Fort Wayne TinCaps (16-20) at Dayton Dragons (21-16)

RH Matt Waldron (2-1, 2.95) vs. RH Noah Davis (0-4, 3.93)

Today's Game: The Dayton Dragons (affiliate of the Cincinnati Reds) meet the Fort Wayne TinCaps (affiliate of the San Diego Padres) in the second game of a six-game series. The Dragons are 5-2 on the current 12-game homestand.

2021 Season Series: Dayton 1, Fort Wayne 0.

Last Game: Tuesday: Dayton 5, Fort Wayne 4. The Dragons scored four runs with one out in the bottom of the ninth inning to erase a 4-1 deficit to win. Reniel Ozuna's double over the head of the right fielder drove in the tying and winning runs. Juan Martinez had two hits in the game including a solo home run to lead a 10-hit attack (five of the hits came in the ninth inning). Francisco Urbaz, Michael Siani, and Miguel Hernandez each had two hits.

Comeback Kids: June 8 and 9, the Dragons won two games in two nights despite trailing by five or more runs in each game. Over the previous five years, they have averaged one win when trailing by 5+ runs per every 116 games played. They had six such comebacks in the last five years (697 games), averaging 1.2 comebacks per season in games when trailing by five or more runs. The June 8 win after trailing 7-0 matched the largest comeback for the Dragons over at least the last 15 seasons. The Dragons also erased seven-run deficits to win in 2013 and 2016. Records on comebacks date back to 2006. The Dragons have battled back to win five times after trailing by at least four runs since May 18. Over the last five years, they averaged 2.2 wins per season when trailing by at least four runs. The Dragons have won eight games in 2021 after trailing by at least three runs, compared to the five-year average of 5.6 per season.

Spiers Earns League Honor: Dragons pitcher Carson Spiers has been named the High-A Central League Pitcher of the Week for the week of June 7-June 13. He made two relief appearances during the week, tossing seven and one-third shutout innings while allowing just one hit and while walk. He struck out 10 of the 24 batters he faced as hitters went 1 for 22 against him. Five of the 12 players in the league who have earned a weekly honor this season have been Dayton players.

Starting Rotation Change: Carson Spiers has been added to the Dragons five-man starting rotation while Spencer Stockton will move from the rotation to the bullpen. Spiers will start the game on Friday night. Spiers was a starter with Daytona before joining the Dragons in late May.

Jacob Hurtubise in the High-A Central League Rankings:

Second in On-Base Percentage at .438; Tied for Third in Stolen Bases with 22 (tied for fifth in all of Minor League Baseball (120 teams), five behind the national leader); Tied for Fourth in Runs Scored with 31; Tied for Fourth in Walks with 24; 13th in batting average at .283.

Other Player Notes

- Quincy McAfee is fifth in all of Minor League Baseball (120 teams) in RBI in the month of June with 18 in 13 games. He is tied for second in MiLB in doubles since May 29 with eight in 15 games.
- Francisco Urbaz over his last 19 games is 22 for 67 (.328) with two home runs, raising his average from .200 to .305.
- Miguel Hernandez has a nine-game hitting streak, batting .361 during the streak, raising his average from .232 to .271.
- James Free is batting .304 over his last seven games.
- Reliever Braxton Roxby has not allowed a run in 14.2 innings, surrendering just four hits and eight walks. He has struck out 25. Opponents have combined to hit just .083 (4 for 48) against Roxby on the year.
- Reliever Francis Peguero has allowed only one run in 11 innings (0.82 ERA), allowing just seven hits and two walks.
- Graham Ashcraft over his last three starts has allowed just one unearned run in 18 innings, lowering his ERA from 5.74 to 2.67.

Team Notes

- Dayton is in first place, one and one-half games ahead of West Michigan in the Central League East Division.
- The Dragons have won nine of their last 13 home games. Their home record is 12-7. They have come from behind in eight of the 12 wins.
- Dayton has held at least a share of first place after 27 of the 37 games they have played this season. The have not been lower than second place in the standings and have not been more than one and one-half games out of first at any time this season.
- **HITTING:** The Dragons have scored 110 runs in their last 19 games, averaging 5.8 runs per game. This comes on the heels of averaging 2.8 runs per game over the previous 12 games.
- The Dragons are second in the league and tied for ninth in all of Minor League Baseball (120 teams) in stolen bases with 63.
- **PITCHING:** Dragons relievers have posted an ERA of 2.67 on the current homestand (7 games, 33.2 IP, 10 ER)...Dragons pitchers have reduced their walks over the last week, allowing 18 over six games, just one more than the league leader in fewest walks during the week.
- **FIELDING:** The Dragons have committed only 30 errors in 37 games, ranking first in the league in team fielding.
- The Dragons roster is headlined by outfielder Michael Siani. Siani is listed by Baseball America as the "Best Athlete" and "Best Defensive Outfielder" in the Reds organization. He is ranked as the Reds 10th best prospect overall. Other Dragons players ranked by Baseball America are RHP Lyon Richardson (#13), RHP Noah Davis (#15), RHP Graham Ashcraft (#28), and OF Jacob Hurtubise (#41).

Notes: Noah Davis is ranked as the #15 prospect in the Reds organization by Baseball America. The Reds drafted Davis in the 11th round in 2018, knowing that he would miss all of that season and part of 2019 after undergoing Tommy John elbow surgery. Davis made 30 starts at UCSB, serving as a full-time starting pitcher as a freshman and sophomore before being limited to eight innings as a junior due to the injury. He posted a career record of 15-9 with a 4.58 ERA. Davis was on the mound for some big games in college and high school. As a freshman at UC Santa Barbara in 2016, he was the team's #2 starting pitcher behind ace Shane Bieber, the 2020 American League Cy Young Award winner. Davis helped UCSB to its first-ever trip to the College World Series as the team finished the year as the #7 team in the nation. Davis was the starting pitcher for their second game of the 2016 College World Series as his team beat powerful Miami. Davis allowed just one run on two hits over six innings in that game. Davis returned to UCSB in 2017 and was his team's top starter, going 7-4 with a 4.63 ERA. At Huntington Beach High School, Davis was a California All-State selection and pitched his team to a state championship. After being drafted by the Reds in 2018, Davis battled back from reconstructive elbow surgery to return to the mound by June of 2019. He made five short rehab starts with the AZL Reds and then joined the Billings roster on July 28. He was limited to a maximum of 75 pitches at Billings but made eight starts, posting a fine ERA of 2.10. Davis was a college teammate at UC Santa Barbara of Dragons catcher Eric Yang, who caught Davis at Billings in 2019 after Davis returned to the mound following his rehab assignment.

Davis in 2021: Has allowed four hits or less in six of his seven starts...Has suffered multiple hard-luck losses with an 0-4 record despite allowing two runs or less in four of his seven starts...Left-handed batters are hitting just .151 against him (8 for 53, 20 strikeouts)...Right-handed batters are hitting .235...Has been dominant on at-bats ending when Davis is ahead in the count, as opposing batters have gone 4 for 39 (.103) in those situations...Opponents are hitting .294 against him with men in scoring position compared to just .157 with the bases empty...Has hit nine batters to tie for team lead.

Last Start: Removed after four innings and 82 pitches with a 4-1 lead...Hit three batters including one in three of the four innings...Dragons went on to win 6-3.

Against this Opponent: First start of 2021.

Dragons Manager/Coaches:

Jose Moreno is in his first season as Dragons manager and his second year in the Reds organization. The 2021 season is Moreno's 22nd year as a coach, instructor, or coordinator in professional baseball. As a manager, he has won three league championships with affiliated clubs, guiding his teams to titles in 2002, 2007, and 2010. Moreno also led his teams to back-to-back championships in the Venezuelan Winter League in 2019-20 and 2020-21. Moreno was a catcher in Cleveland Indians and Baltimore Orioles farm systems.

Wapakoneta, Ohio native **Brian Garman** joins the Dragons in 2021 as pitching coach. Garman was slated to serve as the Dayton pitching coach in 2020 before the season was canceled. He served as a pitching coach in the Los Angeles Angels system for the previous two seasons, working at Rookie-level Orem (Pioneer League) in 2019 and Advanced-A Inland Empire (California League) in 2018. Garman pitched at Wapakoneta High School and the University of Cincinnati before being drafted by the Milwaukee Brewers in the 17th round in 2010. He spent four years as a pitcher in the Brewers system, reaching the Double-A level.

Hitting coach **Daryle Ward** returns to the Dragons in 2021 after serving in the same position in Dayton in 2017-18. He is in his sixth year in coaching in the Cincinnati Reds organization. He served as the hitting coach with the Goodyear Reds in the Arizona League in 2016 and with the Chattanooga Lookouts in 2019. He was slated to return to Chattanooga in 2020 before the season was canceled. Ward played professionally for 22 seasons from 1994-2015. He spent seven full seasons and parts of four others in the Major Leagues, primarily as a left fielder and first baseman. His father, Gary Ward, was a Major League All-Star selection with both the Twins and Rangers as part of a 12-year Major League playing career.

Darren Bragg returns to the Dragons in his 15th year as a coach or instructor in the Reds organization. He will serve in a newly named position within the Reds organization, carrying the title of development coach. Bragg was the Dragons hitting coach for two seasons in 2007-08, helping the club to the playoffs in both years as he worked with future Reds Todd Frazier, Zack Cozart, Chris Heisey, Drew Stubbs, Juan Francisco, and others in Dayton. Bragg served as the Reds minor league outfield coordinator from 2009-18 before returning to a coaching assignment with an individual team. He was the bench coach at Double-A Chattanooga in 2019 and was slated to fill the same role with Daytona in 2020 before the minor league season was canceled. Bragg spent 11 years as a player in Major League Baseball from 1994-2004, appearing in 916 big league games with nine teams
