ABOUT LAST NIGHT...

The Blue Jays opened their six-game series in Ft. Myers with a 3-2 win on Tuesday night. In a ballgame that began as a pitchers duel between Jonathan Stevens and Troy Guthrie, Dunedin jumped out to a 2-0 lead in the 3rd, capitalizing on two walks and an error. Ft. Myers plated runs in the 4th and 6th to tie it, but the Jays reclaimed the lead in the 8th on David Beckles' go-ahead RBI single. The Blue Jays continued to generate traffic throughout the night, stranding 10 runners and going 1-for-12 with runners in scoring position, but Dunedin's bullpen held firm late. Jack Eshleman tossed scoreless 8th and 9th innings to secure his league-leading third save, retiring the final four batters he faced, including a game-ending pickoff in the 9th when he nabbed Yilber Herrera, the winning run, off of first base.

LA MAKINA!

Jose Berrios makes his second start on MLB Rehab Assignment on Wednesday (15-day IL, right elbow stress fracture). Last Thursday vs. Clearwater, the ten-year big leaguer and two-time MLB All-Star allowed four runs in a rocky 1st inning before he retired six of the final seven batters he faced, striking out three on 47 total pitches. Berrios' average four-seam fastball velocity of 94.2 mph in the first two innings Thursday was 1.2 mph higher than his 2025 mark, while his sinker showed a similar bump. He is expected to throw 60-65 pitches in Ft. Myers. Berrios pitched in three Spring Training games for Toronto in 2026, with his last outing coming on March 6th before he was shut down due to elbow discomfort. He has not appeared in an MLB game since September 24, 2025, when elbow inflammation prematurely ended his season. Initially selected by the Twins in 2012, Berrios pitched for the Ft. Myers Miracle in the Florida State League in 2014, where he opened the season going 9-3 with a 1.96 ERA in 16 starts before being promoted.

HE IS THE JUAN

Blue Jays No. 7 prospect Juan Sanchez notched a hit in each of his first three games for Dunedin after being promoted on Thursday. In his first game as a Blue Jay, he slapped his first hit with a single in the 4th inning, then scored the game-winning run in the 10th after reaching on an error. In the series finale vs. Clearwater on Sunday, he smacked an RBI single in the 3rd inning for his first RBI. Sanchez was one of the most feared hitters in the Dominican Summer League last year, slashing .341/.439/.565 with eight home runs in 56 games. He was named a DSL All-Star. Sanchez reportedly hit a ball 115.8 MPH in 2025. He starred in the 2026 Blue Jays vs. Phillies Spring Breakout game, where in the 9th inning, Sanchez launched a bases-clearing 105.6 MPH double off the wall in left-center to make it a one-run game and put the tying run in scoring position.

JOJO SIWA

Despite scorching his hardest hit ball of the season on Tuesday, a groundout at 108.6 MPH, Blue Jays No. 2 prospect JoJo Parker went 0-for-5 to snap his 12-game on-base streak, over which he hit .326 with 2 HR, 11 RBI, 9 R, and a 1.096 OPS. On Saturday night, Parker ripped a leadoff double in the 1st then socked his second professional homer in the 3rd, going back-to-back with Daniel Ramon. Parker's solo blast left the bat at 101.4 MPH and traveled 362 ft, bouncing off the top of the WestJet Flight Deck in right field. It was a strong series last week for Parker, who also launched his first professional homer on Tuesday at 108.3 MPH over the right-field admin building, and on Wednesday worked a nine-pitch walk-off walk in the 10th inning This spring, MLB's No. 40 prospect slapped a single at 109.1 MPH in the Blue Jays Spring Breakout game, and launched home runs in Minor League Spring Training at 109.3 MPH and 111 MPH.

GAX ON, GAX OFF

Aldo Gaxiola smacked a two-run homer in the 7th on Saturday 407 ft. at 106.9 MPH off the bat for his third homer of the season as part of a three-hit, three-RBI night. Gaxiola has a hit in three straight and has reached base in eight straight. After starting the season 0-for-17, over his on-base streak Gaxiola is batting .345 with 3 HR and 10 RBI. His 6th inning RBI single on Saturday was 111.6 MPH off the bat, the hardest hit ball by a Blue Jay this season and hardest by a Jay since Yeuni Munoz at 112.2 in 2025.

CURSE YOU, PERRY THE PLATYPUS

Nolan Perry was named Florida State League Pitcher of the Week following his dominant outing on Thursday, April 16. Pitching in relief of MLB rehabber Jose Berrios, Perry delivered five shutout innings, allowing just one hit with no walks while striking out a career-high 12. Perry struck out the first seven batters he faced and, in his opening inning of relief, came one pitch shy of an immaculate inning. His seven consecutive strikeouts to begin the outing are the most by a Dunedin pitcher since Ricky Tiedemann fanned eight straight on April 29, 2022 vs. Bradenton. His 12 strikeouts are the most by a Dunedin pitcher since Trey Yesavage struck out 12 on May 13, 2025 vs. Bradenton.

IT'S AN HONOR

Blue Jays minor leaguers in Class-A, High-A, and Double-A each earned MiLB Player of the Week honors. At Dunedin, RHP Nolan Perry was named FSL Pitcher of the Week. Vancouver swept the NWL, as Tucker Toman earned Player of the Week after going 9-for-17 (.526) in 5G with 2 HR, including a grand slam, and 9 RBI, while Daniel Guerra was named Pitcher of the Week, going 5 hitless innings with 11 K in his lone start. Sean Keys was named EL Player of the Week after driving in 9 RBI with 3 HR and posting a 1.682 OPS over 18 at-bats.

2026 DUNEDIN BLUE JAYS COACHING STAFF

Ryan Casteel | Manager Year with Toronto: 1 | Year with D-Jays: 1 | Born: Chattanooga, TN

Casteel makes his managerial debut in 2026, joining the Blue Jays organization after a 14-year professional playing career. Casteel spent time in the Colorado Rockies, Seattle Mariners, and Atlanta Braves farm systems, while also playing winter ball in Australia and Puerto Rico. A four-time minor league All-Star, he was named Australian Baseball League MVP in 2013 after earning California League Catcher of the Year honors that summer with the Mariners' High-A Modesto Nuts. Casteel spent parts of six seasons at the Triple-A level, including the final four years of his career with the Gwinnett Stripers. After being placed on the Gwinnett Development List for much of the 2024 season, Casteel was activated for a July series against Jacksonville and delivered a ninth-inning, walk-off home run on July 12 in his first game in nearly two months, lifting the Stripers to a 7-6 win after entering as a late-game defensive replacement. Two days later, on July 14, he announced his retirement following a nearly 900-game minor league career. Casteel immediately transitioned into a coaching role with Gwinnett and served as a coach with the FCL Braves in 2025 before stepping into his first managerial role. Was Arizona Fall League teammates with Blue Jays Farm Director Joe Sclafani in 2014 for the Salt River Rafterers on a team that won the AFL Championship and also included Byron Buxton, Trevor Story, Taylor Rogers, Max Kepler, and Tyler Heineman.

Brett Kennedy | Pitching Coach Year with Toronto: 2 | Year with D-Jays: 1 | Born: Galloway, NJ

Kennedy enters his first season as Dunedin's Pitching Coach and second with the Blue Jays organization after leading the Complex League Champion FCL Blue Jays pitching staff in 2025. Kennedy enjoyed a nine-year professional playing career, including MLB service time with the San Diego Padres in 2018 and the Cincinnati Reds in 2023. A Fordham University graduate, Kennedy takes over for fellow Ram Cory Riordan, who was named the Blue Jays' Pitching Coordinator after three seasons in Dunedin.

Nash Knight | Hitting Coach Year with Toronto: 3 | Year with D-Jays: 3 | Born: Denton, TX

Knight returns for his third season as Dunedin's Hitting Coach. Under Knight's guidance in 2025, Dunedin ranked among the Florida State League's top offensive clubs, finishing fourth in batting average (.244) and home runs (85), second in slugging percentage (.371), and third in OPS (.716). Through the first 46 games of the 2025 season, the Blue Jays led the league in home runs (41), on-base percentage (.368), slugging percentage (.416), OPS (.784), and runs scored (292). Eight position players earned their first promotions to High-A in 2025 under Knight, including JR Freethy, who reached Double-A by season's end. The Denton, Texas native spent six seasons as a player in the Blue Jays organization from 2015–2021, reaching the Triple-A level. He also spent time with the Rangers and Twins in his final season on the diamond 2022. A Dallas Baptist University product, Knight hit .245/.350/.352 while playing in 556 career minor league games. Knight suited up for Dunedin in parts of two seasons, playing 105 career games at TD Ballpark in his career, notably playing all nine positions in a game on Sept. 2, 2018 for a team managed by Casey Candaele. Was a member of 2017 FSL Co-Champion Dunedin team which was managed by current Toronto skipper John Schneider and included future big leaguers including Vladimir Guererro Jr, Bo Bichette, Lourdes Gurriel Jr, Jordan Romano, and Ryan Borucki. Majored in kinesiology at DBU. Brother, Austin, has coached at DBU, Texas A&M, and most recently coached in the Mariners organization.

Ashley Stephenson | Bench Coach Year with Toronto: 4 | Year with D-Jays: 2 | Born: Mississauga, ON.

Stephenson returns for her second season on Dunedin's coaching staff and fourth with the Blue Jays organization. Stephenson spent the 2025 season as a Position Coach for Dunedin, primarily working with the outfielders. She spent the prior two seasons in the same role with the High-A Vancouver Canadians, where she helped guide the club to a Northwest League championship in 2023. Inducted into the Canadian Baseball Hall of Fame in 2024, Stephenson has enjoyed a storied multi-sport career. She starred collegiately in hockey at Wilfrid Laurier University, winning four conference titles and a CIS National Championship before playing professionally in both the National Women's Hockey League and Canadian Women's Hockey League. On the diamond, Stephenson represented Canada's women's national baseball team from 2004–2018, earning two Team MVP honors, an All-Star selection at third base at the 2008 IBAF World Cup, and the 2011 Baseball Canada Jimmy Rattlesnake Award, which was later renamed in her honor. In 2022, she became the first woman to manage a Canadian national baseball team, leading her squad to two victories over Team USA in the Friendship Series, before joining the Blue Jays organization.

Andy Fermin | Position Coach Year with Toronto: 9 | Year with D-Jays: 1 | Born: Cleveland, OH.

Fermin joins the Dunedin staff as a Position Coach in his first season with the club. A former infielder in the Blue Jays farm system from 2010–2016, Fermin has remained with the organization in a coaching capacity following his playing days. He served as a coach with the Double-A New Hampshire Fisher Cats from 2017–2019 and was part of the 2018 Eastern League championship staff under current Toronto Manager John Schneider. He served as Hitting Coach for the DSL Blue Jays in 2021 and managed the club from 2022–2023. He returned stateside as manager of the FCL Blue Jays in 2024 before serving as the club's Bench Coach in 2025. Fermin returns to Dunedin after spending parts of three seasons at TD Ballpark as a player in 2014–2016. His father, Felix, played mainly shortstop over 903 MLB games from 1987–1996 while with Pittsburgh, Cleveland, Seattle and Chicago (NL).

Antonio Caceres | Ast. Pitching Coach Year with Toronto: 26 | Year with D-Jays: 2 | Born: Cotui, DR

Caceres spent the past three years as the Pitching Coach for the FCL Blue Jays. A lifelong member of the Blue Jays organization, Caceres was signed out of the Dominican Republic by Toronto when he was 17. He played in their minor league system from 1995–1998, before he transitioned to a pitching coach role in 2000. He's spent the past 24 years working as a pitching coach at the lower levels of the farm system, mentoring stars over the years including Aaron Sanchez, Noah Syndergaard, Joe Musgrove, Jordan Romano, Daniel Norris, and Roberto Osuna. Has served as Pitching Coach under Dennis Holmberg for 10 seasons, also working under current Blue Jays coaches Brent Lavallee, Jose Mayorga, Cesar Martin, Dallas McPherson, and current Miami Marlins Manager Clayton McCullough.

Despite not being able to have a catch with them, Jop coached all of the twins little league teams growing up. Native of Purvis, MS, is a small, old railway town of approximately 1900 people per the 2020 census, which was a stop on the New Orleans to Northeast Rail Line. JoJo described it as a three stop light town with a couple of stop signs here and there. The Parker family grew up close friends with the family of MLB No. 1 prospect Konor Griffin. Griffin and Parker are best friends, and played on the same teams growing up before Griffin reclassified, and they train together in the offseason. Closest MLB team to his home in Mississippi was the Atlanta Braves, over six hours away, so never had a favorite team but grew up idolizing Derek Jeter. Hobbies include fishing, hunting, and play golf. In 2nd grade wrote on a piece of paper that his teacher gave him that he wanted to be an MLB baseball player.
