NEWS AND NOTES		
HARD WAY: Brewers no. 8-rated prospect Tyson Hardin will make his second start of the series on Sunday evening. He allowed eight hits on Tuesday for a second straight start but limited Indianapolis to just two runs (4.1 IP, 5 K, 0 BB). LET ME CLEAR MY SPROAT: Right-hander Brandon Sproat made his second start with Nashville and his First Horizon Park debut on Saturday night. He turned in a strong start for the Sounds, allowing just one hit across five scoreless innings. He racked up eight strikeouts, which were his second-most in any start this season in 23 total appearances (21 GS) between Milwaukee and Nashville. He set his season-high with 10 strikeouts on June 23 against the Cincinnati Reds. That start was also the only time he had allowed one or fewer hits, and no runs across a 5+ IP start this year. Saturday night's start against Indianapolis marked his 16th career start of 5+ scoreless innings and his ninth in Triple-A. He also has two in the big leagues, four in Double-A, and one in High-A. Saturday night was his fourth while doing so with one or fewer hits allowed. TRI-MUR: Ethan Murray recorded his second triple of the season and his second career three-bagger with Nashville (109 G). It was the 10th triple of his minor league career. He has now recorded multiple triples in the same season for just a third time, also recording two in 2021 with Low-A Carolina and most recently a single-season career-high with three in 2023 for Double-A Biloxi. The Sounds lead the International League with 33 triples this season and are tied fourth in all Triple-A along with El Paso. Nashville's last triple prior to Murray's in the bottom of the fourth inning Saturday night	came on August 1 vs. Charlotte by Freddy Zamora, ending a season-long 11-game drought between triples. 20 of the 33 three-baggers on the year have come at First Horizon Park, just the third time since 2005 the Sounds have recorded 20+ triples at home in a season. The team set a single-season high at home with 23 during the 2018 season. EXTRA-EXTRA: Nashville fell to 2-8 in extra-innings this season with the loss on Saturday. It was the second time going to extras against Indianapolis and the fifth extra-innings game in their last 23 games since the start of the Sugar Land series on July 21. It's just the second time playing multiple extra-innings games in the same series this year after playing three against the Space Cowboys in the six-game series. Nashville was also held to five or fewer hits in a game for the 30th time this season and dropped just their fifth game when leading after six innings (46-5) and the fourth when ahead after the seventh inning (52-4). BO DOUBTERS: Bo Naylor tallied 848 ft worth of home runs with his multi-HR performance on Friday night. The pair of homers marked his first with the Sounds in seven games played since a trade from Cleveland on August 1. It was his eighth career multi-HR game, fifth in Triple-A, and second of the season. His 428 ft 2-run blast in the first inning tied Eduardo Garcia (July 29 vs. CLT) for the third-longest HR hit by a Nashville player this season. His first 2-HR game of the year happened in game one of a doubleheader against Scranton/Wilkes-Barre on June 19 with Columbus. He also has a pair of multi-HR games in the big leagues with Cleveland on July 25, 2023 (vs. KC) and on September 20,	2025 (@MIN). Naylor is the fifth different Nashville player to record a multi-HR game this season and is up to 107 career home runs. PITCH AND CROW: Brewers no. 22-rated prospect Coleman Crow made his 13th start (14th appearance) for the Sounds this season on Friday night and earned his team-leading 7th win of the season. The right-hander posted his second straight quality start, fourth in his last five games, and fifth overall in Triple-A this season while working a season-high 6.2 IP and 94 pitches (2 H, 6 K, BB). His 21 career quality starts are tied for the fourth-most by any minor leaguer since the start of the 2021 season with fewer than 65 starts. Since returning to Nashville on July 4, Crow is 3-0 and ranks second in ERA (1.96), leads in BAA (.177) and WHIP (0.95), ranks T-7th in IP (36.2) and T-7th in strikeouts (34). Friday night was his eighth career start of 6+ IP without an earned run allowed and his second straight scores start (12.2 IP, 7 H, 11 K, 3 BB). He has earned a quality start all 21 times he has gone 6+ IP in his career. SAL PAL: Sal Frelick belted his first home run of his rehab assignment on Friday night, going 1-for-3 (3 RBI, BB, 2 R). The homer was his fifth of the season (4 w/MIL); first since game one of a doubleheader on July 11 at Pittsburgh; and his seventh career homer in Triple-A. The 3-run blast helped surpass 100 career minor league RBI since being selected by 15th overall by the Brewers in 2021 (102 RBI / 203 G). Frelick has reached base in all six games of his rehab assignment after drawing a walk on Saturday night. He owns a .307 AVG (112-for-365) with 29 XBH, 46 RBI, 43 BB, 68 R in 92
