NEWS AND NOTES

PLAYOFF PUSH: Nashville's back-to-back losses have dropped them 1.5 GB Rochester after the Red Wings fourth straight win over Worcester on Saturday night. The Sounds trail Memphis by 0.5 games with a six-game series on deck at AutoZone Park next week to close out the first half schedule while the Rochester has a home series against the Toledo Mud Hens.

WANNA WIN, PUT HARDIN: Brewers no. 16-rated prospect Tyson Hardin will make his sixth Triple-A start and third against Durham on Sunday. He'll make his second start of the week after striking out a career-high 11 batters on Tuesday night to get the series started. It was also his third quality start since a promotion from Double-A Biloxi with 6.0 IP and one run allowed on three hits without a walk. The right-hander has earned the win in both starts against the Bulls since joining the Sounds, working a combined 11.2 IP with seven hits allowed and two runs while striking out 18 and issuing three walks. Both runs he has allowed against Durham have been solo home runs.

G-SHARP: Right-hander Garrett Stallings tossed yet another efficient outing as he allowed three runs on five hits and punched out a season-high nine in five innings of work on Saturday night. The nine strikeouts are his most in a start since he tied his career-high with 10 strikeouts on September 7, 2023,

vs. Jacksonville with Norfolk. Saturday night was his sixth career game with 9+ strikeouts and fourth time in Triple-A. Stallings currently ranks seventh in games started (10) and in innings pitched (52.2) and ties for eighth in strikeouts (50) among full season Milwaukee Brewers minor league pitchers. Since making his Sounds debut on June 1, 2024, Stallings ranks third in the Brewers organization with 204.2 IP.

FIRST (HORIZON): Greg Jones clubbed his first homer of the season for the Sounds with a two-run shot to left field, tying the game up 3-3 in the bottom of the fifth inning. Jones finished the night 2-for-3 with two RBI and a walk. It was his eighth multi-hit game and fourth multi-RBI game in 27 games with the Sounds this season. He's now hitting .309 (25-for-81) with six XBH, 12 RBI, 13 walks, and has 13 stolen bases on the year. His 13 steals are tied for the third-most on Nashville's roster along with Jett Williams. The pair trail clubhouse leader Luis Lara (20) and Cooper Pratt (17).

BASE MAGNET: Luke Adams extended his on-base streak to 17 consecutive games with a walk in the bottom of the eighth on Saturday night. Adams is hitting .263 (15-for-57) with eight XBH and 13 RBI during the on-base streak. His 17 games are tied for the fifth-longest streak for a Nashville player this season and tied for the ninth-longest active on-base streak in the International League.

BAGS TO RICHES: Nashville swiped five bases on Saturday night to set a new team high this season. Greg Jones recorded his first game with 2+ steals this year as did Akil Baddoo, who has now recorded three stolen bases over his last two games after not having a single stolen base through his first 18 games played. Tyler Black chipped in with a stolen base as well. It was the first time Nashville had stolen 5+ bases in a game since setting a franchise-record with eight stolen bases on September 19, 2025, in Louisville. The Sounds rank fourth in the International League with 111 stolen bases this season after setting a single-season team record with 316 steals last year. Nashville finished 2025 with the most steals in all of Triple-A and finished third in the minors. It was the fourth time the Sounds have led the league in steals since 2005, including twice while in the Pacific Coast League (2005, 175; 2006, 196) and twice in the International League (2022, 192).

FIVE OR LESS: Nashville's bats were held to five or fewer hits for the 18th time this season and second straight night overall. It was the fifth time Nashville has been held to fewer than six hits in back-to-back games this season. The Sounds were held to five or fewer hits 36 times last season, including four straight games from March 29-April 2.
