**The Aviators concluded their 42<sup>ND</sup> season on the field as a member of the Pacific Coast League (1983-2019, 2022-25) & Triple-A West (2021)**

The Athletics recalled a total of 21 players from the Las Vegas Aviators (who began the season in minor leagues, in the Athletics minor league system) during the 2025 season: The complete list is included in the Las Vegas Aviators Transactions pages on the final season game notes.

**2025 LAS VEGAS BALLPARK ATTENDANCE:** In 75 dates, Las Vegas total was **491,889** (2<sup>nd</sup> in PCL) for an average of **6,559** with **11 sellouts**...season-high crowd was 11,148 vs. Sacramento on April 5...the all-time attendance total now stands at **15,078,273**...the Las Vegas franchise has reached the 300,000 mark in "home" attendance in all **42** seasons (1983-2019, 2021-25).

The Las Vegas Ballpark regular season attendance total over six seasons (2019, 2021-25) is 3,077,262 which includes 104 sellouts.

*In 36 seasons at Cashman Field (1983-2018), the attendance total was 12,001,011.*

**2024 LAS VEGAS BALLPARK ATTENDANCE:** In 74 dates, Las Vegas total was **481,802** (3<sup>rd</sup> in PCL) for an average of **6,511** with **12 sellouts**...the season-high crowd was **10,646 (sellout)** vs. El Paso on September 20.

**2023 LAS VEGAS BALLPARK ATTENDANCE:** In 74 dates, Las Vegas total was **506,047** (3<sup>rd</sup> in PCL) for an average of **6,838** with **17 sellouts**...the season-high crowd was **11,268 (sellout)** vs. Reno on September 22.

**2022 LAS VEGAS BALLPARK ATTENDANCE:** In 75 dates, Las Vegas total was **518,221** (three-time PCL leader) for an average of **6,910** with **11 sellouts**...season-high crowd was **11,368 (sellout)** vs. Round Rock on July 3.

**2021 LAS VEGAS BALLPARK ATTENDANCE:** In 65 dates, Las Vegas total was **428,369** (led Triple-A West) for an average of **6,590** (50% capacity from May 6-11; May 20-25; **100% capacity from June 10 – September 27**) with six sellouts...season-high crowd was **10,190 (sellout)** vs. Sacramento on July 3.

## LAS VEGAS AVIATORS LEAD 2019 MINOR LEAGUE BASEBALL IN HOME ATTENDANCE:

The Aviators led Triple-A baseball (30 teams: 16 in PCL; 14 in International League) and all minor league baseball in total home attendance (**650,934**) and average (**9,299 in 70 dates**) which included 47 sellouts.

The Columbus Clippers, Triple-A affiliate of the Cleveland Indians, led the IL in total home attendance and average (**590,504 – 8,684 average in 68 dates**).

**Las Vegas Aviators/Athletics:** The Aviators and Athletics, on September 17, 2018, announced a new Player Development Contract through the 2020 season...the A's, on December 9, 2020, invited Las Vegas to be their Triple-A affiliate for the 2021 season...Major League Baseball, on February 12, 2021, announced that all 120 Minor League clubs offered an invitation to become Professional Development League ("PDL") license holders have officially agreed to accept...thus, the Aviators and Athletics have extended the affiliation for 10 seasons through the 2030 campaign...the Las Vegas Stars/51<sup>st</sup>/Aviators have captured the PCL Championship three times (**1986 & 1988 & 2025**) and appeared in the playoffs 12 times (23-33 record, .411)...Las Vegas was the 2002, 2013, 2014, 2019 Pacific Southern Division Champions and 2025 PCL First-Half Champions (10 teams).

Ginn** from March 24-30...defeated Reno on March 28 in the season opener at Las Vegas Ballpark...5.0 shutout innings, one hit, one walk, eight strikeouts on 69 pitches (44 strikes)...Right-hander **Luis Morales** from May 19-25...defeated Sugar Land in his Triple-A debut on May 24 at Constellation Field...pitched six-no-hit innings (19 total batters faced), one walk, seven strikeouts on 88 pitches (62 strikes)...Right-hander **Jack Perkins** from June 2-8...no decision at Tacoma on June 6 with 5.0 shutout innings, allowed two hits, walked two and struck out a season-high 10 on 94 pitches (57 strikes)...Right-hander **Jack Perkins** for the second consecutive week from June 9-15...defeated Salt Lake on June 12 and pitched 6.1 innings, allowed two hits, one run, walked two and struck out a season-high 12 batters on 90 pitches (60 strikes)...Right-hander **Kade Morris** from June 16-22...defeated Sugar Land in first game of double-header on June 19...pitched a complete-game, seven-inning shutout and allowed three hits, walked none and struck out six on 81 pitches (57 strikes)...named **Team Most Valuable Pitcher** (by the coaching staff) on September 19.

**2025 PCL PLAYERS OF THE WEEK:** Catcher **Daniel Susac** from April 14-20...in four games, batted .625 (10-for-16) with three doubles, two home runs and 6 RBI, including a season-best 4-for-4 performance with two doubles, 2 RBI and walk-off home run vs. Sugar Land on **Jackie Robinson Day** (April 15)...INF/OF **Seth Brown** from May 26 – June 1...in six-games, batted .536 (15-for-28) with two doubles, five home runs, 10 RBI, seven runs scored and 1.143 slugging percentage with six-straight multiple-hit games vs. Oklahoma City...OF **Carlos Cortes** from June 23-29...in six-games, batted .609 (14-for-23) with three doubles, four home runs, 13 RBI, seven runs scored and with four multiple-hit games vs. Albuquerque...he was also named June PCL Player of the Month on July 3...Second baseman **Zack Gelof** from August 11-17...in six games, batted .364 (8-for-22) with seven home runs, 11 RBI, 6 BB, 4 SB bases and 11 runs scored.

**2025 PCL PITCHER OF THE MONTH (APRIL):** Right-hander **Gunnar Hoglund** was named PCL Pitcher of the Month (April) on May 5...he appeared in five starts and posted a 1-2 record with a 2.10 ERA...allowed six earned runs on 20 hits and four walks over 25.2 innings pitched...struck out 27 and held opponents to a .222 average.

**2025 PCL PITCHER OF THE MONTH (JUNE):** Right-hander **Jack Perkins** was named PCL Pitcher of the Month (June) on July 3...he appeared in three starts and posted a 2-0 record with a 0.55 ERA...allowed one earned run on five hits over 16.1 innings pitched...struck out 29 batters and held opponents to a .094 average.

**42<sup>nd</sup> SEASON IN THE SILVER STATE (1983-2025)** – The Aviators completed their 42<sup>nd</sup> season (43<sup>rd</sup> calendar season) in the Silver State as a proud member of the Pacific Coast League...**the Las Vegas Aviators have the proud distinction of being Nevada's longest enduring professional sports franchise**...Las Vegas Triple-A baseball was born on April 10, 1983 before a sellout crowd of 10,622 at Cashman Field (Las Vegas defeated Salt Lake City, 11-8)...catcher **Bruce Bochy** has the distinction of hitting the first Triple-A home run in Cashman Field history for the Las Vegas Stars on April 10, 1983.

**PACIFIC COAST LEAGUE:** The PCL completed its 122<sup>nd</sup> season (1903-2020, 2022 -) and consists of two divisions for a total of 10 teams. **West Division:** Las Vegas Aviators, Reno Aces, Sacramento River Cats, Salt Lake Bees, Tacoma Rainiers; **East Division:** Albuquerque Isotopes, El Paso Chihuahuas, Oklahoma City Comets, Round Rock Express, Sugar Land Space Cowboys. The 10-team league in 2021 was named Triple-A West and returned as the PCL in 2022!

**INTERNATIONAL LEAGUE:** The IL consists of two divisions for a total of 20 teams. **East Division:** Buffalo Bisons, Charlotte Knights, Durham Bulls, Jacksonville Jumbo Shrimp, Lehigh Valley IronPigs, Norfolk Tides, Rochester Red Wings, Scranton/Wilkes-Barre RailRiders, Syracuse Mets, Worcester Red Sox. **West Division:** Columbus Clippers,

Gwinnett Stripers, Indianapolis Indians, Iowa Cubs, Louisville Bats, Memphis Redbirds, Nashville Sounds, Omaha Storm Chasers, St. Paul Saints, Toledo Mud Hens. The 20-team league in 2021 was named Triple-A East and returned as the IL in 2022.

**2024 SEASON** – The Aviators compiled an overall record of 74-75 (.497) and finished in fourth place in the PCL West Division. The Tacoma Rainiers captured the West Division with an overall record of 82-68 (.547). Sugar Land Space Cowboys recorded the best record in the 30-team Triple-A (93-56, .624) and defeated the Reno Aces, 2-games-to-0, to capture the PCL Championship. Sugar Land then defeated the Omaha Storm Chasers, Triple-A affiliate of the Kansas City Royals, 13-6, in the **Triple-A National Championship** game on September 28 before a crowd of 8,007 at Las Vegas Ballpark.

**2023 SEASON** – The Aviators compiled an overall record of 75-74 (.503) and finished in third place in the PCL West Division. The Reno Aces captured the West Division with an overall record of 88-62 (.587). Oklahoma City baseball club recorded the best record (90-58, .608) in the 10-team PCL and defeated the Round Rock Express, 2-games-to-0 to capture the PCL Championship. The Norfolk Tides defeated OKC, 7-6, in the **Triple-A National Championship** game on September 30 before a sellout crowd of 8,556 at Las Vegas Ballpark.

**2022 SEASON** – The Aviators compiled an overall record of 71-79 (.473) and finished in third place in the PCL West Division. The Reno Aces captured the West Division with an overall record of 85-63 (.574). The Aces captured the PCL championship and defeated the El Paso Chihuahuas, Triple-A affiliate of the San Diego Padres, 6-2, on September 30 in the inaugural **Triple-A Triple Championship Weekend** at Las Vegas Ballpark. The Durham Bulls, Triple-A affiliate off the Tampa Bay Rays, captured the Triple-A National Championship and defeated Reno, 10-6, on October 2 at Las Vegas Ballpark. The Bulls defeated the Nashville Sounds, Triple-A affiliate of the Milwaukee Brewers, 13-0, to capture the IL championship on October 1 at Las Vegas Ballpark.

**LAS VEGAS 80-WIN SEASONS** – The Las Vegas franchise has won 80 or more games in a season six times: **85** (2002, franchise best 85-59 record (.590); **83** (1983 inaugural season, 83-60 (.580); **83** (83-57, .593 in 2019); **81** (81-63, .563 in 2013); **81** (81-63, .563 in 2014); **80** (1986 PCL champions with an 80-62 mark (.563); **80 (83-67, .553 in 2025)**...Las Vegas recorded back-to-back 80-win seasons for the first time in franchise history (2013 & 2014)...the 83-57 record in 2019 marked a single-season franchise record for winning percentage at .593 (140-game season).

**Aviators on Radio in 2025: Russ Langer** will broadcast the 150 games on **Raider Nation Radio 920 AM** (selected games on **Fox Sports 1340 AM** and **98.9 FM**) on [www.aviatorslv.com](http://www.aviatorslv.com). Langer completed his 25<sup>th</sup> season broadcasting baseball to the Las Vegas Valley and 38th year overall in the business....over his career, Langer has received numerous awards, including being named 1993 Minor League Broadcaster of the Year by the National Association of Professional Baseball Leagues....in 1995 and 2016, he broadcast the Triple-A All-Star game; in 1999, he was named the New Mexico Sportscaster of the Year; and in 2002, he was named Minor League Broadcaster of the Year by Minor League News.com...Langer also is a 12-time recipient (13 overall and seven consecutive years from 2007-13) of the Nevada Sportscaster of the Year award (2003, 2005, 2007, 2008, 2009, 2010, 2011, 2012, 2013, 2015, 2021, 2023), which is presented by the National Sports Media Association (NSMA)...Langer's inaugural season in Las Vegas was in 2000, the final year the franchise was known as the Stars...prior to arriving in Las Vegas, Langer called Pacific Coast League games for the Albuquerque Dukes (1996-99) and Phoenix Firebirds (1992-95)...began his broadcasting career with Single-A Springfield Cardinals in 1987 and 1989, sandwiched around a year in Vero Beach (1988)...moved up the ranks to Double-A, calling games for the Midland Angels in 1990 and '91 before advancing to Triple-A Phoenix...he realized his longtime goal of broadcasting Major League baseball when he worked a total of 30 Montreal Expos games during the 2003 and 2004 seasons, followed by nine games for the Baltimore Orioles in 2006...has also broadcast selected spring training games for the Los Angeles Dodgers (2006-08), Toronto Blue Jays (2009-10) and Chicago White Sox (2012-20)...on April 6, 2023, marked his 3,000<sup>th</sup> broadcast for the Triple-A Las Vegas Stars/51<sup>s</sup>/Aviators franchise...served for 12 seasons (2012-23) as the radio play-by-play voice for the UNLV football team on the UNLV Sports Properties/ Learfield Network.

**Matt Neverett** also served as the play-by-play voice for home games and selected road games...completed his sixth season as game entertainment specialist with the Aviators, and his fifth in the broadcast booth...named **2024 Nevada Sportscaster of the Year** and marked the first time that he received this award...he returned to his birthplace of Las Vegas in 2020 after spending two years with the Bradenton Marauders, Single-A Affiliate of the Pittsburgh Pirates, as the play-by-play broadcaster and media relations director...after graduating from Appalachian State University in Boone, N.C. in 2017, he spent one season with the Birmingham Barons, Double-A Affiliate of the Chicago White Sox, as a media

relations manager and pre/post-game host...also broadcast selected UNLV Runnin' Rebel basketball games, UNLV baseball and UNLV football on SSSEN...on July 10, 2024, he was named the radio play-by-play broadcaster for UNLV football for the '24 season...also named the radio play-by-play broadcaster for UNLV Runnin' Rebels basketball and will begin his second season for the 2025-26 season on UNLV Sports Properties/ Learfield Network...his father, Tim, is a former play-by-play voice of the Las Vegas 51<sup>s</sup> and current play-by-play voice of the Los Angeles Dodgers.

### **Aviators Manager Fran Riordan - \*\*2019 & 2023 & 2025 PCL Manager of the Year\*\***

He was named the 25<sup>th</sup> manager (November 8, 2018) in the history of the Las Vegas franchise (1983-2019, 2021-24, 41 seasons). **Career Summary (current):** He has recorded 25 seasons overall in professional baseball and has been a member of the Athletics organization for 11 seasons (2015-25).

Riordan has compiled an overall managerial regular season record over 24 seasons of 1,392-1,338 (.510). He entered the '25 season ranked eighth among active leaders in minor league managerial wins.

**Triple-A Las Vegas:** He has a six-year record (**current**) of 451-413 (.522) and is Las Vegas' all-time leader in managerial wins: 2. **Jerry Royster**, 1996-98; 2005-06 (323-387, .455); 3. **Wally Backman**, 2013-16 (309-267, .536).

**2025:** Named Pacific Coast League Manager of the Year for the third time in six seasons. The Aviators compiled an overall record of 83-67 (.553) and won the first half (49-26 record, .653) in the 10-team PCL. The Aviators defeated Tacoma, 2-games-0, to capture the PCL Championship, the third in franchise history (1986, 1988, 2025).

**2024:** The Aviators compiled an overall record of 74-75 (.497) and finished in fourth place in the PCL West Division.

**2023:** Named Pacific Coast League Manager of the Year for the second time in four seasons. The Aviators compiled an overall record of 75-74 (.508) and finished in third place in the West Division.

**2022:** The Aviators compiled an overall record of 71-79 (.473) and finished in third place in the PCL West Division.

**2021:** Riordan guided the Aviators to an overall record of 65-61 (.516) and finished in third place in the Triple-A West (Western Division).

**2020:** With the Minor League Baseball season canceled due to the COVID-19 pandemic, Riordan worked with the Athletics' 60-man player pool at the team's alternate training site located in San Jose, California.

**2019:** Named Pacific Coast League Manager of the Year and led Triple-A Las Vegas to the second-best record in the 16-team PCL (83-57, .593) and a Pacific Southern Division Championship...Las Vegas returned to the playoffs for the first time since 2014 and lost to Sacramento, 3-games-to-2, in the conference championship series...the Aviators' record marked a single-season franchise record for winning percentage at .593 (140-game season).

**2018:** Made his Triple-A debut as manager with the Nashville Sounds of the Pacific Coast League and compiled an overall record of 72-68 (.514) and finished in second place in the American Southern Division behind the PCL and Triple-A National Champion, the Memphis Redbirds...Nashville compiled a PCL-best 15-game winning streak from July 29 – August 14.

**2017:** Compiled a record of 67-71 (.486) with Double-A Midland and his squad captured the Texas League Championship...the prior two seasons, he was the skipper of Single-A Beloit of the Midwest League (2015-16)...before joining the Oakland organization, Riordan spent four seasons as manager of the Florence Freedom of the Frontier League (2011-14)...led the team to two playoff berths and ranks second all-time in Frontier League wins with 625...was a 2014 Frontier League Hall of Fame inductee...prior to his time with Florence, he managed the Northern League's Lake County Fielders (2010) and Kalamazoo Kings for six seasons (2004-09), leading the Kings to the 2005 Frontier League title...was named the 2008 Frontier League Manager of the Year. He also served as player-manager in the Frontier League from 2000-02, leading the Richmond Roosters to back-to-back-league championships in 2001 and 2002.

**Professional Playing Career:** A first baseman/outfielder, he played seven seasons in the Frontier League with Richmond (1997-98, 2001-02), Dubois County (1999-2000) and North Shore (2003)...appeared in 501 career games and batted .281 (525-for-1,869) with 95 doubles, 11 triples, 55 home runs and 349 RBI...was a three-time All-Star (first base) from 2000-02 and hit a career-high .314 with Dubois County (2000) and Richmond (2002)...established career-highs in home runs (14) in 2001 and RBI (81) in 2002.

### **Aviators Coaching Staff:**

**Brian McArn** completed his 27th season overall in the Athletics organization...returns to Triple-A Las Vegas for his fifth season...served as hitting coach for his fourth season and was the assistant hitting coach in 2021.
