitcher, trailing only Russ Ford (20 starts from 8/9/1910-G2-5/27/1911-G2).
- ▶ Has made three career postseason starts (all in 2022), going 1-0 with a 4.50 ERA (12.0IP, 6ER)...made his first career postseason start in 2022 ALDS Game 2 vs. Cleveland and did not record a decision (5.0IP, 6H, 2ER, 3BB, 3K, 1HR)...started on short rest in 2022 ALDS Game 5 vs. Cleveland and earned his first postseason win (5.0IP, 3H, 1ER, 1BB, 2K, 0HR)...was just the sixth Yankees starting pitcher to toss at least 5.0IP and allow 1R-or-fewer in a "winner-take-all" game, joining Gerrit Cole (5.1IP and 1R in 2020 ALDS Game 5 at Tampa Bay in San Diego), CC Sabathia (9.0IP and 1R in 2012 ALDS Game 5 vs. Baltimore), Roger Clemens (6.1IP and 1R in 2001 World Series Game 7 at Arizona), Ralph Terry (CGSHO in 1962 World Series Game 7 at San Francisco) and Johnny Kucks (CGSHO in 1956 World Series Game 7 at Brooklyn)...also started 2022 ALCS Game 4 vs. Houston and exited the game in the third inning with a left groin injury (2.0IP, 2H, 3ER, 3BB, 2K, 1HR).

- ▶ Went 12-4 with one complete-game shutout and a 2.44 ERA (158.1IP, 108H, 44R/43ER, 38BB, 163K, 16HR) in 28 starts...opponents hit .189/.241/.313 (108-for-572, 16HR); LH .110/.180/.159 (9-for-82, 1HR); RH .202/.251/.339 (99-for-490, 15HR)...recorded a career best in ERA and set career highs in starts, innings pitched and strikeouts...was named to his first career All-Star team.
- ▶ According to *Elias*, his 2.44 ERA was the third-lowest by a Yankees pitcher in a single season in the Divisional Era since 1969 (min. 25 games started), trailing only Ron Guidry's 1.74 ERA in 1978 and Steve Jack Kline's 2.40 ERA in 1972.
- ▶ Among pitchers with 150.0IP in 2022, ranked second in the Majors in opponents' OBP (.241, second in AL) and opponents' OPS (.554, second in AL), third in WHIP (0.92, second in AL) and opponents' BA (.189, second in AL), sixth in opponents' SLG (.313, fourth in AL) and seventh in ERA (2.44, fifth in AL).
- ▶ Among left-handed pitchers vs. left-handed batters (min. 65BF), owned the lowest OPS (.338), ranked second in opponents' batting average (second in AL), OBP (first in AL) and third in opponents' SLG (second in AL).
- ▶ Tossed at least 6.0IP and allowed 1R-or-fewer in 10 starts.
- ▶ Allowed 3R-or-fewer in 25 of his 28 starts, including 2R-or-fewer in 21 starts and 1R-or-fewer in 15 starts...tossed seven scoreless starts.

## RAUL DOMINGUEZ: Manager (1st year)

Dominguez begins his 1st season as manager for the Somerset Patriots, 9th overall as a manager and 17th overall coaching in the Yankees organization. The Panama City, Panama native has managerial experience with the GCL Yankees East (2016), DSL Yankees 1 (2011-15) and DSL Yankees 2 (2009-10). From 2012-2015, his teams finished at least 10 games over .500, including reaching the DSL semifinals in 2012 and 2015. An outfielder during his playing days, Dominguez signed with the Yankees as an undrafted free agent in 2001 and spread four minor league seasons for New York between the DSL and the GCL. **2023:** At MLB Spring Training, Sweeney had three hits, including a solo home run vs. Tampa Bay on March 4. After being assigned to Somerset to start the season, Sweeney hit .222 over the first 42 games of the season with 3 HR and 17 RBI.

The following 27 games, he hit .281 with 8 HR and 19 RBI. Hit a go-ahead two-run home run in the 7th inning of a 4-3 Patriots win on 6/18 vs. ALT. Delivered a game-tying two-run homer in the 11th inning of a 4-3 Somerset win vs. NH on 6/22, eventually bringing home the walk-off run on a balk in the Eastern League's only 14-inning game this season.

**2022:** Spent the majority of his second pro season (100 games) playing for High-A Hudson Valley, slashing .241/.350/.415 (.765 OPS) with 14 HR, 51 RBI, 70 R, 59 BB and 29 SB. Sweeney hit a home run on the first pitch of the 2022 season on 4/6/22 at Greenville. During the final week of the South Atlantic League season, Sweeney was promoted to Double-A Somerset. In addition to the playoffs, Sweeney started in 11 games for the Patriots, slashing .233/.340/.395 with 2 HR, 5 RBI and 6 R.

**2021:** Made his pro debut in three games with the FCL Yankees to begin 2021. After going 3-for-5, with a HR and 3 BB, he was promoted to Single-A Tampa, where he spent the remainder of the season. Across 29 games, Sweeney slashed .245/.347/.518 (.875 OPS) with 6 HR, 23 RBI and 26 R.

**College:** In three collegiate seasons at Eastern Illinois University, Sweeney hit .328/.437/.517 (134-for-408) with 87 R, 22

2B, 2 3B, 17 HR, 96 RBI and 72 BB over 117 games. Eligible to be drafted after the 2021 NCAA season, Sweeney started 48 games at shortstop

as a junior and hit .382 with 14 HR, 52 R and a .712 SLG. He struck out only 24 times, compared to 65 hits. He ranked seventh in the nation

in OBP (.522), ninth in BB (46) and 13th in RBI (58). He was named a first team All-American by Baseball America, Perfect Game and ABCA

becoming the first player in EIU program history to earn first team All-American honors at the NCAA Division I level. His 46 walks (including 11 intentional) set a single season school record. He played in 14 games during the Covid-shortened 2020 season and hit .351. During his freshman season in 2019, he appeared in 55 games, hitting .266. Sweeney was drafted 20th overall in the first round of the 2021 MLB Draft by the Yankees, signing for \$3 million as one of three first rounders in EIU history.

**Personal Notes:** Sweeney attended St. Xavier High School in his hometown of Louisville, KY (same high school as actor Tom Cruise and golfer Justin Thomas, NFL quarterbacks Tony Romo and Jimmy Garoppolo). After entering his junior year at 5'4" in height, he hit an 8-inch growth spurt. Grew up a Reds fan, Ken Griffey Jr. was his favorite player and he would go to Red Triple-A games in Louisville as a kid. Sweeney went undrafted out of St. Xavier and EIU was the only college to offer him a scholarship. In high school, he hit .389 as a senior with 41 RBI and 18 SB en route to leading St. Xavier to a Kentucky State Baseball Championship. His name is Trey because he's the third child in his family, which is also why he chooses to wear No. 3. Upon signing his \$3 million bonus after being drafted, the only major purchase he made was a new set of golf clubs--while he bats left-handed, he golfs right-handed.
