Regular Season Recap

2024 marked the 57th year of Reading Fightin Phils baseball as an affiliate of the Philadelphia Phillies (since 1967). It was the 70th year of affiliated baseball at America's Classic Ballpark, including Reading's affiliation with the Red Sox and Indians. The Fightin Phils finished with 59 wins for the second-straight season, but had a slightly lower win percentage in 2024 compared to 2023, due to playing one more game. Reading went 31-37 in the first half of the season, finishing fifth in the Eastern League's Northeast Division, then finished the second half with a 28-41 record, which was also fifth in the division. 2024 was the fourth-straight season the Fightin Phils were under .500 and also the fourth-year in a row that Reading did not qualify for the postseason, with the last playoff appearance coming in 2019.

Franchise Marks

As an affiliate of the Phillies (dating back to 1967), the Fightin Phils have played 7,927 games and hold a .502 winning percentage, with a record of 3,980-3,947. Reading is 20 wins away from 4,000 victories as a Phillies affiliate. Dating back to 1952, Reading baseball has a .506 winning percentage, with a record of 4,933-4,808. Reading is 67 wins away from 5,000 victories since the opening of Reading Municipal Stadium (now FirstEnergy Stadium) and the first professional games played there in 1952. Reading is 73 games shy of 8,000 as a Phillies affiliate and 10,000 games shy of 10,000 games in Reading baseball history (since 1952). The Fightin Phils are scheduled to play their 8,000th game as a Phillies affiliate on Friday, June 27, 2025, at the Richmond Flying Squirrels (barring no cancellations ahead of that date). 2025 will also mark the 75th Anniversary Season of America's Classic Ballpark.

The Skipper

Al Pedrique returned to Reading as the manager for his second season in 2024. Through two years, Pedrique holds 118 wins, which ranks 15th all-time in Reading history. There have been 26 managers in Reading Fightin Phils history. Through two seasons with Reading, eight players who played under Pedrique went on to play in the big leagues following their time in Reading (Drew Ellis, Johan Rojas, Orion Kerkering, Oliver Dunn, Tyler Phillips, Max Lazar, Seth Johnson and Sam Aldegheri).

Breaking Down the Roster

In total, 71 players played at least one game for Reading this season (29 hitters and 42 pitchers). 17 players who played for the Fightin Phils were called up to Triple-A Lehigh Valley this season. Three players who played for Reading in 2024 made their Major League debuts this season (Max Lazar, Seth Johnson and Sam Aldegheri - LAA). Nine players with prior Major League service time played for Reading this season (Brandon Marsh, Jose Rodriguez, Kolby Allard, Beau Burrows, Max Castillo, Dylan Covey, Luis F. Ortiz, Michael Rucker and Taijuan Walker). Of those eight, five were big-league rehabs (Marsh, Covey, Ortiz, Rucker and Walker). In total, 11 players who suited up for the Fightin Phils this season had/have played in the big leagues at some point prior to the end of 2024. Three Fightin Phils who were on the team prior to 2024 also made their big-league debuts this season (Erik Miller - 2022/SF, Oliver Dunn - 2023/MIL and Tyler Phillips -2021/'23 - PHI).

Postseason Hardware

Prior to the final home game of the 2024 season, the Fightin Phils handed out their team awards. Robert Moore and Gabriel Rincones Jr. were the Pepsi Stolen Base Award Winners, Noah Skirrow was the R-Phils Gene Shirk Community Service Award Winner, Trevor Schwewe won the Broadway Charlie Wagner Un-Sung Hero Award, Robinson Pina was the Sheetz R-Phils Strikeout Leader and won FirstEnergy R-Phils Pitcher of the Year, Otto Kemp was the R-Phils Clutch Player Award Winner, Carson Taylor won the R-Phils Big Stick Award Winner and was selected as the team's MVP. In the Eastern League, Carson Taylor (1B) and Gabriel Rincones Jr. (OF) were named Eastern League All-Star's. Finally, Justin Crawford and Eiberson Castellano were named the Phillies Paul Owens Award winners as the best hitter and pitcher in the minor league organization for the 2024 season.

Prospects in Baseballtown

Of the Phillies top-30 prospects (as of October 30, 2024), 10 of them played for the Fightin Phils in 2024. They were: Aidan Miller (1), Justin Crawford (3), Gabriel Rincones Jr. (11), Jean Cabrera (13), Seth Johnson (15), Christian McGowan (22), Caleb Ricketts (24), Carlos De La Cruz (25), Moises Chace (26) and Otto Kemp (28). Former Fightin Phils amongst the Phillies top-30 prospects are: Andrew Painter (2), Mick Abel (6) and Griff McGarry (21). In total, 13 of the Phillies top-30 prospects have played for the Fightin Phils. Aidan Miller (26), Andrew Painter (32) and Justin Crawford (53) are amongst MLB's top-100 prospects.

Packing the Park

The Fightin Phils welcomed 414,262 fans to FirstEnergy Stadium in 2024, which was the second-highest total in all of Double-A baseball (30 teams). Out of the 120 total full-season minor league teams, Reading finished 16th in attendance. Additionally, the season-long attendance was the highest season-long Reading total since 2016. The average of 6,277 was the highest average attendance since 2013. In total, the R-Phils drew 28,784 more fans to games in 2024 than 2023, and also 347 more fans per game on average from the 2023 season. Nine of the 66 openings this season saw over 8,000 fans attend game and 28 games welcomed over 7,000 fans. The highest attended game in 2024 was June 7 vs Harrisburg (8,805 fans).

Offensive Recap

The Fightin Phils finished the season with a .237 team average, which was sixth in the Eastern League. Reading's other offensive rankings were fifth in runs scored (603), 7th in doubles (205), tied for fifth in triples (25), second in home runs (133) and fifth in stolen bases (152). The Fightin Phils 152 stolen bases were their most in a season since stealing 172 in 2002. It marks just the 10th time since 1967 that a R-Phils team stole over 150 bases in a season. Reading set a new franchise record in hit by pitches this season with 100, surpassing the previous best of 99 in 2002. That mark was second in the Eastern League to Hartford. Carson Taylor and Ethan Wilson each led the team with six sacrifice flies this season, marking the second-straight year a Reading player has been tied for the league lead in sac flies. Robert Moore led Reading with 11 times caught stealing this season, which was the first time the team leader had been caught stealing 10-or-more times since Roman Quinn (10) in 2015. Marcus Lee Sang led Reading with 61 runs scored, the fewest runs scored by the team leader in a full-season since Keith Kimberlin (56) in 1993. Lee Sang also led the team in triples with five, which was the third-straight year the team leader in triples had five. Lee Sang additionally led the team with 385 at bats, which was the first time in Reading Baseball history that the leader in at bats had less than 400 in a full-season. Moore led Reading in doubles with 20, which is the least amount of doubles by the team leader since Ron Lockett in 1993. Reading's 2023 leader in doubles was Oliver Dunn, who was traded for Moore (and Hendry Mendez) prior to the 2024 season. 2024 was the third-straight season Reading's RBI leader surpassed 70 runs driven in. Prior to 2022, the last time a R-Phil knocked in 70 runs was Dylan Cozens (125) in 2016).

Pitching Recap

The Fightin Phils finished 12th in the Eastern League with a 4.44 ERA. Their other league ranks were third in complete games (2), tied for sixth in shutouts (10), fourth fewest walks (458) and eighth in strikeouts (1,209). Reading's 10 shutouts this season were the pitching staff's most since 2022 (11). It was just the third time since 2015 with 10-or-more shutouts in a season and the sixth time since 2000. Tommy McCollum led the team with 10 saves, marking the first time since 2022 that Reading's save leader had double-digit saves, when Brian Marconi had 18. It's the fifth time in six years that the R-Phils saves leader had 10-or-more saves. McCollum finished tied for second in the Eastern League in saves.

Pinpoint Pina

Robinson Pina turned in a stellar season as the ace of the Fightin Phils pitching staff. Pina's 12 wins marked the first time a Reading pitcher had 10-or-more wins in a season since David Parkinson had 10 in 2019. It's the most wins by a Fightin Phils' pitcher in a season since Austin Hyatt had 12 in 2011. Pina finished second in the Eastern League in wins, trailing only Somerset's Trystan Vrieling (13). Pina threw a complete game shutout on June 8 against Harrisburg (7 IP). It was the first shutout by a Reading pitcher since Nick Pivetta in 2016 and it was tied for the league lead. Pina was not the only Reading pitcher to throw a complete game this season as Braeden Fausnaught also threw a six-inning complete game on August 29 at Somerset. It was the first season with multiple complete games since the Fightin Phils had three in 2018.

Amongst the League Leaders

Carson Taylor's name was littered across the Eastern League leader boards this season. His league rankings were: 9th AVG (.277), T-8th HR (16), 3rd RBI (75), 4th OBP (.389), 5th SLG (.465), 2nd OPS (.854), T-2nd 2B (67) and 8th TB (173). Robert Moore was tied for second in the Eastern League with 11 caught stealing. Robinson Pina finished the season second in wins (12) and tied for first in shutouts (1). Tommy McCollum was tied for second in saves (10).

The Big Club

The Fightin Phils parent club, the Philadelphia Phillies, finished the 2024 season with a 95-67 record and won the National League East for the first time since 2011. Ultimately, the Phillies fell three games to one to the New York Mets in the National League Division Series. There were seven former Fightin Phils on the Phillies postseason roster (Kolby Allard, Orion Kerkering, Aaron Nola, Ranger Suarez, Bryson Stott, Alec Bohm and Johan Rojas). An additional seven also appeared in games this year (Connor Brogdon, Seranthony Dominguez, Tyler Gilbert, Seth Johnson, Max Lazar, Tyler Phillips and Ricardo Pinto). In total, 14 former Fightin Phils appeared in games for the Phillies this season, not including players who appeared with Reading on rehab assignments.

Crawford Crushed It

20-year old Justin Crawford was promoted to Double-A Reading on July 12 and never looked back. Over 40 games with the Fightin Phils this season, Crawford slashed .333/.380/.455 (.835 OPS). The center fielder added 25 runs, 11 doubles, three home runs, 26 RBI and was 15-16 in stolen bases. In total for 2024, Crawford hit .313, with 79 runs, 25 doubles, nine home runs, 61 RBI and was 42-51 in stolen bases between Reading and High-A Jersey Shore. With Reading, Crawford had six three-hit games and 18 multi-hit games over 40 contests, meaning Crawford had multiple hits in 45% of his Double-A games this season.

April Notes

Back at the Helm

Fightin Phils Manager Al Pedrique returns for Reading for his second season, and second overall in the Phillies organization. He previously was a coach for the Marlins and manager in their Minor Leagues. Pedrique's other notable stops include the Yankees, Astros and Diamondbacks. He picked up his 1,000th professional win last season and is closing in on 1,000 minor league victories.

Familiar Face on the Staff

Brock Stassi returns to Baseballtown as the hitting coach for the Fightin Phils. Stassi played the majority of the 2014 and '15 seasons in Reading, and returned in 2021 for a brief stint. Following his playing career, he was hired as a coach by the Phillies last year and served as the hitting coach for the High-A Jersey Shore BlueClaws in 2023.

Rounding Out the Staff

Joining Pedrique will be two pitching coaches in Phil Cundari and Riley McCauley. Cundari was Jersey Shore's pitching coach last season and McCauley was with the FCL Phillies. Karl Ellison enters his first season coaching as the team's development coach. Ellison played in the Phillies organization in 2022. Meaghan Flaherty comes from Jersey Shore as the Athletic Trainer and Bruce Peditto returns to Reading as the Strength Coach.

Breaking Down the Roster

Getting on Base

On April 5, every member of the Fightin Phils lineup got on base, whether it was via a hit or walk. The last time every member of the R-Phils lineup reached base was on August 13, 2023 at the New Hampshire Fisher Cats. Reading did strike out 16 times Friday night in the victory.

Reading's loss on April 6 was its largest margin of defeat since August 18, 2023, when the Fightin Phils lost 22-3 to the Somerset Patriots. R-Phils pitching also issued 10 walks and 15 hits in the loss. Offensively, the R-Phils were held to just two hits. The last time that happened was September 16, 2023 at the Binghamton Rumble Ponies. Rincones Rakes

Phillies No. 10 Prospect Gabriel Rincones Jr. had an impressive start to the season in Bowie. He crushed a 452-foot home run on April 5 deep into the Maryland night. He followed that up on April 6 with a laser home run that just got over the wall in right field. After one series, Rincones is posting a .727 slugging percentage and 1.035 OPS, both marks leading the team.

Home Opener Success

In front of a packed house of 8,530 fans, Reading fought from behind to beat Portland 9-8. Carson Taylor had two home runs and Jose Rodriguez homered as well. Konoor Ash and Carlos Francisco were excellent out of the bullpen, and Max Lazar earned his second save. The attendance of 8,530 marked the most-attended weeknight Home Opener in Fightin Phils history.

Walk it Out

On April 9, Jose Rodriguez posted three walks and Gabriel Rincones Jr. reached base four times via the walk. Rincones Jr's four walks marked the first time a Fightin Phil has done that since Brock Stassi on July 29, 2021.

Taylor Rakes

Carson Taylor crushed two home runs on April 9, including the game winner in the bottom of the seventh inning. It is the second-straight game Taylor has homered and his third overall this season, in four games. The last R-Phil with two home runs in a game was Nick Ward on Aug. 10, 2023 at New Hampshire. Last night marked the third two-home run game for Taylor, with the last coming on July 3, 2023. It is the second time in Taylor's career that he hit home runs in back-to-back games, with the other coming on July 23-24, 2021, where he also hit three homers in two games.

Its Been A While

With a win on April 10, the Fightin Phils improved to 3-2. It marks the first time Reading has been over .500 since Sept. 2, 2019, the final day of the 2019 season. The R-Phils have also won back-to-back games at home after winning consecutivly at home only twice in 2023.

From Down Under

On April 10, Lachlan Wells earned his first affiliated win since the 2019 season. He spent the last five years in the Australian Baseball League and also missed time due to injury. He made his pro debut in 2016 with the Twins organization and advanced as high as High-A in 2019. He pitched in the ABL from 2013-16, and again from 2020-24. He collected accolades from the ABL this past winter, as he went 6-0 with a 0.94 ERA over nine starts with the Adelaide Giants, and helped them to their second-straight ABL Championship. Also apart of that Adelaide team was Kendall Simmons, former R-Phils Rixon Wingrove and Nick Ward, along with others in the Phillies organization.

Unfamiliar Territory

On April 12, Casey Martin played center field in the ninth inning. It marked the first time in Martin's professional career he played an outfield position. The usual infiedler made a nice tumbling catch on the first ball hit his way.

Getting on Base

Multiple Fightin Phils own impressive early-season on-base streaks. Marcus Lee Sang is up to an eight-game on-base streak after reaching in both games on April 13. Lee Sang did not own an on-base streak north of six games in his time with Reading last season. Jim Haley and Carson Taylor both own five-game hit streaks for the Fightin Phils.

Ducks Left Stranded

In total from April 9-14, Reading left 48 runners on base, which is eight per game. The Fightin Phils have also left the bases loaded eight times this season through the season's first nine games. The R-Phils are hitting .219 with RISP and are 0/16 with the bases loaded thus far.

Rincones Rolling

Gabriel Rincones Jr. hit his third home run of the season in April 14th's loss to Portland. It was his first long ball to the opposite field for the left-handed hitter. Against the Sea Dogs last week, Rincones Jr. slashed .300/.500/.700, with a 1.200 OPS, adding four walks, three runs and two RBI. His home run on Sunday also was Reading's first home run since Tuesday night's (4/9) win over Portland.

Max Lazar'd In

Max Lazar has had an excellent start to the 2024 season out of the Reading bullpen. He is the only R-Phils' pitcher to not allow a hit or run yet. Lazar has established himself as a late-inning reliever for Reading, having two saves and has also not issued a walk over four innings thus far.

Ranger Danger

2018 Fightin Phil Ranger Suarez was spectacular for the Phillies on April 16, pitching a complete-game shutout. It came on the six-year anniversary of Suarez's Double-A debut, where Suarez struck out 10 over eight innings at Harrisburg on Apr. 16, 2018.

Runnin' Reading

The R-Phils set a season-high with four stolen bases on April 16. Reading's season-high in stolen bases last season was six in a game. Jose Rodriguez added two swiped bags, marking a season-high for him and any Reading individual player. It was the 22nd multi-steal game in Rodriguez's career.

Extra Extra

April 18th's doubleheader saw both games go into extra innings. The last time Reading had both games of a doubleheader go into extra innings was on June 10, 2023 at home against Binghamton.

Matt Likes Mirabito

Matt Osterberg had another strong outing at Mirabito Stadium on April 18. He allowed two-earned runs and six hits over five innings, with five strikeouts. In his two career starts at Binghamton, Osterberg has gone 12 IP, 8 H, 2 ER and 11 strikeouts. His season ERA is a low 1.98.

Lee Sang's Night

Marcus Lee Sang had a strong night April 18 in the doubleheader. Between the two games, he went 2-5, with three runs scored, a triple, homer, a RBI and two walks. His homer and triple were both his first of the season for each. The triple also marked the first triple hit by a member of the R-Phils in 2024. Lee Sang has now reached base in 11-of-12 games he's played in this season.

Can't Stop Carson

Carson Taylor's hot start to the 2024 season continued on April 19. He went 3-5, with a run scored, double and three RBI. Over his last five games, Taylor is hitting .474, and is .407 in his last 10 contests. He now owns a seven-game hitting streak, three multi-hit games and three multi-RBI game as well. Taylor is also hitting .667 with runners in scoring position and .400 with two outs.

2024 R-PHILS GAME NOTES

Bullpen Success

After a slow start to the season, Reading's bullpen found much success at Binghamton from April 16-21. Over the six games, the group allowed seven-earned runs over 26.2 IP, which is good for a 2.36 ERA for the week.

Who's On First, Nope Actually in Center Field

After making his first pro appearances in center field on Apr. 12 against Portland, Casey Martin made his first pro start at center on Apr. 21 at Binghamton. He also knocked his first triple of the season to end the series on a high note. Martin went 3-8, with two runs scored, two XBH (3B and HR) and two RBI over the final two games he played in last week.

Lee Sang Rolling

Marcus Lee Sang snapped out of a 2-32 slide with a two hit and four RBI performance on April 23. He had a two-run home run in the fourth that proved to be the eventual game-winner, and added a two-run double later in the game. The four RBI were both a season-best for Lee Sang and a Double-A high as well.

Closer Tandem

Max Lazar and Tommy McCollum have established themselves as the early closers for Reading this season. Lazar leads the team with three saves and McCollum picked up his second on April 24. Reading as a team is 5/6 in save opportunities this year. Lazar has not allowed an earned run or walk thus far in 2024.

Swiper Yes Swiping

On April 24, Reading stole a season-high five bases. Which included two from Carson Taylor, and one each from Gabriel Rincones Jr., Robert Moore and Trevor Schewecke. Reading's 24 stolen bases this season ranks third in the Eastern League. This comes after Reading finished 10th in the league last season in stolen bases. The Fightin Phils also executed their first double steal since May 25, 2023, which was with Johan Rojas and Matt Kroon.

Robinson Rolling

Robinson Pina stayed hot on April 25 with his second-straight win. He tossed a season-high six innings, which also marked the longest start by a Fightin Phils pitcher this season. Outside of a poor start on Apr. 13 vs Portland, Pina has thrown 16 IP, and allowed 12 hits, three ER and struck out 14 batters.

First Zero of the Season

Reading pitching combined for its first shutout of the 2024 season on April 25. It marked the R-Phils first shutout since Aug. 27, 2023 at Harrisburg. Tristan Garnett was a part of both of those shutouts as well. In total, the Fightin Phils had three shutouts last season, with the first not coming until May 28 vs Harrisburg.

Caleb Catching Fire

Caleb Ricketts recent hot stretch continued with three hits, two runs and two doubles on April 25. His two doubles marked a season-high for him and the most by any R-Phil in a single game in 2024. Ricketts is on a four-game hit streak and is slashing .500/.529/.688, with a 1.217 OPS over that stretch. He also has three doubles, five runs scored, a RBI and stolen base over that span, dating back to Apr. 19.

Saturday Struggles

So far this season, Reading owns an 0-5 record in Saturday games. In all other days of the week, the Fightin Phils are 9-6. Additionally, Reading is 6-2 on Tuesday-Thursday, and just 3-9 in Friday-Sunday games.

Trifecta of Arms

The Fightin Phils were able to lean on three of its most-consistent pitchers to finish out the game on April 28 against Somerset. Tristan Garnett (7th), Max Lazar (8th) and Tommy McCollum (9th) combined to allow no runs, zero hits and strike out five hitters over the games final three frames. That trio currently own a combined 1.02 ERA, with a 33/2 strikeout to walk ratio over 26.1 innings and 20 games combined. McCollum and Lazar have also combined for six saves. Reading is 6/7 in save opportunities this April, after going 3/6 last season. Also the R-Phils have not blown any leads after the 6th, 7th or 8th innings in April.

News and Notes

Reading's win on April 28 gave the R-Phils their first series win of the season. The R-Phils first series win of the season in 2023 came one week later, the first week of May at Hartford. In total, Reading won seven series in 2023. A win on Tuesday will give Reading a .500 record for the month of April, after going 6-14 in the month last season. The last time Reading had a .500 or better record in April was 2019. Of note, there were no April games in 2020 or '21. Marcus Lee Sang has found much success when slotted in the bottom of the lineup. He is hitting .333 in the eighth spot, which is his best by any spot in the lineup this season.

Schewecke's Week

Trevor Schewecke had a strong week against Somerset capped off with an April 28 performance that saw him go two-for-four, with a double and two RBI. In total, Schewecke slashed .357/.375/.500, with an .875 OPS. He added a run, two doubles and three RBI. Sunday was hit first multi-hit/multi-RBI game of the season.

May Notes

Schewecke's Week

Trevor Schewecke had a strong week against Somerset capped off with an April 28 performance that saw him go two-for-four, with a double and two RBI. In total, Schewecke slashed .357/.375/.500, with an .875 OPS. He added a run, two doubles and three RBI. Sunday was hit first multi-hit/multi-RBI game of the season.

Marcus Mashing

Marcus Lee Sang had his best game of the season on April 30. Lee Sang went three-for-four, with two runs, a double, two homers and three RBI. It marked his third-career multi-homer game, and first in Double-A. It was also the third-time in his career Lee Sang had three extra-base hits. The last time he accomplished both of those feats was Aug. 6, 2022 with High-A Jersey Shore. It marked Reading's second multi-homer game this season, with the other coming Apr. 9 against Portland from Carson Taylor. Ironically, both of Reading's multi-homer games have come in the first game of a series against the Sea Dogs.

Packing the Park

The Fightin Phils welcomed 59,447 fans to FirstEnergy Stadium in April, which is an average of 5,404 per game over 11 openings last month. It marked the largest total attendance and average attendance in April in franchise history.

A Run for the Roses

Fightin Phils first baseman Carson Taylor was named the Phillies Minor League Hitter of the Month on May 3. In April, Taylor slashed .354/.426/.708, with a 1.134 OPS. He added three doubles, one triple, four home runs, 18 RBI, five walks, two stolen bases and eight runs over 13 games. Taylor continues to come up clutch for the Fightin Phils, as he is hitting .611 with runners in scoring position. Taylor also had an eight-game hit streak from Apr. 5-20.

Racing to Worcester

On May 3, Fightin Phils relief pitcher Beau Burrows became the first member of the 2024 R-Phils squad to earn a promotion to Triple-A Lehigh Valley. Burrows will join the IronPigs on their road trip in Worcester, who is ironically the Red Sox Triple-A affiliate. So far this season, Burrows is 1-1, with a 4.00 ERA, while striking out 10 over seven games and nine innings pitched. He pitched in the big leagues with Detroit and Minnesota in 2020 and '21.

Bryce Galloping to Second

Bryce Ball turned in his best game of the season on May 3. Ball had three hits, two doubles and two RBI. The three hits and two doubles were season highs and the two RBI matched a season-best for him. It was the 10th two-double game of Ball's career and the three hits matched a career high, that Ball had done 16 times prior to last night's game.

News and Notes

With their win on May 4, the Fightin Phils earned their first Saturday victory this season. Reading now sits at 1-6 on Saturdays, and 10-9 on all other days of the week. Reading is now 10-1 when scoring over five runs in a game this season, and 1-14 when failing to reach the five-run mark.

One-Two Rotation Punch

Robinson Pina and Lachlan Wells are establishing themselves as the top-two pitchers in the R-Phils rotation. On May 4 at Portland, Pina struck out 11 hitters, which marks a season-high for Pina and the most struck out by a Fightin Phils pitcher this season. It also was the first time a Reading pitcher struck out 11 batters since Tyler Viza did it on August 27, 2018, at Richmond. On May 5, Wells tossed six-shutout innings, but did not factor into the decision.

Zoom Zoom

The Fightin Phils continue to rack up the stolen bases this season. They matched a season-high with five stolen bases in game one of May 4th's doubleheader win over Portland. Reading has 36 stolen bases this season in 41 attempts, which is a 88% success rate. The Fightin Phils 36 stolen bases rank tied for fourth in the Eastern League. Reading is on pace for 184 stolen bases this season, after swiping just 119 last season, which ranked 10th in the Eastern League.

Defense Heating Up

After a slow start to the season defensively, the R-Phils have been much improved in the field as of late. After committing six errors on April 30 at Portland, the Fightin Phils have not committed an error in five-straight contests. The Fightin Phils are the only team in the Eastern League with a perfect fielding percentage dating back to last Wednesday.

2024 R-PHILS GAME NOTES

Simon Says

William Simoneit's recent hot stretch rolled on as he had a triple, two RBI and a couple of runs scored on May 7. Simoneit is riding a four-game hit streak, dating back to May 1. Over that stretch, he's slashing .333/.500/.833, with a 1.333 OPS. He also had three extra-base hits and three RBI over that span. Simoneit hit his first home run of the season on May 4 at Portland, over the Maine Monster in left field at Hadlock Field.

Relievers Rolling

Reading relievers had another strong day on May 7. Over four innings, the Fightin Phils relief pitchers combined to not allow a run over four innings, with six strikeouts. Newcomer Wesley Moore, who was called up from High-A Jersey Shore Tuesday, struck out the side in the one-inning he pitched. The success has been led Tristan Garnett, Max Lazar and Tommy McCollum. McCollum lowered his season ERA to 1.80 with a scoreless ninth inning yesterday. Lazar remains the only Fightin Phils pitcher to not allow an earned run, nor walk any hitters. He also owns a 0.29 WHIP and .088 opponents batting average. Lazar is the only pitcher in the Eastern League who has pitched north of 10 innings this season to not allow a run or walk.

Walking It Off, Literally

The Fightin Phils battled from behind to tie and eventually win over Hartford on May 8, 4-3. With bases-loaded in the bottom of the ninth, Robert Moore worked a four-pitch walk to score Casey Martin and give Reading its second-straight win. It was Reading's first walk off win of the season after having five-walkoff wins last season. Reading also had a walk-off walk on July 26 of last season against Binghamton, when Jhailyn Ortiz drew the base on balls. Reading's bullpen remained hot in the win, not allowing an earned run over 4.2 IP, marking 8.2 innings of shutout ball for the relievers this week.

On the Move

Reading has seen a bunch of roster movement lately. Last weekend, Beau Burrows and Jim Haley both earned promotions to Triple-A Lehigh Valley. Max Lazar joined them with a call-up prior to May 8th's game. Other moves include Andrew Baker being transferred to High-A and Tyler McKay transferred to Reading from Triple-A Lehigh Valley. McKay saw much success with Reading last season, before a call-up to Lehigh Valley last July.

Rolling Again

After a very quiet start to the 2024 season, Carlos De La Cruz broke out in a big way on May 8 and 9. After a double off the wall on Wednesday, he broke through with his first, and second, home runs of the season on May 9. Overall, De La Cruz had two runs scored and three driven in in the win. It marked the third multi-homer game of his career. It was also the first time a R-Phils hit a home run in back-to-back at-bats since Nick Ward did it on Aug. 10, 2023 at New Hampshire. May 9 also marked the third instance this season where a Fightin Phil hit two home runs in a game.

Welcome Back Kendall

Kendall Simmons made his return from the injured list in a big way on May 9. After being activated prior to the game, Simmons had two hits, three runs, a double, home run and two RBI. His two-run home run in the bottom of the fifth inning broke up a no-hitter from Hartford's Jarrod Cande.

Rodriguez Rolling

Jose Rodriguez has been heating up as of late. After hitting .176 in April, Rodriguez is hitting .292 in May. He is also riding a five game hit streak, where he is slashing .350/.364/.550, with a .914 OPS, dating back to May 4. Rodriguez has also added two doubles, one triple and five RBI over that span. Rodriguez is the lone member of the Reading roster who is on the Phillies 40-man roster, after being acquired from the White Sox on Apr. 5 for cash consideration.

Trip, Trip, Triples

Reading's two triples on May 11 were the season-high for triples in a game this season. The Fightin Phils are now up to nine triples on the season, which currently ranks second in the Eastern League. In 2023, Reading had 21 triples and they are on pace for 39 this season.

Wilson Likes Goats

Ethan Wilson is turning in a terrific week against Hartford. This week, Wilson is slashing .467/.579/.733, with a 1.312 OPS. He's added two doubles, one triple, two RBI and scored three runs. In 2023, Wilson hit .388, with five home runs and 17 RBI against Hartford. He won Eastern League Player of the Week in early-May last after a torrid week against the Yard Goats.

News and Notes

On May 11, Reading captured its 15th win of the 2024 season. On May 12 of last season, Reading had just 11 wins. They didn't reach 15 wins until May 21st last year. With his save on May 11, Tommy McCollum improved his team-best ERA to 1.59 and opponents are hitting just .132 against him. McCollum also leads the team with four saves in as many opportunities. Tristan Garnett did not allow an earned run in 1.2 innings in game one to lower his ERA to 1.62, which ranks as second best on the team.

Series Winners

With a win in game two on May 11, Reading captured its second-straight series win at home. In 2023, the R-Phils won just two series at home, one a three-game series with Portland last July, and they won 3/5 against the Sea Dogs in September. The last time the Fightin Phils won back-to-back series at home was in August of 2022 (8/2-7 vs Hartford and 8/16-21 vs Portland). With a win on May 12, Reading will win 5/6 games against Hartford for the second-straight series with the Yard Goats, with the last coming the first week of August in 2023.

A Very Good Week at Home

Reading defeated Hartford 6-3 on May 12 to complete its strongest week of the season with a 5-1 record. It marked the fifth time since the schedule shifted to six-game series in 2021 that the R-Phils won 5/6 games in a series. The last time they did it was Aug. 1-6, 2023 at Hartford. The last time Reading won 5/6 games at home was May 10-15, 2022 against Bowie. It was also Reading's second-straight series win at home. The last time the Fightin Phils won back-to-back series at home was in August of 2022. Reading also had matched its home-series wins from 2023, as the R-Phils won just two home series last season.

Success at Home

This season, the Fightin Phils are playing their best baseball at home, holding an 11-7 record. Reading finished 2023 with just a 23-44 record at FirstEnergy Stadium, so they are just 12 wins away from matching that mark. Reading is on pace for 42 wins at home this season.

No Free Passes

May 12 marked the first time this season that the Fightin Phils pitching staff did not issue a walk. The last time Reading pitching did not allow a walk in a game was nearly one-year to the date, occurring on May 13, 2023 against the New Hampshire Fisher Cats at home.

Pinpoint Pina

Robinson Pina pitched six innings for the second time this season, and has now earned a winning decision in his last four starts. Pina is tied for the Eastern League lead in wins with four, which also ranks as tied for second in Double-A. Pina has the best strikeout to walk ratio in the Eastern League by a wide margin at 12, with second place sitting at 4.38. That mark also leads all of Double-A and is tied for fifth in all of Minor League Baseball. Pina's 10.8 strikeout-per-nine ratio also ranks as seventh in the Eastern League. Over his last four starts Pina is: 4-0, with a 2.86 ERA (22 IP, 3 BB, 29 SO).

Double Double

Reading set a new season-high with five doubles in May 15th's game. It surpassed the Fightin Phils previous season-high of four doubles in a game. Reading's season-high for doubles in a game last season was five, which they did five times. Carson Taylor and Robert Moore each had two doubles in the loss, tying the most by a R-Phils player in a game this season. Moore leads Reading with seven doubles this season, and Taylor is right behind him at six two-baggers.

Carson Crushin' It

Carson Taylor's red-hot season continued on May 15. Taylor had three hits, a run, two doubles and two RBI. His .341 average is tied for the Eastern League lead and ranks tied for third in Double-A. His 29 RBI also lead the Eastern League and all of Double-A. His other Eastern League ranks are third in OBP (.427), fourth in SLG% (.585) and fourth in OPS (1.012).

Noah's Arc-ing Up

Noah Skirrow has put together the two best outings of his season over his last two starts. After a month of April that saw Skirrow go 0-2, with an 11.81 ERA, Skirrow did not pitch for 10 days, as he was on the Development List during Reading's series in Portland from Apr. 30-May 5. Since coming off the Development List, Skirrow has been locked in during his two May starts. Following six-strong innings last night, Skirrow is 1-0, with a 0.82 ERA in May.

Rodriguez Rolling

Jose Rodriguez has been rolling as of late. After hitting just .176 in April, Rodriguez is slashing .300/.333/.480, with an .813 OPS. He's added 11 runs, four doubles, one triple, one home run and nine RBI in 13 games in May. He also has hits in 10-of-12 games in May as well. Rodriguez has also only struck out four times in 54 May plate appearances. He has not struck out in eight-straight games, dating back to May 11, which is a total of 27 plate appearances.

Carlos De La Cruzin'

Carlos De La Cruz had one of his best games of the season on May 19. He had a season-high three hits and two doubles, while he matched season-highs with two runs and three RBI. The two doubles matched a career-high for De La Cruz. De La Cruz finished the week strong at Richmond, going five-for-eight, with two runs, three doubles and three RBI in the final two games of the series with the Flying Squirrels.

Power Outage Restored

With a home run from Jose Rodriguez in the fourth inning on May 21, it snapped a seven-game homerless drought for the Fightin Phils, dating back to May 11 vs Hartford. In Tuesday's game, Reading matched a season-high with three home runs in a game, and also set a new season-best for home runs in an inning with two in the bottom of the fifth inning. Those two home runs in the fifth inning came on back-to-back blasts from Kendall Simmons and Casey Martin. It marked the first instance of back-to-back home runs this season for Reading, and the first time it's happened since Aug. 2, 2023, at Hartford, when Oliver Dunn and Jhailyn Ortiz did it. Binghamton starter Brandon Sproat allowed three home runs in the game, the most allowed by an opposing pitcher this season.

2024 R-PHILS GAME NOTES

Allard on the Bump

Kolby Allard, who is on the Phillies 40-man roster, was transferred to Reading from the FCL-Phillies and will make the start on May 22. Allard signed with the Phillies on January 23 and was optioned to Triple-A Lehigh Valley on March 19. Allard made eight appearances and three starts with the IronPigs and was 0-4, with a 10.71 ERA. The Phillies assigned Allard to the FCL-Phillies on May 9. Allard only appeared in six games last season between Atlanta (4) and Triple-A Gwinnett (2). Allard pitched for the Rangers from 2020-22, making his big-league debut with Texas in 2020. Allard is expected to pitch about three innings or 50 pitches on Wednesday night, and also appear on May 26.

About Last Night

As a team on May 22, Reading set new season highs in runs in an inning (8), hits in a game (16) and hits in an inning (7)... they matched highs in homers in a game (3), homers in an inning (2), and extra-base hits in a game (6)... three hours and two minutes tied Apr. 9 vs Portland as the longest game of the season... Reading batted around for the third time this season, sending 13 men to the plate (most since 14 on 6/13/23 vs HFD)... Marcus Lee Sang matched a season-high in hits and runs... Kendall Simmons has homered in back-to-back games for the ninth time in his career (last: 7/23-26, 2023)... Carson Taylor matched a season-high with three hits (was previously one for his last 15)... Bryce Ball scored a season-high three runs... Trevor Schewecke had a season-high three RBI and his first home run since 9/14/23 with New Hampshire... Ethan Wilson had a season-high two doubles, which ties a career high for the fifth time... With eight runs in the seventh inning, Reading is now outscoring opponents 34-8 in the seventh frame this season... eight-of-nine R-Phils had hits and runs... eight-of-nine had RBI... three players had multiple runs... three had multiple RBI... six had multiple hits (two had three hits)... Marcus Lee Sang had two hits in the seventh, marking the first time a R-Phil had multiple hits in the same inning since 6/13/23 vs HFD.

Scoring in More Ways Than One

Reading added two sacrifice flies in May 23rd's ballgame, both off the bat of Ethan Wilson. On the season, the Fightin Phils have 21 sac flies, which is the most in the Eastern League by a wide margin. Second place is at 16, and third place is 12. Casey Martin leads Reading in sacrifice flies with three.

Got 'Em

Fightin Phils catcher Caleb Ricketts threw out three base runners in May 23rd's ballgame. It was both a season and career-high in runners caught stealing for Ricketts. He is up to nine caught stealings this season, and is five-for-seven in throwing runners out over his last three starts behind the plate.

Home Run Merchants

Reading crushed a season-high five home runs in May 25th's win. Bryce Ball, Kendall Simmons, Robert Moore, Baron Radcliff and Carson Taylor all homered. The last time Reading had five home runs in a game was July 14, 2023, against the Portland Sea Dogs at FirstEnergy Stadium. This week, Reading has hit an Eastern League-high 12 home runs. This comes after not hitting a single homer last week at Richmond. Kendall Simmons has three home runs this week and Bryce Ball has homered in back-to-back games. It is the sixth time in Bryce Ball's career he's homered in back-to-back games, with the last instance coming on April 28-29, 2022, with Tennessee. Ball has never homered in three-straight games. Robert Moore homered for the first time since Aug. 23, 2023, with Wisconsin, and Carson Taylor went deep for the first time since Apr. 20 at Binghamton.

A Good Week Offensively

After not hitting a single home run during its series at Richmond from May 14-19, Reading's offense responded in a big way with 13 home runs the following week. That marked ranked as first in the Eastern League by four home runs. Reading also hit .294 last week, with 39 runs (6.5 per game), 22 extra-base hits and four more sacrifice flies. In the series with Binghamton, Kendall Simmons had three homers and Bryce Ball had two.

Bounce Back for Contreras

Efrain Contreras posted his best outings as a Fightin Phil in May 26th's win over Binghamton. Contreras tossed four innings out of the bullpen, allowing two hits, one run and he had a season-high eight strikeouts. He also earned his first winning decision of the season. His eight strikeouts also marked the most by a R-Phil reliever in a game this season.

June Notes

Home Sick

Reading has performed vastly better at America's Classic Ballpark than on the road this season. The Fightin Phils hold a 14-10 record at home, compared to just 6-19 on the road. This comes after a 2023 where Reading was 36-33 away from home, and just 23-44 at FirstEnergy Stadium. To compare, Reading is hitting .251 at home, to .205 on the road, while averaging 5.2 runs per games at home, while scoring just 3.6 per game on the road. The Fightin Phils have also hit double the amount of home runs at home, than on the road. The R-Phils have hit 28 (1.2/game) at home and 14 (0.6/game) away from home.

So That's May

The Fightin Phils finished the month of May with a 10-17 record, after going 10-12 in April. Reading finished May with a .241 batting average, which ranked as fifth in the Eastern League. They also hit 24 home runs and had 75 extra-base hits. On the pitching side, the R-Phils posted a 5.05 ERA, which ranked as the worst in the Eastern League over the past month. Reading had an 8-4 record at home in May, compared to a 2-13 record on the road in May.

S&S Show (Simmons and Schewecke)

Kendall Simmons and Trevor Schewecke combined for another strong night at the plate on May 31. Simmons had another hit and run scored, while Schewecke had two doubled and two RBI. Schewecke has hits in three-of-his-last four games, and is hitting .400, with one homer (three XBH) and four RBI over that stretch. Simmons has hits in six-of-his-last-seven games, and is hitting .350, with three homers and six RBI over that stretch. Simmons has enjoyed facing Hartford this season, as he has a team-high .429 average (6-14) against the Yard Goats, with three XBH, three RBI across five games against Hartford.

Moore Please

June 1 was perhaps the best game of Robert Moore's young career, and definitely of his brief Phillies tenure this far. Moore matched a season-high with two hits and two runs, while setting a season-high with two stolen bases. Moore's two home runs mark the first multi-homer game of his career, along with also hitting the first grand slam of his professional career. He also had a career-high five RBI in the win at Hartford. With his grand slam on Saturday night, Moore became the first Fightin Phils to hit a grand slam since Cam Cannon did it on April 25, 2023, at home against the Altoona Curve.

Moves on Moves

The Fightin Phils have plenty of moves ahead of June 4th's game against Harrisburg. Eury Ramos re-joined Reading after heading to Lehigh Valley in May. Arutro De Freitas was reinstated from the Development List. Kolby Allard and Trevor Schewecke were both called up to Triple-A Lehigh Valley to fill the roster spots vacated by David Dahl and Weston Wilson's call-up to Philadelphia on Monday.

Defensive Improvement

The Fightin Phils have seen their defensive improve over the past week. During the last seven days, Reading has committed just two errors, which is least in the Eastern League. Additionally, their .990 fielding percentage ranks as the best in the league last week. Reading still ranks 12th in fielding percentage at .969 and is 10th in the league with 52 errors, but those numbers continue to improve for the R-Phils. The Fightin Phils have also picked up more outfield assists as of late to pair along with the recent defensive improvement.

On Last Night

June 6 night marked a season-low two-hits allowed for Reading's pitching staff. It was the first combined two-hitter thrown by Reading pitching since Aug. 27, 2023, at Harrisburg. The game flew by as well, played in just 2:11, which marked the shortest nine-inning home game this season. The Fightin Phils collected six-extra base hits, which ties a season high.

Caleb Crushed It

Fightin Phils Catcher Caleb Ricketts had two home runs in June 6th's win over Harrisburg. It marked the first multi-homer game of Ricketts career, since being drafted by the Phillies in 2022. It was also the fifth time this season a member of the Fightin Phils hit two home runs in a game. Ricketts is currently on a 12-game on-base streak, dating back to May 19. Over that stretch, Ricketts is slashing .304/.407/.543, with a .950 OPS. He's also added eight runs, two doubles, three home runs and 13 RBI. Ricketts .290 batting average would be second amongst Eastern League catchers, but he does not qualify.

Wishing Well

Lachlan Wells tossed his best-outing of the 2024 season on June 6. He went six innings, allowing just one hit and one run, with five strikeouts. He was quite literally nearly perfect, with his lone blemish a solo home run by C) Stubbs in the top of the sixth inning. Wells retired the first 16 hitters he faced and 18-of-19 Senators' batters overall. It marked Wells' first winning decision since Apr. 10 against Portland. The last Fightin Phils pitcher to carry a perfect game past five innings was Tyler Phillips who retired 15-straight to start the game against New Hampshire on May 10, 2023. Wells 5.1 no-hit innings were also the most no-hit innings since Phillips went six no-hit innings on June 14, 2023, against Hartford.

Packing the House

The Fightin Phils welcomed 8,805 fans on June 7 to America's Classic Ballpark. That set a new season high, surpassing Opening Night, April 9, mark of 8,510. It is the largest crowd since May 27, 2023, against Harrisburg, when 8,959 fans came to FirstEnergy Stadium for Harry Potter Night. Currently, the Fightin Phils have the second-highest average attendance in the Eastern League at 5,969 fans per game, trailing on Richmond. Reading currently has the third-highest total attendance in the league at 149,233, which trails just Richmond and Portland. Reading is currently on pace to welcome 393,954 fans this season, which would surpass last seasons total of 385,478.

Historic Outing for Pina

Robinson Pina was nearly unhittable in his game-one complete-game shutout on June 8. Pina pitched seven innings, allowed two hits, no runs, zero walks and struck out six Senators hitters. Pina's complete game was the first seven-inning complete game by a Fightin Phils pitcher since Ranger Suarez did it on June 19, 2018, at Portland. It was the first complete game of any sorts for Reading since Tyler Viza on September 1, 2018, at Trenton. It was also the first seven-inning shutout tossed by a Reading pitcher since Pete Zamora's perfect game on June 7, 2000, which was the only perfect game in Reading history. Pina's seven-inning shutout came 24 years and one-day later. Additionally, Pina threw the first two-hitter by a Reading pitcher since JC Ramirez did it on July 7, 2011, at Bowie. Pina's seven innings pitched is the most in a game by a Fightin Phils pitcher since Matt Osterberg went seven frames at Binghamton on September 14, 2022. It was also the second-shutout of the season thrown by the Fightin Phils, and first since April 25, against Somerset. Pina was named Eastern League Pitcher of the Week following his performance.

2024 R-PHILS GAME NOTES

1-2 Punch at the Top

Marcus Lee Sang and Carlos De La Cruz are forming a strong 1-2 punch at the top of the Reading lineup. The duo combined to go seven-for-eight, with three runs, two doubles, one home run and five RBI in Reading's June 8 game one win. Lee Sang collected a Double-A high four hits, and it was the third time in his career he had four hits in a game, with the last coming on May 24, 2023, with Jersey Shore at Aberdeen. It was the first four-hit game by a Fightin Phil since Matt Kroon on Aug. 4, 2023, at Hartford. Lee Sang is hitting .343 since May 1, after hitting just .197 in April. His .343 average is third in the Eastern League since the start of May. De La Cruz's three hits in game one marked his third-straight multi-hit game. As of the end of game one last night, De La Cruz was 7-11 (.636), with five runs, three doubles, two homers and seven RBI on the week. His .381 average after game one was fifth in the Eastern League at the time for the month of June.

On the Way Up

It was a busy June 11 in the Phillies organizations as many players were promoted to the next level. Reading received infielder Otto Kemp and catcher Andrick Nava from the High-A Jersey Shore BlueClaws. Kemp was named the Phillies Minor League Hitter of the Month for May. In May, Kemp slashed .337/.453/.581, with a 1.034 OPS. He added seven doubles, four triples, two homers and 15 RBI. With Jersey Shore, Kemp hit .333, with four home runs and 22 RBI. He led the South Atlantic League with a .333 batting average, .440 OBP, was sixth with a .533 SLG% and was third with a .973 OPS. Kemp also ranked amongst the league leaders in triples and runs scored. Joining Kemp is catcher Andrick Nava. Over 31 games this season with Jersey Shore, Nava is slashing .314/.388/.490, with a .878 OPS, He's added 13 runs, seven doubles, one triple, three homers and 21 RBI. Nava hit .349 in May and .320 in June prior to being called up.

Rehabbing Relievers

Michael Rucker and Luis Ortiz are both scheduled to be rehab assignments with the Fightin Phils on June 11. Rucker was placed on the 15-day injured list on March 28 with a right hand arterial vasospasm. He was transferred to the 60-day IL on June 3 and began a rehab assignment with Single-A Clearwater on June 7. It's his first year with the Phillies after previously pitching in the Cubs organization. Joining Rucker will be Luis Ortiz. The Phillies placed Ortiz on the 15-day IL on March 31 with a right ankle sprain. He made a brief rehab assignment with Clearwater on April 23.

Bombs Away

The Fightin Phils have been hitting home runs at a much-higher clip as of late. After hitting three home runs on June 11, Reading has now homered in seven-straight games, dating back to June 4. Additionally, the Fightin Phils are now tied for second in the Eastern League with 57 home runs hit this season. In June, Reading has hit 15 home runs, which ranks second in the league, behind only Erie, who has 16 this month.

Shutout Streak Snapped

After allowing three runs in the top of the third on June 11, Reading pitching's shutout streak was snapped at 13 innings, the longest mark of the season.

Marsh Madness

Phillies outfielder Brandon Marsh will begin a rehab assignment with the Fightin Phils on June 13. Marsh was placed on the 10-day IL by the Phillies on June 3 with a right hamstring strain. Prior to being placed on the IL, Marsh is slashing .265/.344/.426, with a .770 OPS through 52 games with the Phillies. He's added 21 runs, six doubles, one triple, six homers and 26 RBI. Marsh is also eight-for-10 in stolen bases this season. It is Marsh's second-full season with the Phillies after being acquired from the Los Angeles Angels on Aug. 2, 2022. Marsh made his Major League debut with the Angels in 2021 and is in his fourth Major League season. The 26-year old was drafted by the Angels in the second round (60th overall) of the 2016 draft out of Buford High School in Buford, Georgia. This will be Marsh's third rehab assignment since joining the Phillies in 2022. He appeared in games for Triple-A Lehigh Valley in both August of 2022 and '23. In 2022, he was injured with a left-ankle strain and was sidelined with a left knee contusion in 2023.

Simmons Gettin' On Base

Kendall Simmons is currently riding a 16-game on-base streak dating back to May 21. Over that streak, he's slashing .278/.409/.611, with a 1.020 OPS. He's added 12 runs, one double, one triple, five homers and 14 RBI over that stretch. Simmons 16-game on-base streak is currently tied with Portland's Roman Anthony for the longest active streak in the Eastern League.

See You on SportsCenter

Marcus Lee Sang's diving catch in the second inning of June 14th's game was on ESPN SportsCenter last night as the number eight play on it's daily top-10 plays. It's the first time a Fightin Phils play was on SportsCenter since Johan Rojas' diving catch against Richmond on July 3, 2023.

Carlos De La Cruzin

From June 11-16, Carlos De La Cruz slashed .346/.414/.692, with a 1.106 OPS. He added nine runs, three home runs and seven RBI. For the month of June, De La Cruz is slashing .327/.422/.655, with a 1.077 OPS. In June, he's added 16 runs, 3 doubles, five home runs and 14 RBI. De La Cruz has the eighth-best batting average in the Eastern League in June (minimum 30 ABs). His other June ranks are: runs (1st), hits (T-4th), home runs (2nd), RBI (T-3rd) and OPS (7th).

Packing The House

For the week of June 11-16, 45,601 fans attended the six games at FirstEnergy Stadium, which was an average of 7,600 fans per game. It was both the highest average and total in over five years, and since the schedule shifted to the six-game series format. It was also the highest mark in the Eastern League and all of Double-A. Out of the 60 Minor League teams that were home last week, Reading also had the fifth highest total and average attendance.

All Good Things Must Come to an End

Kendall Simmons snapped his 19-game on-base streak on June 19, dating back to May 21. Over that streak, he's slashed .292/.410/.600, with a 1.010 OPS. He's added 13 runs, three doubles, one triple, five homers and 15 RBI over that stretch. Simmons 19-game on-base streak was the longest active streak in the Eastern League, and tied for the fifth-longest on-base streak in the Eastern League this season. It was the longest on-base streak by a Fightin Phil since Carlos De La Cruz (38; 5/12-6-25) and Oliver Dunn (22; 5/26-6/23) did it last season.

Taylor Torments New Hampshire

Carson Taylor turned in another impressive game on June 21 in what has been a career-year for him. He set a new season-high with four hits, and also tied a career-high with that mark. The only other time Taylor had four hits in a game was June 22, 2021, when he was with Great Lake in the Dodgers' organization. It was also the second four-hit game for a Fightin Phil this season, as Marcus Lee Sang had four hits on June 8, against Harrisburg. Taylor currently ranks fifth in the Eastern League with his .299 average and leads all active Eastern League players with 48 RBI. This week, Taylor is slashing .417/.462/.500, with a .962 OPS.

Old Cats

Trevor Schwewe has had a strong week at the plate for the Fightin Phils. This week, Schwewe is 4-12 (.333), with three doubles, one home run and three RBI. He's appeared in four games since being transferred back to Reading from Triple-A Lehigh Valley on June 15, and has hits in all four games. Two of those have been multi-hit games. Schwewe is quite familiar with Delta Dental Stadium as he played parts of 2022 (39 games) and '23 (71 games) with the Fisher Cats. The Phillies selected Schwewe in the Minor League Phase of the Rule Five Draft from Toronto this past offseason. Additionally, first year coach, and acting manager, Karl Ellison is a former Fisher Cat. Ellison played part of 2022 (nine games) and '23 (11 games) with New Hampshire. After signing with the Phillies prior to the 2022 season, Ellison was traded to Toronto on Aug. 31, 2022. Following 2023, he retired from playing and is now the R-Phils Development Coach.

Take a Walk, or Not

Dating back to June 18 (eight games), Fightin Phils pitchers have issued just 11 walks, which ranks as the fewest in the Eastern League over that span. It also ranks as the fewest walks allowed in all of Minor League Baseball, with the second least being 17. Reading also leads Minor League baseball in that stretch with a 4.64 strikeout-to-walk ratio, and a 1.38 walk-per-nine ratio.

Bombs Away

After hitting three home runs on June 28, Reading continues its season-high with home runs in 13 games in a row. This comes after also hitting home runs in seven-straight games from June 4-11. The only game since June 4 Reading has not hit a home run in was June 12, so they have homered in 20-of-21 games. The 13-game home run streak is Reading's longest such streak since homering in 13-straight games from June 21-July 3, of the 2019 season. Dating back to the 2005 season, the Fightin Phils have not homered in 14 games in a row.

Marcus Mashing

With a hit on June 28, Marcus Lee Sang is currently riding an active team-best 13-game on-base streak. It also is his personal-best on-base streak for the season. He also had a 12-game on-base streak from Apr. 26 to May 12. Over his current 13-game on-base streak, Lee Sang is slashing .264/.310/.528, with an .838 OPS. He's added 10 runs, two doubles, four home runs and nine RBI over the streak, dating back to June 12.

Wonderful Wilson

Ethan Wilson homered on Friday night for the second-straight game. Prior to his first home run of the season on Thursday night, Wilson had gone 53-straight games without hitting a home run, with his last coming on Aug. 31, 2023, at home against New Hampshire.

July Notes

June Recap

The Fightin Phils ultimately finished the month of June with a 13-12 record, marking their first month an over .500 record this season. It marks the first month that Reading has had a .500 or better record since going 13-12 in August of last season. The Fightin Phils hit .253 in June, which ranked fifth in the Eastern League. On the mound, Reading posted a 3.50 ERA, which was third in the league for the month.

Ramos Rolling

Fightin Phils relief pitcher Eury Ramos has been on a roll as of late. Since returning from Triple-A Lehigh Valley and making his first appearance back with Reading on June 4, the righty owns a 1.74 ERA over seven appearances and 10.1 innings pitched. He's allowed just four hits and two-earned runs, which both came on June 18 at New Hampshire. When eliminating that New Hampshire outing, Ramos owns a 0.00 ERA over 9.2 innings pitched.

Carlos De La Cruzin'

Carlos De La Cruz finished off the month of June slashing .300/.386/.560, with a .946 OPS for the month. He added 21 runs, six doubles, one triple, six home runs and 16 RBI for the month. It's a month that was completely turned his season around, as De La Cruz entered June hitting just .213, and after two more hits on July 1, he is now up to .255 on the season.

2024 R-PHILS GAME NOTES

Schwecke On a Roll

Like Eury Ramos, Trevor Schwecke has been red-hot since returning from Lehigh Valley. Since his first game back on June 15, Schwecke is slashing .333/.356/.548, with a .904 OPS. He's added seven runs, six doubles, one homer and 10 RBI. He's also raised his average from .216 to .242 over that stretch.

Next Crop

Two of the Phillies Top Prospects, and potentially future Fightin Phils, Aidan Miller and Justin Crawford were each named to the All-Star Futures Game on July 2. Crawford and Miller are both teammates with High-A Jersey Shore and were the Phillies 2022 and '23 first round draft picks, respectively.

Marvelous Matt

Matt Osterberg turned in his best start of the season, and one of the best outings by a Reading pitcher, on July 2. He matched a team-season high with seven innings, allowing just one run on a leadoff home run, scattering seven hits, and striking out three, with no walks. The seven innings matched a career-high for him, as he last went seven innings on Sept. 14, 2023, on the road at Binghamton.

What's Up Breaux

Josh Breaux hit a three-run home run on July 3 in just his second start with the Fightin Phils. He was released by the Yankees on June 29 and signed with the Phillies and was assigned to Reading on July 2. Ironically, his first games with the R-Phils come against his old organization and the team he played the most games for in his professional career. Breaux appeared in 104 games for the Patriots between the 2021-23 seasons.

A Man Called Otto (Races Around the Bases)

In game one on July 5, Otto Kemp hit an inside-the-park home run for his fifth home run in 20 games so far since being called up from High-A Jersey Shore. It was the first inside-the-park homer hit by a Fightin Phil since Arquimedes Gamboa his one against Portland on July 15, 2021. The last inside-the-park home run hit at First Energy Stadium was on July 1, 2023, by Richmond's Wade Mecker. The Kemp inside-the-park home run was the first to hit off the Redner's Event Center, as Mecker's was due to a collision in the outfield by Carlos De La Cruz and Matt Kroon.

Phillips is a Phillie

Tyler Phillips, who pitched for Reading in 2021 and '23, earned his first Major League call-up on July 5. Phillips is the third former R-Phil to receive a bigleague promotion in 2024, joining former teammate Oliver Dunn (2023) with the Brewers, and Erik Miller (2022) with the Giants. Phillies is one-of-right Reading alums on the Phillies active roster currently. He is the third member of the 2023 team to be on the Phillies roster, joining Johan Rojas and Orion Kerkering. Phillies grew up in South Jersey, a huge Phillies fan, and attended Bishop Eustace High School, the same as Zac Gallen. The Rangers drafted him in 2015 and was DFA'd and claimed by the Phillies in 2021. He missed all of 2022 recovering from Tommy John Surgery, and has been strong since returning last year.

On The Move

Carlos De La Cruz was promoted to Triple-A Lehigh Valley ahead of their game on July 9. It was a move that was a long-time coming for De La Cruz. After a slow start to the season, De La Cruz turned it on since June began. From June 1 until his call-up (30 games), De La Cruz slashed .314/.390/.529 (.919 OPS). He added 25 runs, six doubles, one triple, six home runs and 18 RBI. His strikeout numbers were down as well as he punched out 33 times in 136 plate appearance. De La Cruz was hitting .208 on June 1, and leaves Reading with a .262 batting average. In total, De La Cruz appeared in 232 games with the Fightin Phils, dating back to his call-up from High-A Jersey Shore on Aug. 1, 2022. De La Cruz hit 39 home runs and drove in 125 RBI over his time in Reading.

Coming from the Shore

Prior to July 9th's game, the Phillies promoted pitching prospects Samuel Aldegheri and Jean Cabrera from High-A Jersey Shore. Both have been impressive, winning South Atlantic League Pitcher of the Week accolades. Cabrera will start Thursday and Aldegheri will get the ball on Friday.

Hey Now, You're an All-Star

Two former Fightin Phils were named All-Star representatives of the Phillies last week. Ranger Suarez (2018) and Alec Bohm (2019) will both represent the Phillies in the midsummer classic next week in Arlington, Texas.

Welcome to the Bakeshow

Andrew Baker struck out the side in a scoreless inning in the top of the ninth inning on June 10. Since returning from High-A Jersey Shore, Baker has appeared in three games, with a 2.25 ERA over four innings and five strikeouts to no walks. After a tough start to the season, Baker was transferred to Jersey Shore on May 7 and was excellent with the BlueClaws. Over 16 games, Baker had a 1.59 ERA with Jersey Shore, while striking out 30 and walking eight.

Here Comes Crawford

The Phillies announced that No. 3 Prospect Justin Crawford was promoted to Reading from High-A Jersey Shore on July 12. Crawford will begin his Reading tenure on the Development List as himself, and Aidan Miller, participate in the All-Star Futures Game in Arlington, Texas.

Starters Showing Control

So far this season, Reading's starting pitchers have issued 115 walks, which ranks as second fewest in the Eastern League. Their 2.98 BB/9 ratio is third in the league. Robinson Pina (1st), Lachlan Wells (2nd) and Matt Osterberg (9th) all rank within the top-10 in the Eastern League in strikeout-to-walk ratio.

Bombs Away

Since June 1, the Fightin Phils lead the Eastern League in home runs hit at 46. That recent surge has propelled the Fightin Phils to second in the Eastern League in home runs with 88. They trail Somerset by six and are ahead of third-place Erie by 10. That stretch featured a team-best home runs in 13-straight games from June 13-28, which tied a mark set by the 2016 Fightin Phils. Reading came back in the bottom of the ninth thanks to a game-tying double from Baron Radcliff and then a walk off single over the head of the Akron center fielder from Ethan Wilson. It was Reading's second walk off win of the season and first since May 8. Akron won the series ultimately 4-2.

Shutout Streak

It was led by seven-shutout innings from Lachlan Wells last Saturday night and then six-scoreless frames on Sunday evening from Matt Osterberg.

Kemp On a Roll

Otto Kemp finished last week's series at Akron on a high note with a home run, as he had two long balls on the week. Since his call-up from High-A Jersey Shore on June 11, Kemp is tied for the Eastern League lead in home runs with seven. He also ranks tied for sixth in RBI and eighth in OPS over that span.

Newcomers on the Block

The Phillies announced roster moves ahead of this weekend's series in Portland. Pitchers Eiberson Castellano and Andrew Walling are joining the Fightin Phils, while infielder Erick Brito joins the mix as well. Otto Kemp has proven to be a reliable bat in the Reading lineup since joining the Fightin Phils on June 11 from High-A Jersey Shore. Following recent promotions and the trade deadline, the Fightin Phils have seven of the Phillies top-30 prospects on their roster, according to MLB Pipeline: Justin Crawford (3), Gabriel Rincones Jr. (9), Seth Johnson (10), Jean Cabrera (15), Christian McGowan (17), Caleb Ricketts (22) and Robert Moore (27).

Leadoff Lee Sang

Marcus Lee Sang set the tone early in August 2nd's ballgame as he blasted a leadoff home run in the bottom of the first inning. It marks the first leadoff home run for Reading this season and the first since Lee Sang had a leadoff home run on Sept. 2, 2023, at home against New Hampshire.

100 For Pina

Robinson Pina struck out his 100th batter of the season on August 2, and currently sits at 102 punchouts on the season. Pina is one-of-six active Eastern League pitchers who have 100-or-more strikeouts this season. He ranks sixth in the league with his 102 strikeouts so far this year.

Reading Debut

Phillies No. 10 Prospect Seth Johnson will make his Fightin Phils debut on August 3. Johnson was acquired, along with Moises Chace (who's with Jersey Shore), in exchange for Gregory Soto in a trade with the Baltimore Orioles. Johnson has had a strong season with Double-A Bowie, posting a 2.63 ERA over 18 starts. Saturday won't be the first time Johnson pitches at FirstEnergy Stadium, as he started for the Baysox here on June 27. In that game, Johnson went four-scoreless innings, allowing three hits and striking out four.

Hardware for Castellano

Fightin Phils' pitcher Eiberson Castellano was named the Phillies Minor League Pitcher of the Month for July. Over four appearances in July, Castellano went 2-1, with a 3.66 ERA. He made his final two starts of the month with Reading and will be on the mound on Sunday for the Fightin Phils

2024 R-PHILS GAME NOTES

Been a While

Reading's shutout loss on August 3 was just the fourth time the R-Phils were shutout this season and the first time since May 18 at Richmond. The Fightin Phils went 61-straight games (5/19-8/2) without being shutout, which is the longest stretch without a shutout of any team in Double-A this season.

Triple Play

On August 3, the Fightin Phils hit into a triple play when Josh Breaux popped up to first base and the infield fly rule was called. Hartford first baseman Zach Kokoska dropped the ball and Justin Crawford tried to advance home on the drop, but was thrown out at the plate. Otto Kemp then tried to advance to second, but was also thrown out. It was the first triple play at FirstEnergy Stadium since Reading turned one on Sept. 9, 2022, against New Hampshire.

Walk It Out

Carson Taylor continues to show a disciplined approach at the plate. He leads the team in walks this season with 49 and he has reached via base on balls eight times through four games this week. His eight walks this week are most in the Eastern League and Taylor has climbed to third in the league in walks for the year. Taylor's on-base percentage is now up to .401, which is a team best and also ranks third in the Eastern League on the season.

Schultz is Shoving

Andrew Schultz has been dominant on the mound as of late for the Fightin Phils. Since June 1 (16 appearances), Schultz has a 1.06 ERA (2 ER, 17 IP). He has allowed a run in just two of his 16 outings over that stretch, while also being a perfect four-for-four in save opportunities.

Wonderful Wilson

After missing the first two games of the series, Ethan Wilson has been red-hot this week. So far this series, Wilson has four hits, two runs, two doubles, two home runs and four RBI. He homered in back-to-back games on Thursday and Friday, marking the second time he's homered in consecutive contests this season (6/27-28 vs Bowie). In his career against Hartford (35 games), Wilson is 46-132 (.348), with 29 runs, 19 XBH (11 2B, 1 3B, 7 HR) and 23 RBI.

Welcome Back Walker

Taijuan Walker will make his second rehab start with the Fightin Phils on August 7. Walker was scheduled to start Tuesday night for Triple-A Lehigh Valley at home, but that game was postponed and the weather in the Philadelphia area is iffy over the next few days. So, Walker will join Reading Wednesday night and pitch en route to his way back to the Phillies rotation. Walker pitched for Reading last Wednesday, July 31, against Hartford. He allowed three runs (two-earned) on four hits, over 2.2 innings pitched. Walker also struck out three hitters and walked one.

Breaking Out the Brooms

The Fightin Phils rolled Akron in both ends of August 10th's doubleheader 6-3 and 11-4. It marked Reading's first doubleheader sweep since Sept. 7, 2022, against New Hampshire. In game one, Robinson Pina earned his 12th win and allowed three runs over six innings, with five strikeouts. Gabriel Rincones Jr. homered and Otto Kemp had two hits. Daniel Harper followed Pina and earned his first Double-A save with a clean seventh inning. In game two, Rincones Jr. homered again and Justin Crawford had three hits, two runs, five RBI and a grand slam. Seth Johnson was strong on the mound, going four scoreless innings and striking out six. Andrew Baker earned the win, while striking out two in a scoreless fifth inning.

Crawford's Cruising

Phillies No. 3 Prospect Justin Crawford turned in perhaps his best game at the Double-A level on August 10. Crawford had three hits, two runs, a grand slam and five RBI. His five RBI tied a career-high, with the last time being Aug. 5, 2023, with Clearwater against Lakeland. Crawford's grand slam was the third of Crawford's professional career, with his other two coming on Aug. 5, 2023, with Clearwater against Lakeland; and May 30, 2024, with Jersey Shore against Brooklyn. Crawford now has 10 professional home runs, and three of them have been grand slams. His grand slam was Reading's second of the season and first since Robert Moore on June 1, 2024, at Hartford.

Rincones Rolling

Gabriel Rincones Jr. turned in one of his best days as a professional on August 10. Between both games of the doubleheader, Rincones Jr. went five-for-eight, with four runs, two doubles, two home runs and four RBI. Rincones has now homered in three-straight games, making him the first R-Phil to homer in three-consecutive contests since Oliver Dunn did it from Aug. 15-17, of 2023. Rincones also went deep in both games of Saturday's doubleheader, marking the first time a Fightin Phil has hit a homer in both ends of a twin bill since Jorge Bonifacio did it on May 27, 2021, against Richmond. So far this week, Rincones is slashing .400/.455/1.000, with a 1.455 OPS. He's added six runs, three doubles, three home runs and eight RBI.

Welcome to the Show

Despite an 11-1 loss on August 10, the Philadelphia Phillies welcomed another former Fightin Phil to the big leagues on Saturday night. Max Lazar, who did not allow a run over eight appearances with Reading this season, went 1.1-scoreless innings, with a strikeout at Arizona. Lazar became the fourth former Fightin Phil to make his Major League debut in 2024. He joins Erik Miller (2022), Oliver Dunn (2023), Tyler Phillips (2021, '23) as other former R-Phils to make the big leagues this season. Lazar is the sixth player who played under Al Pedrique in Reading (2023-24) to go on to play in the big leagues, joining Johan Rojas, Orion Kerkering, Drew Ellis, Oliver Dunn and Tyler Phillips.

On the Way Up

The Philadelphia Phillies announced multiple promotions prior to August 13th's game. Pitchers Robinson Pina and Seth Johnson were both promoted to Triple-A Lehigh Valley. Pina was stellar for the Fightin Phils, winning 12 games and ranking amongst the Eastern League leaders in multiple categories. His 12 wins were the most by an R-Phil since Austin Hyatt in 2011. Johnson made just two starts with Reading after being acquired from Baltimore in the Gregory Soto trade, but he did spend the other part of the season with Double-A Bowie. Coming to Reading from High-A Jersey Shore are pitchers Braeden Fausnaught and Moises Chace, along with infielder Zach Arnold. Fausnaught played his college baseball at West Chester and Chace was also in the Soto deal with Johnson. Arnold played his college baseball at Houston and LSU and spent the entire season with High-A Jersey Shore.

Got (Oat) Milk?

On August 14, the Fightin Phils will transition to Minor League Baseball's 121st team, the Malmo Oatmilkers. This partnership comes in conjunction with MLB's partnership with Oatly, as every Minor League team plays one game as the Oat Milkers in 2024. So far this season, the Malmo Oat Milkers hold a record of 48-46. Malmo is located in Sweden, which is home of Oatly, which is a company that produces Oatmilk. The Fort Wayne TinCaps join the Fightin Phils as also transitioning to the Malmo Oat Milkers on Wednesday night.

The Local Kid

Braeden Fausnaught fired five-strong innings in his Double-A debut on August 14. He went five innings and allowed one run on five hits, with no walks and five strikeouts. Fausnaught had tons of family and friends on hand for his debut on Wednesday. He played his high school baseball at Danville High School, which is 71 miles away from FirstEnergy Stadium. Fausnaught then played collegiately at West Chester University, which is just 45 miles from Baseballtown.

Driving Them Home

Trevor Schwewe is turning in another stellar week against his former team, the Fisher Cats. So far this series, Schwewe is slashing .417/.417/.583, with a 1.000 OPS. He's added one run, two doubles and six RBI, while striking out just one time. Schwewe has now driven in multiple runs in three-straight games as well. Schwewe is the fifth Fightin Phil to have a streak of three-or-more games with multiple RBI this season. It is the first time this season Schwewe has driven in multiple RBI in consecutive contests.

Brito Breaking Through

With Justin Crawford getting August 16 off, Erick Brito was placed in the leadoff spot in the lineup for the first time this season. Brito proceeded to turn in his best game with Double-A Reading, having two hits, one run, two doubles and three RBI. He had a three-run double in the eighth inning to break a tie game. It was both his first multi-hit and multi-RBI games at the Double-A level.

The First Fightin

Right-handed pitcher Moises Chace makes both his Double-A and Fightin Phils' debut on August 17. Chace was acquired with Seth Johnson from the Baltimore Orioles in exchange for Gregory Soto at the trade deadline. Chace made 17 appearances and nine starts for Baltimore's High-A Aberdeen prior to the trade. He made two starts with Jersey Shore prior to his call-up, most recently earning a win on Aug. 10 at Wilmington. In that contest, Chace went five innings, allowing one run on three hits, with seven strikeouts. After the trade, Chace now ranks as the Phillies' No. 26 Prospect, according to MLB Pipeline.

Streaks on Streaks

Otto Kemp extended his season-best on-base streak to 16 games on August 16. Over his streak, dating back to July 27, Kemp is slashing .305/.406/.458, with an .864 OPS. Carson Taylor also extended his season-best on-base streak to 14 games on Friday night. Taylor is slashing .304/.450/.928, with a .928 OPS over his streak, which dates back to July 30. Gabriel Rincones Jr. also had a nine-game on-base streak, where he is slashing .353/.436/.794, with a 1.230 OPS over it, which dates back to August 7.

The Road Ahead

After August 18th's game, the Fightin Phils hit the road for a season-long two-week, 12-game road trip. It will begin at Binghamton and then finish in Somerset. Reading will return home for its final-home series of the season from Sept. 3-8 against Erie, before finishing the season in Harrisburg from Sept. 10-15.

Like Jordan, Going Back-to-Back-to-Back

The Fightin Phils hit three-straight home runs in the bottom of the fifth inning in August 17th's game against the Fisher Cats. Gabriel Rincones Jr. (10) launched a solo shot, then Otto Kemp (10) homered and Trevor Schwewe (5) followed with a blast to left. It was the first time Reading homered in threestraight at bats since June 7, 2016 at Akron. It was done by Jorge Alfaro, Dylan Cozens and Rhys Hoskins. Reading also homered for three times in an inning for the third time this season, with all of those instances coming after the All-Star Break.

2024 R-PHILS GAME NOTES

Red-Hot Schwecke

Trevor Schwecke's red-hot week finished with two hits and a run scored on August 18. Last week, Schwecke slashed .429/.429/.667, with a 1.096 OPS. He's added four runs, two doubles, a home run and seven RBI, while striking out just one time. Schwecke drove in multiple runs in three-straight games (8/14-16), as well. Schwecke was the fifth Fightin Phil to have a streak of three-or-more games with multiple RBI this season. It was the first time this season Schwecke has driven in multiple RBI in consecutive contests. He also matched his season-long six-game hitting streak.

Racking Up Strikeouts

Moises Chace and Eiberson Castellano each turned in impressive starts on the mound on August 24 and August 25, respectively. Chace struck out a career-high 10 hitters on Saturday night over 4.2 innings pitched. Castellano struck out 11 hitters the following night, Sunday, at Binghamton. It was the second-straight start Castellano punched out double-digit batters, as he did so on Aug. 18 vs New Hampshire. Castellano's 11 strikeouts match a Reading-season high for the third time. It was the fourth game this season where Castellano had over 10 strikeouts, and second time with the Fightin Phils.

Strong Starters

Last week was a strong week for Fightin Phils' starting pitchers. The group allowed 12 earned runs over 30.2 innings for the week, which is a 3.52 ERA. The Fightin Phils remain 12th in the Eastern League in starter ERA at 4.80, but it's a mark that has gradually improved the last few weeks. On August 1, Reading's starting pitchers had an ERA of 5.25, so it has dropped 0.45 runs over the last four weeks.

Rincones Rolling

Gabriel Rincones Jr. hit his 11th home run on August 27, which came in just his 44th game of the season. He missed nearly three months with an injury from late-April to mid-July. If Rincones played a full 138-game season, he would be on pace for 35 home runs, 38 doubles, 66 RBI and 47 stolen bases. Since his return on July 19, Rincones Jr. is tied for second in the Eastern League in home runs (7) and tied for second in stolen bases (11).

Carson Cruising Again

After going 0-for-10 in his first three starts at Binghamton last week, Carson Taylor has locked back in in his last three games. Over those three contests, Taylor is 5-11 (.455), with two doubles and four RBI. Taylor's strong season has seen him littered amongst the Eastern League leaderboards. Those rankings are: 7th AVG (.284), T-4th HR (16), 2nd RBI (72), 2nd OBP (.393), 1st SLG (.495), 1st OPS (.888), 4th BB (57) and 6th TB (162).

Going Going Gone

This week's series matches up the two teams with the most home runs in the Eastern League this season. Somerset is in first place with 131 home runs and Reading sits in second with 127 long balls. Reading is on pace for 143 home runs this season, which would be the first time the R-Phils hit over 140 home runs in consecutive seasons since 2017 (153) and 2018 (141).

Marcus Mashing

After a recent slow stretch, Marcus Lee Sang is swinging the bat well again. Since August 13, Lee Sang is slashing .304/.333/.522, with an .855 OPS. He's added seven runs, two doubles, one triple, two home runs and four RBI. This comes after a stretch that saw Lee Sang go 7-72 (.097) from July 4-August 10. In Friday night's game, Lee Sang set a new career-high with three stolen bases. It also marked the second time this season a R-Phil stole three bags in a game. The other came from Gabriel Rincones Jr. on July 27 at New Hampshire.

News and Notes

August 30 was Reading's eighth shutout win of the season which by far and away surpasses last season's total of three. It's the most shutouts Reading has had in a season since posting 11 in 2022. Tommy McCollum also reached 10 saves in Friday night's ballgame. That mark surpasses last season's individual high of seven from Orion Kerkering. McCollum's 10 saves are the most by a Fightin Phil in a season since Brian Marconi had 18 in 2022.

September Notes

Magical Moises

Moises Chace was nothing short of dominant in his third Double-A start on August 31. After setting a then-career high with 10 strikeouts over 4.2 innings last week at Binghamton, he followed that with a new career-high 13 strikeouts over a career-best six-innings pitched. His 13 strikeouts are the most by a Reading pitcher this season, with the previous high being 11, done three times. The last Reading pitcher with exactly 13 strikeouts in a game was Adam Walker on May 10, 2001, at Portland. His 13 strikeouts were also the most in a game by a Fightin Phil since Spencer Howard had 12 on Sept. 4, 2019, against Trenton. In total, Chace retired 18-of-19 hitters and the final 16 he faced. Of those 19 hitters, 13 were retired via strikeout. 13 of his 18 outs were via a strikeout (72%). He collected 19 swing and missed on the night, with 13 of those coming against his fastball. His effort led to 16 strikeouts on the night for Reading pitching, matching a season high. Since his Double-A debut (August 17), Chace leads the Eastern League with 29 strikeouts, with second place over that stretch being Sunday's starter Eiberson Castellano, who has 21 entering today's start. Chace was named Eastern League Pitcher of the Week following his start, along with Phillies Pitcher of the Month.

It's Miller Time

The Philadelphia Phillies announced on September 3 that No. 1 prospect (according to MLB Pipeline) Aidan Miller was promoted to Reading from High-A Jersey Shore. Miller was the Phillies first round draft pick in the 2023 draft. He began the season with Single-A Clearwater and after a strong start with the Threshers, Miller was promoted to Jersey Shore on June 11. Miller had a slower start to his time with Jersey Shore, but turned it up in the month of August. He slashed .299/.370/.536 (.906 OPS) in August. Miller finished his time in Jersey Shore with a five-hit performance on Sunday. Miller joins Crawford as the last two Phillies first round picks prior to 2024 to play for the Fightin Phils. It's the first time the Phillies top prospect has played in Reading since Andrew Painter in 2022 and the first time consecutive first round picks are suiting up for the R-Phils since Mick Abel (2020) and Andrew Painter (2021) during the 2022 season.

It Comes in Twos

Ethan Wilson launched his ninth home run of the season in September 1st's loss at Somerset. Wilson had three hits last week at Somerset, with all three being home runs. Wilson's home run on Sunday was his second in as many games, as he also went deep on Saturday. It marked the third instance this season that Wilson has homered in back-to-back games (6/27-28, 8/1-2 and 8/31-9/1).

A Rare Comeback

September 4th's game was not the first time in R-Phils' history that they won a game on catchers' interference. Reading had a walk-off catchers' interference on June 20, 2007, when Jason Hill drew the interference to five Reading a 3-2 win over Binghamton. Wednesday's win was the second time this season Reading won a game when trailing entering their final at bats. The other instance was on July 14 against Akron at home.

Home Cooking

Following September 4th's win, the Fightin Phils are 35-30 at FirstEnergy Stadium this season. After last night, Reading has clinched a winning record at home for the first time since going 36-33 in 2022. This comes after the R-Phils posted a 23-44 record at home last season.

Piling on the Strikeouts

Fightin Phils pitching set a new season-high with 18 strikeouts in September 5th's game against Erie. That mark surpasses their previous season-high of 16, that was last done last Saturday at Somerset. Tommy McCollum punched out a career-high six batters over two innings of work. Andrew Schultz added four as well.

On the Move

The flurry of rosters moves continued for the Fightin Phils ahead of September 6th's game. Both Otto Kemp and Josh Breaux were promoted to Triple-A Lehigh Valley on Friday, one day after Marcus Lee Sang was called-up to the IronPigs on Thursday. The Fightin Phils added catcher Jordan Dissin and first baseman Keaton Anthony on call-ups from High-A Jersey Shore.

Top Prospects in Baseballtown

The Fightin Phils have Phillies No. 1 Prospect Aidan Miller and No. 3 Prospect Justin Crawford on their roster. Crawford joined the team on July 19 and Miller on Sept. 3 from High-A Jersey Shore. Miller was recently named South Atlantic Player of the Month of August and has a hit in each of his first four Reading games. Crawford leads Reading in hitting since his debut and has 14 multi-hit games over 34 appearances (41%). Crawford was the Phillies first round pick in 2022 and Miller in 2023, marking the first time Reading has had consecutive first round picks since Mick Abel (2020) and Andrew Painter (2021) in 2022.

Road to the Show

Former Fightin Phil Seth Johnson will make his Major League debut for the Phillies on September 8 in Miami. Johnson's time in Baseballtown was brief, as he was promoted to Triple-A Lehigh Valley after two starts. Johnson is the sixth former Fightin Phil to make his Major League debut this season. He joins Erik Miller (SF), Oliver Dunn (MIL), Tyler Phillips (PHI), Max Lazar (PHI) and Sam Aldegheri (LAA).

Team Awards

The Fightin Phils announced their team awards prior to September 8th's home finale. Robert Moore and Gabriel Rincones Jr. split the Stolen Base Leader Award, Noah Skirrow won the Community Service Award, Trevor Schwecke was recognized as the team's Un-Sung Hero, Robinson Pina won Strikeout Leader and Pitcher of the Year, Otto Kemp won the Clutch Player Award and Carson Taylor was recognized for the Big Stick Award and as the team's MVP.

Crawford Is Cruising

Phillies No. 3 Prospect Justin Crawford turned in another strong game on September 8, registering two hits, a double and run scored. Over five games last week, Crawford slashed .474/.545/.526 (1.071 OPS). He added five runs, a double and three stolen bases. Over 35 games so far with Reading, Crawford has 15 multi-hit games (43%), which includes six three-hit games. Since his Double-A debut on July 19, Crawford holds the following Eastern League ranks: 2nd AVG (.331), 9th runs (23), 2nd hits (48), 4th doubles (10) and 1st SB (15).

M-V-P M-V-P

Carson Taylor received the team MVP award on September 8 after a stellar first season in the Phillies organization. He enters the final week of the regular season with the following Eastern League rankings: 7th AVG (.280), T-6th HR (16), 3rd RBI (73), 2nd OBP (.395), 3rd SLG (.473), 1st OPS (.868), T-1st BB (66) and T-7th TB (169). The Phillies selected Taylor in the minor league phase of the Rule Five Draft from the Dodgers' organization, where he played from 2021-23, primarily as a catcher, but has moved to first base this season. He's set career highs in games, hits, runs, home runs and RBI.

2024 R-PHILS GAME NOTES

Pitchers Giving Length

After getting six-shutout innings from Braeden Fausnaught on September 11, Fightin Phils pitchers have tossed six-or-more innings on 32 instances this season. In those games, Reading has posted a 22-10 record. When pitchers have gone seven innings, the Fightin Phils are 6-0 this year; and they have posted a 16-10 record in 26 games where pitchers have thrown 6-plus frames. Reading pitchers went six-or-more innings 33 times in 2023, and seven-plus three times.

Milestone Watch

With four games to go in the season, the Fightin Phils have a few milestones to look out for. With Carson Taylor holding 73 RBI, this will mark the third-straight year that Reading's RBI leader has 70-plus RBI, afternot doing so from 2017-21. This year will mark the first time since 2015 (Roman Quinn) that a R-Phil had been caught stealing over 10 times, as Robert Moore has been caught 11 times. Robinson Pina's 12 wins are the most since Austin Hyatt in 2012. It's also the first time a Reading pitcher has double-digit wins since David Parkinson in 2019.

Crawford Is Cruising

Phillies No. 3 Prospect Justin Crawford turned in another strong game on September 13, registering two hits and two RBI. Since Sept. 3, Crawford is slashing .444/.487/.583 (1.070 OPS). He's added seven runs, two doubles, one home run, six RBI and three stolen bases over that stretch. Over 39 games so far with Reading, Crawford has 18 multi-hit games (46%), which includes six three-hit games. Since his Double-A debut on July 19, Crawford holds the following Eastern League ranks: 1st AVG (.340), T-7th RBI (26), 8th OBP (.383), 6th SLG (.463), 5th OPS (.846), 2nd Hits (55), T-3rd Doubles (11), 6th TB (75), 10th Runs (25) and T-1st SB (15). He has a hit in 16 of his last 17 games and is riding a 10-game hitting streak.

Shutting Them Down

Fightin Phils pitching picked up their 10th shutout win of the season on September 14. The 10 shutouts are the most in a season for the R-Phils since posting 11 shutouts in 2022. It marks just the sixth time since 2000 that Reading has 10-or-more shutouts in a season, and just the third instance since 2010. This week, Reading pitching as hosted a 1.05 ERA (5 ER, 43 IP) through five games, which is the lowest in Double-A and second-lowest in all of Minor League Baseball. The bullpen has an ERA of 1.40 (3 ER, 19.1 IP) and starters have an ERA of 0.76 (2 ER, 23.2 IP) this week.

There's No Place Like Home

The Fightin Phils were much better at home this season, than when away from FirstEnergy Stadium. Reading went 35-34 at home, compared to a 24-43 record on the road entering the final day of the regular season. This came after the R-Phils went 23-44 at home last season and 36-33 on the road.

Pitchers Giving Length

After getting six-shutout innings from Noah Skirrow on September 14, Fightin Phils pitchers have tossed six-or-more innings on 34 instances this season, and three times this week (Fausnaught, Neunborn and Skirrow). In those games, Reading has posted a 24-10 record. When pitchers have gone seven innings, the Fightin Phils are 6-0 this year; and they have posted a 18-10 record in 28 games where pitchers have thrown 6-plus frames.

Amongst the League Leaders

Carson Taylor holds the following Eastern League ranks entering the final game of the regular season: 10th AVG (.277), 3rd RBI (75), 4th OBP (.389), 5th SLG (.465), 2nd OPS (.854), T-2nd BB (67) and 8th TB (173). Robert Moore ranks tied for second in the league with 11 caught stealings. On the pitching side, Robinson Pina is tied for the league lead in wins (12), T-1st in shutouts (1) and complete games (1). 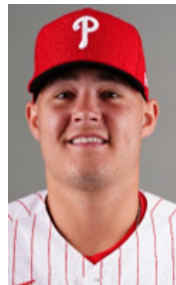
