TODAY'S HEADLINES

LAST TIME OUT: The Saints scored their largest shutout victory in franchise history on Wednesday afternoon, beating the Iowa Cubs 11-0. The bullpen combined to throw a five-hit shutout, the sixth shutout for the Saints this season. Yunior Severino hit a two-run homer in the first inning and hit a three-run blast in the second inning, propelling the Saints to a 5-0 lead. Wynton Bernard hit a solo home run in the third inning, making it 6-0. DaShawn Keirsej Jr. joined the party in the sixth inning with a solo shot, padding the lead at 7-0. Ronny Henriquez struck out the first five men he faced, throwing 3.0 innings in the start. Hobie Harris struck out three in 2.0 innings. The Saints added four runs in the ninth inning, including a Severino double that drove in his career-high sixth run.

STARTERS BEWARE: Coming out of the All-Star Break, the Saints have jumped on opposing starters for early offense. The Saints have a .306 average against starting pitching since July 19, the third-best in the International League. Their .922 OPS and their 60 hits against starters since the break are both the second-most in the IL. In the first six innings of the game since the break, the Saints' 53 runs scored are tied for the third-most in the IL. The Saints +33 run differential in the first six innings since July 19 is the second-best in the IL (Indianapolis, +40).

ON THE RUN: The Saints have stolen a base in their last nine games, dating back to July 21, their second-longest streak of the season and tied for the second-longest streak in franchise history. In that stretch, the Saints have gone 16-for-19 in stolen base attempts. Their longest streak of the season is a franchise-record 13 games, from May 12-26. The Saints have been successful in 83.1% of their attempts this season, the third-highest mark in Triple-A and the 15th-best among full-season minor league teams.

JULIEN JUMPING ON BASE: Edouard Julien has reached base in 27 consecutive games, riding the Saints' longest on-base streak this season. It is the second-longest franchise history trailing only Jake Cave - 49 G (2022). It is tied for the fourth-longest streak in the International League this season and the second-longest active streak (Buddy Kennedy - 43G). During Julien's 27-game streak, he is hitting .260/.450/.417 (.867 OPS).

WINK WINK: Patrick Winkel has been locked in since the start of July, hitting .360. July was the best month of his career (min. 20 PA's) in terms of batting average, beating out August of 2023, where he hit .333. His .976 OPS in July was the second-best of his career (min. 20 PA's), trailing his 1,024 OPS, also in August 2023. Winkel has hit safely in 10 of his 14 games since July 1, collecting multiple hits in six games, including five of his last seven games.

WILLIAMS RECORD WATCH: Chris Williams hit his 12th home run of the season on July 21 and the 43rd of his Saints career. He has tied Mark Contreras for the career franchise lead at 43 long balls. His 43 home runs since his Triple-A debut on July 17, 2022 are tied for the 10th-most in the International League.

§ Since the start of July, Williams has clubbed seven home runs, tied for the third-most in the International League. He also ranks among league leaders in that time with his 17 runs (T-3rd) and his .627 slugging percentage (5th). His .990 OPS is also the best of any month he's had in 2024 and nearly double his .544 OPS in June.

ELECTRIC EELES: Since joining the Saints on July 4, he has constantly found ways to get on base, sporting a .403 on-base percentage in Triple-A. He's reached base in 17 of the 20 games he's played in, drawing 12 walks and been hit by a pitch four times. He is fifth among full-season minor league players in on-base percentage at .441 across three levels.

SUMMERTIME SEVERINO: In Yunior Severino's 50 games since May 21, he has hit .351 (66-for-188), with 12 home runs, drawing 35 walks, owning a 1.047 OPS. In that time, Severino leads the league in batting average, second in on-base percentage at .451 and in OPS, third with 66 hits and fourth in slugging percentage at .596. His 35 walks since May 21 are tied for the ninth-most in the league.

TWINS UPDATE: The Twins wrapped up their series against the Mets with an 8-3 win. Pablo López got his 10th win, throwing 6.0 innings and striking out seven. Randy Dobnak threw 1.0 inning of relief in his return to the Major Leagues, allowing one hit, walking one and striking one out. Matt Wallner went 2-for-5 with a double and a two-run home run in the win.

LAST APPEARANCE: 7/26 v OMA...made 10th start of the season, tossing his quality start of the year...threw 6.0 innings of one-hit baseball, walking one and striking out a season-high eight...walked one in the first inning before retiring seven in a row into the third inning when he allowed a two-out single...retired his final 10 batters faced through the sixth inning...was the 14th start in the IL in 2024 to go at least 6.0 innings allowing one-or-fewer hits and zero runs and the seventh such start to also have at least eight strikeouts...marked the second time this year Plutko has retired 10 in a row, matching his July 12 effort at Louisville in relief...received fifth win in 6-1 Saints victory

APPEARANCE PRIOR: 7/20 @ TOL...made ninth start of the season, allowing two runs on six hits over 5.1 innings...tied season high with six strikeouts (June 30 @ Iowa)...retired the side in order in the first inning...allowed a double to Bligh Madris that scored the first run allowed...two batters later allowed a single to Justice Bigbie that plated second run...did not allow another runner to reach scoring position until the fifth inning, stranding runners at second and third...five of six hits allowed were singles...received fourth win in 11-3 Saints victory

FROM THE TWINS TO THE TWINS: The last 2 seasons for Plutko have been spent in the KBO, where he has dominated for the LG Twins, going 26-8 between the 2022 and 2023 seasons. After signing for \$500,000 in 2022, he went 15-5 in his first season, re-signing for \$ 1.4 million in 2023. He followed that campaign with a season that saw him go 11-3, but did not make it to the championship series due to a hip injury.

REMEMBER THE PAC 12: Plutko finished his career as one of the best pitchers in program history at UCLA, where he finished his three-year stint there with second-most wins (29), starts (52) and IP (351.1) in school history. His career ERA of 2.25 and 272 career strikeouts both rank 7th on UCLA's all-time lists. His sister, Sara, was a three-year soccer letterwinner at University of Oregon and his wife, Allison, was a four-year gymnast at UCLA and was on same team as gold medalist Carly Patterson.

LEAVE A MESSAGE AFTER THE TONE: When he was promoted to Triple-A Columbus (Cleveland organization) in September, 2021 he missed the phone call from Cleveland's Director of Player Personnel Carter Hawkins because he was at a friend's wedding. They had just got done saying, "I Do" and got done taking the bridal party photos. Got a call from Cleveland and he put it straight to voice mail. When the call came again his wife Allison prodded him to answer because it could be important, so he did.

NOT PERFECT, BUT STILL PRETTY GOOD: On June 2, 2018, Plutko was spinning a gem with Columbus, not allowing a baserunner until the ninth inning at Syracuse when he issued a one-out walk. He followed that with a fly out and a strikeout to finish off the no-hitter. It was just the ninth complete-game no-hitter in the IL since 2005. It continued a stellar stretch for Plutko, who took a no-hitter into the sixth just two starts prior with Cleveland against the Chicago Cubs

- 2022-23 Pitched in the Korean Baseball Organization (KBO) for two seasons, combining for a 26-8 record and a 2.40 ERA in 49 starts with the LG Twins, striking out 250 in 285.1 innings, walking 69 batters...left Korea following the 2023 season, and before the championship series, due to a hip injury
- 2021 Spent the season with the Baltimore Orioles, making 37 relief appearances and one spot start, finished the season 1-2 with a 6.71 ERA, walking 27 and striking out 44 in 56.1 innings...had a 1.20 ERA in April, allowing two earned runs in 15.0 innings...allowed a run in his final six outings...was designated for assignment or release by Baltimore on August 15, 2021
- 2020 Split the shortened season between the rotation and the bullpen, opening the year in the pen entering Spring Training and Summer in a battle for a rotation spot...Season ERA in relief was 1.54 in 6 outings (2ER/11.2IP)...Recorded first career relief win on Sept. 25 vs. Pittsburgh and notched his second career save in a 4.0-inning outing on Aug. 29 at St. Louis.
