**The Aviators concluded their 41st season on the field as
a member of the Pacific Coast League
(1983-2019, 2022-24) & Triple-A West (2021)**

The Oakland Athletics recalled a total of **19** players from the Las Vegas Aviators (who began the season in minor leagues in the Oakland minor league system) during the 2024 season:
The complete list is included in the Las Vegas Aviators Transactions pages on the final season game notes.

2024 LAS VEGAS BALLPARK ATTENDANCE: In 74 dates, Las Vegas total is **481,802** (3rd in PCL) for an average of **6,511** with **12 sellouts**...the season-high crowd was **10,646 (sellout)** vs. El Paso on September 20...all-time attendance total now stands at **14,586,384**...the Las Vegas franchise has reached the 300,000 mark in "home" attendance in all **41** seasons (1983-2019, 2021-24).

The Las Vegas Ballpark regular season attendance total over five seasons (2019, 2021-24) is 2,585,373 which includes 93 sellouts.

2023 LAS VEGAS BALLPARK ATTENDANCE: In 74 dates, Las Vegas total was **506,047** (3rd in PCL) for an average of 6,838 with **17 sellouts**...the season-high crowd was **11,268 (sellout)** vs. Reno on September 22.

2022 LAS VEGAS BALLPARK ATTENDANCE: In 75 dates, Las Vegas total was **518,221** (three-time PCL leader) for an average of 6,910 with **11 sellouts**...season-high crowd was **11,368 (sellout)** vs. Round Rock on July 3.

2021 LAS VEGAS BALLPARK ATTENDANCE: In 65 dates, Las Vegas total was **428,369** (led Triple-A West) for an average of 6,590 (50% capacity from May 6-11; May 20-25; **100% capacity from June 10 – September 27**) with six sellouts...season-high crowd was **10,190 (sellout)** vs. Sacramento on July 3.

In 36 seasons at Cashman Field (1983-2018), the attendance total was 12,001,011.

LAS VEGAS AVIATORS LEAD 2019 MINOR LEAGUE BASEBALL IN HOME ATTENDANCE:

The Aviators led Triple-A baseball (30 teams: 16 in PCL; 14 in International League) and all minor league baseball in total home attendance (**650,934**) and average (**9,299 in 70 dates**) which included 47 sellouts.

The Columbus Clippers, Triple-A affiliate of the Cleveland Indians, led the IL in total home attendance and average (590,504 – 8,684 average in 68 dates).

Las Vegas Aviators/Oakland Athletics: The Aviators and Athletics, on September 17, 2018, announced a new Player Development Contract through the 2020 season...the A's, on December 9, 2020, invited Las Vegas to be their Triple-A affiliate for the 2021 season...Major League Baseball, on February 12, 2021, announced that all 120 Minor League clubs offered an invitation to become Professional Development League ("PDL") license holders have officially agreed to accept...thus, the Aviators and Oakland Athletics have extended the affiliation for 10 seasons through the 2030 campaign...the Las Vegas Stars/51^s/Aviators have captured the PCL Championship twice (1986 & 1988) and appeared in the playoffs 11 times (21-32 record, .396), last appeared in 2019...Las Vegas was the 2002, 2013, 2014, 2019 Pacific Southern Division Champions.

2024 PCL PITCHERS OF THE WEEK: Right-hander **Oswaldo Bido** from April 29 – May 5 (defeated Reno on May 2 at Las Vegas Ballpark: season-high 7.0 shutout innings, two hits, one walk, eight strikeouts). Right-hander **Joe Boyle** from July 22-28 (5.0 shutout innings in a no decision at Reno on July 26, one hit, two walks, nine strikeouts) and from August 5-11 (defeated Salt Lake on August 6, 5.2 shutout innings, one hit, one walk, season-high 12 strikeouts)...left-hander **Brady Basso** was named PCL August Minor League Pitcher of the Month (5 starts/2-1/2.84 ERA/25.1 IP/27 SO)...Boyle was also named Team MVP (by the Aviators coaching staff) on September 20.

2024 PCL PLAYERS OF THE WEEK: Outfielder **Daz Cameron** from April 29 – May 5...appeared in seven games vs. Reno and batted .591 (13-for-22) with five doubles, triple, home run, five walks, two stolen bases and 10 RBI...recorded four straight multiple-hit games...Outfielder **Seth Brown** from June 17-23...appeared in four games against Tacoma and batted .444 (8-for-18) with two doubles, three home runs, 7 RBI, seven runs scored...infielder **Jordan Díaz** from July 29 – August 4...appeared in five games against Albuquerque and batted .500 (12-for-24) with three doubles, four home runs and 13 RBI...infielder/outfielder **Ryan Noda** from August 12-18...appeared in six games and batted .455 (10-for-22) with five doubles, four home runs, five walks, 10 RBI and 27 total bases...infielder/outfielder **Logan Davidson** from August 26 – September 1...appeared in five games and batted .524 (11-for-21) with two doubles, triple, two home runs and 5 RBI and hit for the cycle on August 30 (5-for-5)...catcher **Carlos Pérez** from September 2-8...appeared in five games

and batted .350 (7-for-20) with five walks, three home runs and 9 RBI...infielder/outfielder **Logan Davidson** from September 9-15...appeared in six games and batted .538 (14-for-26) with six doubles, four home runs and 14 RBI.

THE “3 20’s” HOME RUNS IN A SEASON: C/INF **Carlos Pérez** (27), INF **Jordan Díaz** (22) and INF/OF **Ryan Noda** (22) have reached the 20-home run mark...the last time three players reached 20 plus home runs in a season was 2021: **Carlos Pérez** (31), C/INF **Francisco Peña** (23) and C **Austin Allen** (20).

2024 AVIATORS OFFENSE: Las Vegas led all of Triple-A (30 teams) with 921 runs scored and 232 home runs...the franchise record for single-season home runs is 250 (2019).

41st SEASON IN THE SILVER STATE (1983-2024) – The Aviators completed their 41st season (42nd calendar season) in the Silver State as a proud member of the Pacific Coast League...**the Las Vegas Aviators have the proud distinction of being Nevada’s longest enduring professional sports franchise**...Las Vegas Triple-A baseball was born on April 10, 1983 before a sellout crowd of 10,622 at Cashman Field (Las Vegas defeated Salt Lake City, 11-8)...catcher **Bruce Bochy** has the distinction of hitting the first Triple-A home run in Cashman Field history for the Las Vegas Stars on April 10, 1983.

PACIFIC COAST LEAGUE: The PCL completed its 121st season (1903-2020, 2022 -) and consists of two divisions for a total of 10 teams. **West Division:** Las Vegas Aviators, Reno Aces, Sacramento River Cats, Salt Lake Bees, Tacoma Rainiers; **East Division:** Albuquerque Isotopes, El Paso Chihuahuas, Oklahoma City Baseball Club, Round Rock Express, Sugar Land Space Cowboys. The 10-team league in 2021 was named Triple-A West and returned as the PCL in 2022!

INTERNATIONAL LEAGUE: The IL consists of two divisions for a total of 20 teams. **East Division:** Buffalo Bisons, Charlotte Knights, Durham Bulls, Jacksonville Jumbo Shrimp, Lehigh Valley IronPigs, Norfolk Tides, Rochester Red Wings, Scranton/Wilkes-Barre RailRiders, Syracuse Mets, Worcester Red Sox. **West Division:** Columbus Clippers, Gwinnett Stripers, Indianapolis Indians, Iowa Cubs, Louisville Bats, Memphis Redbirds, Nashville Sounds, Omaha Storm Chasers, St. Paul Saints, Toledo Mud Hens. The 20-team league in 2021 was named Triple-A East and returned as the IL in 2022.

2023 SEASON – The Aviators compiled an overall record of 75-74 (.503) and finished in third place in the PCL West Division. The Reno Aces captured the West Division with an overall record of 88-62 (.587). Oklahoma City baseball club recorded the best record (90-58, .608) in the 10-team PCL and defeated the Round Rock Express, 2-games-to-0 to capture the PCL Championship. The Norfolk Tides defeated OKC, 7-6, in the **Triple-A National Championship** game on September 30 before a sellout crowd of 8,556 at Las Vegas Ballpark.

2022 SEASON – The Aviators compiled an overall record of 71-79 (.473) and finished in third place in the PCL West Division. The Reno Aces captured the West Division with an overall record of 85-63 (.574). The Aces captured the PCL championship and defeated the El Paso Chihuahuas, Triple-A affiliate of the San Diego Padres, 6-2, on September 30 in the inaugural **Triple-A Triple Championship Weekend** at Las Vegas Ballpark. The Durham Bulls, Triple-A affiliate off the Tampa Bay Rays, captured the Triple-A National Championship and defeated Reno, 10-6, on October 2 at Las Vegas Ballpark. The Bulls defeated the Nashville Sounds, Triple-A affiliate of the Milwaukee Brewers, 13-0, to capture the IL championship on October 1 at Las Vegas Ballpark.

LAS VEGAS 80-WIN SEASONS – The Las Vegas franchise has won 80 or more games in a season six times: **85** (2002, franchise best 85-59 record (.590)); **83** (1983 inaugural season, 83-60 (.580)); **83** (83-57, .593 in 2019); **81** (81-63, .563 in 2013); **81** (81-63, .563 in 2014); **80** (1986 PCL champions with an 80-62 mark (.563))...Las Vegas recorded back-to-back 80-win seasons for the first time in franchise history (2013 & 2014)...the 83-57 record in 2019 marked a single-season franchise record for winning percentage at .593 (140-game season).

Aviators on Radio in 2024: Russ Langer broadcast the 149 games on **Raider Nation Radio 920 AM** (selected games on **Fox Sports 1340 AM** and **98.9 FM**) on www.aviatorslv.com. Langer completed his 24th season broadcasting baseball to the Las Vegas Valley and 37th year overall in the business....over his career, Langer has received numerous awards, including being named 1993 Minor League Broadcaster of the Year by the National Association of Professional Baseball Leagues....in 1995 and 2016, he broadcast the Triple-A All-Star game; in 1999, he was named the New Mexico Sportscaster of the Year; and in 2002, he was named Minor League Broadcaster of the Year by Minor League News.com...Langer also is a 12-time recipient (13 overall and seven consecutive years from 2007-13) of the Nevada Sportscaster of the Year award (2003, 2005, 2007, 2008, 2009, 2010, 2011, 2012, 2013, 2015, 2021, 2023), which is presented by the National Sports Media Association (NSMA)...Langer's inaugural season in Las Vegas was in 2000, the final year the franchise was known as the Stars...prior to arriving in Las Vegas, Langer called Pacific Coast League games for the Albuquerque Dukes (1996-99) and Phoenix Firebirds (1992-95)...began his broadcasting career with Single-A Springfield Cardinals in 1987 and 1989, sandwiched around a year in Vero Beach (1988)...moved up the ranks to Double-A, calling games for the Midland Angels in 1990 and '91 before advancing to Triple-A Phoenix...he realized his longtime goal of broadcasting Major League baseball when he worked a total of 30 Montreal Expos games during the 2003 and 2004 seasons, followed by nine games for the Baltimore Orioles in 2006...has also broadcast selected spring training games for the Los Angeles Dodgers (2006-08), Toronto Blue Jays (2009-10) and Chicago White Sox (2012-20)...on April 6, 2023, marked his 3,000th broadcast for the Triple-A Las Vegas Stars/51^s/Aviators franchise..also in 2023, Langer completed his 12th season as the radio play-by-play voice for the UNLV football team on the UNLV Sports Properties/Learfield Network.

Matt Neverett also served as the play-by-play voice for home games and selected road games...completed his fifth season with the Aviators, and his fourth in the broadcast booth...he returned to his birthplace of Las Vegas in 2020 after spending two years with the Bradenton Marauders, Single-A Affiliate of the Pittsburgh Pirates, as the play-by-play broadcaster and media relations director...after graduating from Appalachian State University in Boone, NC in 2017, he spent one season with the Birmingham Barons, Double-A Affiliate of the Chicago White Sox, as a media relations manager and pre/post game host...also broadcast selected UNLV Runnin' Rebel basketball games, UNLV baseball and UNLV football on SSEN...on July 10, he was named the radio play-by-play broadcaster for UNLV football for the 2024 season...his father, Tim, is a former play-by-play voice of the Las Vegas 51^s and current play-by-play voice of the Los Angeles Dodgers.

Aviators Manager Fran Riordan - **2019 & 2023 PCL Manager of the Year**

He was named the 25th manager (November 8, 2018) in the history of the Las Vegas franchise (1983-2019, 2021-23, 40 seasons). **Career Summary:** He has recorded 23 seasons overall in professional baseball and has been a member of the Oakland Athletics organization for the past 10 seasons (2015-24).

Riordan has compiled an overall managerial record over 23 seasons of 1,309-1,271 (.507). He entered the '24 season ranked eighth among active leaders in minor league managerial wins.

Triple-A Las Vegas: He has a five-year record of 368-346 (.515) and is Las Vegas' all-time leader in managerial wins: 2. **Jerry Royster**, 1996-98; 2005-06 (323-387, .455); 3. **Wally Backman**, 2013-16 (309-267, .536).

2023: Named Pacific Coast League Manager of the Year for the second time in four seasons. The Aviators compiled an overall record of 75-74 (.508) and finished in third place in the West Division.

2022: The Aviators compiled an overall record of 71-79 (.473) and finished in third place in the PCL West Division.

2021: Riordan guided the Aviators to an overall record of 65-61 (.516) and finished in third place in the Triple-A West (Western Division).

2020: With the Minor League Baseball season canceled due to the COVID-19 pandemic, Riordan worked with the Athletics' 60-man player pool at the team's alternate training site located in San Jose, California.

2019: Named Pacific Coast League Manager of the Year and led Triple-A Las Vegas to the second-best record in the 16-team PCL (83-57, .593) and a Pacific Southern Division Championship...Las Vegas returned to the playoffs for the first time since 2014 and lost to Sacramento, 3-games-to-2, in the conference championship series...the Aviators' record marked a single-season franchise record for winning percentage at .593 (140-game season).

2018: Made his Triple-A debut as manager with the Nashville Sounds of the Pacific Coast League and compiled an overall record of 72-68 (.514) and finished in second place in the American Southern Division behind the PCL and Triple-A National Champion, the Memphis Redbirds...Nashville compiled a PCL-best 15-game winning streak from July 29 – August 14.

2017: Compiled a record of 67-71 (.486) with Double-A Midland and his squad captured the Texas League Championship...the prior two seasons, he was the skipper of Single-A Beloit of the Midwest League (2015-16)...before joining the Oakland organization, Riordan spent four seasons as manager of the Florence Freedom of the Frontier League

(2011-14)...led the team to two playoff berths and is the all-time Frontier League leader in wins with 625...was a 2014 Frontier League Hall of Fame inductee...prior to his time with Florence, he managed the Northern League's Lake County Fielders (2010) and Kalamazoo Kings for six seasons (2004-09), leading the Kings to the 2005 Frontier League title...was named the 2008 Frontier League Manager of the Year. He also served as player-manager in the Frontier League from 2000-02, leading the Richmond Roosters to back-to-back-league championships in 2001 and 2002.

Professional Playing Career: A first baseman/outfielder, he played seven seasons in the Frontier League with Richmond (1997-98, 2001-02), Dubois County (1999-2000) and North Shore (2003)...appeared in 501 career games and batted .281 (525-for-1,869) with 95 doubles, 11 triples, 55 home runs and 349 RBI...was a three-time All-Star (first base) from 2000-02 and hit a career-high .314 with Dubois County (2000) and Richmond (2002)...established career-highs in home runs (14) in 2001 and RBI (81) in 2002.

Aviators Coaching Staff:

Brian McArn completed his 26th season overall in the Oakland Athletics organization...returned to Triple-A Las Vegas for his fourth season...served as hitting coach for his third season and was the assistant hitting coach in 2021.

Minor League Coaching Career: He had three stints as hitting coach for Single-A Stockton of the California League for a total of seven seasons (2011-12, 2014-15, 2018-2020); Triple-A Las Vegas of the Pacific Coast League for three seasons (2021-23); Double-A Midland of the Texas League hitting coach for four seasons (2004, 2013, 2016-17); Triple-A Sacramento of the Pacific Coast League for six seasons (2005-10); the A's former Single-A affiliate in Modesto of the California League where he served as hitting coach for six seasons (1998-2003)...prior to joining the A's organization, McArn spent one season as the hitting coach for Single-A Vermont of the New York-Penn League...has been a minor league coach for a total of 24 seasons...began his coaching career at American River Junior College in Sacramento, where he served as assistant coach.

Professional Playing Career: He was selected by Oakland in the 26th round of June 1991 First-Year Player Draft...spent two seasons in the A's organization before injuries ended his career in 1992.

Bryan Corey completed his eighth season overall in the Oakland Athletics organization and his second season with Triple-A Las Vegas as pitching coach...Before joining Las Vegas, he served as pitching coach at Single-A Stockton of the California League in 2022 and in 2018.

Minor League Coaching Career: He served as pitching coach at Single-A Stockton of the California League for two seasons (2018, 2022); pitching coach for Triple-A Las Vegas of the Pacific Coast League (2023)...also served as assistant pitching rehab coordinator (2021) and was pitching coach for the rookie-level Arizona A's for two seasons (2019-20)...spent two seasons as pitching coach at Short-Season, Single-A Vermont of the New York-Penn League (2017) and Single-A Stockton (2018)...also served as a Four Corners scout for Milwaukee (2015-16) and a Major League Advance scout for Cleveland (2013-14).

Professional Playing Career: He was originally drafted as a shortstop by Detroit in the 12th round of June 1993 First-Year Player Draft...converted to a pitcher after two professional seasons...the right-hander spent the next 18 seasons on the mound and played in five Major League seasons with Arizona (1998), Los Angeles Dodgers (2002), Texas (2006), Boston (2006-08) and San Diego (2008)...was a member of the 2007 World Series champion Red Sox...appeared in 91 career Major League games and posted a 4-4 record with a 5.13 ERA (98.1 IP/57 SO)...member of the Las Vegas 51^s, Triple-A affiliate of the Los Angeles Dodgers, for two seasons (2002-03)...appeared in 97 career games for the 51^s and posted a 9-9 record in 144.2 innings pitched and struck out 79 batters...he also played two seasons in Japan (2004, 2010), winning the Japan Series with Chiba Lotte during his second stint. Additionally, he pitched in both Korea and Taiwan before retiring after the 2012 season.

Bronswell Patrick completed his second season in the Oakland Athletics organization and his first season with Triple-A Las Vegas as bullpen coach. Before joining Las Vegas, he served as pitching coach for Rookie-level Arizona in 2023.

Minor League Coaching Career: He has coached for 15 years in affiliated and international baseball before joining the Athletics...in 2022, served as pitching coach for the Acereros de Monclova of the Mexican League...also coached for Naranjeros de Hermosillo of the Mexican Pacific League and was promoted to manager of the club for the 2018-19 seasons...began his coaching career in the San Diego organization and was pitching coach of Arizona League Padres in 2008...also served as pitching coach for Single-A Fort Wayne in 2010...spent a total of 12 seasons in the Padres organization and was the pitching coach for Triple-A affiliation for six seasons (Tucson in 2013 and El Paso, 2015-19)...was named pitching coach for the 2016 Triple-A All-Star Game.

Professional Playing Career: He was selected by Oakland in the 23rd round of June 1988 First Year Player draft and played 18 professional seasons...the right-handed pitcher played in parts of two Major League seasons with Milwaukee (1998) and San Francisco (1999) and appeared in 38 career games and posted a 5-1 record with a 5.04 ERA (84.0 IP/55 SO)...made his Major League debut with Milwaukee on May 18, 1998...following his career in affiliated ball, played international in the Mexican League (2001, 2003-05), Korean Baseball Organization (2002), Chinese Professional League (2005) and Mexican Pacific Winter League (2006-07).
