COMING OUT OF MY CAGE: The Somerset Patriots snapped their five-game losing streak on Wednesday with a 13-12 win over the Bowie Baysox. The 13 runs tied Somerset's most in a game this year for the fourth time. The Patriots have begun this week's series in Bowie by scoring 19 R on 21 H with 6 HR, going 6-for-20 with RISP. During the final four games of their series vs. Portland, the Patriots combined to score 8 R on 15 H with 3 HR, going 1-for-17 with RISP. The Patriots have pieced together double-digit hits in back-to-back games for the first time since 6/30-7/1.

THANK YOU, JESUS! Jesus Rodriguez enters today contest having homered in back-to-back games for the second time in his career (last: 6/15-16, 2023 @CLR). Rodriguez's 4 RBIs on Wednesday matched a career-high for the fourth time in his career. Rodrigues now has multiple hits and multiple RBIs in both games this week, overall having gone 4-for-10 with 2 HR, 6 RBI and 3 R.

VARGY PARTY: Over his last 14 game started dating back to 6/13 @ BNG, INF Alexander Vargas is batting .340/.365/.560 with 2 HR, 15 RBI, 2 3B, and 7 R. With runners in scoring position this season for Somerset, Vargas is 11-for-30 (.367) with 1 HR and 19 RBI and a .975 OPS, including his 2nd inning grand slam vs. POR last Thursday. Vargas, who struck out 21 times over his first 79 Double-A at-bats (26.5 K%) has struck out only five times over his last 29 at-bats (17.2 K%). Tuesday's game marked the first time Vargas had struck out twice in a game since 6/20 @ERI.

GAME-WINNING FLO: Since the All-Star break, Rafael Flores' 3 HR are tied for the most in the Eastern League, while his 23 TB tie for third. Now with 12 HR overall this season, Flores continues to extend his career-best mark.

GRANT IS RICH: After entering this week amid an 0-for-13 skid, Grant Richardson has begun this week's series with his 23rd and 24th multihit games of the season, tying for the most by any Patriot this year (Ben Cowles). Richardson's 4 multi-hit games outnumber his 18 single-hit games this season. Over his last 27 games, Richardson is slashing .271/.330/.417 with 3 HR, 8 RBI, and 12 R.

SAY CHEESE: Elijah Dunham, winner of Eastern League Player of the Week in back-to-back weeks entering the All-Star break, has reached base in 10 of his last 11 games. Dunham has hit safely in 26 of his last 29 games and reached base in 31 of his last 33. Since 6/13, Dunham leads the Eastern league in OPS (1.018), SLG (.611), 2B (11), XBH (19) and TB (77).

JONES IS JAMMING: Spencer Jones enters today with hits in four of his last five games, over which he is 6-for-19. After hitting his 12th home run of the season on Tuesday, Jones secured his sixth game of the season with 3+ RBIs on Wednesday, while adding a home run robbery of Jud Fabian in the fifth inning. Against Bowie this season, Jones is 11-for-31 (.333) with 2 HR, 12 RBI, and a 1.124 OPS. Jones ranks among Eastern League leaders with 54 RBI (T-5th), 139 TB (6th), 51 R (9th), and 21 SB (T-6th).

Raul Dominguez enters his second consecutive season as manager for the Somerset Patriots, 10th overall as a manager and 18th coaching in the Yankees organization. He led the 2023 Patriots to a Double-A best record of 84-53 and a +211 run differential, which ranked first among all MiLB teams. Under his leadership, the Patriots finished with the Eastern League's top record in both halves of the season and clinched their second straight playoff berth. In 2023, Dominguez became the third manager in Somerset Patriots Double-A franchise history and in 2024 he will become the first to serve as manager for more than one season. Before joining Somerset, Dominguez spent the prior two seasons (2021-2022) as a defensive coach for Triple-A Scranton/Wilkes-Barre. He previously served as defensive coach for Trenton (2018-2019) and Tampa (2017). The Panama City, Panama native gained prior managerial experience with the GCL Yankees East (2016), DSL Yankees 1 (2011-15) and DSL Yankees 2 (2009-10). From 2012-2015, his teams finished at least 10 games over .500, including reaching the DSL semifinals in 2012 and 2015.

KEVIN MARTIR: Hitting Coach (1st year)

Hitting coach Kevin Martir begins his first season in Somerset and fourth in the Yankees organization, after serving in the same position for High-A Hudson Valley in 2023 and Single-A Tampa for two seasons in 2021-22. He joined the Yankees organization in 2020 and had been scheduled to serve as hitting coach for former Rookie-Advanced level Pulaski, prior to the cancellation of the minor league season. Martir began his coaching career in 2019 as a development coach for the GCL Phillies East. Martir starred at catcher during his playing career at the University of Maryland (2013-15), where he was a semi-finalist for the Johnny Bench Award in 2015. Martir was drafted by the Houston Astros in the 18th round of the 2015 MLB Draft. He played two professional seasons for the Astros with Rookie-Advanced Greeneville in 2015 and Short-Season Class-A Tri-City in 2016. A native of Brooklyn, New York, Martir graduated from the Grand Street Campus in 2012, after transferring from Xaverian High School in Brooklyn prior to his senior year.

BRETT DeGAGNE: Pitching Coach (1st year)

Pitching coach Brett DeGagne begins his first season with Somerset and fourth year in the Yankees organization. After making his organizational coaching debut as the Single-A Tampa Tarpons' pitch-ing coach in 2021, DeGagne most recently served as the FCL Yankees pitching coach in 2022 and 2023, his staff led the Florida Complex League in strikeouts (587) and finished fourth in ERA (4.47). DeGagne was initially tabbed to be the DSL Yankees pitching coach in 2020, before the cancellation of the minor league season. DeGagne played college ball at the University of North Dakota from 2012-2016. He moved on to grad school at St. Cloud State University, where DeGagne also began his baseball coaching career. He served as the Huskies' pitching coach during the 2017-2018 seasons. He gained additional coaching experience in 2018 as the pitching coach for the Bismarck Larks of the Northwoods League. One year prior to joining the Yankees, in 2019 DeGagne took over as pitching coach for North Iowa Area Community College.

AARON BOSSI: Defensive Coach (3rd year)

Aaron Bossi returns for his third consecutive season as the Patriots' defensive coach. Under Bossi's leadership in each of the past two seasons, infielders Jesus Bastidas (2B, 2022) and T.J. Rumfield (1B, 2023) were each awarded Rawlings Minor League Gold Gloves for their work in the field. Bossi has also overseen Somerset's baserunning program each of the last two seasons, leading the team to an Eastern League-best 205 stolen bases in 2022 and a Double-A-best 256 stolen bases in 2023. Bossi made his coaching debut as Hudson Valley's defensive coach in 2021. Prior to his coaching experience with the Yankees, he spent 2017-2019 assisting rehabbing players at the organization's minor league complex in Tampa. The St. Louis, Missouri native was signed as a non-drafted free agent by the Yankees on June 24, 2016 as a catcher/infielder. He played in 22 games for the GCL Yankees East in 2016

2023: Messinger's second pro season was his first full season working as a starter. He spent all but one game in 2023 pitching for High-A Hudson Valley, posting a 1-10 record and 4.36 ERA over 21 appearances (20 starts). During the first half of the season (11 starts), Messinger posted a 2.44 ERA with 68 K over 55.1 IP. In the second half of the season, he pitched to a 6.91 ERA. Following the conclusion of the 2023 South Atlantic League regular season, Messinger was promoted to Double-A Somerset on 9/12, during the final week of the Eastern League regular season. He made his Double-A debut on 9/14 @NH, pitching to a no-decision while allowing 2 ER over 4.1 IP with 7 K. Among Yankees farmhands, Messinger ended the season ranked tied for ninth in games started (21) and 10th in both strikeouts (120) and innings pitched (101.1).

2022: After being drafted as a reliever, Messinger made his first 15 professional appearances out of the bullpen for Single-A Tampa and posted a 3.57 ERA, before being approached by the Yankees about transitioning to a starting role. After fully converting to a starting pitcher, Messinger then started his final 16 appearances down the stretch to end his first professional season, pitching to a 4.57 ERA. Overall, he spent the full season with Single-A Tampa, pitching in 31 games (16 starts) and compiling a 4.30 ERA with 112 K in 83.2 IP.

College: Pitched three seasons at the University of Virginia (2019-21), working primarily as a reliever in 51 appearances (11 starts). During his junior season in 2021, he appeared in a team-high 28 games (four starts). Messinger led Virginia to the 2021 College World Series, where he pitched .2 IP across two appearances against Mississippi State and Texas where he allowed 4 R. Across his three seasons at Virginia, Messinger went 5-3 with a 4.42 ERA and 112 K over 99.2 IP.

Personal Notes: Attended Castle High School (IN), where he served as team captain for both the baseball and basketball teams. As a senior in 2018, he posted a 7-1 record and 1.66 ERA working as a starter, while being named an Indiana South All-Star. He was also awarded First Team All-State honors and was named Castle's 2018 Lonnie Fisher Male Athlete of the Year. Father, Dennis, played basketball at Olney Central College, and his mother, Lisa, played volleyball at the University of Evansville. Messinger got married this off-season to his now-wife Kinsey.

Career Notes: Selected by the Yankees in the 13th round of the 2021 MLB Draft for \$225,000.

As a senior, he slashed .343/.459/.635 with a team-leading 11 HR and 53 RBI, earning All-Big East 1st Team honors. Overall in his four seasons for Creighton, he posted a .306 average and 14 HR. Within 30 minutes of entering the NCAA transfer portal, he was contacted by Arkansas assistant coach Nate Thompson. During his fifth college season at Arkansas in 2023, Wegner played in 43 games, missing 18 games due to a fractured thumb, and hit .313 with an 1.130 OPS, 15 HR, and 51 RBI. In his lone season as a Razorback, Wegner's team won the 2023 SEC Championship in 2023, the school's fourth in program history, leading Arkansas to the No. 3 overall seed in the NCAA Tournament. He hit home runs in his final two college games in the Fayetteville Regional of the NCAA Tournament and was named a midseason All-American by D1Baseball.

Personal Notes: Three-sport athlete at Kearney High School (Kearney, NE), Wegner was ranked the No. 13 overall prospect in the state of Nebraska by Prep Baseball Report. Prior to high school, he represented Nebraska (Kearney Little League) in the 2012 Little League World Series with his father, rad, serving as the team's head coach. He went 3-for-4 with a homer and 5 RBI in the state's first ever LLWS win, coming over Germany. During his graduate year at Arkansas, Wegner earned the nickname "Pops" from his teammates.

Career Notes: Selected in the ninth round of the 2023 MLB Draft by the Yankees, signing for \$72,500 as a senior-sign.

2021: Ranked as the Yankees' No. 13 prospect by MLB Pipeline, Vargas spent all of 2021 season with FCL Yankees, playing in 42 games, hitting 273 with a .755 OPS, 3 HR, and 26 RBI. Vargas led the FCL in runs (37) and ranked fourth in stolen bases (17).

2019: Made professional debut for the Dominican Summer League Yankees on 6/1, where he played eight games and hit .289, ahead of a promotion to the Gulf Coast League on 6/24. Played in 40 games for the GCL Yankees-East, hitting .219 with 1 HR, 16 RBI and 14 BB to only 22 K. Vargas went a perfect to Rookie-Advanced Pulaski for the 2019 Appalachian League with five triples. The Yankees acquired the extra international pool money they needed for Vargas, the 8th-ranked prospect in the class, by sending Caleb Frare to the White Sox, and both Giovanny Gallegos and Chasen Shreve to the Cardinals. Vargas played for Matanzas in Cuba's 15U national league in 2016, batting .296/.395/.449 with 14 walks and eight strikeouts in 116 plate appearances. In 2017, he jumped to the 18Ŭ league as a 15-year-old. Vargas was part of the first signing class which allowed Cuban players to be signed by MLB teams without having to defect.
