**WHITE HOT BAT: INF Clay Dungan** has had an incredible last two games. On Sunday, Dungan became just the fourth player in the Storm Chaser Era to record four extra-base hits in the same game. The most recent time the feat was accomplished was just over a month prior when **INF Vinnie Pasquantino** recorded five total hits during a 25-hit 19-0 blowout win at Louisville. Dungan continued his hot bat yesterday with a three-hit game that included a homer and a double, bringing his extra-base total to six over the last two games. He has bumped his batting average 21 points going a combined 7-for-9.

**OFFENSIVE FIREPOWER:** The Storm Chasers have recorded back-to-back games with at least 10 runs and 10 hits for just the second time this season after Sunday's wild 17-14 win over Columbus and yesterday's 11-2 wire-to-wire win at St. Paul. The only other time the Chasers hit the 10-10 mark in consecutive games this season came on May 6 and 7 against Columbus. Omaha is now 17-1 when they produce double digit hits, with the lone loss coming during the first series of the season when the Storm Chasers scored just one run on 10 hits. Of Omaha's 27 hits across the last two games, 15 have been for extra bases while also drawing nine walks.

**MIGHTY MASSEY: INF Michael Massey** has now been on base in 11 consecutive games, failing to get on base just once through his first 13 games with Triple-A Omaha. The 11-game on-base streak is now tied for the longest streak by a Storm Chaser this season. His nine-game hit streak is just one shy of matching OF Nate Eaton's team-best 10-game streak that ended just over a week ago. Massey is slashing .353/.393/.647, now leading the active roster in both batting average and slugging percentage.

**THEFT ON THE BASES:** Omaha steals a base successfully 85.1 percent of the time, the second best stolen base percentage in the International League. The Storm Chasers' 13 caught stealing is the second lowest mark in the league. Jacksonville's 12 caught stealing leads the league, but they have attempted 23 fewer stolen bases this season. **OF Dairon Blanco** is currently in a tie for sixth place with 17 stolen bases after swiping a pair yesterday while **OF Brewer Hicklen** stole a base yesterday and his 16 stolen bases is tied for eighth. Hicklen has yet to be caught stealing this season and is the only member of the top-10 that has a 100 percent success rate.

**FOR OMAHA: LHP Austin Cox** toes the rubber to make his 13th start and 15th overall appearance for the Storm Chasers. In his last start, Cox produced a quality start, going 6.2 scoreless innings while allowing just two hits with six strikeouts and three walks. The 25-year-old has thrown three quality starts over his last four games, with the only non-quality start coming in the form of a 5.1-inning game in which he allowed one earned run and one unearned run. The Macon, Ga. native played college ball at Mercer University. In his final season with the Bears in 2019, Cox was named the team's Friday night starter, earning a 7-4 record in 17 starts with 124 strikeouts over 87.2 innings. Cox was drafted in the fifth round of the 2018 MLB Draft, making professional debut with the Burlington Royals in the Rookie-level Appalachian League. He split time during the 2019 season between Lexington and Wilmington, earning Pitcher of the Week honors in early June with Lexington. In 2021, Cox was initially assigned to Double-A Northwest Arkansas and was promoted to Triple-A Omaha in September of that year.

**FOR ST. PAUL: RHP Cole Sands** takes the ball to make his eighth start of the season for the Saints. In his last start, Sands went 5.0 innings and allowed three unearned runs with six strikeouts and no walks. The 24-year-old has allowed three or more runs in four of his last six Triple-A appearances, one of which was out of the bullpen. Sands has bounced between The Show and the minors this season after making his MLB debut for the Twins on May 1. The Tallahassee, Fla. native attended Florida State, throwing three seasons for the Seminoles before being drafted by Minnesota in the fifth round of the 2018 MLB Draft. Sands started his professional career with Single-A Cedar Rapids before moving up to High-A Fort Meyers. He also made stops with Double-A Pensacola and Double-A Wichita before starting the 2022 season on the Saints roster.

- Became first Storm Chasers starter to complete 5.0 innings on 4/12 vs. LOU, allowing one run on four hits with three strikeouts and three walks in 5.0 innings
- Allowed five runs (four earned) in season debut on 4/7 (1) @ IND, striking out four and walking none across 4.0 innings
- Earned non-roster invite to 2022 Major League Spring Training, throwing 2.0 perfect innings with three strikeouts
- Enters 2022 as the No. 19 prospect in the Royals organization per MLB Pipeline
- Spent most of 2021 season with Double-A Northwest Arkansas before finishing the year with Triple-A Omaha and making his Triple-A debut
- Made 2021 debut on 5/26 vs. San Antonio after dealing with arm soreness to start the season
- Posted a 5.06 ERA in five Double-A starts in June before recording a 1.80 ERA in five starts in July
