One and a Half Games for the Price of One – The Worcester Red Sox – who are 21-7 since August 7 - begin their final homestand of the 2024 season today and tonight when they “host” the Syracuse Mets for one and a half games at Polar Park. At 4:05 pm the clubs will resume and complete a suspended game from August 11 in Syracuse (the Mets lead 4-2 with the WooSox batting in the top of the 5th-inning). To set the scene, Worcester will be the visiting team in this game and they have runners on 1st and 2nd base with nobody out and Tyler McDonough the batter in the top of the 5th. The WooSox will have to make several lineup changes during the suspended game as 1B Triston Casas, LF Eddy Alvarez, RF Bobby Dalbec, and DH Nathan Hickey are no longer with the team and the starting pitcher from August 11, Jason Alexander, will give way to a reliever. Tylor Megill was the Syracuse starter on August 11, but he pitched for the Mets last night and lefty Joey Lucchesi is expected to take over in relief today. After the completion of that suspended game, the teams will play their regularly-scheduled game but that will become a 7-inning affair.

Broadcast News - Today’s first game is live on NESN+ while game two will be shown on tape delay on NESN+ later tonight at 11:00 pm. Both games will air on NASH 98.9 FM and The Pike 100.1 FM and the rest of the WooSox Radio Network.

This Series – After a pair of games conclude tonight, this series resumes tomorrow night at 6:05 pm. Please note that the games tomorrow, Thursday, and Friday all start at 6:05 pm as the WooSox revert to their April/May earlier start time now that we have reached September. The weekend start times of 4:05 pm on Saturday and 1:05 pm for the home finale on Sunday remain as normal.

Thank You Fans - It is Fan Appreciation Week/Weekend at Polar Park, presented by Bank of America. See more info on page 2 of these Game Notes for further details as the WooSox take this week and weekend to “thank” their loyal fans for another tremendous season as they get set to complete their fourth year together at Polar Park.

Weather Gods – Let’s hope we don’t jinx things, but if the weather forecasters are correct, we might have the best weather for any WooSox homestand *ever* this week/weekend since Polar Park opened in May of 2021. Every day looks sunny with temperatures in the high 70’s – 80’s during the day and then 60’s at night with an almost zero chance of rain from today through Sunday’s home finale. Thank you for perfect September weather in Massachusetts!

Dancing in September – Worcester is off to a 6-1 start in September as Sox batters are hitting .292 in September (70-for-240) while pitchers have posted a 3.92 ERA this month (27 ER in 62 IP). The WooSox have out-homered, 13-4 and out-scored their opponents, 57-29 thus far this month. Furthermore, Worcester has recorded victories by scores of 11-6, 13-10, 12-2, and 9-7 already this month.

A New High – Worcester is presently both a 2nd-half high of 10-games over .500 (now at 36-26) and an overall season-high of 5-games over .500 (now at 71-66). The WooSox have won 6 of 7 overall, 6 of 7 also on the road, 8 of 12 at home as well as 8 of 12 overall, and have come up winners in 21 of their last 28 games since August 7. The WooSox had not been 5-games above .500 since they ended last season with a 79-68 record.

As a bonus, don’t forget the 3rd Annual Worcester “Police vs. Fire Baseball Classic” at Polar Park, presented by Country Bank. Tickets are still available at PolarPark.com and proceeds this year will benefit the Worcester Firefighters Memorials Care Fund.

What’s Left – The 71-66 WooSox have 13 games remaining to try to post their fourth consecutive winning season in four tries. The 2021 WooSox went 74-54 during their abbreviated inaugural season, the 2022 WooSox went 75-73, and last season Worcester finished with a 79-68 record.

Thirteen to Gain Four – The WooSox have 13 games remaining and they are tied for 2nd-place in the 2nd-half among all 20 clubs in the International League. Worcester, Scranton/Wilkes-Barre, and Indianapolis are all 36-26 and thus 4-games behind Columbus who has the best 2nd half record in the entire league at 40-22. Worcester is tied with Scranton/Wilkes-Barre atop the IL East division (both 2½-games ahead of 3rd-place Rochester), but a division pennant does not mean a playoff spot as only one team (with the best 2nd half record) will earn a playoff spot opposite 1st half winner Omaha. The IL Playoffs will be a best two out of three series from September 24-26 in Omaha. The Triple-A National Championship Game (IL winner vs. PCL winner) will take place on September 28 in a little town called Vegas.

Remaining Schedules – Columbus hosts St. Paul for six games and plays at Toledo for six games. Worcester hosts Syracuse for seven games and plays at Lehigh Valley for six games. Scranton/Wilkes-Barre hosts Lehigh Valley for seven games and plays at Buffalo for six games. And Indianapolis hosts Rochester for six games and plays at St. Paul for six games.

Runs on Dunkin' – The WooSox – who lead the league with 796 runs scored on the season - have out-scored their opponents by a combined, 57-29 while winning 6 of their last 7 games (all in September) with their victories by scores of 11-6, 3-1, 7-0, 13-10, 12-2, and 9-7. During a 3-game winning streak from August 25-28, Worcester routed opponents by a total of 30-6 including wins by scores of 13-0, 12-2, and 5-4. While winning 9 of their last 13, the Sox are averaging 9.4 runs/game in those 9 victories (85 runs total).

Coming Up Winners – The WooSox have also won 16 of their last 21 games and they are 21-7 since August 7.

Five Guys – The WooSox have won 5 of 6 games during three of their last four series. They most recently finished off 5 victories in 6 tries in Rochester from September 2-8 including back-to-back wins this past weekend (12-2 on Saturday and 9-7 in 10-innings on Sunday). In their last home series from August 27 – September 1, Worcester split a 6-game set vs. Toledo, but prior to that they won 5 of 6 in Norfolk from August 20-25 and then turned the similar trick vs. Lehigh Valley at home from August 13-18. Worcester's previous series from August 6-11 will actually be completed tonight as they won 3 of 5 in Syracuse with the 6th and final game suspended on August 11 to be resumed today. Worcester is 10-8-7 in their first 25 series this season (10 wins, 8 losses, and 7 splits) and they have not lost a series since dropping 4 of 6 at Scranton/Wilkes-Barre from July 23-28 (seven series ago).

Road Work – Worcester has won 6 of their last 7 away games and they have won 10 of their last 12 on the road. They are also 14-4 on the road since July 28 to pull over .500 with their 35-34 away record. Worcester is 4-games over .500 at Polar Park with their 36-32 home record.

WooSox Batters Leading the Way – Worcester leads all 20 International League clubs in a host of team offensive categories. The WooSox lead the league with 796 runs scored (Scranton/Wilkes-Barre is next with 781 runs scored). The Sox also lead the IL with 718 walks (Buffalo is 2nd with 631 walks). Worcester is tied for 1st in the league with Buffalo for most hit batsmen at 91 (a new Red Sox Triple-A record). It all adds up to an impressive .371 on-base pct. as the WooSox are the only team in the IL with an OBP of over .360 (Scranton/WB is 2nd at .360).

Runs in the Family – Worcester has the 2nd best run differential in the league overall this season at +111 (796 runs scored and 685 runs allowed). Only Omaha (+126) is better. In the 2nd half alone, the WooSox are tied with Gwinnett for the best run differential in the IL at +77 runs (the Sox have 373 runs vs. 296 against).

Pitching In – Since August 13, WooSox pitchers lead the International League with a 3.38 ERA (80 ER in 244 IP) with 11 saves and a 1.21 WHIP (both best in all of Triple-A). Worcester is 18-6 during this span. Sox hurlers are also top three in a host of categories, including 3rd fewest hits allowed (176), 2nd fewest home runs allowed (16), 3rd most strikeouts (245), 2nd best opponents' batting average (.224), second best K/BB ratio (2.99), and 2nd fewest pitches per inning (15.93). The bullpen has also thrown 46% of the WooSox' last 244 innings (112.2 total) dating back to August 7 and has a 3.29 ERA with 10.9 K/9 (136 Ks in 112.2 innings). Worcester is 21-7 during that stretch.

Rankings – Worcester is 6th in the IL in team batting with a .260 average while Syracuse is 15th at .250. On the pitching side, the Sox are 8th in team ERA (4.85) while the Mets are 13th with a 4.94 ERA. Sox pitchers have allowed the 2nd fewest HR in the league (133 while Nashville has 132 HRA). And Worcester is 2nd in the IL with 1067 LOB behind only Gwinnett (1090 LOB).

Hit Me With Your Best Shot – When Eddy Alvarez was hit by a pitch in Game 1 of the August 10 doubleheader at Syracuse he became the 80th WooSox player hit by a pitch this season which is a new Boston Red Sox Triple-A record. The previous Red Sox Triple-A record for Most Hit by Pitch (by batters) had been 79 set by both the Pawtucket Red Sox in 2000 & tied by the Worcester Red Sox in 2022. Worcester now has 91 HB on the year.

This Season vs. Syracuse – The WooSox are 8-9 vs. Syracuse this season (going 7-7 in Syracuse and 1-2 at Polar Park thus far). The Sox dropped 4 of 6 in their first series at Syracuse this season back from April 8-14, won 2 of 3 during their next visit from July 1-3, and Worcester had a 3 games to 2 lead in their 6-game set in Syracuse from August 6-11 that will actually conclude with today's resumption of the suspended game from August 11.

Stats vs. the Mets – Worcester is 8-9 vs. Syracuse this season as pitchers have posted a 4.76 ERA (73 ER in 138 IP) with 24 HRA while Sox batters are hitting .241 (131-for-543) with 23 HR. The WooSox have out-scored the Mets, 92-80 in the first 17 games.

Last Season vs. Syracuse - The WooSox won the season-series over Syracuse last year by a 14-7 margin. The Sox went 10-5 at home vs. the Mets and were 4-2 here in Syracuse. Pawtucket/Worcester leads the all-time series over Syracuse by a 476-462 count.

Highs and Lows – The WooSox (now 71-66 overall) have reached a season-high 5-games over .500 for the first time since they ended last year with a 79-68 record. On August 6 (at 50-59) - for only the second time in club-history - they had dropped to 9-games under. On July 27, for the first time this year and the first time in franchise-history, Worcester had fallen to 9-games under .500 (at 46-55).

Streaks – Worcester's 7-game winning streak from August 16-23 was their season-high and tied the second longest winning streak in WooSox franchise history. The Sox had one other 7-game winning streak and that came during their inaugural 2021 season (from June 8-15, 2021). The WooSox club record for longest winning streak is 8-games from August 31 – September 8, 2021. The Sox suffered a season-high 6-game losing streak from May 22-28 which was Worcester's longest in over a year since a 6-game losing streak from April 9-14 of last season.

One of a Kind – Worcester had won six straight 1-run decisions between July 28 and August 28, but they have dropped their last two 1-run decisions and are now 10-16 in 1-run affairs this season. They began the year 4-14 in 1-run games.

Close Encounters - In games decided by one run or two runs this season, the WooSox are 21-32 (.396). When games are decided by 3 runs or more, the WooSox are 50-34 (.595).

Daydream Believers – Worcester has had more success this season in day games (32-23) than at night (39-43).

Series Matters – Worcester is 10-8-7 in their first 25 series this season (10 wins, 8 losses, and 7 splits). The WooSox are 4-3-5 in their 12 home series compared to 6-5-2 in their 13 road sets. Worcester finished 13-8-5 in their 26 series last season...13 winners, 8 losers, and 5 splits. The Sox went 8-3-2 in 13 series at Polar Park and 5-5-3 in 13 sets on the road.

Comebacks and Last AB – Worcester has 37 come-from-behind victories this season including 9 wins in their last at-bat of the game and 2 walk-offs. They have suffered 17 losses during the opponent's final at-bat.

Second Half Adjustments – The WooSox are 36-26 in the 2nd half of the season (the final 75 games from June 25 through September 22). Worcester went 35-40 during the 1st half good for 7th-place in the IL East and 11½-games in back of division champ Syracuse who went 46-28 and won the division. However, Omaha from the IL West had the best overall record in the first half and the Storm Chasers earned the one playoff spot as first half champs.

No Dogs in August – Despite the fact that August is over, the final WooSox record for August is not quite in the books yet. The Sox have a 17-10 record in August and thus set a new club-record for most wins in a single month. However, Worcester's official August record will not be finalized until today at Polar Park when the WooSox and Syracuse complete their suspended game from back on August 11 in Syracuse (the Mets led that game, 4-2 in the top of the 5th-inning with the Sox batting). Suspended games – no matter when they finish – count for the date they started.

Monthly Dividends – As mentioned above, with a 17-10 record in August, the WooSox have already set a new club-record for most wins in a single month. Worcester had won 16 games in a month four other times in their nearly four years of existence...they went 16-7 in September of 2021 (their best month ever), 16-10 in June of 2022, 16-9 in June of 2023, and 16-11 in August of 2023. This season the Sox have gone 2-1 in March, 10-14 in April, 14-14 in May, 12-13 in June, and 10-13 in July, along with their current 17-10 mark in August with one game still pending for the August record.

August Moon – The WooSox are batting .258 in August (221-for-858) with a 4.30 ERA (110 ER in 230 IP). Worcester has hit 27 HR and allowed 24 HR and they have out-scored the opposition, 148-119 while going 17-10 during the month.

Goodbye to July - The WooSox finished 10-13 in July after going 2-1 in March, 10-14 in April, 14-14 in May, and 12-13 in June. This July the WooSox batted .253 with 31 HR along with a 5.05 ERA while out-scoring the opposition, 129-122. Worcester's best offensive month was June (.284) and their best month on the mound was May (4.88).

June Over – The WooSox finished 12-13 in June. The team batted .284 in June with 30 HR – their best month of the year and the 3rd highest average in the league in June. Sox pitchers had a 4.99 ERA during the month with 26 HRA. Worcester out-scored their opponents, 160-137 in June.

May Be or Might Be - The WooSox rallied to win their final three games in May and finish the month even with a 14-14 record. Sox pitchers had a 4.88 ERA with 27 HRA in May while Sox batters hit .256 during the month with 42 HR.

April Recap - The WooSox finished 10-14 in April (after going 2-1 in March) while batting .244 with 22 HR. Sox pitchers were 10-14 with a 5.55 ERA with 25 HRA.

A Winning Tradition – The 2023 Worcester Red Sox went 79-68 to post a winning season for the third time in as many years of existence. Worcester finished with a 43-33 home record compared to 36-35 on the road last year. The 2021 WooSox went 74-54 during their abbreviated inaugural season while the 2022 WooSox finished 75-73.

You Need a Scorecard – The 2023 WooSox built on a pair of all-time Red Sox Triple-A records as they made **271 player transactions** during the 2023 campaign and set a new all-time Red Sox Triple-A record for players appearing in a single season. The WooSox used **79 different players** in 2023 (33 position players and 46 pitchers) to better the mark of 75 different players in 2022 (31 position players and 44 pitchers). Ironically, the 2021 WooSox set the previous mark of 72 different players (31 position players and 41 pitchers).

Two Dozen to Go - 25 different WooSox players were promoted to Boston during the 2023 season (not counting Red Sox rehabbing players) including Jarren Duran, Chris Murphy, Brandon Walter, David Hamilton, Wilyer Abreu, Ceddanne Rafaela, and many others.

PORTLAND SEA DOGS (AA) UPDATE – The 1st-place Portland Sea Dogs (40-23)/(76-56) begin their final series of the year when they host the Binghamton Rumble Ponies in the opener of a 6-game series starting tonight in Portland. The Sea Dogs have a 1½-game over Somerset in the Eastern League Northeast Division. Each team has six games remaining as Somerset hosts New Hampshire this week/weekend. Somerset had a game canceled so they will play one less game than the Sea Dogs. The 2nd half division champ will face Hartford in the first round of the playoffs beginning September 17.

WOOSOX PLAYER MOVES – The WooSox today added RHP **Chase Shugart** C/INF **Mickey Gasper** to their roster following their recent options from Boston. The Boston Red Sox today also sent RHP **Bryan Mata** to Worcester on another injury rehab assignment. And the WooSox added OF Corey Rosier from Double-A Portland.

Including today, the WooSox have made 65 player transactions in the last 30 days.

Chase Shugart appeared in three games for Boston this season, his Major League debut, recording a 6.00 ERA (4 ER/6.0 IP). Selected by the Red Sox in the 12th round of the 2018 First-Year Player Draft, the Texas native also owns a 4.55 ERA (33 ER/65.1 IP) in 32 games (five starts) for Worcester this season.

C/INF **Mickey Gasper** played in 10 games for Boston, his Major League debut, going 0-for-12 with 3 walks. He made three starts at second base. The switch-hitter has also played in 84 minor league games with Double-A Portland (44 games) and Worcester (40 games), batting .341 (95-for-279) with a 1.017 OPS. With the WooSox, Mickey was hitting .401 (55-for-137) with 12 2B, 8 HR, 32 RBI, and 36 runs scored prior to his promotion to Boston on August 12. Originally selected by the New York Yankees in the 27th round of the 2018 First-Year Player Draft, the New Hampshire native was selected by Boston in the minor league phase of the 2023 Rule 5 Draft.

RHP **Bryan Mata**, who most recently was placed on the Red Sox injured list on July 15 with right elbow inflammation, has appeared in 5 games (2 starts) for the WooSox during a rehab assignment from June 25 – July 14 going 0-0 with a 4.50 ERA (5 ER in 10 IP). He began this season on Boston's injured list (March 25) with a right hamstring strain and then suffered a lat injury while working his way back to action on May 24. Bryan was signed by the Red Sox in January of 2016 and was ranked by Baseball America as one of the top prospects in the Red Sox system in 2018, 2019 and 2020. After the 2020 minor league season was canceled, Mata missed all of 2021 and half of 2022 after undergoing Tommy John surgery. Last year, a right teres major strain limited him to 27 innings with the WooSox (0-3, 6.33). He has yet to pitch in the big leagues.

OF **Corey Rosier** will begin his third stint with the WooSox this season. He was on Worcester's Opening Day roster and played in 43 games before being transferred to Portland on July 12. He returned to the WooSox for one game on August 2 before being sent back to Portland where he has remained until today. In 44 games for the WooSox he is batting .170 with 2 HR, 14 RBI, and 9 stolen bases while in 34 games for Portland he hit .225 with 1 HR, 9 RBI, and 8 SB.

Worcester has used 77 players this season (33 position players and 44 pitchers). The all-time Pawtucket/Worcester franchise-record is 79 players employed by the WooSox last year.

Update on Red Sox Rehabber...

Veteran reliever **Liam Hendriks** worked another scoreless inning of relief during his WooSox rehab assignment last Thursday night in Rochester (on just 4 pitches – all strikes). In 4 relief appearances on rehab with the WooSox he has tossed 4 shutout innings allowing just 2 hits and 1 walk with 1 strikeout. He pitched an inning on August 30 at home vs. Toledo allowing one hit on 11 pitches (7 strikes) in the 8th-inning. Liam is coming back from Tommy John surgery just over one year ago (August 2, 2023). On August 28 vs. Toledo he worked a scoreless 8th-inning (allowing just a lead-off walk) with one strikeout while throwing 16 pitches (9 strikes). Hendriks had his first official rehab outing on August 18 at Polar Park vs. Lehigh Valley working a perfect 1-2-3 inning on 12 pitches (10 strikes). He made two relief appearances for Double-A Portland vs. Somerset. On August 22 he threw 12 pitches (7 strikes) - .1 IP, 1 H, 0 R, 0 ER, 1 BB, 0 SO and on Sunday, August 25 he threw 19 pitches (13 strikes) - .2 IP, 1 H, 1 R, 0 ER, 0 BB, 2 SO.

Hendriks, 35, signed a two year free agent deal with Boston this past February and this is his 14th season in Major League Baseball. The Perth, Australia native has pitched in 476 big league games (432 in relief) with the Twins (2011-13), Royals (2014), Blue Jays (2014-15), A's (2016-2020), and White Sox (2021-23). His career record is 33-34, 3.82 but he has 116 saves including 114 saves from June of 2019 through the 2022 season which led the major leagues. He also has recorded 727 strikeouts in his 650 career big league innings. Liam was named Mariano Rivera American League Reliever of the Year in both 2020 and 2021. He is a three-time American League All-Star (2019, '21-22). He has also been nominated for the Roberto Clemente Award five different times.

In December 2022, Hendriks was diagnosed with Stage 4 non-Hodgkin's lymphoma, a blood cancer that he believes he had been pitching with during the 2022 season when he posted a 2.81 ERA with 37 saves in 58 games for the White Sox. After undergoing eight rounds of chemotherapy – which began in January of 2023 – and four rounds of immunotherapy, Hendriks completed his treatment on April 3 and announced he was cancer free on April 20, 2023. He began a rehab assignment on May 5 with Charlotte and returned to the majors on May 29. He appeared in five games for the White Sox, earning two wins and one save, before being sidelined with a torn ulnar collateral ligament in his right elbow that forced him to miss the remainder of the 2023 season and led to Tommy John surgery on August 2, 2023. Liam is hoping to become the first Australian born player to appear for the Boston Red Sox.
