TAKING IT TO 'EM: The Storm Chasers have won three series outright this season after taking the six-game set with the St. Paul Saints 5-1 last week at home. Earlier this season, the Storm Chasers won their series against Louisville 3-2. Last week, Omaha averaged 7.5 runs per game which is the highest average in any single series this season. The first time Omaha and Louisville faced off this year, the Storm Chasers averaged 5.3 runs per game while holding the Bats to just 4.0 runs per game. Omaha (4.8 runs per game) is averaging one run per game more than Louisville (3.8 runs per game) overall this season. During the 2021 season, the two teams saw each other for just one six-game series with Omaha winning four out of six.

RIDING THE ROLLERCOASTER: Despite being 5-1 over their last six games, Omaha is just 6-6 over their last 12 games. Omaha won five of six against St. Paul at home last week but lost five of six at lowa the week prior. Omaha has won just one game on each day of the week on the road this season, looking to get their second win on a Tuesday on the road tonight.

HOLDING ON LATE: The Storm Chasers are 17-0 when they are leading after the seventh and eighth innings. Omaha's bullpen is fourth in the International League, holding a 3.51 ERA in 177.0 innings this season. Omaha has four come-from-behind wins and is 2-1 in extra inning games this year, all of which have been at home.

THE MIGHTY THOR: Scott Thorman is in his first season as the manager of the Omaha Storm Chasers, taking over for Brian Poldberg, who retired from managing following the 2021 season. Thorman, who played for Omaha in 2009 and 2010, is the 19th manager in franchise history and the sixth Omaha manager to have previously played for the franchise. He has won Minor League titles in each of the last three seasons, winning with Double-A Northwest Arkansas in 2021, High-A Wilmington in 2019, and Low-A Lexington in 2018. Thorman, 40, was drafted by the Atlanta Braves in the first round (30th overall) of the 2000 MLB Draft and later made his Major League debut with Atlana on June 18, 2006. A Kitchener, Ontario, Canada, native, Thorman began his coaching career in 2014 as the bench coach for the Burlington Royals under manager Tommy Shields, who serves as the Storm Chasers' bench coach in 2022.

FOR OMAHA: RHP Carlos Hernández heads to the mound to make his Triple-A Omaha season debut today. Hernández started the 2022 season with the big-league squad before being optioned to Omaha on May 20. With Kansas City this season, Hernández holds a 9.10 ERA and 0-3 record in 29.2 innings across seven starts. In his most recent start, Hernández faced off against the Chicago White Sox, throwing 3.0 innings while allowing three earned runs on five hits with five walks and three strikeouts. The Venezuela native split the 2021 season between MLB Kansas City and Triple-A Omaha, spending just six starts with the minor league club, while making 11 starts in 24 appearances with Kansas City. Hernández signed an international free agent deal in July of 2016, spending his first professional season with the rookie-level Burlington Royals. He worked his way up the Royals farm system and made his MLB debut on Sept. 1, 2020, throwing 3.2 scoreless innings against Cleveland out of the bullpen. On Sept. 12, Hernández made his first start for the Royals, going 3.0 innings against Pittsburg with two strikeouts and no walks.

FOR ST. PAUL: RHP Ben Lively toes the rubber for his ninth start of the 2022 season for Louisville, still looking for his first win of the season, holding a 5.30 ERA and 0-3 record across 35.2 innings. In his last start, Lively went 4.1 innings and allowed three earned runs on six hits and three walks with six strikeouts. On April 28, Lively tossed 6.0 innings with a season-best eight strikeouts. In his previous start against Omaha, the Florida native threw 4.0 innings of two-run ball, allowing the Storm Chasers to record three hits and three walks with three strikeouts. The 30-year-old was drafted in the fourth round of the 2013 MLB draft by the Cincinnati Reds before being traded to the Philadelphia Phillies on New Year's Eve 2014. He spent the 2015 season with Double-A Reading Fightin Phills. Lively started the 2016 season at Double-A before being promoted to Triple-A Lehigh Valley IronPigs and was added to the Phillies 40-man roster after the 2016 season. He made his big-league debut on June 3, 2017, against the San Francisco Giants. In 2018, Lively was claimed off waivers by the Kansas City Royals before being traded to Arizona in 2019. On Aug. 7, 2019, he left Arizona's organization to play with the Samsung Lions of the KBO League. Lively signed a minor league contract with the Cincinnati Reds in January of this year.

HERNÁNDEZ NOTES

- Started 2022 in Kansas City, making seven starts before being optioned to Triple-A Omaha on May 23, 2022. To start the 2022 season, Hernández holds record of 0-2 with a 9.10 ERA
- Called back up to Kansas City in mid-June, still in the bullpen before making the transition to starter on July 18, 2021. After that day, Hernández made all but one appearance as the first man up for the Royals, earning a 3.68 ERA and 6-2 record in 24 big-league appearances in 2021.
- Spent a little over a month of 2021 in Omaha, earning a 4.44 ERA and a 2-1 record in six starts for the Storm Chasers.
- Made his Triple-A debut on May 5, 2021, at Werner Park against St. Paul, throwing 4.0 innings.
- Started the 2021 season in Kansas City in the bullpen before coming to Omaha as a starting pitcher.
- Made five total appearances in 2020 with the Royals, getting three starts. His win-loss record was 0-1 and he held a 4.91 ERA during his first season with the big-league club.
- Hernández was called up to The Show on Sept. 1, 2020, and made his Major League debut that same day, throwing 3.2 scoreless relief innings against Cleveland.
- Did not play in the minors in 2020 due to cancelation of minor league season during the COVID-19 pandemic.
- Spend the final seven appearances of the season with Lexington with a 3-3 record and 3.50 ERA
- Moved up to AZL Royals where he went 0-2 with a 7.36 ERA in five appearances.
- Started the season with Burlington, making three appearances with a 9.28 ERA.
- Saw times with three different clubs within the Kansas City Royals organization during the 2019 season after suffering a stress fracture in his rib cage at spring training, delaying his season debut to mid-June. Hernández had a combined record of 3-5 with a 5.31 ERA in 15 starts.
- Earned 6-5 record with 3.29 ERA with the Low-A Lexington Legends during 2018 season.
- Spent 2017 with the Burlington Royals with a 1-4 record and 5.49 ERA in first professional season.
- Signed with the Kansas City Royals on July 29, 2016, as an international free agent.
