Today's Game

The Clippers will send LHP **Kirk McCarty** to the mound today, looking for his third straight win to start his Triple-A career. Omaha will counter with RHP **Carlos Hernandez**. The Clippers are 5-4 (.556) against right handers this year. Hernandez has pitched against the Clippers once in his career, on Tuesday (ND, 5.0IP, 3H, 0R, 0ER, 2BB, 6K).

vs. the Storm Chasers

Columbus had not played Omaha in the regular season since 1991, when they were known as the Royals and played in the American Association. From 1988-91, the two leagues played crossover games with the Clippers winning 11 of 21 against Omaha, including six of nine in Columbus. The Clippers met the Storm Chasers in the 2011 Triple-A National Championship in Albuquerque (W, 8-3).

Goodbye, Columbus

A win today would close the season opening home stand at 3-3 for the Clippers, following a 4-1 roadtrip to Louisville. The 2019 Clippers finished the home season at an even 35-35 (46-24 on the road). Last night's crowd, the best of the young season, left disappointed, continuing a trend from 2019 in which the Clippers lost nine of their 10 most highly attended games (outscored 103-43 in those 10).

That's Two Thus Far, Shooter

The Clippers lost consecutive games in the last inning before flipping the script with a last at bat win of their own Friday night (1-2 in such games this season). In each of the last three seasons, the Clippers have led the IL in last at bat win%, going 16-8 (.667) in 2019, 26-8 (.765) in 2018 and 14-7 (.667) in 2017. Each of the three games from Wednesday to Friday saw the losing team blow multi-run leads.

Miller Time

Before Friday night, Clipper #3 hitters were at .147/.216/.206 (13th, last and last in the IL) with 0HR and 2RBI (tied for last in each), including an 0x4 from **Owen Miller** on 5/6 at Louisville. Miller went 3x4 batting in front of **Bobby Bradley** Friday night, his fifth 3-hit game of the season, while pounding out his first homer. Last night he was 2x4, marking his seventh multi-hit game of the season.

Struggles Continue

In 50 games since getting optioned on 7/16/19, **Bobby Bradley** has hit .203/.313/.434 with just 12HR and 29RBI while posting a strikeout in 37% of his PA (77 of 214). Only 11RBI since the option are on non-HR and he has accumulated 84LOB in 50 games. In 43 games immediately prior to getting recalled (5/3-6/21/19), Bradley hit .310/.373/.732 with 21HR and 44RBI (32% strikeout rate, 59K in 185PA).

Bump it Up

Gabriel Arias doubled his season hit total with Thursday's 3x4 performance and has gone 6x11 in this last 3G, raising his average 138 points from .143 to .281 (going into Thursday, Arias was one of five regulars hitting .150 or below, joining **Bradley Zimmer**, **Bobby Bradley**, **Oscar Mercado** and **Nolan Jones**). Arias has reached base in every game this season, posting a .439OBP.

In the Middle

Through 10 games, the Clippers rank 7th among the 14 recognized IL teams in average, 35 points from the top (Durham) and 59 points from the bottom (Indianapolis). Columbus has just two players (**Owen Miller**, 2nd and **Ernie Clement**, 13th) ranking among the top 34 hitters and four among the bottom 10 (**Nolan Jones**, 104th, **Oscar Mercado**, 97th, **Bradley Zimmer**, 96th and **Bobby Bradley**, 95th).

Swinging Hard

Heading into today, the Clippers have two players among the top four in the IL in strikeouts, as **Bradley Zimmer** sits in a tie for 2nd (19K) **Nolan Jones** is in a tie for 4th (18K). Zimmer has seen 48% of his trips to the plate end with a walk back to the dugout, while Jones is at 46%. Neither player has homered yet, but each has a double (Jones ranks 104th out of 104 with a .121SLG; Zimmer is 102nd, .194).

Bullpen Getting Roughed Up

The Clipper bullpen had not allowed a run in the final third of a ballgame through the first six, but has given up 10 runs in the 7th or later in the last four games. Despite the last four games (20.1IP, 12ER), the bullpen still ranks 2nd in the IL with a 2.54ERA (28.1IP, 2ER, through first six games). Relievers started the year with 0HR to 132TBF, but have allowed 3HR to the last 72TBF.

This Date in Clipper History

5/16/2010

Columbus beat Durham 5-0 at Huntington Park, with **Carlos Santana** strumming a 2-run HR to lead the way. Santana played in only 57 games for the Clippers in 2010, receiving a permanent promotion to the Big Leagues on 6/11. In his short time with Columbus, he batted .316 (62x196) with 13HR and 51RBI, while posting a .447OBP and .597SLG.

Huntington (Small) Park

In each of the first 11 years since the move downtown, Huntington Park has ranked among the top two in the IL in homers per game, totaling 2.25 per contest (1,763HR, 783 games). Last year, HP averaged over three per game for the first time ever (seventh time averaging over a pair), as the Clippers surrendered a record 127HR and just missed out on triple digits themselves (97HR was second highest team total). Including the postseason, the Clippers have been out-homered over the life of the park (928 to 900).

Record Destruction

The Clippers broke the established mark for homers in a season (182 in 1983) on 8/7/19 and finished with a total of 213 (most in the IL). From 5/14-6/2, they homered in 20 straight games (44HR total) and they had seven straight multi-HR games from 6/14-6/21 (22HR). On the mound, they broke the record for homers allowed (156 in 1998) on 7/31/19, giving up 198 for the year (2nd most in the IL).

Ain't Over 'Til It's Over

Since the start of the 2014 season, no team has had more come from behind victories than the 210 posted by Columbus (35 last season) and no team has produced a better winning percentage when trailing than the .353 of the Clippers (Scranton/WB ranks 2nd in win percentage at .338 and wins, 192).

Walk-Off Magic

Columbus was 5-2 in walk-off games last season, winning four thanks to the courtesy runner in extra innings (Columbus pitching did not allow a run through first 9.0IP in extras last year). On 6/29/19 at Louisville, they suffered their first walk-off loss of the year, snapping an 81 game streak without (previous loss was 5/31/18 at Buffalo). Additionally, the Clippers ranked 1st in the IL with a 16-8 (.667) record in games decided in the last at bat.

Trending Downward

While ranking in the top three of the IL with a 4.71ERA (3rd), the 2019 Clippers registered their worst mark since the 1998 season (4.85ERA). In 2018, they ranked dead last in the IL with a 4.34ERA, marking the third straight (now fourth) season that the team ERA had gotten worse. From 2011-16, the Clipper staff turned in a sub-4.00ERA five times in six seasons (zero such seasons from 1993-2010), including the best two ERAs of the past 30 years (3.33 in 2015 and 3.65 in 2016).

Doing Damage

In 2019, the Clippers ranked tied for 5th in the IL with 112RBI with the bases loaded, while carrying a .252 average (10th, 36x143, 4HR). In both 2017 and 2018, the Clippers led the IL in RBI with the bases loaded (243RBI total) and paced the circuit in grand slams (16 total, no other team had more than eight).

Free Swingers

After two straight seasons leading the IL in strikeouts, the Clipper lineup was atop the IL again in 2019 (1,392K, 60 more than 2nd place). They obliterated the franchise record (1,297, set in 2017; 2018's total of 1,290 was 2nd worst in franchise history), passing it on 8/22/19 (reduced strikeout rate to 8.3 per game after setting record, 10.1 prior). On the season a Clipper was punched out at least four times in a game on 15 occasions (**Eric Haase** led the team with three golden sombreros).

That's More Like It

In 2019, the Clippers were 50-30 (.625) when playing errorless baseball, while turning in a 31-29 (.517) mark with at least one error. Contrary to logic, in 2018 they actually had a worse winning percentage when playing mistake free (.514), than when committing at least one error (.530). The Clipper defense finished 1st in 2019 (.983) after falling to 6th in the IL in 2018, ending a run of three consecutive seasons ranked among the top three (2015-17 resulted in the three best seasons in franchise history).

One On, No Out Success

When the leadoff batter of an inning reached base in 2019, the Clippers plated him nearly 60% of the time (over 51% only once in the last six seasons, 55% in 2016). Getting more than one base was a specialty of Clipper hitters, as they led the IL with 136XBH to lead off the inning, including 54HR (led the IL, had 28 leadoff homers in 2018). From 4/13-4/20/19, the Clippers hit 16 leadoff doubles over 72 innings, including four straight innings in a win at Louisville on 4/15/19.

Good Baseball

Ernie Clement advanced a runner with a sac bunt on 5/8 at Louisville and the runner came around to score in the win. During 2019, the Clippers struggled in the bunt department (12 successes), but when the advanced runners did score, they were 7-1. During 2018, Columbus was 23-2 in games in which a run was scored after a good bunt attempt (54 successes; won 17 in a row from 4/12-7/31/18).

International Accolades

Bobby Bradley was named International League Player of the Month for May 2019, reaching base in 24 of 25 games during the month while hitting .302/.374/.740 with 12HR (led IL) and 28RBI. **Brandon Barnes**, **Eric Haase**, **Josh Smith** and **Asher Wojciechowski** were named to the 2019 IL All-Star Team and Bradley, Barnes and Haase were selected to the postseason squad.

Manager Profile

Andy Tracy makes his Clippers debut in 2021, following **Tony Mansolino's** championship rookie year in 2019 (sixth Clipper skipper to win Governors' Cup in first season; **Gene Michael**-'79, **Joe Altobelli**-'80, **Frank Verdi**-'81, **Bucky Dent**-'87 and **Mike Sarbaugh**-'10). This season marks Tracy's second year as a manager (first with Williamsport in the Philadelphia system), as he holds a career record of 36-50 (.419), 6-4 with Columbus (.600).

Lack of Lefties:

Over the course of 140 games in 2019, the Clippers trotted out a lefty starter just 15 times (**Logan Allen**- 5, **Scott Moss**- 4, **Tanner Tully**- 3, **Sean Brady**- 2 and **Kyle Nelson**- 1), as right handers made 68 consecutive starts from 4/18-6/30. Including the bullpen, lefties accounted for 15.5% of the innings pitched for Columbus in 2019 (191.1IP) and only Louisville had fewer. **Josh Smith** (52.2IP) was the only Clipper with at least 25.0IP.

2019 Season:

Started the year on Lynchburg's DL with a strained lat... activated on 6/12 and threw 42 pitches at Wilmington (3.0IP, 2H, 4K)... gave up 24H in 16.0IP over next 4GS (10ER)... allowed 1H in 6.0IP (2BB, 6K) at Down East on 7/11, then had a brief stint on the DL (7/18-7/23)... returned from the DL and had 7GS to finish the season, posting a 7.37ERA (30.2IP, 25)... had 10K in 5.1IP at Wilmington on 8/13 (also had 5BB, career high 93 pitches)... following the season, pitched in 6G for Mesa in the Arizona Fall League (24.0IP, 17H, 8R, 8ER, 6BB, 19K).
