Tonight's Game

The Clippers will send RHP **Austin Peterson** to the mound tonight, looking for his first win of the season (last win was 9/9/25 at St. Paul). Lehigh Valley will counter with LHP **Kolby Allard**. Columbus is 10-16 (.385) versus left handers this year. Allard has pitched against the Clippers twice in his career (2018-19 with Gwinnett), going 1-1 with a 6.39ERA (12.2IP, 16H, 9R, 9ER, 4BB, 9K).

vs. the IronPigs

Columbus has won 46 of the last 78G (.590), including playoffs. All-time in Allentown, the Clippers are 34-25 (.576), including playoffs (2-0 in '11 GC Finals). This year marks the second straight season the Clippers have travelled to Allentown and the third time since the expansion of the IL (Lehigh has been to Columbus once, 2024). **Dom Nunez** has 2HR and 7RBI in 8G against the Pigs in his career.

Outliers

The Clippers are on the verge of reaching 50 wins, doing so with a negative run differential (-5; other five teams with at least 49 wins are at least +23, averaging +53). Columbus also has the wrong end of the hit battle (-2; other five teams average +20), while sitting perfectly even in the homer department (other five average +18). Over 70% of the team's wins (35) have been in games decided by three or fewer.

Missed Opportunities

In the second half of the year, Columbus has the 7th most PA with the bases loaded in the IL (24), but the lineup has produced the 19th best OPS (.394; 3x22 with a triple and 9RBI). The Clippers left the bases loaded once last night (fifth time in last 3G) and lead the IL with 129LOB through 14G this half (9.2 per game; led with 585LOB, 7.9 per in the first half). With RISP, they are 10x63 (.159) in the last 6G.

Frias Feeling It

Dayan Frias is 0x7 in his last 2G, but has drawn a walk in each to grow his on base streak to 12G (.354OBP since 6/18). He is hitting .279 (12x43) during the streak, after having gone 2x27 (.074) in his previous 15G (5/6-6/16). Prior to his two hitless games, both his average (.208) and slugging (.283) stood at season highs on 7/1, while his OBP sat at just under .300 (has not been over since 4/12).

Angel Ascendant

Angel Genao has a 1.033OPS in the last 19G, batting .391 (27x69) while drawing 13BB in 85PA (15%) over that time (11BB in 139PA, 8%, in first 35G with Columbus). Genao has scored 15 runs in those 19G, collecting 11RBI and 7XBH (.551SLG). Among IL hitters with at least 35PA from the 7th inning on, Genao has the 2nd best OPS (1.209; 1st- **Travis Bazzana**, 11th- **Kody Huff**, 12th- **Cooper Ingle**).

More Ralphy

Ralph Velazquez extended his career best on base streak to 28G last night (.387OBP since 6/3), collecting a homer (hits in 14 of last 15; .339, 20x59). His streak is the third longest active streak in the IL and, since its start, he has watched his OBP balloon by 80 points, his average jump 72 points and his SLG climb 150 points (had 6XBH in first 8G, 1XBH in middle 16G, 4XBH in last 4G).

Free for All

CJ Kayfus was part of the crime ring last night, collecting the first multi-steal game of his career (21SB in 304G prior). As a team, the 7SB from Columbus equaled to the total over the previous 12G (87SB in first 59G of the year, 16SB in next 28G before last night). In his last 5G, Kayfus is hitting .353 (6x17) with a double, triple and homer (.706SLG; was 10x56, .179, with 2HR and a .286SLG in 15G prior).

Another Personal Best

Kody Huff tied his career high in steals (7) on 6/28, having already hit top marks in triples (4), homers (11), runs (51), RBI (50), hit streak (12G, 5/1-5/16) and on base streak (20G, 6/2-6/28). He enters tonight a pair of walks short of his personal best (44BB in 2024 with Akron). All of that damage has come in just 286PA (averaged 398PA from 2024-25, when he set all his prior career highs).

Ten for Tolentino

Milan Tolentino saw his hitting streak snapped at 10G on Sunday (.382, 13x34, 6/24-7/4), one off his career best of 11G in 2023 with Lake County. Dating to the nightcap vs. Scranton/WB on 6/19, he is 16x48 (.333) in his last 15G, collecting 9XBH (.625SLG) and 11RBI (was 5x39, .128, in 13G prior). Over his last 8G, Tolentino has drawn 9BB to only 5K (33PA; had 8BB and 42K in previous 33G, 114PA).

This Date in Clipper History

7/9/1988

The Clippers blew out the PawSox 10-3 at McCoy Stadium thanks to a rare offensive explosion by the lowest scoring team in Clipper history. **Hal Morris** led the way, going 3x5 with a HR and 4RBI. Morris would lead the IL in hitting with a .326 mark, now good for 9th best in Clipper history, and he was also named Clipper of the Year. Two years later, Morris helped the Cincinnati Reds beat Oakland in the World Series.

First Half Wrap

Despite being eliminated from playoff contention on the penultimate Sunday of the first half, the Clippers were 41-33 and finished with their first winning record in the front half since the season was split in 2023 (averaged 32 wins from 2023-25, topping out at 34-38, .472, last season). From 4/22-6/17, they spent every day between 3.0 and 6.0 games off the lead, while occupying anywhere between 4th and 13th in the standings. A late push (15-6 from 5/16-6/9) got them to within 2.5 before derailing with a 3G losing streak at Indy to seal their fate. On the back half, Columbus has posted just one winning record, clinching a playoff berth in 2024 with a mark of 48-26 (.649).

Huntington (Small) Park

In each of the first 11 seasons after the move downtown (2009-19), Huntington Park ranked among the top two in the IL in homers per game. With the arrival of six new parks to the IL in 2021, Huntington Park finished 4th, 6th and 10th from 2021-23, respectively. The 2024 season saw a return to the top (2.96; 108HR hit by the Clippers, most for the home team in HP's existence), but it dropped back to 7th last year (2.31). Including the postseason, the Clippers have been out-homered over the life of the park (1,453 to 1,400).

Challenging Times

The Clippers are 129-106 (.549) in pitch reviews, with batters going 67-70 (.489) and pitchers/catchers going 62-36 (.633). They have run out of challenges in 38G and have not challenged in 4G. Last season, they were correct 43.1% of the time (2nd worst in the IL).

Extras, Read All About Them

Columbus is 5-4 in extra innings this year, after having gone .500 in each of the last two seasons. Since the start of the 2018 season, when baserunners started appearing at second base, the Clippers are 55-37 when playing past regulation (.598, best in the IL; no other team above .571), including 27-17 at home (.614; 5-7 in last 12G). Of the 92G to require extra play, 73 have been resolved after one frame (including nine DH games) and only one has gone past the 12th (5-4 loss in 13 on 9/20/22 at Toledo).

On the Runs

Starting with the embiggened 150G schedule in 2022, the Clippers scored over 800 runs in three consecutive seasons from 2022-2024 (855, 808 and 805 runs, respectively; accounting for the 3rd, 4th and 5th best totals in team history). Following a steep decline last season (670, fewest scored in a full season since 2018), Columbus is looking to top 800 again (on pace for 806, would rank as 5th most all-time; record is 898 scored in 1983).

On the Run

On the basepaths, the Clippers are making a run at the franchise mark in stolen bases, with 110 through the first 88G (on pace for 186SB). The team record was set in 2024 when Columbus swiped an even 200, but the team speed was throttled last year (129SB; still, the 2nd highest total since the Cleveland affiliation started in 2009). However, with 30CS so far, the Clippers are also pacing for the most times caught stealing of the Cleveland affiliation (51; nabbed 51 times in 2024).

Crazy Eighth's

From the 8th inning on, the Clippers have scored an IL-best 134 runs while crafting a .920OPS (nearly 100 points better than all other teams). On the flipside, Columbus has given up 70 runs from the 8th on, resulting in a +64 run differential (Clippers are getting outscored 200-133 from innings 5-7).

Juiced is Loose

In the Huntington Park Era (since 2009), Columbus leads the IL with 78 grand slams and 1,954RBI (led IL in RBI in 2010, '11, '12, '17, '18 and '22). Collecting an IL-best 10 grand slams last season, it marked their fifth straight season with at least four (118RBI last year; had only 97RBI in 2024, worst in a 140+G season since 2016).

In Big Trouble

The Clipper pitching staff is trending toward the worst ERA in club history, sitting at 5.15 through the first 88G. Since the reorganization of the minor leagues in 2021, Columbus has twice finished the season with a 5+ ERA (current record is 5.32, set in 2023), after having done so just once in the first 43 seasons (5.08 in 1983). However, the staff is pacing to give up only 174HR (average of 182 per season since the Year of the Homer in 2019).

Department of Defense

The Columbus defense is sitting at 7th in the IL this year (.980), following a 2025 that saw a franchise record (.985, led the IL). On 4/10 at Worcester, the defense collapsed for the first 5E game since 8/27/24 (topped out at 3E in a game twice last year and had fewer than 5E in 21 of 26 series). The Clippers have played flawlessly in 48G this season (29-19, .604), after doing so in nearly 60% of games last year (44-42, .512), including 16 straight from 6/20-7/8/25 (longest streak in the IL over the last 20 years).

Good Baseball

CJ Kayfus bunted a runner into scoring position with a single on 7/5 vs. Louisville, with that runner kicking off a 5-run inning that led the Clippers to victory. Since the start of the 2018 season, Columbus is 90-23 (.796) in games in which a run is scored after a good bunt attempt, including a 7-2 mark this season (.778, blew 7-run lead in one of the losses; went 23-2 in 2018).

To the End

The Clippers have the most last at bat wins this year (14, tied with Syracuse) while playing in the most games decided in the last at bat (24). Since the start of the 2024 season, Columbus has played in 97G decided in the last at bat (2nd most in the IL), going 48-49 (.495, 14th best winning percentage; 3rd most wins, 2nd most losses).

Manager Profile

Andy Tracy made his Clippers debut in 2021, following **Tony Mansolino's** championship rookie year in 2019 (sixth Clipper skipper to win Governors' Cup in first season; **Gene Michael**-'79, **Joe Altobelli**-'80, **Frank Verdi**-'81, **Bucky Dent**-'87 and **Mike Sarbaugh**-'10). This season marks Tracy's sixth year as a manager (first was with Williamsport in the Philadelphia system), as he holds a career record of 435-445 (.494), 405-399 with Columbus (.504).

Starting Now:

Peterson got a late start to the season, beginning the year on the shelf with a strained right triceps. Since being activated on 4/28, he is one of 27 pitchers in the IL to accumulate at least 50.0IP, ranking 14th among that group with a 4.55ERA (55.1IP, 28ER) and 18th with a 1.41WHIP. He ranks 2nd with 63K, thanks to a 12K outing on 6/16 vs. Scranton/WB (one off career high of 13K with Lake County at Cedar Rapids on 5/29/24).

Love Those Ohio Mounds:

Peterson excels when pitching in Ohio, having appeared in the state 38 times over his short career (15G with Columbus, 12G with Akron, 8G with Lake County, 3G in Toledo). He owns a 13-9 record in the Buckeye State, fashioning a 2.38ERA (216.0IP, 165H, 61R, 57ER, 44BB, 208K). Outside of Ohio, his ERA sits at 4.43 over 53G (262.0IP, 275H, 147R, 129ER, 67BB, 243K).

First and Foremost:

Through his first 12GS, Peterson has allowed a single run in the 1st inning (homer to **Kaelen Culpepper** to lead off the game on 5/15 at St. Paul; opposing hitters are 3x38 with 3BB and 16K in the 1st inning). Despite that early success, the top third of the order has a .931OPS off Peterson (6HRin 85AB). When wrapping around to include the bottom two in the order, Peterson has surrendered a line of .304/.370/.512, while holding batters 4-7 to a line of .202/.299/.274.

In a Jam:

Opposing hitters are batting .303 (27x89) with runners on base (.333, 17x51 with RISP) this year, while going just 28x120 (.233) with the bases empty. Only 23.5% of at bats end in a strikeout with RISP (12K, 51AB), compared to 32.3% in all other scenarios (51K, 158AB). Of his 401 pitches thrown with runners on base this season, he has yet to uncork a wild pitch (1WP in 999 pitches with men on base during Clipper career).
