# Lake Elsinore Storm (0-1, 29-38)

**TODAY'S GAME:** Welcome to LoanMart Field! The Quakes continue a six-game series as they host the Lake Elsinore Storm (Padres) in game five of a six-game series. Fans will enjoy post-game Fireworks tonight, thanks to LaRocque Better Roofs. The SoCal Helpful Honda Street Team will also be on hand! Tickets are available at rcquakes.com.

**VS THE STORM:** Today's game is the eighth of 24 head-to-head games, with 15 of those taking place here at LoanMart Field. The Quakes are 7-0 against the Storm this year after four straight wins to open this series. Last season, the Quakes went just 10-20 against the Storm, 7-8 here at home.

**LAST GAME:** The Quakes opened the second half with a win and upped their winning streak to a season-high nine straight games, as they held on for a 10-7 victory over the Lake Elsinore Storm at LoanMart Field on Friday night. Angel Diaz had a career-night, with two homers (2, 3), five RBIs and three runs scored. Eduardo Quintero also homered, his league-leading 12th of the year, finishing with two hits and two RBIs. Quakes' starter Aidan Foeller (3-2) allowed six runs over five innings, but earned the win. Shawn Oduber fired 1.2 innings of scoreless relief and Connor Godwin worked a 1-2-3 ninth for his first career save. Lake Elsinore reliever Ruben Salinas (0-3) got shelled for six runs in two innings, taking the loss. The Storm have now equaled their longest losing streak of the year, at seven straight defeats. "ALL WE DO IS WIN": The Quakes are on their best run of the season right now, having won nine straight games overall and four straight here at home. Last night's win makes them 21-10 at LoanMart Field. Their longest winning streak of 2024 was eight straight games. Their longest winning streak since moving from High-A to Low-A is 10 straight (2023). Their longest winning streak in franchise history was back in their third and most recent championship season of 2018, when they won 15 straight in the second half.

**THE END AND THE BEGINNING:** This six-game set against the Storm is unusual, as it marked the end of the 66game first half (Thursday's game) and the beginning of the 66-game second half (Friday's game). The Quakes finished the half with their best first-half mark (41-25) since the entire Cal League moved to the Low-A level in 2021. FIRST HALF SOUTH DIVISION CHAMPS: After stumbling a bit over a two-week stretch with an eight-game losing streak while both Visalia and Lake Elsinore were in the middle of seven-game win streaks, respectively, the Quakes put all doubt behind them by wrapping up the First Half South Division with last Friday's win over the 66ers in San Bernardino. The Quakes will now return to the playoffs for the first time since 2023, when they made it to the Championship Series, where they were swept by Modesto. The Quakes will have qualified for the playoffs in nine of the

14 seasons (2011, 2013, 2015, 2016, 2017, 2018, 2019, 2023 and 2025) of affiliation with the Los Angeles Dodgers. Ran

cho has won three Championships in franchise history (1994, 2015 and 2018) with the last two coming as a Dodgers' affiliate. This will mark the second time in five seasons they'll make it to the playoffs under Manager John Shoemaker. JHOLBRAN HERDER: The 20-year-old right-hander makes his 12th appearance and first start of the year, and his first start and second appearance against the Storm. In one game against the Storm, he allowed four runs (three earned) on five hits over just 2.2 innings in a win in his Quakes' debut on April 4th. Herder allowed two runs on two hits over 1.1 innings in his last game, a no-decision at Inland on June 15th. Herder signed in 2022 out of Venezuela. ABRAHAM PARRA: 19-year-old right-hander Abraham Parra makes his ninth appearance and fifth start of the year for the Storm and his first against the Quakes. In his last outing overall, he allowed two unearned runs on just three hits over six innings in a no-decision against Visalia on June 14th. Parra signed with San Diego in April of 2023 out of Venezuela.
