YESTERDAY: The Flying Squirrels lost to the Curve, 5-4, in 10 innings. Richmond took a 1-0 lead in the top of the first inning with a run scoring on a double-play groundout. Altoona tied the game in the bottom of the first, also scoring on a double play. In the fourth, the Curve took a 2-1 lead with a run scoring on a pair of Flying Squirrels errors. **Turner Hill** moved Richmond ahead, 4-2, with a bases-clearing, three-run triple in the top of the fifth. Altoona rallied to even the score with two runs in the seventh. After the Flying Squirrels were held scoreless in the top of the 10th, Abraham Gutierrez won the game with a walk-off sac fly in the bottom of the 10th. **Seth Lonsway** started for Richmond and pitched six innings, allowing two unearned runs. **Tanner Kiest** pitched two scoreless relief innings, striking out two. The Flying Squirrels had four errors in the game and were held to three hits.

TODAY'S GAME: The Flying Squirrels face the Altoona Curve, Double-A affiliate of the Pittsburgh Pirates, in the fourth of a six-game series at PNG Field. This is the first of two trips to Altoona for Richmond this year. The Flying Squirrels won two-of-six at The Diamond from June 4-9, dropping the final four games of the series. The Curve also return to Richmond for a six-game set from August 20-25 and the Flying Squirrels close the regular season in Altoona from September 10-15.

THE FLYING SQUIRRELS have gone 4-11 in their last 15 games dating back to July 13 after winning their previous four games. They have lost four straight games since Sunday. For the year, the Flying Squirrels are hitting .228 and averaging 3.75 runs per game (191 runs/51 games) at home compared to a .232 batting average and 4.67 runs per game on the road (224 runs/48 games).

THE CURVE have won the first three games of the series after going 1-8 in their previous nine games. Altoona's roster includes five of Baseball America's top-30 Pirates prospects, including RHP Bubba Chandler (No. 1), RHP Thomas Harrington (No. 5), INF/OF Charles McAdoo (No. 12), INF Tsung-Che Cheng (No. 13) and LHP Hunter Barco (No. 16). MLB.com's top-30 Pirates prospects list includes seven Altoona players, including Chandler (No. 1), Harrington (No. 6), Cheng (No. 8), Barco (No. 13), OF Jase Bowen (No. 19), OF Tres Gonzalez (No. 26) and McAdoo (No. 29).

FOR RICHMOND: Right-hander **Will Bednar** makes his fifth Double-A start and his ninth appearance at Double-A. He last pitched on Sunday afternoon at The Diamond against the Rumble Ponies and threw two scoreless, hitless innings. He had allowed six runs over 1.2 innings combined in his previous two outings. Bednar began the season with Low-A San Jose and made five appearances, going 1-0 with a 3.60 ERA. In his six games for High-A Eugene, going 0-2 with a 3.18 ERA. Bednar was selected with the 14th overall pick in the 2021 MLB Draft out of Mississippi State, where he helped lead the Bulldogs to a national title that year. He was named the College World Series Most Outstanding Pitcher after throwing six hitless innings in Mississippi State's Game 3 clincher that year against Vanderbilt. **For more on Bednar, see page two.**

FOR ALTOONA: Right-hander Bubba Chandler makes his 19th appearance and 16th start of the season. Last time out, he pitched 4.2 innings at Erie on Saturday and allowed four runs in a loss, striking out seven. In his previous five outings from June 21-July 21, he went 3-1 with a 1.59 ERA (5 ER/28.1 IP). He made two appearances against the Flying Squirrels at The Diamond earlier this season. On June 4, he worked five innings and allowed one unearned run, striking out five. He worked out of the bullpen at The Diamond on June 9 and allowed two unearned runs in three innings of work, picking up a win. Chandler was selected in the third round of the 2021 MLB Draft by the Pirates out of North Oconee High School in Georgia. He is currently rated by MLB.com and Baseball America as the No. 1 Pirates prospect.

DOUBLE TROUBLE: The Flying Squirrels have turned 72 double plays this year, which is the most in the Eastern League. Altoona is ranked second with 69. Richmond pitcher **John Michael Bertrand** has induced 15 double plays this year, which is the most in the league, ahead of three pitchers tied for second with 11, including Altoona's Po-Yu Chen. It is also the second-most in the minors. The Flying Squirrels turned four double plays last Saturday night against Binghamton, which is tied for the most in a game this season in the league. On July 10 against the Senators, **Seth Lonsway** induced three double plays, which is tied for the most by one pitcher in a game in the league this year. Bertrand matched that with three double plays behind him on July 19 against the RubberDucks.

KING OF THE HILL: **Turner Hill** is batting .476 (10-for-21) with two doubles, a triple and five RBIs in his last six games dating back to July 23, including three multi-hit games. He went 3-for-4 on Sunday afternoon against the Rumble Ponies, including a double. In his next game played on Wednesday at Altoona, he again picked up three hits, including a double. On Thursday night, he belted a bases-clearing, three-run double. Since his Double-A debut on June 27, Hill is ranked fourth in the Eastern League in batting average (.325) and second in OBP (.411).

GO, DIEGO, GO!: Last Friday in his second Double-A game, **Diego Velasquez** hit a solo home run in the fourth inning for his first Double-A hit. He finished the night with three hits, adding an RBI single in the eighth inning. In his debut last Thursday, he walked twice and added a sacrifice bunt. Between Richmond and High-A Eugene this year, Velasquez has hit .272, which is sixth-best in the Giants organization. He is also ranked tied for fourth in hits (80), fifth in stolen bases (18), tied for sixth in doubles (17), tied for sixth in triples (3), ninth in OBP (.357), ninth in SLG (.391) and 10th in total bases (115). With his debut on July 24, Velasquez became the sixth-youngest player in Flying Squirrels history, the ninth player to debut for Richmond at age 20 or younger and the first player in team history born in 2003. On Saturday night, he made a diving stop to begin a double play that landed at No. 3 on ESPN's SportsCenter Top 10 Plays.

BERICOTO BASHING: In his last 41 games dating back to June 6, **Victor Bericoto** is hitting .304 (49-for-161) with three homers, eight doubles, eight walks and 18 RBIs. After leading the Giants organization in homers (27) last year, Bericoto hit just one homer in his first 34 games this season through May 21. From May 22-28, he homered three times in five games. He went deep again on June 14 at New Hampshire and added a homer on June 18 at Portland, but he has not homered in his last 31 games. Bericoto has picked up multiple hits in 14-of-33 games dating back to June 15 and is batting .302 (38-for-126) in that stretch.

PACKING THE HOUSE: The Flying Squirrels drew an average of 7,113 fans in April for their home games at The Diamond to open the season, their highest April average in franchise history. The previous high was 6,891 in 2014 followed by 6,571 in 2019. This season, the Flying Squirrels are leading all 30 Double-A teams and are ranked eighth among the 120 minor league clubs in average home attendance (6,653), just shy of the highest average attendance in franchise history (6,689 in 2013).

DEADLINE DEALS: The MLB trade deadline was Tuesday at 6 p.m. and Flying Squirrels reliever **Eric Silva** was traded to the Detroit Tigers for Mark Canha and will join the Erie SeaWolves. Silva became the fifth player all time traded from the Flying Squirrels at trade deadline time. The most recent deadline day trades directly impacting the Flying Squirrels were in 2021. That year, pitcher **Caleb Kilian** was traded to the Cubs as part of a deal for Kris Bryant and reliever **Jose Marte** was sent to the Angels as part of a package for Tony Watson. In 2012, catcher **Tommy Joseph** was traded from the Flying Squirrels along with two other players to the Phillies for Hunter Pence. In 2010, pitcher Daniel Turpen was swapped to the Red Sox for Ramon Ramirez. Current Flying Squirrels catcher **Andy Thomas** was a trade deadline acquisition for the Giants along with reliever **Michael Stryffeler** in 2022 for Matthew Boyd and Curt Casali. In 2022, **Tristan Peters** became the only players sent straight to Richmond after being traded at the deadline when he was picked up from the Brewers for Trevor Rosenthal.

PROSPECT WATCH: One of Baseball America's top-30 Giants prospects are on the Richmond roster, which is SS **Diego Velasquez** (No. 26). On Baseball America's Best Tools list, LHP **John Michael Bertrand** is rated as having the best control. MLB.com's top-30 Giants prospects list features three Richmond players, including Velasquez (No. 18), OF/1B **Victor Bericoto** (No. 19) and OF **Jairo Pomares** (No. 26).
