#### **GRAND SLAM DOOMS FISHER CATS IN 9-4 LOSS:**

A sixth-inning grand slam from Jack Lopez turned a 4-3 nail-biter into a 9-4 defeat for the Fisher Cats last night at Hadlock Field. The 'Cats hung with Portland for most of the night thanks to RBIs from Kevin Vicuna, Chavez Young, and Otto Lopez, but a bases-loaded hit-by-pitch put the Sea Dogs up 4-3 in the sixth inning, and Portland's Lopez put the game out of reach with a blast over the left field wall one batter later.

MARTIN AT SS: In his first start of the season at shortstop, Blue Jays top offensive prospect Austin Martin made a spectacular jump throw to rob Roldani Baldwin of a hit in the fifth inning, and later plated the Fisher Cats' fourth run with an RBI triple to right field in the eighth.

**HEADING HOME:** A pair of matinees at Hadlock will end the season-opening six-game series. All series in the Double-A Northeast League have been scheduled for six games, Tuesdays-Sundays. New Hampshire will meet the Somerset Patriots (Yankees Double-A) for the first time on Tuesday at 6:35 p.m. with a spectacular Atlas Fireworks show after the game. Fans will receive a Magnet Schedule from Eastern Propane & Oil.

**ROSTER MOVES:** The Toronto Blue Jays have assigned the maximum of 28 players to Double-A New Hampshire to open the season. Three members of the Fisher Cats are currently on Toronto's 40-man roster - pitchers Elvis Luciano, catcher Gabriel Moreno, and infielder Otto Lopez. There are 15 pitchers and 13 position players. There have been no roster moves since the start of the season.

BOB LIPMAN'S THIS DATE IN FISHER CATS HISTORY: May 8, 2015 - The Fisher Cats will try to snap a four-game losing streak on May 8. The last win on this date came six years ago, 4-1, over Trenton at Delta Dental Stadium. New Hampshire would score three times in the third on a Jon Berti single and stolen base, a Dwight Smith Jr. triple, a Kevin Nolan double, and a Matt Newman double.

FLIGHT TO THE MAJORS: The Blue Jays dropped the series opener in Houston 10-4 despite homers from Bo Bichette, Danny Jansen and Teoscar Hernandez. Triple-A Buffalo fell to Worcester 4-2 in Trenton. Tayler Saucedo threw three scoreless innings in relief of loser TJ Zeuch. The Tri-City Dust Devils handled Vancouver (A+) 10-6, and Class A Dunedin had a forgettable night in a 25-10 loss at Tampa.

ON THE HILL: RHP Maximo Castillo makes his first Double-A start in this game. A Florida State League Post-Season All-Star in 2019, Castillo was a work horse for the D-Jays (A+), making 24 starts and accumulating more than 130 innings. After a rough outing on June 30th, went 7-0, 1.41 over his final nine starts. Castillo, a native of Caracas, Venezuela, was signed by the Jays in September 2015.

The Sea Dogs start Kutter Crawford today. He was selected by the Red Sox in the 16th round of the 2017 draft (Florida Gulf Coast). Crawford is making his 48th career start, and sixth with the Sea Dogs. Made 5 starts for Portland between June 23 and August 14, including the 4th of July game at Delta Delta Stadium. He picked up his first Double-A win, striking out nine in six innings in a 6-3 win. Made only two starts after that, and eventually had Tommy John surgery in October 2019, then had another procedure to remove bone spurs from his elbow in 2020 (Sox Prospects.com).
