NH GETS FIRST SAVE OF 2021 WITH 5-3 WIN LAST NIGHT: Samad Taylor delivered a go-ahead single in the top of the seventh inning and the bullpen held Portland scoreless the rest of the way as the Fisher Cats slipped past Portland 5-3 on Thursday at Hadlock Field.

STRONG BULLPEN: Three New Hampshire pitchers combined to hold the Sea Dogs to just five hits. Troy Miller picked up his first Double-A win, working a season-high six innings. He allowed three runs, walked one, and struck out five. Fitz Stadler and Brody Rodning held Portland scoreless the rest of the night. Rodning became the first New Hampshire reliever to earn a save in 2021, recording the final seven outs of the game without allowing a hit.

GETTING IT GOING EARLY: The Fisher Cats plated two runs in the first inning last night on a double by Otto Lopez. New Hampshire has now scored in the first inning in eight consecutive games dating back to June 2. On June 1, they waited until the second inning to score a run. The first inning has been the most productive for New Hampshire this year, with 28 runs scored.

TAYLOR HOT STREAK CONTINUES: Samad Taylor has now reached base successfully in 11 of 14 plate appearances in this series as his season OBP vs. Portland improves to .448. Taylor has hit half of his team-leading eight homers against the Sea Dogs and is 18-50 (.360) against them. Not only does Taylor have a hit in all nine games in June, he's scored at least one run in each of the games this month.

BOB LIPMAN'S THIS DATE IN FISHER CATS HISTORY: June 11, 2010—After being swept at Akron, the Fisher Cats opened a series in Erie with a 4-0 win. Eric Thames hit a two-run homer in the first inning to provide enough offense to win the game. Ronald Uviedo went five innings of three-hit ball to start the shutout. BJ LaMura and Tim Collins finished up with Collins recording his second save.

MANCHESTER BOSTON REGIONAL AIRPORT FLIGHT TO THE MAJORS: The Toronto Blue Jays dropped the series finale, and the series, to the White Sox with a 5-2 loss last night. Lourdes Gurriel Jr. knocked in a run in the sixth to cut the lead to 3-2, but they could not get any closer. Toronto is at Fenway Park to open four-game series tonight....Triple-A Buffalo and Scranton/WB split a doubleheader in Trenton with the RailRiders taking the opener 3-2 before a 10-0 Bison rout in the nightcap. Nate Pearson went five scoreless in the second game, allowing three hits and walking three. He struck out six....Spokane blanked Vancouver 8-0 and Dunedin won 6-1 at Lakeland on Thursday night.

2021 SCHEDULE IS NEW ENGLAND HEAVY: The Fisher Cats play half of the schedule against its New England rivals Portland (36 games) and Hartford (24 games). This series is the third of six with the Sea Dogs. Next week, New Hampshire plays its first series against the Yard Goats (Rockies) at Delta Dental Stadium.

TONIGHT'S STARTERS: LHP Zach Logue is scheduled on Friday night for the Fisher Cats. He will be making his seventh start of the season. Last Friday against the Rumble Ponies, Logue left in the fifth inning with the game tied at 2-2. He allowed six hits and four walks in his 4.1 IP, and suffered his first loss in New Hampshire's 11-4 defeat. Logue will be making his fourth start of the season against Portland (2-0, 3.45 ERA). The 25-year old was selected by the Blue Jays in the 9th round of the 2017 draft (Kentucky).

Opposite Logue will be 24-year old RHP Denyi Reyes, who's 2-1, 3.63 ERA in six games (two starts). Won his first start May 30 against Hartford with five scoreless innings, but lost last Saturday at Harrisburg. Worked in relief three times against the Fisher Cats this season, allowing five runs in nine innings...He also made a pair of starts against New Hampshire in 2019, going 1-0, allowing just three runs in 14 innings.

LAST TIME OUT: In last Friday's 11-4 loss to Binghamton at Delta Dental Stadium, Logue allowed three runs on six hits in a season-low 4.1 innings (92 pitches). He also walked four batters, while striking out five.

v. PORTLAND: Makes his sixth career start against Portland, and fourth of 2021. Did not record a win in three 2019 starts against the Sea Dogs, but two of his three wins this year are against Portland. On May 21 in Manchester, allowed just one run in six innings in a 12-4 win.

2019: Made first Double-A start with Fisher Cats at Delta Dental Stadium on April 6 vs. Binghamton. Did not figure in decision, but allowed one run (unearned) on two hits over 6.0 IP. First win came at Binghamton 4/17. Made one appearance in relief for Triple-A Buffalo on April 20, earning a win in relief against Scranton Wilkes-Barre.

2018: Started season at Class A Lansing, making nine starts before promotion to Adv. A Dunedin, where he pitched the rest of the season. Combined for 12 wins (three with Lugnuts, and nine with the D-Jays).

RHP Johnny Barbato will make his second start for the Fisher Cats since being signed as a minor league free agent. Allowed three runs (two earned) in 5.1 IP against the Rumble Ponies last Saturday in an 8-3 win.

Barbato made two starts for the Lincoln (NE) Saltdogs before joining the Blue Jays organization. The 28-year old Las Vegas native pitched with the New York Yankees in 2016, Pittsburgh Pirates in 2017 and Detroit Tigers in 2018. He also had experience pitching in Japan with Nippon Ham in 2019.

Barbato was originally drafted by San Diego in the 6th round of the 2010 draft out of Varela HS, Miami, FL.
