## TODAY'S HEADLINES

**LAST TIME OUT:** The Saints could not come up with runners in scoring position, going 1-for-14 in a 7-4 loss on Sunday to Syracuse. The Saints went with a bullpen game, throwing five relievers. The first three, Scott Blewett, Jordan Balazovic and Josh Winder each gave up multiple runs. The first three runs the Saints scored came via long ball, with Yunior Severino hitting his 10<sup>th</sup> of the season in the second inning, followed by Michael Helman, who also clubbed his 10<sup>th</sup>, a two-run blast in the third inning. The Saints loaded the bases in the fourth and fifth innings, but could not plate any runs, leaving 13 men on base in the loss.

**CAMARGO COMEBACK:** Jair Camargo was activated from the Injured List on Tuesday following his minor league rehab assignment, where he went 9-for-30 (.300) with two doubles, a home run, five RBI and three walks in seven games with the FCL Twins and Fort Myers. Camargo was placed on the 7-Day Injured List on May 1 with a right forearm strain.

**BIG-TIME BOZ:** Caleb Boushley delivered one of the Saints' best starts of the season last Wednesday, throwing 7.0 innings of one-run baseball. He's the second Saints pitcher to throw 7.0 innings this season, joining Louie Varland, who did so on May 3. Boushley is the sixth IL (and the Saints' second) pitcher this season to throw at least 7.0 innings with no walks and eight strikeouts. The Saints are one of three IL teams to have multiple starts of 7.0 innings and no walks (Memphis 4, Lehigh Valley 2).  
**☑** Boushley also enters today's start tied for the IL lead in wins (six) and the league's leader in WHIP (1.06)

**BOUSHLEY UNDER CONTROL:** When Caleb Boushley has allowed runners to reach base, he has minimized the damage. Boushley has not walked a batter his season with runners on base. The right-hander has completed 21.2 innings worth of baseball with runners on base, facing 77 batters with runners on, the most in all of baseball (Majors or minors) without issuing a free pass.

**RISP ASSESSMENT:** Over the last three games, the Saints have had their chances with runners on base, but unable to cash in. The club has gone 3-for-27 over the last three games with runners in scoring position, leaving 30 men on over that span.

**LOATHING LEFTIES:** Today will be the 17<sup>th</sup> game of the season, and the third in a row, the Saints have faced a left-handed starter, going 6-10 in games facing a southpaw starter. The Saints are hitting just .208/.301/.347 against left-handers this season, ranking last in Triple-A in average and OBP, sitting 29<sup>th</sup> in slugging percentage. Their 193 strikeouts against left-handed pitching are the most in the circuit. But not all is bad for the Saints, as Diego Castillo is hitting a team-best .367 against left-handers and Will Holland has gone 8-for-21 (.381) as well.

**☑** This marks the first time the Saints have faced a southpaw starter in three consecutive games since July 23-26, 2023 (24<sup>th</sup> was an off day). It is the seventh time in franchise history the Saints have faced a left-handed starter in three straight games.

**JUNE HEAT:** Once the calendar flipped to June, the Saints offense has started to click. Their .268 batting average in June is tied for sixth in the IL with 14 home runs, tied for the third-most in the league. The club's .479 slugging percentage is tied for the seventh-highest in the IL in June and their .841 OPS is the third-best in the IL in June.

**KEMP KRUSHING:** Tony Kemp has turned it on over his last 14 games since May 22, hitting .327 (18-for-55). In that stretch he has hits in 10 of those 14 games, six multi-hit games and a pair of three-hit nights. In his last 58 plate appearances, Kemp has drawn three walks and struck out seven times, sporting a .362 on-base percentage and a .527 slugging percentage.

**SUMMER HEAT:** Over the last three series, two players have stepped up their game at the plate: Yunior Severino and Michael Helman.

**☑** In Severino's 15 games since May 21, he has hit .340 (18-for-53), with four home runs and a 1.028 OPS. His average exit velocity over that stretch is 92.1 mph, up from his season average of 89.3 mph.

**☑** Michael Helman has turned it on again, hitting .348 (24-for-69) over the 18-game stretch. He's reached base in 16 of those 18 games.

**TWINS UPDATE:** The Twins started off their homestand with a 5-0 victory over Colorado. Chris Paddock dealt 6.1 innings, striking out six without walking a batter. Royce Lewis hit a two-run home run in the eighth inning to put an exclamation point on the win.

**LAST APPEARANCE:** 6/5 v SYR...made 10<sup>th</sup> start of the season, throwing season-high 7.0 innings of one-run baseball, allowing four hits, walking none and striking out eight...surrendered a two-out doubled in the first inning, one of two runners to get past first base...lone run against came on a solo home run from Trayce Thompson in the fifth inning...retired 19 of 23 batters faced...got a pair of inning-ending double plays, coming in the third and fifth innings...tied season-high with eight strikeouts...became the second Saints pitcher to throw 7.0 innings this season, joining Louie Varland, who did so on May 3...received league-leading sixth win in 5-1 Saints victory.

**APPEARANCE PRIOR:** 5/28 (2) @ ROC...made ninth start of the season and first since being optioned back by the Minnesota Twins...threw 5.0 innings, allowing one run on three hits, walking two and striking out five in second game of the doubleheader...allowed lone run in first inning on two singles and a fielder's choice...did not allow another hit until the fifth inning, a Brady Lindsly double...retired six of final seven batters...received fifth win in 4-1 Saints victory in seven innings.

**WORLD SERIES RUNNER-UP:** Caleb spent his college years not far from home at the University of Wisconsin-La Crosse. As a freshman, he got to experience something that not many players get the opportunity to experience: a trip to the College World Series. His DIII squad reached the championship after beating Salisbury, 7-3, Emory, 3-2 in 12, losing the first game of the semifinals to Trinity(TX), 16-7, but bouncing back to win the second game, 10-7. Unfortunately, they met their match in the championship dropping the best-of-three to Cortland, getting swept 11-3 and 6-2. He would get back to the DIII World Series in 2016, but this was less successful losing 8-0 to Trinity, beating Emory, 12-3 before being eliminated by the team they lost to in the 2015 DIII Championship Game, Cortland, 8-3.

**SOMETHINGS BREWING:** One can't help where they grow up which can determine who you root for growing up. Caleb was born in Neenah, WI and resides in Madison, WI, so naturally he rooted for the Milwaukee Brewers. His hometown team came calling in the Minor League phase of the Rule 5 Draft in 2021, taking Caleb with the 22nd pick overall from the San Diego Padres. The storybook had an incredible ending when he was called up to the Brewers on September 29, 2023. He pitched 2.1 innings of relief vs. Chicago Cubs and allowed one run on one hit while walking two and striking out five. He earned the win in his lone Major League appearance.

**GIVE BACK:** Each of the Major League team's usually choose a player or players within their organization for the hard work they put towards the community. In 2023, the Brewers selected Caleb as the Nashville Sounds Community Player of the Year.
