Highlights

Andres Gimenez hit a 3-run double to cap a 6-run 2nd inning that saw Daniel Johnson leadoff with a homer. Cam Hill (1.0IP), Francisco Perez (2.1IP) and Kyle Dowdy (1.2IP) closed out the game with shutout relief.

Tonight's Game

The Clippers will send LHP **Kirk McCarty** to the mound tonight, as they try to reach .500 for the first time since 5/22 (8-8, lost next eight games). St. Paul will counter with LHP **Bryan Sammons**. The Clippers are 3-5 (.375) against left handers this year. Sammons has never pitched against the Clippers in his career (made Triple-A debut three weeks ago).

vs. the Saints

This series marks the first ever matchup between the Clippers and the St. Paul Saints. In 2019, Columbus split the season series against the baby Twins with Rochester, 3-3, after having won 2018, 4-2 (outscored by a combined 57-39 from 2018-19, as the Clippers went 6-1 in 1-run games). The series win over Rochester in 2018 was the first for Columbus since 2015.

Pummeled Pitching

Huntington Park has zoomed back near the top of the IL in homers per game (2nd, 3.14). Unfortunately, 29 of the last 48 have been surrendered by Columbus (149HR allowed in last 75G in the regular season at HP). Clipper pitchers have kept St. Paul in the yard in two straight games, marking the first consecutive homerless games for HP visitors since 7/11-7/12/19 (last with three: 4/23-4/25/19).

Hammering Gimenez

Andres Gimenez homered in each of six games from 6/13-6/19, after never having homered in consecutive games in his career (7HR and 18RBI since 6/13, most in IL; .891SLG ranks 2nd). Prior to his surge, Gimenez laid down three sac bunts over four games from 6/6-6/9 (3-0 when Gimenez executes a sac bunt, 6-2 when he homers). However, Gimenez has missed his last four sac bunt attempts.

Perez Rehab

Wednesday night was the first appearance for **Roberto Perez** since he fractured his right ring finger on 5/3 in Cleveland (on DL since 5/5, on 60-day since 5/23). Perez was hitting .131/.274/.295 with 3HR and 9RBI in 19G (61AB) with Cleveland this year. He last played in Columbus during a rehab assignment in 2016 and has hit .238/.339/.373 with 8HR and 68RBI in 124G with the Clippers.

Johnson Streaks

Daniel Johnson is riding an 11G on base streak (since 6/13, .383OBP), his second double digit streak of the year (first Clipper with multiple, joined by **Gabriel Arias** last night, currently has .419OBP over last 10G). Johnson's homer last night, second straight game, extend his hitting streak to 7G (9x26, .346), making him only the second Clipper to reach the mark (**Ernie Clement**, 7G from 5/6-5/27).

Work to Do

Owen Miller has five hitless games in 10 chances since his return to Columbus (four hitless games in 16G before promotion), batting .200 (7x35). He went hitless in four straight from 6/18-6/22 (14AB), watching his average sink to .333 on 6/23 (season low). Miller is 9PA short of qualifying for the batting title and adding them as hitless at bats would place him in 8th (would rank 9th in OBP).

Take Two

The double from **Nolan Jones** Thursday night was his IL-best 15th of the year (**Oscar Mercado** is tied for 3rd, 13). As a team, the Clippers doubled in 26 straight from 5/22-6/20 and 43 of 45 on the year (doubleless in 25 games during 2019, 10 times in first 45). Jones is slugging .532 over his last 18G, collecting 10 doubles and a pair of HR (6XBH through first 26G).

Group Effort

The bullpen provided 5.0IP of scoreless work last night (2H, 2BB, 6K), marking the second game in a row, and eighth this season, with at least 5.0IP and 0ER (only six such games in all of 2019). After giving up at least 1ER in 12 straight at home, from 5/27-6/23 (62.1IP, 48ER), the bullpen has turned in consecutive scoreless outings at home (11.0IP) for the first time since 8/19-8/20/19 vs. Louisville (5.1IP).

More Bullpen

The last time the bullpen had consecutive scoreless outings at home with at least 5.0IP in each was 7/21-7/22/18 vs. Scranton/WB, the tail end of the last stretch of three straight scoreless home games (0ER over 13.0IP from 7/19-7/22/18; currently at 0ER in last 14.0IP). That dominance has helped the Clippers boat race St. Paul in three straight (game decided by the 2nd inning in each of last three).

This Date in Clipper History

6/26/1983

The Clippers and Mud Hens combined to hit 10HR in a 16-13 shootout at Ned Skeldon Stadium, a game in which the Clippers would win. The 1983 Clippers set the team record with 182HR on the year, with three players, **Brian Dayett** (35), **Matt Winters** (29) and **Steve Balboni** (27) hitting at least 27HR. The 2019 Clippers demolished that record, pounding 213HR (four players with at least 24HR).

Huntington (Small) Park

In each of the first 11 years since the move downtown, Huntington Park has ranked among the top two in the IL in homers per game, totaling 2.25 per contest (1,763HR, 783 games). In 2019, HP averaged over three per game for the first time ever (seventh time averaging over a pair), as the Clippers surrendered a record 127HR and just missed out on triple digits themselves (97HR was second highest team total). Including the postseason, the Clippers have been out-homered over the life of the park (964 to 922).

Record Destruction

The Clippers broke the established mark for homers in a season (182 in 1983) on 8/7/19 and finished with a total of 213 (most in the IL). From 5/14-6/2, they homered in 20 straight games (44HR total) and they had seven straight multi-HR games from 6/14-6/21 (22HR). On the mound, they broke the record for homers allowed (156 in 1998) on 7/31/19, giving up 198 for the year (2nd most in the IL).

Ain't Over 'Til It's Over

From 2014-19, no team had more come from behind victories than the 210 posted by Columbus and no team produced a better winning percentage when trailing than the .353 of the Clippers (Scranton/WB was 2nd in win percentage, .338, and wins, 192). This year has seen the Clippers go 9-23 (.281) in games in which they trail, ranking 9th.

Get What You Pay For

Columbus is the only team in the IL that has yet to play any free baseball this season, having played 85 straight games, including the postseason, since their last extra-inning rumble (7/31/19 vs. Louisville, an 11-8 loss in 11; only extra inning loss of the season, 8-1). Dating to the 1984 season (as far back as the day by day records go) this is the longest the Clippers have gone without extras (had 83 straight from 4/22-7/19/94; current run of 45 straight to start the season is a record, had 39 in 1987).

Trending Downward

The current staff ERA of 5.25 is on pace to be the worst in franchise history (5.08, 1983) and anything over 4.71 will mark the fifth straight season in which the ERA has gotten worse. From 2011-16, the Clipper staff turned in a sub-4.00ERA five times in six seasons (zero such seasons from 1993-2010), including the best two ERAs of the past 32 years (3.33 in 2015 and 3.65 in 2016). The 6.00ERA at Huntington Park is by far the worst ever (5.29 in 2019, only time ERA has ever been over 5.00 at HP).

Doing Damage

In 2019, the Clippers ranked tied for 5th in the IL with 112RBI with the bases loaded, while carrying a .252 average (10th, 36x143, 4HR). In both 2017 and 2018, the Clippers led the IL in RBI with the bases loaded (243RBI total) and paced the circuit in grand slams (16 total, no other team had more than eight).

Free Swingers

After three straight seasons leading the IL in strikeouts, the Clipper lineup is threatening for a fourth, as they currently rank 5th (438K, 41 off the pace, St. Paul). The 2019 squad obliterated the franchise record, as they struck out 95 more times than the previous high (1,392; each of last three seasons rank among franchise's three worst, totalling 3,979K in 422G). While the record appears safe due to the truncated schedule, this year's version is averaging 9.73K per game.

That's More Like It

In 2019, the Clippers were 50-30 (.625) when playing errorless baseball, while turning in a 31-29 (.517) mark with at least one error. Contrary to logic, in 2018 they actually had a worse winning percentage when playing mistake free (.514), than when committing at least one error (.530). The Clipper defense finished 1st in 2019 (.983) after falling to 6th in the IL in 2018, ending a run of three consecutive seasons ranked among the top three (2015-17 resulted in the three best seasons in franchise history).

One On, No Out Success

When the leadoff batter of an inning reached base in 2019, the Clippers plated him nearly 60% of the time (over 51% only once in the last six seasons, 55% in 2016). Getting more than one base was a specialty of Clipper hitters, as they led the IL with 136XBH to lead off the inning, including 54HR (led the IL, had 28 leadoff homers in 2018). From 4/13-4/20/19, the Clippers hit 16 leadoff doubles over 72 innings, including four straight innings in a win at Louisville on 4/15/19.

Good Baseball

Andres Gimenez advanced a runner with a sac bunt on 6/10 at Iowa and the runner came around to score in the win (3-0 when advanced runner scores). During 2019, the Clippers struggled in the bunt department, but when the advanced runners scored, they were 7-1. During 2018, Columbus was 23-2 in games in which a run was scored after a good bunt attempt.

International Accolades

Bobby Bradley was named International League Player of the Month for May 2019, reaching base in 24 of 25 games during the month while hitting .302/.374/.740 with 12HR (led IL) and 28RBI. **Brandon Barnes**, **Eric Haase**, **Josh Smith** and **Asher Wojciechowski** were named to the 2019 IL All-Star Team and Bradley, Barnes and Haase were selected to the postseason squad.

Manager Profile

Andy Tracy makes his Clippers debut in 2021, following **Tony Mansolino's** championship rookie year in 2019 (sixth Clipper skipper to win Governors' Cup in first season; **Gene Michael**-79, **Joe Altobelli**-80, **Frank Verdi**-81, **Bucky Dent**-87 and **Mike Sarbaugh**-10). This season marks Tracy's second year as a manager (first with Williamsport in the Philadelphia system), as he holds a career record of 52-69 (.430), 22-23 with Columbus (.489).

Winning Ways:

McCarty began the season with wins in five consecutive decisions, after having never won more than two in a row in his career prior. While he had his share of success in the wins (31.0IP, 10ER), he needed the offense to get him off the hook in two of his no-decisions (came back from 7-0 deficit vs. Nashville on 5/28, trailed 3-1 when leaving start vs. Toledo on 6/15).

Off the Board:

Starting with his last 2.0IP in the season opener on 5/4 at Louisville and continuing through his first 2.0IP vs. Omaha on 5/16, McCarty fired 10 straight scoreless innings (4H, 0BB, 4K). Through his first 4GS, McCarty started 24 innings (retired the first batter 20 times) and allowed a single tally in seven of them with zero multi-run innings allowed. In his fifth start, on 5/28 vs. Nashville, McCarty allowed multi-run innings in each of the first three, surrendering 4HR (career high, 6th multi-HR game). In four starts since 5/28, McCarty has allowed one multi-run inning in each, while producing scoreless baseball in 17 of 23.0IP.

Lack of Lefties:

Over the course of 140 games in 2019, the Clippers trotted out a lefty starter just 15 times (**Logan Allen**- 5, **Scott Moss**- 4, **Tanner Tully**- 3, **Sean Brady**- 2 and **Kyle Nelson**- 1), as right handers made 68 consecutive starts from 4/18-6/30. Including the bullpen, lefties accounted for 15.5% of the innings pitched for Columbus in 2019 (191.1IP) and only Louisville had fewer. **Josh Smith** led Clipper lefties with 52.2IP in 2019, a total that should be surpassed by McCarty tonight (leads IL with 51.2IP).

2019 Season:

Started the year on Lynchburg's DL with a strained lat... activated on 6/12 and threw 42 pitches at Wilmington (3.0IP, 2H, 4K)... gave up 24H in 16.0IP over next 4GS (10ER)... allowed 1H in 6.0IP (2BB, 6K) at Down East on 7/11, then had a brief stint on the DL (7/18-7/23)... returned from the DL and had 7GS to finish the season, posting a 7.37ERA (30.2IP, 25)... had 10K in 5.1IP at Wilmington on 8/13 (also had 5BB, career high 93 pitches)... following the season, pitched in 6G for Mesa in the Arizona Fall League (24.0IP, 17H, 8R, 8ER, 6BB, 19K).
