TODAY'S GAME: The Isotopes hold a 2-1 series advantage after a 12-8 triumph last night; It's just the third time Albuquerque has held a series lead in 2024 (other: at El Paso, April 18 and April 20
.. Albuquerque has won two-straight for the third time this year . Josh Rogers is expected to toe the rubber for the Isotopes while Ryan Carpenter is slated to start for EI Paso.
DINGERS: Last night was the 13th time Albuquerque hit six or more long balls in a contest (last: May 3, 2023 vs. Sugar Land, six). Seven of the occurrences have taken place since 2019.

FOUR-PLUS DINGERS: Albuquerque blasted at least four home runs in consecutive ballgames for the first time since May 27-28, 2023 vs. Round Rock (four in each).
XBH: The Isotopes tallied 11 extra-base hits last night, their most since tying a franchise record (13) May 16, 2023 vs. Tacoma.

BACK-TO-BACK: Michael Toglia and Aaron Schunk delivered the second set of back-to-back blasts for Isotopes hitters in 2024 (also: Sam Hilliard \& Hunter Goodman, April 23 vs. Oklahoma City).

TOTAL BASES: The Isotopes registered 38 total bases yesterday, most in any contest since July 2, 2023 vs. El Paso (39) when they recorded a 20-2 triumph.

SWIPES: Albuquerque stole four bases yesterday, and are 10-for-10 on the basepaths against El Paso the past two days. Was their fourth contest with at least a quartet of thefts this season, and the Chihuahuas have been the opponent in three of them.

BAGS FOR THE YEAR: The Isotopes have 59 steals on the year, second in Triple-A (most: Tacoma, 79).
BULLPEN: Last night,the Isotopes bullpen (Austin Kitchen, Matt Koch, Matt Carasiti) did not walk anyone for the third time this season (also: April 5 at OKC, April 28 vs. OKC).

FIRST INNING RUNS: The Isotopes allowed one first-inning run yesterday; yielded 16 over their last nine games. For the year, the club has surrendered 39 first-inning tallies, most in Triple-A.

ERROR 404: The Isotopes committed two errors, increasing Albuquerque's Triple-A worst miscue total to 41. Have at least one error in eight of the last 10 ballgames.

THREE-BAGGERS: Coco Montes tripled in the fourth frame Sunday, giving the Isotopes an MiLB-leading 17 three-baggers on the year. They've tallied a triple in 12 of 36 games.

TAKE FLIGHT: Jimmy Herron has a hit in 22 of 23 games played in 2024, including eight-straight (10×30, double and four RBI), with four multi-hit contests on the year and two in his last four ... Dating back to June 25, 2023, Herron has reached base in 67 of his last 73 ballgames.
ON-BASE STREAK: Jimmy Herron tallied a hit yesterday to extend his on-base streak to 23 , every game he's played in 2024. His on-base streak is tied for the longest active streak in Triple-A (also: Shay Whitcomb, SUG).

FAN FAVORITE: Coco Montes tallied two doubles and a homer yesterday, his second-straight three-hit game (last back-to-back three hit games: Sept. 10-11, 2021, Double-A Hartford). Was first time registering three XBH hits in a game. ... Has a hit in 11 of his last 13 games. Slashing .400/.468/.727 with five doubles, two triples, three homers and eight RBI during stretch.

BIG MIKE: Michael Toglia has gone deep three times in his last two games. Has back-to-back multi-hit performances for the first time since Sept. 8-9, 2023, vs. Reno, his last two games of the season before being shut down with an injury.
REAL SLIM SCHUNKY: Aaron Schunk is 6 -for-10 with a pair of doubles and homers in the last two games. Has gone deep in consecutive ballgames for the first time since July 30-31, 2022 (Yard Goats) ... Has three homers in his last eight games after recording one in his first 22.

JC: Julio Carreras hit first homer yesterday since Sept. 22, 2023, vs. Oklahoma City, snapping 124 homerless at-bat streak. His first multi-RBI game since July 19, 2023 at Somerset (two).
TONY: Drew Romo swatted his second Triple-A homer in his last seven games. Had zero in his first 24 contests.

## NUGLE NOTES

SKIPPER: Pedro Lopez enters his 20th year as a minor league manager and second guiding the Isotopes, the eighth manager in club history ... Spent 2021 as Albuquerque's hitting coach and 2022 as its bench coach ... Notched his 1,000th career managerial victory June 4, 2023 at Salt Lake, 7-1. Managed in the Texas Rangers (2001-05, 2007) and New York Mets (2011-19) organizations while claiming the 2014 Eastern League Championship with Double-A Binghamton. Lopez was drafted in the 21st round by the San Diego Padres in the 1988 MLB Draft and spent 13 years in the minor leagues, reaching Triple-A on four occasions.

HOMETOWN KID: Jordan Pacheco begins his third season as the Isotopes hitting coach . An Albuquerque native and 2004 graduate of La Cueva High School, Pacheco then attended the University of New Mexico (2005-07), where he was one of the most prolific offensive players in school history (.384, 59 2B, 25 HR, 145 RBI) ... Drafted by Rockies in the 9th round in 2007 and made his MLB debut with Colorado in 2011.

CHRIS MICHALAK: Begins his second season as Isotopes pitching coach ... Pitched for the Albuquerque Dukes in 2000, followed by stints with the Isotopes in 2004 and 2008
. Started second-to-last game in Dukes history, giving up two runs in 6.0 innings during Game 4 of a PCL First Round playoff series at Memphis Sept. 9, 2000 ... Appeared in 61 Major League games (24 starts) over five season with the Arizona Diamondbacks (1998), Toronto Blue Jays (2001) Texas Rangers (2001-02) and Cincinnati Reds (2006)

12th round selection by the Athletics in 1993 ... Has been in the coaching ranks since 2009, including stops as the pitching coach for the Hagerstown Suns (2010-11), Potomac Nationals (2012-13) and Harrisburg Senators (2014-17). He was also the Minor League pitching coordinator for the Miami Marlins form 2018-20 and coached in the Washington Nationals organization from 2021-22.

MICHAEL RYAN: Enters his first year with the Rockies organization as the Isotopes bench coach ... It's his second stop in Albuquerque after the former outfielder played in 33 games for the club and hit nine homers during the 2008 campaign. He and Michalak were teammates on that squad for four days in late July ... Entered the coaching ranks in 2012 as a coach for the Double-A Altoona Curve (Pirates). He then managed in the Pirates organization at three levels for seven seasons with stops at Single-A West Virginia (2013-14), High-A Bradenton (2015-16) and Double-A Altoona (2017-19), while winning the Florida State League in 2016 and Eastern League in 2017. Ryan compiled a 221-197 managerial record with Altoona-the most wins for a manager in Curve history
. He also managed in the Cubs organization (High-A South Bend, 2021 and Double-A Tennessee, 2022-June 2023) ... A 5th round draft pick by the Minnesota Twins in 1996, played in 149 MLB games over parts of five seasons with the Twins (2002-05) and Angels (2010) ... Last Angels player to wear 27 prior to Mike Trout's call-up in 2011.

SPLIT-SEASON PLAYOFF FORMAT: For the second-straight year, the Pacific Coast League will use a split-season format to determine playoff participants.
