TODAY'S HEADLINES

YESTERDAY'S RESULT - The Saints got another superb starting performance as Dereck Rodríguez went 4.0 shutout allowing one hit while walking two and striking out five. The Saints had two separate three run innings as they took down the Louisville Bats 7-1.

SUPERB STARTING STUFF: The St. Paul Saints first four starters have played a game of can you top this. Three of the four didn't yield a run as Mario Sanchez, Cole Sands, and Dereck Rodríguez put up goose eggs. Adding in Daniel Gossett and the Saints starters have gone 16.2 innings and allowed three runs for a 1.63 ERA.

WE'RE #1: The St. Paul Saints spent exactly one day in first place in 2021. By winning the first two games of 2022 the Saints spent more days in first within the first two games of the season than they did in all of 2021. They have been in first place all four days of the season.

RUN BABY RUN- The St. Paul Saints swiped three bases on April 4 @ Louisville as Gilberto Celestino, Royce Lewis, and Jake Cave all stole second. The three steals tied the franchise record, which they accomplished four times in a nine inning game in 2021.

RUNNIN' ROYCE/QUICK CONTRERAS: In his first three games Royce Lewis has stolen three bases, one in each game. It leaves him one shy of the most consecutive games he has stolen a base in, which is four from May 3-7, 2018. Mark Contreras, on the other hand, has also swiped a bag in the first three games he's played setting a new career high for consecutive games with a stolen base.

WE COULD GET USED TO THIS: The St. Paul Saints played their first ever game in the month of April on Opening Night, April 4. Prior to the April 4 game, the earliest the Saints had ever started the season dating back to their franchises beginning in 1993, was May 5, 2021. The Saints beat the Louisville Bats 3-2 to win their first ever April game.

F-R-I-G-I-D - It took four games, but the Saints broke their franchise record for coldest game. On April 8 at Louisville the game time temperature was 46 degrees. Last season their coldest start on the road was 48 degrees on May 28 at Iowa. Their coldest start at home: a balmy 61 degrees done twice, the last on September 24 against, who else, Iowa.

The Ultimate Sacrifice: The St. Paul Saints had the fewest sacrifice bunts in Triple-A in 2021 with one. That came 105 games into the season on September 5 at Columbus by Drew Stankiewicz. Overall, the Minnesota Twins organization had the fewest sacrifice bunts among the 30 Minor League systems with 12.

Top Talent in the Twin Cities - The Saints Opening Day Roster featured six of the top 30 prospects in the Twins' system according to MLB Pipeline. The first, third, 17th, 19th, 24th, and 30th best prospects in the organization are: IF Royce Lewis, IF Jose Miranda, RHP Cole Sands, RHP Drew Strotman, Jovani Moran, and IF Jermaine Palacios, respectively.

Twins Update -The Twins fell just short in their first game of the season losing 2-1 to the Seattle Mariners. Gio Urshela hit a solo homer for the Twins and Joe Ryan worked 4.0 innings allowing two runs while striking out four. Carlos Correa collected a hit in his Twins debut.

A PITCHER YOU ROOT FOR: When Smeltzer was just nine years old, he was diagnosed with pelvic rhabdomyosarcoma (bladder cancer), as a tumor had formed against his bladder that was connected to his prostate. He underwent surgery and chemotherapy at St. Christopher's Hospital for Children in Philadelphia, PA, and sent the cancer into full remission in 2012.

PHILLIE FAN(ATIC): During his time with cancer, Devin took a photo with the Phillies Cole Hamels. He also received encouragement and an autograph from Chase Utley when he was 10 on a trip to Citizens Bank Park. Fast forward to 2018 when Hamels was in spring training with the Dodgers and who else was on that team? That's right, Chase Utley. The two reunited 13 years later at Spring Training in Arizona.

CATCH CANCER LOOKING: The lefty, who's worn glasses and a goatee for the majority of his professional career, continues to offer support to others fighting cancer through his Catch Cancer Looking apparel with his likeness. All proceeds benefit Katie's Crusaders, an organization focused on helping cover expenses for pediatric cancer survivors.

#NEVERFORGET: -Smeltzer writes the names of fellow cancer patients under the brim of his cap of both survivors and those that didn't make it. He started this at the age of 10 and did that as recently as 2018. Since then he carries a hat that has a bunch of names on it and puts it on his top shelf with all his other hats in his locker.

THE-OUT-OF-TOWNER: Believe it or not, Smeltzer had never stepped foot in New York City, that is until he pitched in Game 2 of the American League Division Series at Yankee Stadium against the New York Yankees. The New York crowd didn't phase Smeltzer as he went 3.1 scoreless innings with two hits allowed, three walks and four strikeouts in a Twins 8-2 defeat.

WELCOME TO THE CLUB: Devin made his Major League debut with the Minnesota Twins on May 28, 2019 vs. Milwaukee. All he did was go 6.0 shutout innings allowing three hits, no walks, and seven strikeouts. He became fourth Twins starter in history to throw 6.0-or-more shutout innings in his debut, joining Andrew Albers (8.1 on August 6, 2013), Anthony Swarzak (7.0 on May 23, 2009) and Eric Milton (6.0 on April 5, 1998). His seven strikeouts were one shy of the franchise record in a debut (Boof Bonser set by Boof Bonser on May 21, 2006 at Milwaukee).

FLY LIKE AN EAGLE: Following his high school career at Bishop Eustace (NJ) Preparatory School in 2014, Smeltzer was drafted in the 33rd round by the Chicago Cubs. Smeltzer elected not to sign with the Cubs and instead went to school at Florida Gulf Coast University. After one season, however, Smeltzer transferred to San Jacinto (TX) JC so that he would be eligible for the draft after two years instead of three. The moved paid off when the Los Angeles Dodgers selected him in the 5th round of the 2016 draft.

- Pitched in one game for the Minnesota Twins in 2021 before being optioned back to the alternate training site on April 25. He was recalled from the Saints on May 6, but never pitched in a game for the Twins. Was placed on 10-day Injured List on May 12 with left elbow inflammation; missed remainder of season
- Made the Twins Opening Day roster in 2020 for the first time in his career
- Earned the Twins minor league Pitcher of the Week and Southern League Pitcher of the Week April 14, 2019 after making two starts, going 2-0, 0.00 ERA (14.0 IP) with five hits allowed, two walks and 17 strikeouts
- Earned first major league win August 4, 2019 vs. Kansas City, pitching 6.0 shutout innings with two hits allowed, one walk and four strikeouts in a 3-0 Twins victory
- Became just the fifth Twins pitcher to record seven-or-more strikeouts in a debut on May 28, 2019, joining Bonser (8, in 20016), Yohan Pino (7 in 2014), Darrell Jackson (7 in 1978) and Bert Blyleven (7 in 1970)
- Had five overall stints with the Twins in 2019, going 2-2 with a 3.86 ERA (49.0 IP, 21 ER), 12 walks and 38 strikeouts in 11 games (6 starts)
- Traded from the Los Angeles Dodgers, along with 2B Logan Forsyth and OF Luke Raley in exchange for 2B Brian Dozier on July 31, 2018
- Started 2017 with Low-A Great Lakes (Los Angeles Dodgers), where he pitched in 10 games (all starts), and allowed 22 earned runs in 52.1 innings pitched (3.78 ERA). He was promoted to High-A Rancho Cucamonga, where he pitched in 16 games (15 starts), amassing a 5-4 record with a 4.40 ERA (90.0 IP, 44 ER), 102 strikeouts and just 18 walks
- Made professional debut with Rookie AZL Dodgers in 2016, pitching 11 games out of the bullpen and yielding 10 runs (9 earned) in 10.2 innings pitched
