SUNDAY: The Flying Squirrels beat the Yard Goats, 5-2, at CarMax Park for a series split. Hartford broke a scoreless tie in the top of the sixth with a sac fly by Aidan Longwell. Dyan Jorge extended the lead to 2-0 in the top of the seventh with an RBI single. After a rain delay of one hour and 10 minutes, play resumed in the bottom of the seventh and the Flying Squirrels scored five runs to take the lead. **Ty Hanchey** hit an RBI single. **Trevor Cohen** tied the score with an RBI single and the go-ahead run scored on an error. **Gavin Kilen** pushed the lead to 5-2 with a two-run single. **Tyler Vogel** picked up his seventh win of the season. **Dale Stanavich** and **Cristian Alvarado** finished the game with two scoreless innings.

POSTSEASON BOUND: The June 12 win clinched the Eastern League Southwest Division title for the Flying Squirrels, locking in a postseason berth. The Flying Squirrels will play the second-half division champion in the Division Series. Game 1 will be at the home of the second-half champion on Tues., Sept. 15. Game 2 and, if necessary, Game 3 will be at CarMax Park on Thurs., Sept. 17 and Sat., Sept. 18. If Richmond advances to the EL Championship Series, Game 1 will be at CarMax Park on Sun., Sept. 20. This year marks the fifth postseason appearance in franchise history and the first since 2023.

TODAY'S GAME: The Flying Squirrels face the Somerset Patriots, Double-A affiliate, in the first and second of a six-game series. This series is the second between the two teams this year. The Flying Squirrels won five-of-six against the Patriots at CarMax Park from April 21-26. This series is Richmond's second of three straight against Northeast Division opponent and the team's second of two trips to Northeast Division ballparks this season.

RECORD YEAR: The Flying Squirrels' 10-game win streak from April 4-15 was the longest in franchise history, surpassing an eight-game win streak from May 5-13, 2021, also beginning with the second game of the season. The 57-37 record is the best in team history through 94 games, passing a 55-39 record in 2014. Richmond has won seven series, split seven and lost three so far this year. After opening the season with a 27-7 record through May 13, the Flying Squirrels are 30-30 in their last 60 games since.

RELENTLESS: In their 57 wins this year, the Flying Squirrels have come from behind in 29 of them. In 18 of the wins, Richmond has taken the lead in the eighth inning or later. The Flying Squirrels have 10 walk-off wins at CarMax Park this season, including at least one in each home series. **Diego Velasquez** has three walk-off hits this year, all in 10th innings. **Drew Cavanaugh**, **Parks Harber** and **Dayson Croes** each have two walk-off winners this year. Richmond has three wins after trailing by five-or-more runs this season. The Flying Squirrels are batting .294 in the ninth inning this year, which leads the EL and is third in MiLB.

THE FLYING SQUIRRELS won the Southwest Division first-half title by seven games over second-place Erie and has the Eastern League's best overall record this season. Richmond leads all 30 Double-A teams in batting average (.269) and sacrifice flies (38) this season and ranks fourth in hits (843) and third in doubles (182). The team has combined for 99 homers this year, surpassing 11 of the franchise's previous 15 season totals. The Flying Squirrels are on pace to set offensive single-season franchise records for batting average, runs, total bases, doubles, RBIs, stolen bases, OBP, SLG, OPS, sacrifice flies and hit by pitches. The Richmond pitching staff has thrown nine shutouts this season, which is the most in the Eastern League and tied for second in Double-A. At 35-16, the Flying Squirrels have the second-best home record in MiLB this season, trailing only High-A Bowling Green (37-10). Richmond's No. 9 batters have combined to hit .345 this year, which leads the minors.

THE PATRIOTS finished in second place in the Northeast Division first-half standings, 2.5 games behind Hartford. In the second half, they are in the place and three games behind first-place Reading. After going 3-9 from July 4-22, Somerset won five straight games to finish last week's series at New Hampshire. This season, the Patriots lead all Double-A teams in homers (140). Somerset's roster features six players ranked in Baseball America's top-30 Yankees prospects list, including RHP Ben Hess (No. 6), RHP Cade Smith (No. 18), RHP Ben Grable (No. 19), RHP Chase Hampton (No. 21), LHP Xavier Rivas (No. 27) and OF Jace Avina (No. 30). MLB.com's top-30 Yankees prospects list features eight Somerset players, including Hess (No. 6), Smith (No. 15), Avina (No. 19), RHP Rory Fox (No. 20), Hampton (No. 21), Rivas (No. 24), Grable (No. 25) and RHP Tony Rossi (No. 30).

FOR RICHMOND: Right-hander **Trystan Vrieling** makes his 19th start of the season and the second of his career against the Patriots, his former team, in Game 1. He holds the Patriots' affiliated franchise record for the most career wins. He last pitched last Wednesday and allowed three runs over five innings in a no-decision against Hartford. In his last four starts since June 30, Vrieling is 3-0 with a 2.46 ERA (6 ER/22.0 IP). On April 24, he faced the Patriots at CarMax Park and allowed two runs over five innings. On June 12, he threw a five-inning, complete-game shutout in a rain-shortened win over the Senators as the Flying Squirrels clinched the first-half title. Last year, he missed the start of the season before joining Double-A Somerset in May. After going 1-2 with a 4.50 ERA in 12 outings, he was traded at the deadline on August 1 to the Giants from the Yankees as part of the deal for reliever Camilo Doval. The trade happened in the middle of a Richmond series at Somerset. In 2024, he made professional debut against the Flying Squirrels on April 7 at TD Bank Ballpark to close opening weekend and threw five scoreless innings, allowing two hits with six strikeouts. Vrieling was selected by the Yankees in the third round of the 2022 MLB Draft out of Gonzaga. **For more on Vrieling, see page two.**

Left-hander **Greg Farone** makes his 19th Double-A start and his second against the Patriots in Game 2. In his last start last Wednesday against Hartford, he allowed six runs over 3.1 innings, including a three-run homer in the fourth inning. He was 2-0 with a 0.82 ERA (1 ER/11.0 IP) in his previous two starts. He faced the Patriots on April 22 in Richmond and allowed three runs over 3.1 innings in a no-decision. Farone was Richmond's Opening Day starter on April 4 at Erie in his Double-A debut and allowed one run over 4.2 innings. He had eight strikeouts, tying the franchise record for the most strikeouts on Opening Day. He pitched his first professional season in 2025 and split the year between Low-A San Jose and High-A Eugene. He made 12 starts for San Jose, going 2-1 with a 3.73 ERA. At the time of his promotion in June, he ranked third in the California League in strikeouts (73). Farone closed the year with 11 starts at High-A, going 4-2 with a 4.25 ERA. Farone began his college career at Herkimer College in New York, where he led the team to the program's first NJCAA national title in 2022, going 7-0 with a 1.65 ERA and was named the NJCAA Division III Player of the Year and MVP of the World Series. He transferred to the University of Louisville for the 2023 season and pitched at the University of Alabama in 2024 before being selected by the Giants in the seventh round of that year's MLB Draft. **For more on Farone, see page two.**

FOR SOMERSET: Right-hander Cade Smith makes his 16th start of the season and his second against Richmond. In his last start last Wednesday, he surrendered two runs over five innings in a no-decision at New Hampshire. On April 23 at CarMax Park, Smith was charged with a loss after allowing four runs over 4.2 innings. He pitched for Mesa in the Arizona Fall League last year and was named to the Fall Stars Game. Smith was selected in the sixth round of the 2023 MLB Draft out of Mississippi State, where he was teammates with Richmond pitcher **Will Bednar** and former Richmond pitcher **Dylan Carmouche** as the Bulldogs won the program's first-ever College World Series title in 2021 and current Richmond outfielder **Dakota Jordan** in 2023.

KILEN IT: In his first nine Double-A games, **Gavin Kilen** is batting .344 (11-for-32) with five doubles, a triple and eight RBIs. For the season, he leads all MiLB hitters with 32 doubles this year. He also leads all Giants minor league hitters with 73 RBIs this season. After playing in the All-Star Futures Game in Philadelphia, Kilen was promoted to Double-A on July 17. He has at least one hit in eight of his nine games in the Eastern League. On Sunday, he went 2-for-3 with a double and two RBIs. Kilen was selected by the Giants last year out of the University of Tennessee with the 13th overall pick in the MLB Draft. He is tied for the third-highest pick in the MLB Draft in Flying Squirrels franchise history, even with Patrick Bailey (2020) and trailing only Joey Bart (2, 2019) and Hunter Bishop (10, 2019).

GO, DIEGO, GO!: In his last 21 games since June 28, **Diego Velasquez** is batting .429 (27-for-63) with a homer, five doubles, 11 walks, eight RBIs and four stolen bases. Since joining the Flying Squirrels in July 2024, Velasquez has played 250 games. In Richmond's franchise history, Velasquez ranks second in sacrifices (19), third in walks (121), third in OBP (.376, min. 400 PA), tied for fourth in stolen bases (40) and sixth in hits (245). This month, he leads the Eastern League in OBP (.500), which is tied for eighth among full-season MiLB hitters, and he leads the EL in batting average (.414), which is fourth in MiLB.

JACK ATTACK: In his last 30 games since June 5, **Jack Payton** is batting .352 (38-for-108) with a homer, six doubles, a triple, 10 RBIs, 10 walks and 13 runs scored. He has 10 multi-hit performances in his last 29 games dating back to June 9, including seven two-hit games and three three-hit games.

TOP SKIPPER: Flying Squirrels manager **Dennis Pelfrey** has led the team to 317 wins in his career, which is a franchise record all-time wins record for a manager. He passed the record with Richmond's 6-1 win at Binghamton on May 23, 2025. From 2011-2013, **Dave Machemer** won 216 games as Richmond's manager, leading the team to the Eastern League postseason for in 2011. Pelfrey, who has been with Richmond since the 2022 season, led the team to back-to-back postseason appearances for the first time in franchise history in 2022 and 2023. He also managed the 2021 Eugene Emeralds to the High-A West championship. Of Richmond managers since 1954, Pelfrey is second in wins behind Eddie Haas (1968, 1981-84), who had 351 wins.

IN THE LEAGUE LEADERS: In the Eastern League, **Diego Velasquez** is fourth in batting average (.300) and fifth in OBP (.392). **Charlie Szykowny** is tied for second in triples (4). **Bo Davidson** is tied for third in homers (19), tied for seventh in RBIs (54) and eighth in SLG (.521). **Parks Harber** is tied for seventh in doubles (20), eighth in batting average (.284) and ninth in OPS (.879). **Jonah Cox** is first in triples (5) and tied for sixth in stolen bases (27). **Tyler Vogel** is first in saves (13) and tied for seventh in wins (7). **Trystan Vrieling** is first in shutouts (1), tied for first in complete games (1), seventh in ERA (4.13) and fourth in BAA (.233). **Cesar Perdomo** is tied for ninth in strikeouts (89).

PROSPECT WATCH: Richmond's roster features five players are ranked in Baseball America's top-30 Giants prospects, including **Dakota Jordan** (No. 8), **Gavin Kilen** (No. 9), **Trevor Cohen** (No. 10), **Diego Velasquez** (No. 24) and RHP **Yunior Marte** (No. 29). Jordan is rated as the organization's best athlete. MLB.com's top-30 Giants prospects list features six Richmond players, including Kilen (No. 4), Jordan (No. 5), Cohen (No. 9), **Jancel Villarroel** (No. 22), Marte (No. 24) and **Maui Ahuna** (No. 30).

THIS DATE IN RICHMOND BASEBALL HISTORY

1989: The Richmond Braves beat the Rochester Red Wings, 7-5, on the road. Ron Gant hit for the cycle, capping the feat with a go-ahead, ninth-inning triple to score David Justice. It was the fourth cycle in R-Braves history, joining Albert Hall, Gerald Perry and Tommy Dunbar. Mike Stanton picked up the win in his Triple-A debut, working two scoreless relief innings. **1993:** The Richmond Braves beat the Syracuse Chiefs, 8-2, at The Diamond. Brian Barot started and allowed one unearned run over eight innings, striking out eight. His only run allowed was in the first inning. Chipper Jones and Javy Lopez each hit two-run homers. **2011:** The Flying Squirrels beat the Trenton Thunder, 3-2, at Mercer County Waterfront Park. Eric Surkamp started for the Flying Squirrels and struck out 12 batters over six innings, tying his own single-game franchise record he had set earlier in the month. **2023:** The Flying Squirrels beat the Portland Sea Dogs, 4-3, at The Diamond. In the bottom of the ninth, Ismael Munguia tied the score with a single and Brady Whalen won the game with a walk-off sacrifice fly.
