Tonight's Game

The Clippers will send RHP Brad Peacock to the mound tonight, making his second start since signing on 6/25. Indianapolis will counter with RHP Mitch Keller. The Clippers are 20-23 (.465) against right handers this year. Keller has pitched against the Clippers five times in his career, going 1-1 with a 5.18ERA (24.1IP, 23H, 16R, 14ER, 14BB, 31K).

vs. the Indians

Columbus was 15-9 against Indy in 2019, despite scoring just 10 more runs on the season, 132-122 (more wins, fewer runs than Indy in each of three seasons from 2016-18). This year, the Clippers are again getting beat up in the run column (26-17) and the record shows it (2-4). The homer battle is tied at 6-6, but Ryan Lavarnway is the only Clipper in the lineup tonight that has homered vs. Indy this year.

Cooling Off

The Clippers sailed into Toledo as the hottest team in the IL (14-6), but lost five of six to the Mud Hens (now 11-9 in last 20, tied for 3rd with Indianapolis), while hitting just 3HR (fewest in a series this year) and striking out 68 times (most in a series this year). Columbus blew 1-run leads in three of the losses (13 losses after leading this season) after having won 10 of 11 with a lead from 6/12-6/27.

Pummeled Pitching

Huntington Park has zoomed back near the top of the IL in homers per game (2nd, 3.13). Unfortunatley, 32 of the last 53 have been surrendered by Columbus (152HR allowed in last 77G in the regular season at HP). Clipper pitchers kept St. Paul in the yard in two straight games 6/24-6/25 (five 0HR games this year), marking the first consecutive homerless games for HP visitors since 7/11-7/12/19.

Getting the Call

Alex Call was promoted from Akron Tuesday and has gone 5x23 with 2HR in 6G (1x14 in last 4G). At the time of his call up, Call populated the top ten of the EL in batting (9th, .310), OBP (10th, .389), doubles (7th, 13), runs (6th, 34) and steals (2nd, 12). He has batted leadoff in 5G for Columbus, scoring three times (twice off his own HR; Clipper leadoff hitters have scored an IL-low 26 runs).

Chang-ing It Up

Yu Chang has reutrned to the Clipper lineup tonight after three months in the Majors (.176 with 2HR and 14RBI in 49G). Chang has 22HR in his career at Triple-A (195G), including 17HR at Huntington Park (108G). He spent most of 2019 with Columbus, struggling with a left finger sprain (on DL 4/18-4/25, 4/30-6/17). He hit .314 with 6HR and 25RBI over 137AB in his first 35G off the DL (6/18-8/3/19).

Take Two

The double from Nolan Jones Saturday night was his IL-best 19th of the year (Oscar Mercado is 5th, 13). Jones is slugging .591 over his last 26G, collecting 14 doubles, a triple, 3HR (6XBH through first 26G) and only 22K (had 43K in first 26G). Thanks to his current tear, he is on pace for 46 doubles, a number that would set the franchise record (42 by Kurt Bierek in 1999; Bierek played in 135G).

Right Behind

Gabriel Arias has a hit in 12 of his last 13G, putting up a .347 mark (17x49) while scoring 15 runs (leads IL in runs since 6/19). Arias batted behind Nolan Jones on opening day and the pair are the only ones from the opening day lineup that has not played in the Majors this year (opening outfield is currently in Majors, Bradley Zimmer and Oscar Mercado in Cleveland, Ben Gamel in Pittsburgh).

A New Oscar

Due to the aforementioned outfield exodus, the Clippers have added a second outfielder from Akron in the last week, as Oscar Gonzalez enters the lineup tonight. Gonzalez was the only player in the Eastern League to rank among the top three in the Triple Crown, placing 3rd in each (.330, 13HR, 41RBI), and had a hit in 21 of his last 23 with Akron (.383, 36x94, 6HR, 24RBI).

Bullpen Bashers

The Clipper bullpen got tagged for 2ER Sunday night (had given up at least 4ER to the Mud Hens in four straight, from 6/20-7/2), and now has a 5.65ERA (78.0IP, 49ER) against Toledo (4.26ERA, 162.2IP, 77ER against all others). Toledo has scored a total of 30 runs from the 7th inning on against Columbus in only 18G, while all others in the IL have scored 38 runs from the 7th inning on in 35G.

This Date in Clipper History 7/6/1979

Rick Anderson notched his 10th save in a 6-5 victory over the Toledo Mud Hens, giving the Clippers their 11th straight win on what would become a franchise record, 16 game winning streak. Anderson went on to go 13-3 with 21 saves and a 1.63ERA for Columbus, winning the club's first ever IL Most Valuable Pitcher Award (Columbus has six Most Valuable Pitchers since 1977, leading the IL in that time).

Huntington (Small) Park

In each of the first 11 years since the move downtown, Huntington Park has ranked among the top two in the IL in homers per game, totaling 2.25 per contest (1,763HR, 783 games). In 2019, HP averaged over three per game for the first time ever (seventh time averaging over a pair), as the Clippers surrendered a record 127HR and just missed out on triple digits themselves (97HR was second highest team total). Including the postseason, the Clippers have been out-homered over the life of the park (967 to 925).

Deadball Era

The franchise record for homers was destroyed in 2019 (213, +31 from 1983), as was the record for homers allowed (198, +42 from 1998). This season's Clippers are homering at a rate of 1.17 per game, putting them 18 off the pace of the pre-2019 record (adjusted for 140G). However, on the mound they are allowing 1.38 per game, enough to beat the pre-2019 record by 22, even with the shortened season.

Ain't Over 'Til It's Over

From 2014-19, no team had more come from behind victories than the 210 posted by Columbus and no team produced a better winning percentage when trailing than the .353 of the Clippers (Scranton/WB was 2nd in win percentage, .338, and wins, 192). This year has seen the Clippers go 10-29 (.256) in games in which they trail, ranking 10th

Not Close

The Clippers are tied for the 2nd most losses by at least a grand slam in the IL (16, Memphis leads with 20) and rank 13th in wins by at least that many (8, one ahead of Memphis). That poor ratio has led to a -36 run differential, a figure that places them 13th in the IL (Memphis is securely in the basement at -85).

Get What You Pay For

Columbus was the last team in the IL to play free baseball this season, playing 85 straight games, including the postseason, between extra-inning rumbles on 7/31/19 vs. Louisville (11-8 loss in 11) and 6/26/21 vs. St. Paul (6-4 loss in 10; two straight extra-inning losses following nine straight wins, 8/21/18-7/3/19). The regulation-inning streak was the longest for Columbus dating to the 1984 season (as far back as the day by day records go) and 45 straight to start the season was also a record.

Trending Downward

The current staff ERA of 5.12 is on pace to be the worst in franchise history (5.08, 1983) and anything over 4.71 will mark the fifth straight season in which the ERA has gotten worse. From 2011-16, the Clipper staff turned in a sub-4.00ERA five times in six seasons (zero such seasons from 1993-2010), including the best two ERAs of the past 32 years (3.33 in 2015 and 3.65 in 2016). The 5.76ERA at Huntington Park is by far the worst ever (5.29 in 2019, only time ERA has ever been over 5.00 at HP).

Free Swingers

After three straight seasons leading the IL in strikeouts, the Clipper lineup is threatening for a fourth, as they currently rank 5th (520K, 30 off the pace, St. Paul). The 2019 squad obliterated the franchise record, as they struck out 95 more times than the previous high (1,392; each of last three seasons rank among franchise's three worst, totalling 3,979K in 422G). While the record appears safe due to the truncated schedule, this year's version is averaging 9.81K per game.

Night and Day

When playing errorless baseball, the Clippers have a winning percentage that is over 200 points higher (.560, 14-11) than when they make a mistake in the field (.357, 10-18). After an exceptional defensive run from 2015-2019, in which the fielding percentage was never below .983 and the team never committed more than 88E, the 2021 team is on pace to botch 100 plays with a fielding percentage of .979 (have not had triple digits in errors since six straight seasons from 2009-14).

One On, No Out Success

When the leadoff batter of an inning reached base in 2019, the Clippers plated him nearly 60% of the time (over 51% only once in the last six seasons, 55% in 2016). Getting more than one base was a specialty of Clipper hitters, as they led the IL with 136XBH to lead off the inning, including 54HR (led the IL, had 28 leadoff homers in 2018). So far in 2021, the Clippers are scoring the leadoff batter 52% of the time he reaches, with the leadoff batter scoring himself 13 times (on pace for 32HR).

Good Baseball

Oscar Mercado advanced a runner with a sac bunt on 6/26 vs. St. Paul and the runner came around to score in the loss (3-1 when advanced runner scores). During 2019, the Clippers struggled in the bunt department, but when the advanced runners scored, they were 7-1. During 2018, Columbus was 23-2 in games in which a run was scored after a good bunt attempt.

International Accolades

Bobby Bradley was named International League Player of the Month for May 2019, reaching base in 24 of 25 games during the month while hitting .302/.374/.740 with 12HR (led IL) and 28RBI. **Brandon Barnes, Eric Haase, Josh Smith** and **Asher Wojciechowski** were named to the 2019 IL All-Star Team and Bradley, Barnes and Haase were selected to the postseason squad.

Manager Profile

Andy Tracy makes his Clippers debut in 2021, following Tony Mansolino's championship rookie year in 2019 (sixth Clipper skipper to win Governors' Cup in first season; Gene Michael-'79, Joe Altobelli-'80, Frank Verdi-'81, Bucky Dent-'87 and Mike Sarbaugh-'10). This season marks Tracy's second year as a manager (first with Williamsport in the Philadelphia system), as he holds a career record of 54-75 (.419), 24-29 with Columbus (.453).
