RHP TANNER GORDON (1-3, 6.23) vs. RHP AARON BROOKS (1-0, 1.50)

TODAY'S GAME: The Isotopes and Aviators meet for the first of two series on the year and only set in Las Vegas ... This marks the first day of the 75-game second half ... Tanner Gordon is expected to make a rehab start for the Isotopes while Aaron Brooks is slated to toe the rubber for the Aviators.

TOUGH STRETCH: Since winning eight of 10 games between May 25-June 3, the Isotopes have dropped 13 of their last 17 contests.

LAST WEEK: With the loss to Tacoma Sunday, the Isotopes dropped five of the six games during the set. It's the first time Tacoma has won five contests in a series against Albuquerque in club history.

-The team is also in the midst of their fourth four-game losing streak of the year, tying a season-high.

-Albuquerque lost five games in a six-game set for the first time since losing five of six at Reno to finish the 2024 season.

TWO RUNS OR FEWER: Albuquerque was held to two runs or fewer for the 17th time this season Sunday and fourth time in the series against Tacoma. The club's 25 runs over the set were tied for the eighth-fewest in Triple-A during the span.

FREE PASSES: Albuquerque's pitching staff walked seven batters Sunday and issued at least five free passes in all six games, a season-high streak ... The club's 36 walks during the six-game set were the third-most in Triple-A during span.

XBH: Despite allowing seven runs Sunday, the Isotopes only relented one extra-base hit, the 11th occurrence permitting one or fewer this season.

HITS: The Isotopes registered just four hits Sunday, the seventh time in 2025 with four or fewer in a contest (last: May 13 vs. Tacoma). Five of the seven instances have come on the road (other at home: April 1 vs. Salt Lake, four).

FIRST HALF: The Isotopes finished the first half with a 31-43 record, 9th in the Pacific Coast League standings and 17.5 games back of first-half winner Las Vegas ... The club tallied a -35 run differential. In 2024, the Isotopes had a -137 run differential at the end of the first half.

LAS VEGAS TIES: Albuquerque skipper **Pedro Lopez** managed the Las Vegas 51s in 2017. Right-handed pitcher **Scott McGough** appeared in 43 games for the Isotopes in 2018 ... Southpaw **Jack O'Loughlin** split last season between the Athletics and Aviators.

MILLER TIME: Owen Miller extended his career-long hit streak to 17 games Sunday with a double. Slashing .370/.380/.548 with seven doubles, two homers, eight RBI and eight multi-hit games during the span ... Miller is tied with Sammy Stafura (Daytona Tortugas) for the second-longest active hit streak in Minor League Baseball ... Seven of his 11 doubles on the year have come since June 1.

-Miller has the longest active hit streak by players currently in the PCL. Ryan Ritter (18) has the longest active hit streak but is in the bigs.

KESTDADDY: Keston Hiura doubled and walked Sunday to extend his on-base streak at Triple-A to 25 games, a season-high by an Isotope and the longest active streak in Triple-A. Slashing .337/.417/.695 with eight doubles, a triple, eight home runs and 24 RBI during the stretch. Has at least one hit in 23 of the 25 contests

-Second-longest on-base streak in PCL this year (long: Drew Avans, 28) ... Longest by an Isotope since Cole Tucker's 27-gamer from July 1-August 5, 2023.

VEEN, VEEN: Since returning to Triple-A Albuquerque June 18, Zac Veen has gone 3-for-20 with one homer and one RBI. ... Has just seven hits in his last 54 at-bats with Albuquerque dating back to May 10.

WARMIN' UP: Warming Bernabel's 14-game hit streak remains intact after leaving Friday's game after one plate appearance (hit by a pitch in the first inning). Slashing .429/.452/.500 with one double, one homer and eight RBI. It's tied for the longest hit streak of his career (also: June 26-July 20, 2024, and August 23-September 10, 2024).

-During last 27 games, is slashing .402/.448/.520 with six doubles, two homers and 14 RBI, raising his batting average from .258 to .323 in the span.

YF: Yanquiel Fernández went 2-for-4 Friday, his 22nd multi-hit game of 2025, second on the team behind Bernabel (24). Is 18-for-41 with three doubles, two homers and seven RBI in his last 10 contests ... Since May 16 (24 games), slashing .389/.433/.579 with nine doubles, three homers, 13 RBI and 15 multi-hit contests.

STERLIN: Since May 2, Sterlin Thompson is slashing .326/.422/.617 with 11 doubles, three triples, eight homers and 25 RBI, raising batting average from .172 to .265 ... Tallied eight stolen bases in 2025 over nine attempts ... Has 13 hit-by-pitch this year, second-most in Triple-A.

NUCLEI NOTES

SKIPPER: Pedro Lopez enters his 21st year as a minor league manager and third guiding the Isotopes. He is the eighth manager in club history ... Spent 2021 as Albuquerque's hitting coach and 2022 as its bench coach ... Notched his 1,000th career managerial victory June 4, 2023 at Salt Lake, 7-1 ... Managed in the Texas Rangers (2001-05, 2007) and New York Mets (2011-19) organizations while claiming the 2014 Eastern League Championship with Double-A Binghamton. Lopez was drafted in the 21st round by the San Diego Padres in the 1988 MLB Draft and spent 13 years in the minor leagues, reaching Triple-A on four occasions.

CHRIS MICHALAK: Begins his third season as Isotopes pitching coach ... Pitched for the Albuquerque Dukes in 2000, followed by stints with the Isotopes in 2004 and 2008 ... Started second-to-last game in Dukes history, giving up two runs in 6.0 innings during Game 4 of a PCL First Round playoff series at Memphis Sept. 9, 2000 ... Appeared in 61 Major League games (24 starts) over five seasons with the Arizona Diamondbacks (1998), Toronto Blue Jays (2001) Texas Rangers (2001-02) and Cincinnati Reds (2006) ... 12th round selection by the Athletics in 1993 ... Has been in the coaching ranks since 2009, including stops as the pitching coach for the Hagerstown Suns (2010-11), Potomac Nationals (2012-13) and Harrisburg Senators (2014-17). He was also the Minor League pitching coordinator for the Miami Marlins from 2018-20 and coached in the Washington Nationals organization from 2021-22.

MICHAEL RYAN: Enters his second year with the Rockies organization as the Isotopes bench coach ... The former outfielder played in 33 games for the Isotopes and hit nine homers during the 2008 campaign. He and Michalak were teammates on that squad for four days in late July ... Entered the coaching ranks in 2012 as a coach for the Double-A Altoona Curve (Pirates). He then managed in the Pirates organization at three levels for seven seasons with stops at Single-A West Virginia (2013-14), High-A Bradenton (2015-16) and Double-A Altoona (2017-19), while winning the Florida State League in 2016 and Eastern League in 2017. Ryan compiled a 221-197 managerial record with Altoona—the most wins for a manager in Curve history ... He also managed in the Cubs organization (High-A South Bend, 2021 and Double-A Tennessee, 2022-June 2023) ... A 5th round draft pick by the Minnesota Twins in 1996, played in 149 MLB games over parts of five seasons with the Twins (2002-05) and Angels (2010) ... Last Angels player to wear 27 prior to Mike Trout's call-up in 2011.

AARON MUNOZ: Takes over as Isotopes hitting coach after Jordan Pacheco was named one of two new hitting coaches for the Colorado Rockies on May 12 ... Began the 2025 season as the hitting coach for the ACL Rockies ... Spent nine seasons (2016-2024) as the Rockies bullpen catcher ... Was Isotopes bullpen catcher in 2015 ... Originally drafted by the Blue Jays in the 34th round of the MLB Draft ... Played parts of four seasons in the Minor Leagues (2011-14), making it to Double-A.

SPLIT-SEASON PLAYOFF FORMAT: For the third-straight year, the Pacific Coast League will use a split-season format to determine playoff participants. With one 10 team division, the first half winner (concluding June 22) will host the second half winner (beginning June 24) in a three-game set. The winner will then face the International League champion for the Triple-A Championship in Las Vegas, NV, on September 27.

BALLS AND STRIKES: The Challenge System, in it's third full year in the PCL, will be used exclusively for every game this season. Under this system, the home plate umpire will call balls or strikes while each team has the opportunity to challenge the umpire's call with two challenges per game, retaining one for each successful challenge.

Logan Community College, pitching for two seasons (2017-18) ... Named National Pitcher of the Week April 26, 2018, after spinning a complete-game victory where he fanned a school record 19 batters
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- ◆ Made his third Rockies start on May 28 at Chicago (NL) and charged with second loss of year ... Tossed 4.2 innings and allowed two runs on six hits and one homer with one strikeout ... Induced seven groundouts and three flyouts over 19 batters faced ... Surrendered run in first on a Seiya Suzuki RBI double ... Permitted solo homer to Pete-Crow Armstrong in fourth

- Made 11 starts for Triple-A Albuquerque, going 4-4 with a 4.45 ERA (54.2 IP)
