## TODAY'S HEADLINES

**LAST TIME OUT:** The Saints did not have a hit against Riley Thompson and the I-Cubs until the seventh inning in an 8-1 loss on Friday. The Cubs took a 1-0 lead in the first on an Owen Caissie infield single. That would be the only run through the first five innings as Caleb Boushley took the loss in 6.0 innings of two-run baseball. The Cubs scored again in the sixth on a BJ Murray Jr. double. DaShawn Keirsej Jr. broke up the no-hit bid and the shutout in the seventh with his 10<sup>th</sup> home run of the season, cutting the deficit to 2-1. However, the Cubs scored six runs (five unearned) in the eighth inning to put the game out of reach, beating the Saints 8-1.

**FIELDING FAUX PAS:** By committing three errors in Friday's 8-1 loss, the Saints have extended their streak to five consecutive games with an error, tied for their second-longest streak of the season. Their longest streak is eight games, from April 23-May 2. The Saints have committed three errors in each of their last two games, marking the first time in franchise history they committed three errors in back-to-back games.

**NO NO-NO, NO MO':** The Saints did not collect a hit until the seventh inning on Friday in their 8-1 loss to Iowa. It's the second time this season a Saints opponent has carried a no-hitter into the seventh inning this season. Indianapolis carried a no-hitter into the seventh on April 21 before Alex Isola singled with two outs in the inning. The Saints have been no-hit in a nine-inning game once in franchise history; on April 13, 2022 against Indianapolis. The Iowa Cubs did not allow a hit to the Saints on July 11, 2021 in a seven-inning contest.

**ANOTHER DAY, ANOTHER STREAK NOTE:** DaShawn Keirsej Jr. is on a season-long, 12-game hit streak, dating back to May 21, prior to his stint on the Injured List. Over the streak, Keirsej Jr. is hitting .382 (21-for-55), with a .386 on-base percentage and a .655 slugging percentage. He's hit three doubles and four home runs over the 12-game streak. Keirsej Jr. is the 10<sup>th</sup> Saints batter to collect a 12-game hit streak, only six have made it to 13-or-more games. The franchise record is 17 games, set by Andrew Stevenson from June 8-July 3, 2023.

**JUNE JOLT:** June has been a major turning point for the Saints in 2024. They lead all full-season clubs with a .391 on-base percentage and .913 OPS in June, ranking second in batting average (.294) and slugging percentage (.522). Their 153 runs scored this month are the sixth-most and their 45 homers are the third-most. The 126 walks drawn are tied for the third-most. Below is how the Saints' offense has fared in each month this season:

**SUMMERTIME SEVERINO:** In Yunior Severino's 30 games since May 21, he has hit .396 (42-for-106), with nine home runs, drawing 26 walks to 28 strikeouts, owning a 1.194 OPS. In June, Severino leads the IL in batting average (.437), on-base percentage, sporting a .564 clip, and OPS, at 1.296, ranking second in slugging percentage at .732. His 21 June walks are tied for the the second-most in the league.

Severino is having one of the best months a for a Saints hitter in franchise history. Severino's .437 June batting average is the highest for any Saints player (min. 35 PAs) in any month dating back to 2021. His .564 on-base percentage is also the highest and his 1.296 OPS is the third-highest. He's also just the eighth player to register a 30-hit month in franchise history.

**WALLNER WARMING UP:** In his 24 June games, Matt Wallner has hit .316/.391/.735 sporting a 1.126 OPS. He's hit a league-high 12 home runs in his this month, averaging a 93.4 mph exit velocity and owns a .418 ISO in that span. He's also the league leader in June in RBI (28), total bases (72), slugging percentage, and extra-base hits (17) and runs (25).

Wallner's 12 home runs in June are the most for any Triple-A player in any month this season and tied for the most for any IL batter in any month since 2021. Wallner is the 18<sup>th</sup> IL batter since 2021 to hit 10 home runs in a month and just the second Saint to accomplish the feat, joining Chris Williams, who hit 10 home runs in June of 2023.

**TWINS UPDATE:** The Twins took a 2-1 lead over the Mariners in the sixth inning thanks to a two-run home run from Carlos Correa, but could not hold the lead in a 3-2 loss to Seattle in 10 innings. Bailey Ober allowed just one run over 6.0 innings, allowing two hits, three walks and nine strikeouts. Seattle tied the game in the eighth inning and forced extras. The Twins were held off the board in the 10<sup>th</sup>, while Seattle got a run in the bottom half to walk off the Twins, 3-2.

**LAST APPEARANCE:** 6/23 v TOL...made ninth AAA start of the season, allowing a career-high 12 runs over 2.1 innings on 11 hits, tying his career-high, walked none and struck out five...gave up three runs in the first inning on a solo home run to Parker Meadows to lead off the ballgame...two batters later Dillon Dingler connected on a two-run homer...gave up three extra-base hits to begin the second inning: doubles to Riley Unroe and Alvaro Gonzalez before surrendering a three-run home run to Andrew Navigato...three batters later Dingler hit his second homer, a two-run blast...allowed a one-out home run to Unroe in the third inning, followed by two singles and an RBI double to Meadows to close the start...12 runs are the most allowed in a start in franchise history, as are the five home runs...Saints allowed a franchise-record seven home runs on the day...took sixth loss and fourth consecutive in AAA in 20-9 Saints defeat.

**APPEARANCE PRIOR:** 6/16 v OAK...appointed as 27<sup>th</sup> man by Minnesota, pitching in relief after Chris Paddock allowed five runs over 2.1 innings...threw a career-high 4.1 innings of relief, making his eighth career relief appearance in the Major Leagues...retired his first six batters...allowed two runners in the fifth via single and hit by pitch...followed HBP with another six consecutive outs...surrendered four consecutive two-out singles in the seventh, allowing a pair of runs to score...bequeathed a pair of runners to Josh Staumont, who was able to get out of the inning...did not receive a decision in 8-7 Twins victory

**SOMEONE IS FLIPPING OVER A CHECKERS BOARD:** During the 2023 offseason, Louie got engaged to Maddie Hentges, a former lacrosse player at Concordia-St. Paul (2017-20), the same school as Varland. Maddies brother, Sam, was a star forward on the Totino-Grace HS hockey team, played at St. Cloud State, and was a Minnesota Wild draft pick. Maddies Dad, Mark, was a Hobie Baker Award finalist in 1980 at St. Thomas, a 2x All-American (1980 & 81) and played in the Montreal Canadiens organization.

**NOTHING TO RANT(Z) ABOUT X 2:** Make it back-to-back years in which Varland was honored with the Jim Rantz Minnesota Twins Minor League Pitcher of the Year Award. In 2021 he received it after going 10-4 with a 2.10 ERA in 20 games (18 starts) between Low-A Fort Myers and High-A Cedar Rapids. In 103.0 innings pitched he fanned 142 while opponents hit .214 against him. In 2022, between Double-A Wichita and Triple-A St. Paul, he went 8-5, 3.06 (126.1 IP, 43 ER) with 42 walks and 146 strikeouts as opponents hit .242 against him across 24 games (23) starts. He also went 1-2, 3.81 ERA (26.0 IP, 11 ER) with six walks, 21 strikeouts, and a .261 opponents batting average in five starts.

**WHO SAYS YOU CAN'T GO HOME:** With the transfer from Double-A to Triple-A, on August 8, 2022, Varland returned home. He became the first player from St. Paul to play for the Saints since the team became a Triple-A franchise. Some of the players from the Independent days that were from St. Paul that played for the Saints include Jack Morris, Ryan Schlosser, Tim Thomas (1995), Chris Schwab, Steve Butler, Adam Larson, Brian Whinnery, Zach Peterson, Reid Mahon, Matt Schuld, Joe Bonfe, Jack Gohl, and Jake Esch.

**HULKAMANIA:** While in high school at North St. Paul High School, Varland was on the wrestling team. He was a two-time MSHSL State Tournament wrestler, two-time MVP, Most Improved, Rookie of the Year, two-time section runner up and four-time captain of the wrestling team.

**GET ON THE BUS, GUS:** Louie's brother, Gus, is 13 months older than him. They played together at North St. Paul High School and Concordia, St. Paul. Gus was selected in the 14<sup>th</sup> round by the Oakland Athletics in 2018 out of Concordia, St. Paul. Gus was then traded to the Dodgers along with 3B Sheldon Neuse in exchange for LHP Adam Kolarek and RF Cody Thomas on February 12, 2021. He was claimed in the Minor League phase of the Rule 5 draft by the Milwaukee Brewers from the L.A. Dodgers on December 7, 2022

**NOT MY BROTHERS KEEPER:** - Louie faced off against his brother Gus in 2022 as the Wind Surge took on the Tulsa Drillers on May 6, 2022 in Wichita. It's the first time brothers started against each other in the Minors since at least the 2000s. Louie went 5.0 IP allowed two runs on four hits while walking two and striking out six. His brother went 3.0 IP allowing six runs on eight hits while walking two and striking out two in a 7-2 Wichita victory in game one of a doubleheader.

**BROTHERLY LOVE:** On June 15, 2022 the Wind Surge and Drillers met again in a doubleheader in Wichita. This time, the brothers pitched opposite ends of the doubleheader and each got a victory. Louie won Game 1 allowing two runs across 6.0 innings while walking one and striking out four in a 7-4 Wind Surge win. In the second game, Gus pitched 2.0 shutout innings of relief allowing one hit and striking out four in a 4-3 Drillers victory.

**RUNS IN THE FAMILY:** While Louie has more than made a name for himself, he might not even be the most athletic person in his family. His Aunt's Denise and Sue were legendary softball pitchers at North St. Paul High School.

- Post-Season International League All-Star with the Saints going 7-1 with a 3.97 ERA (81.2 IP/36 ER) while walking 26 and striking out 88 with a .265 OBA in 16 games (15 starts) in 2023
- Allowed three-or-fewer earned runs in 18-straight minor league starts in 2022 from May 18, 2022-end of season going 4-4, 2.85 ERA (94.2 IP, 30 ER) with 31 walks and 111 strikeouts in that span. His teams were 12-6 in that span
- Made his major league debut in game one of the doubleheader on September 7, 2022 at New York-AJL, becoming the 10<sup>th</sup> player to make his major league debut for the Twins in 2022 (5<sup>th</sup> pitcher)
