# Sparky Lyle



## SPARKY LYLE

MANAGER EMERITUS

Yankees World Series champion and Cy Young award winner Sparky Lyle was the first employee ever hired by the Somerset Patriots. Since that point, Sparky has become synonymous with the Patriots. His reach has stretched from being the team's mascot's namesake to a 15-year run as the most successful manager in the history of the Atlantic League. But his story starts well before his time in Somerset

Lyle was a three-sport athlete growing up in Reynoldsville, Pennsylvania, a borough 92 miles Northeast of Pittsburgh with a population less than 3,600 people at the time. Despite his success in football and basketball, it was when he began playing American Legion Baseball during his junior year of high school that people started to take notice.

In one state tournament game alone, the southpaw pitched in 14 of 17 innings and struck out 31 batters. He caught the eye of the Baltimore Orioles, who signed him as an amateur free agent in 1964. Two years later, he was selected by the Boston Red Sox in the first-year draft.

During his time in the minors, Lyle was introduced to one of the greatest hitters in the history of the game, Ted Williams, whose advice changed his life forever.

After hours that night perfecting the grip and movement, Lyle had added his signature pitch that became as much his trademark as his handle-bar mustache was later in life. He made his Major League Baseball debut on July 4, 1967 and remained with Boston until the 1971 season.

In what many believe to be one of the worst trades in baseball history, Lyle was sent to the Yankees for Danny Cater prior to the 1972 season. Lyle's impact was immediate as he set a then American League record for saves with 35 in year one.

Through the next few years in the Bronx, Lyle established himself as one of the best pitchers in the game, cemented by the 1977 Cy Young Award, the first won by a reliever in American League history. His 13-5 record, 2.17 ERA, 26 saves and 68 strikeouts over 137 innings pitched in 72 games helped chart the path to the Yankees' first of back-to-back World Series titles.

The 1978 season would be Lyle's final one with the Yankees, but despite contributing to the team's on-field success, that year would forever be tied to his best-selling book, *The Bronx Zoo*, with author Peter Golenbock. The memoir documents the 1978 Yankees season and all the turmoil around the team.



Released in 1979, the book spent 29 weeks on the *New York Times* Best Sellers list.

By the time Lyle concluded his 16-year major league career, the two-time champion and three-time All-Star had 99 wins and 238 saves.

Lyle continued his standout success once he transitioned into his role as manager of the Somerset Patriots. After a rough first year at the helm without playing any home games, Lyle’s squad rebounded with strong showings in the first two years of the Patriots shiny new home ballpark.

It wasn’t until 2001 that the Patriots not only won their first postseason game, but earned their first Atlantic League championship.

Fast forward 15 years later, Lyle established himself as the most successful manager in the history of the league. Over his tenure, Lyle led Somerset to a 1,025-912 record, 23 postseason wins, 12 half championships, eight division titles, five league championships and three manager of the year awards.

Lyle’s final season as manager was in 2012 before he transitioned into the role of manager emeritus; one he continues to hold with the team to this day.

Cooper enters his first season as manager of the Somerset Patriots, his fifth overall year in the Yankees organization and his fourth consecutive as a minor league manager. He spent the 2025 season as the manager of the High-A Hudson Valley Renegades, after serving as manager of the Single-A Tampa Tarpons in 2024 and beginning his minor league managerial career with the FCL Yankees in 2023.

Under Cooper's leadership in 2025, Hudson Valley finished with a franchise-record 79 wins (79-50), being eliminated from playoff contention on the final day of the regular season. During the season, the Renegades finished second in AVG (.235), H (970), OBP (.336), SLG (.363), OPS (.699), third in R (598) and HR (547). At the helm for Tampa in 2024, the Tarpons led the FSL in SB, while ranking second in AVG, H and 2B, and fourth in OPS. During Cooper's first assignment with the Yankees organization in 2022, he served as defensive coach for the FCL Yankees, where he helped the team win the 2022 FCL Championship. The following season, Cooper made his managerial debut with the FCL Yankees and was named the Florida Complex League Manager of the Year in 2023, when his team led the FCL in R, H, 3B, RBI, AVG, OBP, SLG and OPS.

Before joining the Yankees organization, Cooper served as the head baseball coach at Grambling State University for 12 seasons from 2010 – 2021. His teams made the SWAC Tournament 10 times and Cooper was honored as the SWAC Head Coach of the Year in 2010 and 2017. He attended Grambling State as a student and was a multi-time All-SWAC performer, including First Team All-SWAC honors in his senior year. He was also involved as an assistant coach at USA Baseball's National Team Development Program from 2018 through 2021, coaching both the 16U and 18U teams.

The Houston Astros selected Cooper in the 33rd round of the 2004 MLB Draft and played 103 games over two minor league seasons for the organization. During his two years with the Tri-City ValleyCats in the New York-Penn League, Cooper batted .249/.342/.344 (79-for-317) with 3 HR and 43 RBI. He also played a season with the Sussex Skyhawks of the Canadian American Association of Professional Baseball in 2006.

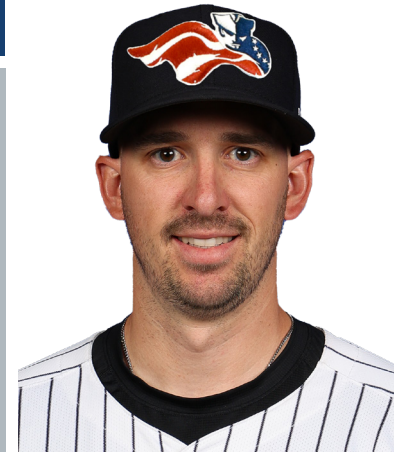
Pitching coach Demetre Kokoris enters his first season in Somerset and second with the Yankees. He served as the pitching coach in Hudson Valley in 2025 and guided the team to a league-best 2.82 ERA and 20 shutouts. Kokoris worked with the South Atlantic League Pitcher of the Year, Kyle Carr, who finished 8-6 with a 3.26 ERA and 104 K before his promotion to Somerset to end the season. Prior to joining the Yankees, Kokoris, coached in the Texas Rangers (2022-2024) and Toronto Blue Jays (2019-2021) organizations.

He spent the 2023 and 2024 seasons as the bullpen coach for the Triple-A Round Rock Express, and was the pitching coach for the Single-A Down East Wood Ducks in 2022, where he led the staff to a 3.84 ERA, the second-best in the Carolina League. Prior to joining the Rangers organization, he was the pitching coach for the Short-Season Class-A Vancouver Canadians (2019-20) and was a rehab pitching coach (2021) with the Blue Jays. Before entering the professional coaching ranks, Kokoris was a college pitching coach at Chemeketa Community College, Point Loma Nazarene University and Santa Barbara City College. He has also served as the pitching coach for the Greek National Team since 2021, when he joined in advance of the 2021 European Baseball Championships in Turin, Italy. Kokoris received a bachelor’s degree from the University of South Carolina in 2006, where he was the student manager of the Gamecock Baseball team under legendary head coach Ray Tanner.

Hitting coach Mike Fransoso enters his second season as a coach in Somerset and within the Yankees organization. Under Fransoso’s leadership during the 2025 season, the Patriots’ offense ranked among the Eastern League leaders with 129 HR (2nd), a .691 OPS (4th) and 600 R (5th).

Fransoso played for the Somerset Patriots (2018-2019) during the team’s run as an independent team and also the Pittsburgh Pirates organization (2013-2015). He previously coached in the Seattle Mariners organization (2021-2024), serving as the hitting coach and interim manager for the Double-A Arkansas Travelers in 2024, when he helped manage the team to a Southern League Championship.

Defensive coach Caleb Hamilton enters his first season in Somerset and second with the Yankees organization. After a playing career that included MLB experience with the Minnesota Twins (2022) and Boston Red Sox (2023), Hamilton completed his first year in coaching as the defensive coach for High-A Hudson Valley in 2025.

During his final season playing in 2024, Hamilton saw time in 39 games for the Rocket City Trash Pandas, the Double-A affiliate of the Los Angeles Angels. He was drafted by Minnesota in the 23rd round of the 2016 MLB Draft out of Oregon State University, where he was an All-Pac-12 performer for the Beavers. Despite not catching in college, Hamilton made 323 of his 574 professional appearances as a catcher, and he played at least one game at all nine positions.

During his playing career, Viloria signed with the Phillies as an international free agent in 2019 and went on to play 112 games in four seasons as an infielder in the organization (2019-2023), reaching High-A Jersey Shore in 2022 and 2023.

### 2025

Spent the entire 2025 season with Double-A Somerset, primarily working in a closer role. Austin tied for the team lead with 43 relief appearances and posted a 3-2 record, 2.95 ERA, 28 BB, 37 K and 7 SV in 42.2 IP. Austin's seven saves led the Patriots and tied for second in the Yankees minor league system.

### 2024

Began his first full season with Single-A Fayetteville in the Astros organization. After allowing 1 ER in 10.0 IP (0.90 ERA) with 14 K and 1 BB, he was transferred to High-A Asheville on May 11. In 18 relief appearances for Asheville, Austin went 2-0 with a 2.70 ERA, 3 SV, 32 K and 6 BB. On July 30, he was traded to the Yankees and assigned to High-A Hudson Valley. In 10 games to end the regular season with the Renegades, he went 3-0 with a 1.29 ERA over 14.0 IP with 19 K and 2 BB. During the post-season for Hudson Valley, Austin spread five perfect innings across three appearances. Following five affiliated minor league seasons, Torres put together a six-year career in the Mexican League (LMB), where he was a career .321 hitter with a career .955 OPS, along with 178 2B, 13 3B, 128 HR and 501 RBI in 691 games. 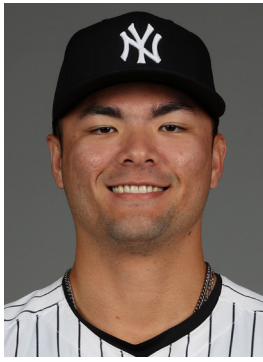

## HERE WE GO, OSWALDO

In the Somerset Patriots' inaugural season as the Yankees' Double-A affiliate (2021), utility man Oswaldo Cabrera was named the Most Valuable Player of the Double-A Northeast League. The former international signing of the Yankees in 2015 led the league in H (112), RBI (78), XBH (54) and TB (215). He was also among the leaders in HR (24, 3rd), 2B (29, T-3rd), SB (20, T-5th) and SLG (.492, 10th).

The following year, Cabrera began his season in Triple-A and excelled for the RailRiders, prior to earning a promotion to the Bronx on August 17 and serving as key contributor in the Yankees' 2022 postseason run. Down the stretch, Cabrera played in 44 games for the Yankees, slashing .247/.312/.429 with 6 HR and 19 RBIs. On October 15, 2022, Cabrera became the first Yankees rookie to homer in a postseason game since Aaron Judge in 2017.

## FIRST HE WAS SAUER, THEN HE WAS SWEET

Over the span of his first three Double-A starts, RHP Matt Sauer set the Somerset Patriots' single-game records for most earned runs allowed in a game and most strikeouts in a game. On the same mound where he made his Double-A debut (8/13/22 vs. HFD) and gave up nine earned runs, two starts later at TD Bank Ballpark, Sauer struck out 17 batters (8/25/22 vs. NH). The 17 punchouts were the most by any MiLB pitcher since 2019 and set a Somerset Patriots franchise record. Following the 2023 season, Sauer was selected by the Kansas City Royals with the No. 2 overall pick of the MLB Rule 5 Draft. He made his MLB debut with the Royals in 2024, before returning to the Yankees for the remainder of the season. Entering 2025, Sauer signed a minor league deal with the Los Angeles Dodgers.

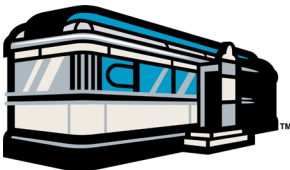

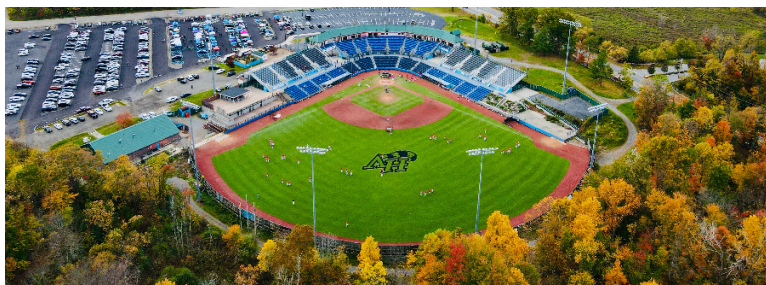

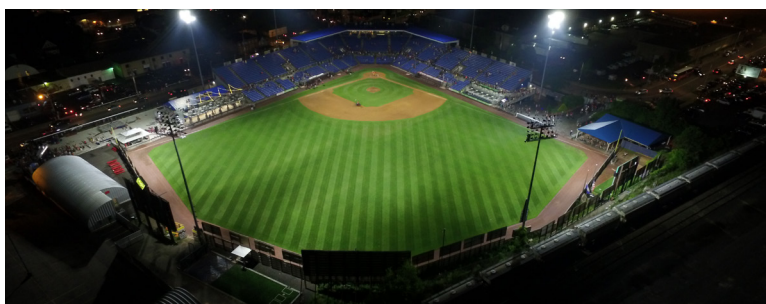

**REQUESTING CREDENTIALS:** All credential requests must be submitted online by using the form located at media website above. Credentials will be strictly limited to legitimate working media professionals. The Patriots require that credential requests are made at least 48 hours prior to the game of your choice. Late requests and/or day-of requests will be accepted if available, but the team cannot guarantee acceptance. Media already credentialed through Major League Baseball, the New York Yankees, or any other MLB club will still need to apply through the Patriots for a credential to TD Bank Ballpark. No other credentials will be accepted. All credential-related questions should be sent to the Vice President of Communications & Media Relations, Marc Russinoff, at [mrussinoff@somersetpatriots.com](mailto:mrussinoff@somersetpatriots.com).

**CREDENTIAL PICK-UP / ENTRY:** Once approved by the Somerset Patriots, credentialed media will be emailed a confirmation for their scheduled event. Media credentials can be picked up at the Will Call Window of the box office starting 3 1/2 hours prior to schedule game times (unless other arrangements have been made with the Patriots Media Relations Department). When at the ballpark, media should enter through the main gate and either display their credential at all times when at TD Bank Ballpark. If arriving before gates are open, media should check in at the ticket office next to the main gate and display their credential for entry.

**PARKING:** It is advised that media park in the RED LOT (to the right of the ballpark) and let parking attendants know they are working media. There will be no charge.

**PLAYER / COACH AVAILABILITY:** All media availability will take place on the field/dugout area around the batting practice schedule. The Patriots media relations department will conduct weekly group media sessions at home with Yankees top prospects as selected by the team or requested by media. One-on-ones will be granted for specific and approved requests. Video of those interviews will be made available to all media when completed via a link. Players and coaches will be made available after games as needed. Zoom and conference calls will also be made available for approved media outlet requests that cannot attend in person.

**ACCESS AREAS:** The Patriots will adhere to all MLB, New York Yankees and New Jersey safety protocols. Credentialed media will have access to the playing field, press box, and areas pre-determined by the team and at specific times. Photographers / videographers will coordinate with the media department once at TD Bank Ballpark to find accessible areas to shoot.

**PRESS MATERIALS:** The Somerset Patriots will print and provide daily game notes, rosters, stat packs and lineup scorecards. The team will not print its Media Guide in bulk, but can print upon request. All game notes and press releases, along with the team's Media Guide, are available digitally at [milb.com/somerset/team/press-box](http://milb.com/somerset/team/press-box).

**MEDIA DINING:** The Somerset Patriots will provide food options for credentialed/working media during each game. Food will be available approximately two hours prior to the scheduled game time.

**DAILY SCHEDULE / FACILITY HOURS:** Daily schedules, game times and facility hours are all subject to change. The press box will typically be open for media beginning 2.5 hours before first pitch and remain open for 60 minutes following the last out.

**DRESS CODE / CODE OF CONDUCT:** Members of the media are expected to dress professionally, respect other media and press box staff and follow the guidelines set forth by the team while at TD Bank Ballpark.

*Southbound – Exit 13: Somerville Route 28* -- As you bear onto the exit you will come to a traffic light. Go straight across the light onto Promenade Boulevard (McDonalds, Applebee's, Home Depot, Target, etc.) Come to the end of the road to traffic light and the ballpark is directly in front of you. Make a left onto East Main Street and make the first right into TD Bank Ballpark's parking lot.
