YESTERDAY: The Flying Squirrels and Baysox were suspended in the middle of the third inning. Reed Trimble led off the game with a solo homer to give the Baysox a 1-0 lead. The start of the game was delayed for one hour. Richmond starter **Jack Choate** threw three innings and allowed one run with four strikeouts. Nestor German started for the Baysox and struck out two in two scoreless innings, allowing one hit.

TODAY'S GAME: The Flying Squirrels play completion of Tuesday's rain-suspended game as well as the second of a three-game home series against the Chesapeake Baysox, Double-A affiliate of the Baltimore Orioles. This is the second set between these two teams this year. The Baysox won four-of-six at The Diamond from April 15-20. The Flying Squirrels will head to Bowie for three games from Friday through Sunday and return to Prince George's Stadium for the final series between the two teams from August 19-24.

RETURN OF THE VEES: In the first game tonight, the Flying Squirrels don Richmond Virginians jerseys, celebrating the former International League team that called Richmond home from 1954-1964. When the St. Louis Browns moved to Baltimore in 1954, the Triple-A Baltimore Orioles relocated to Richmond that year and became the Virginians. They were managed by Hall of Fame inductee Luke Appling for their first two seasons. In 1956, the Virginians became the Triple-A affiliate of the New York Yankees. The team played at Parker Field through the 1964 season before moving to Toledo to become the present-day Mud Hens. Notable players including Joe Pepitone, Mel Stottlemyre, Bobby Richardson, Al Downing, Tom Tresh, Clete Boyer, Deron Johnson, Granny Hamner, Jake Gibbs, Luis Arroyo, Eddie Kasko and Monty Kennedy played for the Virginians over their 11 seasons in Richmond.

PACKING THE HOUSE: Last year, the Flying Squirrels led all 30 Double-A teams in average (6,595) and total (435,295) attendance. Among the 120 MiLB teams, the Flying Squirrels were 10th in average attendance. It was the third straight year the Flying Squirrels led all 30 Double-A clubs in average and total attendance, which had not been done prior to 2022. Last year's total attendance is the highest since 2013 (434,769) and the fourth-highest average in team history. April 4 marked the 15th consecutive Opening Night sellout, marking every home opener in franchise history to date. This year, the Flying Squirrels are averaging 6,622 fans per home game, which ranks fifth among all 120 MiLB clubs. Their average of 7,290 in the season's first month was the highest April attendance in franchise history.

THE FLYING SQUIRRELS dropped four-of-six in last week's series against the Fightin' Phils to open the second half, splitting the first four before dropping the last two. Of Richmond's 50 losses this season, 27 of them have been by two runs or less (18 by one, nine by two). Their 18 one-run losses are the most in the EL, two ahead of Reading (16). The Richmond offense is last in the Eastern League in runs scored (237). Richmond's pitching staff has a league-high 4.60 ERA.

THE BAYSOX: went 1-5 to open the Eastern League's second half last week at home against the Curve. Chesapeake's roster features five players ranked in Baseball America's top-30 prospects list, including OF Enrique Bradfield Jr. (No. 3), RHP Braxton Bragg (No. 9), RHP Trey Gibson (No. 10), RHP Levi Wells (No. 11) and RHP Nestor German (No. 13). MLB.com's top-30 Orioles prospects list includes six Baysox players, including Bradfield (No. 2), German (No. 10), C/IB Creed Willems (No. 11), Gibson (No. 14), Bragg (No. 15) and Bright (No. 25).

STRONG ARMS: Since June 16, the Flying Squirrels have posted a 3.19 ERA (33 ER/93.0 IP) in 11 games. The Richmond bullpen has posted a 0.60 ERA (3 ER/45.1 IP) in that stretch. Richmond's 2.08 ERA (9 ER/39.0 IP) in their last road set at Altoona from June 17-22 was their lowest of the season for a series and the best in the Eastern League for the week. The previous low was a 3.17 ERA (19 ER/54.0 IP) in their six-game series from April 15-20 against Chesapeake at The Diamond.

FOR RICHMOND: Left-hander **Seth Lonsway** makes his 15th start of the season and the fourth of his career against the Baysox. He last pitched on Thursday against the Fightin' Phils and was charged with a loss after allowing one run over five innings with five strikeouts. In his three previous starts against the Baysox, Lonsway is 0-1 with a 6.00 ERA (10 ER/15.0 IP). He has made two starts against the Baysox this year, both at The Diamond in April, and went 0-1 with a 4.50 ERA (5 ER/10.0 IP). In his first eight starts this season through May 20, Lonsway went 2-2 with a 2.40 ERA (11 ER/41.1 IP). On the season, Lonsway is ranked seventh in the Eastern League in innings pitched (70.1) and seventh in ERA (3.45). Lonsway was selected by the Giants in the sixth round of the 2021 MLB Draft out of Ohio State. He joined the Flying Squirrels last June and went 2-1 with a 1.38 ERA in six outings before his season ended in August. **For more on Lonsway, see page two.**

FOR CHESAPEAKE: Right-hander Trey Gibson makes his fifth Double-A start and the first of his career against the Flying Squirrels. In his last outing on Thursday against the Curve, Gibson threw 3.2 innings and allowed two runs with seven strikeouts. Gibson began the season with High-A Aberdeen and went 1-2 with a 5.12 ERA in nine outings (eight starts). Gibson grew up in Yorktown, Va., and attended Grafton High School. He spent his college career at Liberty University, where he was teammates with former Flying Squirrels pitcher Dylan Cumming, and was the 2021 Atlantic Sun Freshman of the Year. Gibson signed with the Orioles as a non-drafted free agent in 2023. He is ranked by Baseball America as the No. 10 Orioles prospect and No. 14 by MLB.com.

DON'T RUN ON RICHMOND: The Flying Squirrels' catching unit of **Adrián Sugastey**, **Zach Morgan** and **Onil Perez** have combined to catch 40 stolen base attempts this season, which is second among the 30 Double-A teams and leads the Eastern League. Sugastey leads all Double-A catchers with 27 runners caught stealing. Morgan, who was promoted to Triple-A Sacramento on June 10, is seventh in the Eastern League with 12. Perez threw out his first base-stealing attempt on Wednesday.

GO, DIEGO, GO!: **Diego Velasquez** is batting .301 (22-for-73) in his last 19 games since June 6 with two doubles, three RBIs, 11 walks and eight runs scored. In that span, he has at least one hit in 14-of-19 games and multiple hits in seven games. He went 0-for-4 on Saturday and 0-for-5 on Sunday to snap his team-leading 14-game on-base streak that dated back to June 10, which was the longest by a Richmond player this season. His 13-game on-base streak from April 18-May 5 is tied for the second-longest on the team in 2025. In the Eastern League this season, Velasquez is fifth in hits (70), eighth in OBP (.375), tied for seventh in walks (38) and 10th in batting average (.276). Since his Double-A debut on July 24, 2024, Velasquez is ranked third in the Eastern League in batting average (.289), fourth in OBP (.380), second in hits (116), tied for fifth in walks (54) and tied for seventh in total bases (139).

BERI BOMBS: Outfielder/first baseman **Victor Bericoto** has homered twice in his last five games. He hit a solo homer on Wednesday and added another on Saturday. He has six homers with the Flying Squirrels this season, giving him 28 for his Richmond career dating back to 2023, which is the fourth-most in franchise history. He is two homers behind third-place **Jarrett Parker** (30). Bericoto opened the season with Richmond and hits .319 with three homers, four doubles and eight RBIs in 13 games before being promoted to the River Cats on April 20. He was placed on the injured list with Triple-A Sacramento on May 9 and played six games with the ACL Giants on a rehab assignment before returning to the Flying Squirrels on June 3.

NIGHT AT THE ROXBY: Reliever **Braxton Roxby** closed his third save of the season on Sunday in Richmond's 2-1 win at Altoona. In that outing, he allowed an earned run for the first time since April 29 after throwing 13 consecutive games without surrendering an earned run, spanning 18 innings. In that stretch, the only two runs he surrendered were a pair of unearned runs in the 10th inning on May 27 against the Senators. In his last 15 outings since April 29, Roxby is 3-0 with a 0.43 ERA (1 ER/21.0) with 24 strikeouts and six walks. Among Eastern League relievers (min. 30 IP) this season, Roxby's 1.20 ERA is ranked third.

IN THE LEAGUE LEADERS: In the Eastern League, **Diego Velasquez** is ranked fifth in hits (70), eighth in OBP (.375), tied for seventh in walks (38) and 10th in batting average (.276). **Seth Lonsway** is seventh in ERA (3.45) and sixth in innings pitched (70.1). **John Michael Bertrand** is 10th in ERA (3.69) and second in innings pitched (78.0). **Jack Choate** is tied for eighth in strikeouts (67).

TOP SKIPPER: Flying Squirrels manager **Dennis Pelfrey** has led the team to 227 wins in his career, which is a new franchise record all-time wins record for a manager. He passed the record with Richmond's 6-1 win at Binghamton on May 23. From 2011-2013, **Dave Machemer** won 216 games as Richmond's manager, leading the team to the Eastern League postseason for in 2011. Pelfrey, who has been with Richmond since the 2022 season, led the team to back-to-back postseason appearances for the first time in franchise history in 2022 and 2023. He also managed the 2021 Eugene Emeralds to the High-A West championship.

PROSPECT WATCH: Richmond's roster features five players are ranked in Baseball America's top-30 Giants prospects, including **Joe Whitman** (No. 5), **Diego Velasquez** (No. 10), **Sabin Ceballos** (No. 21) and **Jack Choate** (No. 26). **John Michael Bertrand** is rated as having the best control in the Giants system. **Adrian Sugastey** is ranked as the top defensive catcher. **Aeverson Arteaga** is rated as the best defensive infielder and best infield arm. MLB.com's top-30 Giants prospects list features five Richmond players, including Whitman (No. 7), Velasquez (No. 15), Arteaga (No. 16), Ceballos (No. 23) and Choate (No. 27).

THIS DATE IN RICHMOND BASEBALL HISTORY

1958: The Richmond Virginians lost to the Miami Marlins, 5-2, in 10 innings at Parker Field. Frank Herrera broke the game open with a three-run homer in the top of the 10th. Satchel Paige entered from the Miami bullpen with the bases loaded and one out in the seventh inning and escaped the jam. He worked the rest of the game on the mound without allowing a run over 3.2 innings to pick up his sixth win of the season. **1982:** The Richmond Braves beat the Tidewater Tides, 17-15, at Parker Field. Craig McMurtry walked in a run before a grand slam by Brian Giles gave the Tides a 5-0 lead in the first inning. Albert Hall tripled in Brett Butler to cut the score to 5-1 in the bottom of the first. Tidewater scored a run on a double by Mike Davis in the second and Mike Cabbage hit a three-run homer in the in the fourth to give the Tides a 9-1 lead. Richmond closed the score to 9-5 with four runs in the bottom of the fourth, including a two-run homer by Gerald Perry. In the sixth, Davis hit a solo homer and Bruce Bochy added a two-run homer to extend the lead to 12-5. In the bottom of the sixth, Jerry Keller and Brook Jacoby hit RBI singles before a run on an error and a three-run homer by Leo Vargas closed the gap to 12-11. Mike Howard singled in a run for Tidewater in the seventh to open a 13-11 lead. Matt Snarto hit a two-run single in the bottom of the eighth to tie the game, 13-13. Howard gave Tidewater a 15-13 lead with a two-run triple in the top of the ninth but was thrown out at the plate trying to stretch to an inside-the-park homer. Paul Runge stepped in 0-for-5 in the bottom of the ninth but hit a two-run homer to tie the score, 15-15. In the bottom of the 11th inning, Paul Zuvela, who was 0-for-6 heading into the at-bat, ended the game with a two-run, walk-off homer. The game took three hours and 59 minutes. There were 37 hits, including eight homers, four doubles and three triples. **2022:** The Flying Squirrels beat the Bowie Baysox, 10-3, at Prince George's Stadium. Kyle Harrison started on the mound and struck out seven, allowing one run over five innings. Tyler Fitzgerald hit a three-run homer in the second, his 10th of the year. Sean Roby hit a solo home run in the fourth to become the second player in franchise history to reach 20 home runs in a single season, tying David Villar's single-season record. The game was called early in the middle of the seventh for rain.
